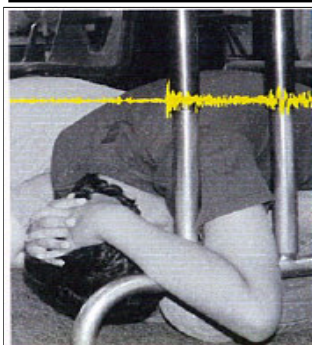
If that isn't clear enough then you are about to be educated through various media, as to what to do!

## Mayoral views

Brrr.....!!! The weather station tells me it is minus nine degrees outside this morning – a cold start but the dawn of another beautiful sunny day. I am certainly looking forward to a break in August, visiting family in Queensland. Apparently it's cold over there at the moment down to 15 degrees overnight!

The Long Term Plan process is almost over now with 530 submissions received overall. The hearing and deliberations have finished and the decisions have been made. All submitters will receive a response to their submission and there will be an information sheet sent to all ratepayers outlining the changes to the Long Term Plan. It has been a busy time and quite a learning curve for me personally.

You may have read in the media that Council decided to cease funding Mackenzie Tourism & Development Trust as of 31st July this year. In spite of the hard work of trustees to bring the business back to solvency, and the proposed increase in the targeted tourism rate for its future funding, there was a strong response from the public objecting to the increase with a number of submitters suggesting that a fresh approach to tourism and economic development should be taken. In response to this, a working party is at present being established to determine an affordable and effective way forward for the Mackenzie.

We will keep you updated as things progress. Last Monday was the official opening of the Lake Tekapo Tennis courts. Rather than just being a single-purpose facility, these courts with their artificial surface are designed to cater for netball, hockey and basketball as well. Although the courts had a good coating of snow, a few hardy locals turned out on a dark and chilly night to celebrate the occasion. This is the first in a series of great new projects that the Lake Tekapo Community Board has planned and I applaud them for their commitment to making Tekapo a vibrant and welcoming place to live.

This Saturday night in Twizel is time to celebrate two very special people in the community. Graeme and Marian Palmer, long time volunteers with St John are retiring. Both in their 70<sup>th</sup> year, Marian and Graeme have given selflessly to the Twizel community in a number of voluntary roles. It is folk like this that are the backbone of small communities and I hope that you will join with me in commending them both for a life lived in service to the people of Twizel.

On a final note, it has been pleasing to see the work of the Fairlie Forum in taking the initiative to discuss with interested locals and business owners, potential opportunities to grow the town and make the centre a vibrant and busy village that people want to visit. Initiatives like this can wax and wane unless there is a commitment from one or two to see a project through and

I want to thank Trish Willis and Anne Thomson for their passion and commitment to this project. Keep up the good work!

