A Century in the Making

'A Century in the Making' is the title of the Mackenzie Highland Pipe Band's latest book by author Noel Guthrie.

Over the next couple of months, we will bring some interesting little tidbits to the Fairlie Accessible as a means of whetting the reader's appetite for when the book is finally launched at the Mackenzie A & P Show, April 2012.

It is with a sense of pride, that current members of the Mackenzie Highland Pipe Band produce this publication, in the form of a coffee table addendum, for their supporters, in a series of reflections, of the past 100 years.

It contains more than 300 pages of text and photographs, and traces the Band's history back to its inception in 1912, as well as individually profiling over 200 past and present members.

Down through the last one hundred years, the Mackenzie Highland Pipe Band, as bands do in any other small communities, figured largely in the lives of local residents.

It is perhaps with this in mind, the current Centennial Committee has deemed it prudent to put together a publication, not only to mark the one hundred years that the band has been in existence, but also as an acknowledgement of the time and effort, so many volunteers have put in assisting the band down through those years.

Many of those men and women are no longer with us, but we are sure all of them will be with us in spirit.

As in all historical publications, it is difficult to gather information of those early days of the Band's existence. In this particular case, the Band has lost, or mislaid all records from the Band's inception, until 1962. This has been a devastating blow, and made the Centennial Committee's work so much more difficult, if not nigh on impossible.

However they do extend their sincere thanks to those in the community, and those further afield, for their help to put this information together, before it too, is lost forever.

Throughout this account, readers may find many anecdotal stories or personal memories from members, particularly those who did not mind sharing their own embarrassing, or cherished experiences. As author, I have endeavoured to lighten the intense side of history, to add a little bit of writer's license if you like, and make it interesting for those who are not avid readers.

As a coffee table addendum, I hope you will enjoy your read and have a pleasant journey down memory lane.

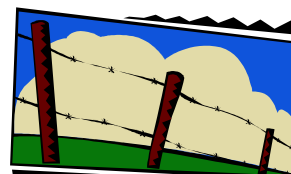

Be SunSmart this summer

The summer sun's fierce ultraviolet rays can soon damage your skin. Too much exposure to UV rays now can lead to melanoma and other skin cancers later in life.

Skin cancer is the commonest cancer in New Zealand and we have one of the highest rates of melanoma deaths in the world. We know that sunburn and tanning- especially before the age of 18 years, not only increases melanoma risk, but will also lead to skin damage, early ageing and wrinkles!

The Cancer Society reminds you to enjoy the outdoors this summer – but do it safely. To avoid sunburn and turning brown: **wear a good hat and sun protective clothing, apply SPF 30+ sunscreen, wear sunnies and seek the shade as much as possible!** Make sure your whole family is SunSmart, especially between 10.00am and 4.00pm from September to April.

The team at Heartlands Fairlie Resource and Information Centre are supporting the Cancer Society by running a free shade tent loan programme. The Cancer Society have made available one portable shade structure and sunscreen stand - free of cost- for use over the summer months by community groups, schools or event organizers for the public to seek the shade and slop on some sunscreen if they get caught out.

A New Year welcome from the Mayor

Welcome back to the 2012 year! I am sure that this year will have its share of challenges but let's hope that it doesn't bring the tempestuous types of events that 2011 did. I hope that many of you had the opportunity to have some quality time with family and friends over the Christmas period and a chance to "refresh the batteries" ready for whatever this year brings.

Stephen and I decided to head north for three weeks, right up to Cape Reinga and back again, driving 3500kms in that time. We caught up with family and friends whom we hadn't seen for a while and passed through some interesting places along the way.



I knew that my thinking had definitely taken a turn for the worse when I found myself with a bit of a penchant for searching out public toilets in towns all over the North Island and musing about the cost/benefit differences between the world-renowned Hundertwasser toilets in Kawakawa (see picture) and the somewhat boring but functional "self-cleaning" toilets in Picton.

I also found myself comparing the condition of the roads around urban and provincial New Zealand with our own humble carriageways and found myself feeling quite proud of what we achieve here in the Mackenzie with such a small budget. Previous councils have done an excellent job of building and maintaining our roadways and it is the intention of this council to carry on that good work.

Driving through so many towns gave me cause to think about some of the places that had reinvented themselves and placed themselves fairly and squarely on the tourist map of NZ. One of these towns is Tirau (Pop 732) in the Waikato district.

Years ago, when Stephen was an engineer and had to visit the dairy factory in Tirau, to work on their compressors, I stayed with him for the two nights while he was there in the only accommodation for miles. At the time there was absolutely nothing to do – nothing! By the late 1980's it was virtually a ghost town.

Not so today. In 1991, local businessman Henry Clothier sought to gain advantage from the relatively cheap real estate and high traffic volume in the town by opening an Antique shop in the former grocery store building.

Other businesses followed suit off the back of his success throughout the 1990s. Tirau has built a reputation as a shopping destination for antiques, collectibles and other niche items – including some excellent cafes. It is now a "must stop" destination and was humming with domestic and international visitors when we were there.

Tirau is of similar size to our own Fairlie, and while it doesn't have any iconic landscapes or attractions, it has reinvented itself through the imagination and investment of a local businessman and put itself firmly on the map. When I look at what we have to offer here in Fairlie I believe we can do the same. We are certainly moving in the right direction.

There are people in this town with a passion and a vision to make Fairlie a place where families want to live and work and visitors want to take time to stop, relax and enjoy all that we have to offer. This type of progress is important to our sustainability as a town.

On February 21st an evening has been set aside for all those with the ideas, skills and drive to revitalise Fairlie to come together and share those ideas and let's see if we can't bring some of those dreams to fruition. When I look at what the Village Green committee have achieved I know that we can do so much more as a community.

Watch out for the notices in the Accessible and mark February 21st on your calendars if you want to be involved in this initiative. I look forward to seeing you there.

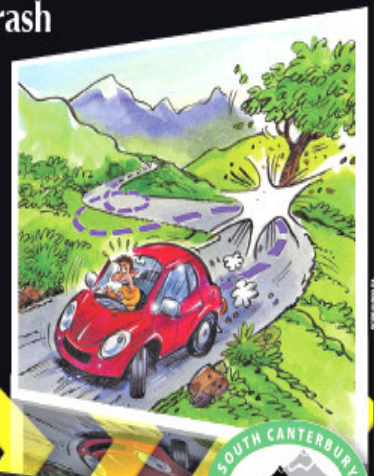
