Police Notebook:

Well I guess that was another summer gone, if you could call it that. Another Easter and Mackenzie Highland Show is just around the corner again, so it's probably a good time, as it is any time, to think about our responsibilities around alcohol. Look out for each other and don't let a friend drive drunk.

Parents, take an interest in what your kids are doing as well. Do you know where they are and what they are up to? They seem to have ways and means of getting hold of alcohol or other substances if they want to.

By and large the crime front has been fairly quiet lately, so keep up the good work.

A couple of weeks ago a young Christchurch male was arrested for theft of diesel after he drove off from Tekapo without paying.

A holiday home at Lake Alexandrina was broken into where the offenders made themselves at home for the night. The Police are following a good line of enquiry which should bear fruit with this one.

An Ashwick Flat farmer had a run in with an escaped dairy cow while trying to round it up on the motor bike. The man went flying over the handle bars and hit the road after a shoulder charge from the errant animal. He was very lucky to escape serious injury due to wearing a good helmet, but still needed some patching up at hospital.

There are still some poachers snooping around at night shooting from the road sides into private paddocks. There were three deer shot on a private block next to the Clayton Rd recently. The offenders very kindly left the guts behind. This type of shooting is not only illegal but highly dangerous and I will be coming down hard on any offenders that are identified.

If you see any suspicious vehicles or spotlights around call the police straight away. It is always best and easier to catch them at the time red handed, especially up the Clayton or Lochaber Roads where there is only one way out.

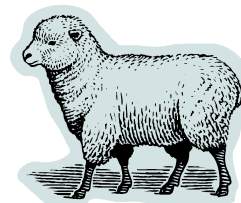

There are so many people to thank that I can't name them all but to everyone who helped in any and every way, a huge thank you!

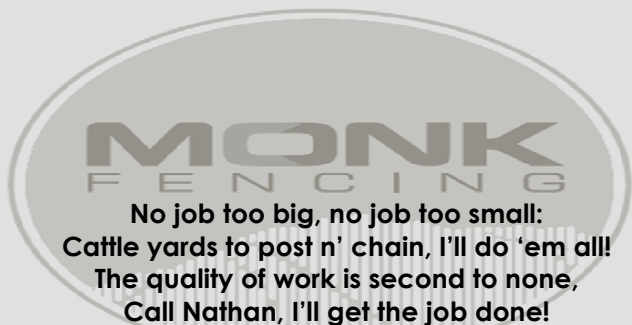

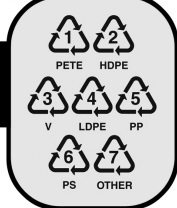

Mackenzie District Council Briefs

ITEMS OF INTEREST FROM THE COUNCIL MEETINGS
HELD ON 6th and 13th MARCH 2012

Draft Budgets Approved

The Mackenzie District Council has approved a draft budget requiring 6.19% more rates than the previous year. The rating level is still subject to input by its three Community Boards and the outcome of public consultation which will take place in April and May.

This year's budget include some far reaching policy changes affecting rating. From 1 July 2012 Council plans to introduce District-wide Rates and Charges for roading, water, sewerage and stormwater. In commenting on this, the Mayor said that it was seen as the most sustainable way the District could meet the major upgrading of its piped infrastructure over the next 10 years and beyond. The reality is that, looking out 25 years it will have to completely replace aging pipes in the Twizel township at the cost of approximately \$25 million. This would be beyond the reach of just that township alone. Changes are also proposed in the way Council funds marketing and economic development. Community Boards will meet to add their local priorities to the mix and Council should consider those recommendations on 3 April 2012 before signing off the final Long Term Plan on 17 April 2012.

New Tennis Courts In Tekapo

The Council has endorsed the acceptance of a tender from Fulton Hogan for \$205,000 to install new tennis courts at Aorangi Crescent, Tekapo. This is part of the overall upgrading of the Community Hall/recreational complex in that area.

Water supply Renewals

A series of renewals for aging water pipes in Fairlie are planned this year and Council has given delegated authority to accept tenders for this work.

Other Roothing Improvements

The Lake Alexandrina middle access road is going to receive a traction seal to enhance the lake access this year and quotations are being sought for this work. However in Fairlie, it has been agreed to defer the Princes Street project until Spring to minimise potential disruption caused by any bad weather.

Maadi Cup Sponsorship

The Twizel Community Board and the Council have agreed to share the sponsorship of one finals race in the New Zealand Maadi Cup event which will be held at Lake Ruataniwha from 26-30 March 2012.

Alps 2 Ocean Cycle Trail

Council has requested further discussions with the Cycle Trail company before finalising its contribution for the capitalisation of the company and agreeing the preliminary marketing expenses. It has, however, agreed to cover maintenance costs of the trail for the first three years.