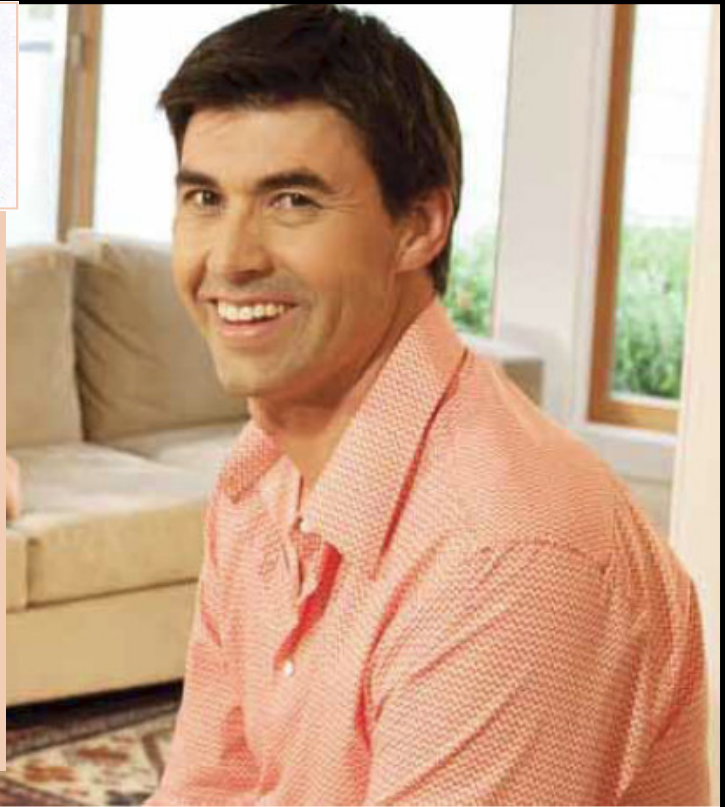

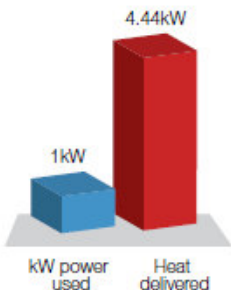

## Tekapo Tennis Courts a great asset

The new Tekapo Tennis Courts were opened on Monday night 25th June, by a small hardy crowd in freezing conditions.

Mayor Claire Barlow, the Tekapo Community Board and a number of Tekapo locals and their children, braved the elements to see the courts opened at 7pm.

Using the lights of two cars, with snow on the court, with the proposed netball game cancelled, the group celebrated the completion of the project with a glass of bubbly, whilst watching the local children play tennis and soccer in the snow!!

The new courts replace the original courts that were installed in 1958. The new facility is made up of three tennis courts, two netball courts and is over marked with a mini hockey pitch.

The sand filled artificial grass on the surface will provide an all weather surface for the community. The cost of \$208,000 was funded from the Council's Land Subdivision Reserve, which collects funds from developers for creating reserves and community facilities in the district.

This project is one of the first projects in the plans of the Tekapo Community Board to enhance the community facilities in the township.

Other projects on the books are the redevelopment of the Tekapo Community Hall, assisting with the footbridge, a new play area and the construction of new public toilets and a transport centre.

Community Board Chair Murray Cox said he was delighted with the new facility which he was sure would be well used by the local residents and visitors alike.

## RAINCLIFF FOREST - Restored Tracks

This time we are back in our local district with some very good news. The South Canterbury Mountain Bike Club have been working very hard over the last 6 months restoring the old walking tracks in the Raincliff Forest. I heard about this a few weeks ago, so just had to go and investigate!

Well, what a delight to see the work they have done and the fine job they are making - all for public use.

This outstanding 84 hector forest was planted in 1890 and is managed and owned by Blakely Pacific. The forest contains a wide variety of exotic trees.

You can MTB, walk or run along the colour coded marked tracks. There is a big sign in the car park at the southern end of the forest that gives you all the necessary details. Be aware that the times on the sign are Walking times, not MTB times. The original tracks have been there a long time and in the 1990's the Transistion Group at Mackenzie College went out each week to maintain it. The wooden steps were already in place.

Please note, where there are wooden steps the MTB club have made a diversion around the steps to allow easy riding on the bikes, so you have a choice if walking or running which part of the track to follow. They are only very short sections, as in a few metres, great for the kids to race around! I would recommend that the kids take a whistle to use if they get too far ahead and take a different track. They have built new tracks on the bottom side of the road, which is flat, good for easy riding and pushchairs. These tracks are still a little soft, but will get firmer with time and use.

It is a 'work in progress' project for them so they have plans to build more tracks. They have had shingle supplied for free, and a digger to spread the shingle, all donated. A kind 'runner' farmer donated spray to kill weeds.

This is a great facility to have so close to home, so let's use it and help keep the track clear for us all. There are no public toilets out there. The forest is on Middle Valley road, which is on the right just before you drive up to the Farm Barn. It is about a half hour drive from Fairlie to the forest.

