Burkes Pass can honestly claim as to having something for everyone with two interesting enterprises trading opposite each other, the Burkes Pass Heritage Walk and the numerous sites and buildings of interest along that path.

Arleah Aitkenhead and Andrew Bolton have opened the classy Arleah's, with the theme through the shop being 'shabby chic' and based around a French country theme. This is reinforced with recycled and distressed furniture, Maryanne Robert's quirky and beautifully made resin jewellery, 'Posh' Clothing by Jude, both Dunedin based, plus merino from 'Angel A' of Cromwell.

Arleah had a similar business down in Dunedin and has bought here creative design and presentation skills to invest in the Pass. She has great plans for the place – 'A Man Cave' with gift items of interest for the male, country themed photo shoots using authentic clothing and continuing to create items based on ideas she has seen in Rachel Ashwell publications.

Of sure appeal to the men to gaze over as memories abound (and the women shop) is the 1952 A40 Devon car parked outside Arleah's at Burkes Pass.

Arleah is on the lookout for items and photos of Burkes Pass to copy and use in some of her designs. She is a really enthusiastic and enterprising woman and you will enjoy meeting her.

Across the road, grab a coffee from the caravan, and take a look around David Taylor's 'Three Creeks' business, built on the site of the former Burkes Pass Hotel which burned down in 1994. Here he sells a wide range of quality items from fridge magnets through to shepherd's huts on wheels. Remember the Edmond's sign, the Four Square Man, well these and a number of other signs and symbols of yesteryear, warm wool products, clothing, accessories, decorative household ware, country themed goods – all displayed in the store - and outside – well that's another story!

Dave began working with wood when he was involved in the demolition of houses and saw quality rimu rubbish-bound. From that has grown a solid business building quality household and outside furniture, and utilising items of yesteryear in his creations. Old wheels, machinery; nothing is chucked out as David has an eye for creating a popular range from memorabilia and focusing on the use of macrocarpa.

Having had retail outlets in Dunedin, Timaru and Christchurch he has returned home to the Pass to build for his wholesale business, operate the superb retail store managed by his partner, Kim Perkins and to focus on the business's cheerful future.

The shepherd's huts cant help but catch the eye and add further interest to "Three Creeks" and the historic hamlet.

'The Power of Mothers' is the theme for the 15th annual Fairlie Mid Winter Seminar being held by the South Canterbury Provincial of Rural Women New Zealand.

Open to all women, both rural and urban, the sessions will be presented by keynote speakers **Celia Lashlie and Fiona Hargreaves**. Celia will be speaking on: *The Power of Mothers: The role of women in the lives of at-risk children* and will share her belief that the mothers, grandmothers and matriarchs at the centre of at-risk families hold the key to changing the lives of the children within those families.

Celia states that the two tenets underpinning her work, are her belief that all children are born filled with magic, their own unique brand of magic and that communities, rather than central government, hold the answers to the problems New Zealand is facing in terms of the negative statistics of child abuse, prison numbers and social disconnection.

Fiona Hargreaves is the senior youth co-ordinator for the 180Degree Trust. This is a Canterbury based Trust working to turn around the lives of at risk young people. Fiona grew up on a farm with a passion for the outdoors. She found she had a skill helping others with challenging behaviours. This is her dream job working in the outdoors with young people who had behavioural problems. This year Fiona is a "World of Difference Recipient" for the Vodafone Foundation.

As in other years the seminar is expected to be challenging, stimulating and provide much food for thought.

News from Heartlands Fairlie Resource and Information Centre

The Mackenzie Community Enhancement Board who operate the heartlands Fairlie Centre held a planning evening for the organisation to look into its future operation and plan for where they want to be five years down the track.

Under the guidance of the highly skilled former Fairlie girl who has returned here to live – Trish Willis (nee Dwyer) the board and staff enjoyed an interesting evening where they looked at the organisations constitution and the reason for it's existence. From there Trish led them through a look at each area of the Centres operation, identifying current activities and looking to future opportunities.