Downlands Water Supply

Waimate District Council and Mackenzie District Council have jointly agreed to appoint Bill Wright of Cannington, as their community representative on the Downlands Water Supply.

Canterbury Water Zone Presentations

Councillors were updated on progress with the implementation plans for the Canterbury Water Management Strategy. The two zones that are in the Mackenzie are the Upper Waitaki Zone and the Orari Opihi Pareora Zone. The latter zone report is being consulted on currently and Council agreed to make a submission on its content.

Noel will be there to autograph your copy. In the tent will also be a display of photographs from the last 100 years. The cost of the book will be in the region of \$35.

The book committee included; John Campbell, Graham Parcell, Eric Jones, Catherine Johnson and Heather Fifield. We met monthly for about 18 months to go through the vast quantity of material that came into our hands. We were helped by many locals who dug deep into their photo and newspaper collections as well as contacting family and friends from days gone by, who had band associations. 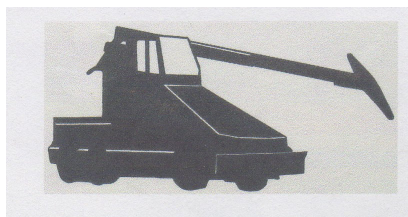

INSTALL ENERGY EFFICIENT LIGHT BULBS TO OFFSET POWER PRICE RISE



A number of electricity retailers are preparing to pass on increased transmission charges from April this year. Increases range from 2.4%-around 7% depending on suppliers.

The Energy Efficiency and Conservation Authority's (EECA) RightLight campaign programme manager, Bill Brander, said switching to energy efficient bulbs is one of the easiest ways Canterbury residents can save money on their power bills.

"By replacing five of the most used standard light bulbs with five energy efficient bulbs, a household will save around \$100 a year." Mr Brander added: "Consumers may be thinking they're getting a good deal by paying \$1 for a traditional light bulb rather than \$8 for an energy efficient bulb, but the reality is that a standard 100W bulb is going to cost you a lot more to run in the first year alone. An energy efficient bulb could also last up to six times longer."

A \$1 standard incandescent 100W light bulb costs \$25 a year to run, while an \$8 efficient Compact Fluorescent Lamps (CFL) costs \$5 over the same period.

EECA's RightLight programme provides online interactive tools for evaluating costs and potential savings.

Advances in lighting design mean there is now a range of efficient light bulbs available for every situation.

"When choosing a light bulb, think about where the bulb is being used, for example, the bathroom or bedroom, and how often the light is used and for how long. Put them in the places you use most."

Despite the rapid uptake of energy-efficient light bulbs, nearly 90% of NZ homes still have older-style bulbs in over half the sockets and are paying much more for their lighting than they have to.

The range of energy efficient bulbs includes halogens, LEDs and CFLs; these are now available in attractive designs, colours and shapes to suit different settings.

Examples include:

CFLs and LEDs offering major energy savings in high use area such as lounge, dining and family rooms in covered and dimmable forms.

New generation halogen bulbs looking just like the older style light bulbs, ideal for areas such as cupboards and hallways where lights are on for short periods of time, or for use on dimmers

Fluorescent tubes in an increasing range of sizes and shapes designed for use over kitchen work benches and bathroom mirrors.

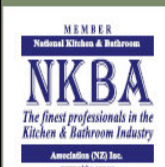

Following the recent publication of our photo in the Fairlie Accessible we feel the need to congratulate the organisers, the sponsors and the participants in the recent Relay for Life held in Twizel.

Mike had received an invitation from the Cancer Society to join with other survivors and walk the first lap, so on a pleasant Saturday morning we packed up the campervan and headed for Twizel. The opening ceremony was held at 4 pm and to then watch that cheerful little band of survivors wearing their red sashes and carrying purple and white balloons was very moving.

By contrast the mood for the candle lighting ceremony at 9pm was quite sombre, and when the candles were all aglow and positioned around the track it was an awesome sight; all those little flames glowing in memory of someone's nearest and dearest lost to this dreadful disease.

However, the differential between the small band of survivors and the large number of memory bags, many bearing more than one name, was truly horrifying; - what can we do to help reverse this trend??

In spite of all the attempts at education, ignorance still appears to be a large part of the problem; especially amongst our menfolk. While the ladies have their lumpy bits squeezed and their internal plumbing checked on a regular basis, a lot of men are unaware that they too can, and should, be checked regularly. This is especially true in the case of prostate cancer which is particularly insidious and often displays no symptoms until it is too late. Initially all it takes is a simple blood test. A small price indeed to pay for peace of mind!!