Don't be confused by Pioneer Park, which is a few km further down the same road. There are good walking tracks there plus toilets, camping and picnic facilities.

**Blakely Pacific have a standard policy for their forests, which is enter at weekends only and after 6pm during the week. Also not to enter during high winds.**

**Now that is some good news.**

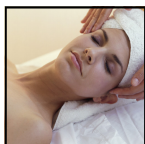

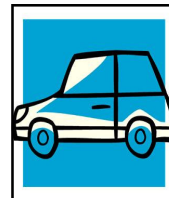

# Microlighting in the Mackenzie

It was Saturday morning. The day was clear and cold, with hardly a breath of wind. After receiving the call from Gary, I grabbed some warm clothes, my notebook, and a camera, and headed out the door. As I drove down Hamilton Road, towards the diminutive airstrip in the distance, both excitement and a light feeling of uneasiness gripped me.

This was to be my first time experiencing a flight in a microlight aircraft. I knew little about this mysterious form of aviation, and I really wasn't sure what to expect.

I pulled into the airstrip just as Gary had touched down from a test flight in his shiny red machine. He cut the engine and came over to greet me.

Like the rest of Gary's property, his microlight was in immaculate condition, its 4-stroke engine gleaming in the mid morning sun.

Purchased from the UK a little over a year ago, the aircraft has the appearance of a futuristic hang glider. Gary informed me that it was a top of the line piece of machinery and I certainly believed him as I inspected the conspicuous aircraft, sitting proudly on display at the end of the 400m airstrip. I was handed a faded blue jumpsuit and given a brief run through of some basic procedures before I carefully scrambled aboard, buckled up, and squeezed my head into a white helmet. Gary hopped into the pilot's seat and after a quick sound check and radio call, we were ready for take off.

As we careered down the grass runway I couldn't help but grin in youthful excitement. The small aircraft quickly lifted off the ground and we shot up over the level paddocks of Ashwick Flat, heading towards Allandale and Lake Opuha. After flying over the glassy looking surface of the lake we started to bank towards the sprawling foothills of Mount Dobson, staying at an altitude of about 2500ft. Although light fog prevented us from seeing the ocean, we had exceptional views of the scantily clad snow-capped peaks of the Two Thumb Range.

I had been warned that it would be cold in the open cockpit and it wasn't long until the late-June air, hitting me at 80mph, was relentlessly accosting my gloved hands. Despite my lack of finger movement due to my thick gloves and the piercing wind chill, I was furiously trying to snap away with my camera in an attempt to capture the striking view that lay below us. From north of Kimbell we followed the highway south, and then circled Fairlie before cruising back to the airstrip.

To a novice like myself, the landing felt a little hairy as a light wind gently rocked the rear of the aircraft; for Gary however, it was just business as usual. I knew later I had been in good hands when Gary mentioned to me the two engine failures he had experienced whilst flying in the UK, and a sandstorm that unexpectedly engulfed him and his aircraft on the Gambian coast.

Before heading home I spent some time chatting with Gary and his wife Christina. Their home, and Gary's business, Ashwick Welding Services, sits conveniently just across the road from the airstrip. Gary revealed that he began flying at the age of 16 and it has been a passion of his ever since. I asked him what it was about flying that gave him the biggest buzz, to which he replied, "Taking up others who have never flown before." I thanked Gary for the experience and was on my way.

As I drove home I could certainly see the appeal of this sport; gearing up in *Top Gun* clothing, blasting through the skies without another soul in sight, soaking up the beautiful scenery, and generally, getting a bit of a rush.

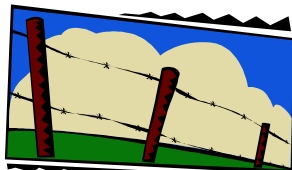

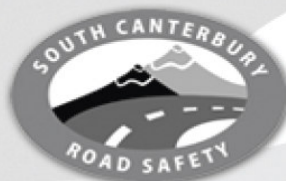