The five main areas of operation are: social cultural recreational economic and environmental - with it obvious from discussion and identification of current function that social is the main area of service.

You may wonder how the centre works in these areas and what they do to address the goals of the organisation.

A few simple examples are:

- Social** – operation of the community car formation and operation of the Fairlie Aged Forum
- Cultural** – encouraging groups to host AOTNZ performances supporting and assisting other groups who support the arts
- Recreational** – leading the way with the Fairlie Village Green Project
- Economic** – providing information and promoting businesses in the area
- Environmental** – conducting the process back in 1998 indentifying 2000 project as Main Street upgrade

Working through identifying strengths, weaknesses and opportunities for the organisation bought renewed vigour and the incentive to consider and try new ideas and take up opportunities to further enhance life in the Fairlie – Lower Mackenzie area.

Chairperson Kevin O'Neill expressed the view of each person taking part when he said that they had all learned from and felt part of this valuable process and complimented Trish on her skill and desire to help Fairlie plan for the future.

Footnote: I believe this to be one of the most worthwhile activities I have taken part in for ages and encourage any group to consider contacting Trish and inquiring about how you do the same for your group – if you don't already do it!

Many of us who have been involved in community for years get into the habit of 'same old same old' and really for any organisation to progress we need purpose, process and a clear vision as to what we want in the future.

Chief Fire Officer Jim Irving, reported at the 102th Annual General Meeting that during the year the Brigade responded to 52 callouts.

Of these, 23 were motor vehicle accidents, 10 grass and scrub fires, 10 structure and property fires, 5 to render assistance to Lake Tekapo Brigade and 2 special service assistance.

One of the major fires for the year was the Old Library Café, which was a difficult fire to contain. There was an increase in all areas of fire from last year.

Training opportunities were appreciated by members; a refresher course and vector bus training was again provided, plus another house burn training exercise.

Senior Station Officer John Edmonston was farewelled at a function at the station on his retirement from the brigade after 40 years service. John and Aylene were thanked for their devoted service to the Brigade.

The station verandah was completed, the back fence was replaced and a new Honours Board in the Brigade Rooms completed the alterations.

The Brigade received a replacement appliance to update our 821 machine.

Lake Tekapo Community Board

Mackenzie District Council Long Term Plan

The Community Board urges residents and ratepayers of Lake Tekapo to have their say on the long term plan submitted by the Mackenzie District council. Note submissions to the council close at 5pm 8th June 2012.

The Community Board would also urge residents and ratepayers to provide feedback to the board on the wider range of issues and direction that Lake Tekapo is taking.

Following discussions and feedback last year the board put its support behind the existing projects in the town such as the footbridge, domain playground, solar challenge and Regional Park. The Board sees the completion of these as an important part of the overall strategy to provide increased activities and services for both visitors and residents.

The Board also responded by approving the upgrade to the tennis courts and the existing community hall, currently under construction. Work has continued on providing a sealed and lit walkway from Tekapo Springs/ camping ground to the regional park, linking with the footbridge. This will provide a link to activities and the village centre, and forms part of the towns overall walkway and cycling strategy.

Feedback to the board previously indicated that going forward we should consider the following improvements:

- Provision of further recreational facilities such as a gym, climbing wall and possible re location of the squash courts.
- Following on from the playground on the Domain, further landscaping and upgraded village green area.
- In conjunction with any future commercial development, the provision of new public toilets and possibility of public showers/laundry and bus shelter. (The board would like to commission the drafting of a concept plan for the domain area and public amenities block linking to commercial development for public consultation)
- Continued landscaping and amenities planting around the village.
- Tidy up the freedom camping issues around the village with better signage and policing of areas where camping not permitted.

The Board also knows that long term it should be looking at strategies around such issues as staff housing and provision of services such as medical and providing for the elderly in the community.

The Mackenzie Tourism and Development trust has indicated that it may not support the future funding of an i-site in Tekapo. The current indication by the council is that there has been no dedicated funding for the provision of the i-site. The Trust is yet to indicate whether they will assist with funding for a i-site run by another provider. Feedback is required to the board as to how this issue should be addressed going forward and how important do residents see the continuation of having an i-site in the town.

The Board provided funding to keep the i-site open until the 30th June 2012.

280 More Healthy Homes for South Canterbury this winter

LineTrust South Canterbury will be holding a draw to select 35 more households for a complete insulation retrofit this month. This will complete the 70 houses allocated for general income households as part of the South Canterbury Healthy Homes community insulation retrofit project.

EnergySmart has insulated close to 2000 homes through the South Canterbury Healthy Homes Project to date and the Ballots have been well subscribed to by the general public who may not otherwise have been able to access the higher government subsidies. The Project is sponsored by LineTrust South Canterbury, the South Canterbury District Health Board and the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Authority (EECA) and continues to be managed by EnergySmart. The General Ballot is an additional heavily discounted insulation package offered by Line Trust Sth Canterbury and is open to all residents throughout the Aoraki region living in houses built prior to 1978.

"The South Canterbury Healthy Homes Project is a local community project that brings together a number of community-minded sponsors, creates employment opportunities and makes a genuine contribution to the quality of people's lives," said EnergySmart's Mid & South Canterbury Branch Manager, Mat Allan.

"By the end of June this year, 2000 South Canterbury households will have had insulation retrofits through the project. Occupants of these households will benefit from improved health outcomes as well as the financial savings of having a warmer, drier and more energy efficient home," he said.

Each retrofit includes ceiling and under-floor insulation, an energy check and additional energy efficiency measures (ground moisture barrier, draught excluders for doors, hot water cylinder wraps) where possible. Retrofitting of the selected homes is expected to be carried out in June.

UPDATE ON DRAFT LONG TERM PLAN ISSUES

We have held four public meetings now, each tailored to highlight the implications of our LTP for that particular community (Tekapo, Twizel, Fairlie and Rural). Each meeting has had its own flavour and as a result of the questions at the end of the meetings we realise that there are some issues that we need to explain further to our communities to keep them as informed as possible. Below is not an exhaustive list but some of the main points that have arisen.

Why is MDC borrowing money when it has had a “debt-free” record for some time that they are rightly proud of?

To put it succinctly, and the issue was raised with David Carter today, the Ministry of Health requires all Councils to meet the NZ Drinking Water Standards and this has necessitated a projected investment in infrastructure and treatment of approximately \$6.7m to bring our urban water supplies up to the required standard. As we are above the deprivation index threshold for government subsidy the costs of these upgrades must be born entirely by the ratepayer. Twizel’s upgrade is expected to cost \$4.5m and Fairlie’s \$2.2m. Tekapo already has good quality source water and so their upgrade costs are minimal by comparison (\$200k).

Why doesn’t Council use its cash reserves to fund these upgrades?

MDC currently has cash reserves of \$6m and working capital of \$2m but due to insurance costs for our above-ground assets we must keep some cash in reserves to cover the balance of replacement/repair costs in the event of an earthquake or similar disaster. Our underground assets (water & sewer) are not insured and in the event of a major disaster, such as happened in Christchurch, we must have sufficient cash to ensure we can meet our financial obligations (approx. \$3m) to trigger government assistance. This reduces the level of cash reserves available and Council has decided that it is prudent to keep those reserves intact and to borrow to fund the water upgrades.

Who will pay for this debt?

The users of the urban water supplies will pay for this debt (principal and interest), not the district as a whole however the costs will be evenly distributed across all urban water users (including Burkes Pass) under the amalgamation proposals. This spreads the cost of the upgrades over a larger rating base and means that all users will pay the same rate for the same service. This applies to our sewer and stormwater services as well.

If water, sewer and roading are amalgamated, what will happen to our Community Boards?

Although the funding will be evenly spread across the district, the Community Boards in the Mackenzie play a

vital role in advocating on behalf of their constituents for projects to be included in list of work to be undertaken. There seems to be speculation that this proposal will undermine the role of Community Boards but this is just not so. I can’t speak for other districts but I know that in the Mackenzie, due to the isolated nature of its three communities and the unique characteristics of those communities, our Community Boards are highly valued and regarded by the Council as being “in touch” with their various communities’ needs. We are too widespread as a district to have our finger on the pulse of each individual town and it would be a rare occasion for this Council to overrule a local Community Board decision. The only time where we might not see eye to eye is when we are looking at district-wide issues and Council have a mandate to think and act in the best interests of the wider district whereas Community Boards only have to consider their particular towns.

How can we be certain that our roads will be maintained properly and the money collected not be siphoned off unfairly to towns or the rural areas if we amalgamate the funds?

The funding for roads comes from two sources: ratepayers and New Zealand Transport Agency (NZTA). Council must satisfy NZTA that we are maintaining our roads to an appropriate standard to receive the funding from them. Currently 83% of the subsidised roading budget is spent on maintenance and renewals in the rural area and the balance is spent in the urban areas. This is spent on the basis of need and Council do not see this proportion changing in the future as we will always be required to spend the money where the need is greatest.

These are some of the questions we have been asked and it would appear there is a sense of fear/suspicion in some sectors of our communities that the Council are trying to do something that will bring a level of unfairness to the decision making but this is merely speculation. We have worked very hard with two main principles in mind:

- How do we create a funding structure that will provide a level of surety for infrastructure demands across the district and well into the future?
- How can we make sure that future maintenance and upgrades is affordable to every ratepayer?

There are no hidden agendas and I know that change is difficult for most but we are living in changing times and we need to ensure that we can continue to remain autonomous for as long as we are practicably able because this is what the majority of our ratepayers told us they wanted in a survey conducted last year.

Update from the Mayor

I have to confess to being a little dismayed at the reaction of some ratepayers towards the notion of amalgamating our water, sewer, storm-water and roading rates.

Council have worked for months on developing a plan that would bring about the necessary changes in policy to unify and improve the Mackenzie District and while there has been plenty of noise no sensible alternatives have been provided to date.

What I struggle to understand is the reaction of the Twizel Community Board to these changes. While I respect the fact that they must act in the best interests of the Twizel urban ratepayers I find it somewhat of an anomaly that this same Community Board have requested that \$16.8m of capital value in the rural area be incorporated into their town boundary to increase the Twizel Community Board rate take. This takes the rating value of that \$16.8m out of the rural ratepayer "bucket" and puts it into the Twizel urban ratepayer "bucket", effectively reducing the amount of money spent in the rural areas of our district (if we do not amalgamate the rates).

If you look at all the infrastructure needs approaching this district over the long term, the reduction in subsidy from the government for our roads, inflation and increased compliance costs, the new wheelie bin service, a better spread of costs over the users of Council services and a genuine effort to break down the barriers that separate our communities so that we begin to operate as one, I don't believe you can say that the proposed changes are unjustified or unfair.

If we are to progress as a district we need to do away with the historical parochialism that separates our communities and be prepared to "share the load" across the whole ratepayer base. I was quite open when I stood for election about the fact that I was not parochial and I do not tolerate well the attitudes of those who consider only their own particular circumstances as opposed to the needs of the wider community. As the Mayor, considering the needs of the "whole" district is my mandate and I make no apology for taking that view.

When our four children lived at home, decisions made by Stephen and I always had to take into account the entire family and its well-being. There would be times when one child got more than another and the others might complain, but now that they are adults they appreciate that we love them all equally and the sense of fairness or unfairness was just a matter of perspective.

So it is with the Mackenzie – each community is as important as the other and a year or two from now I believe you will see that there will be benefits for **every** sector of the district. If we support this decision to amalgamate our rates, not only will the government look favourably upon a more collaborative approach to the issues facing us but also, when one area has growth **all** areas will benefit from the increase in the ratepayer base. The more ratepayers there are sharing the load, the lighter the load.

To me that seems quite reasonable.
