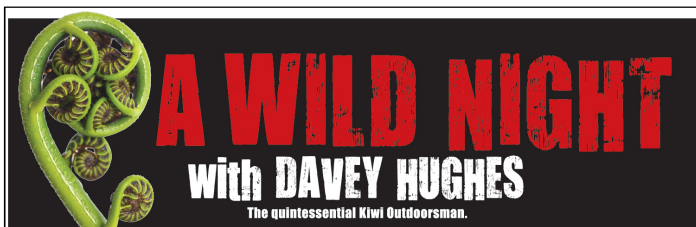

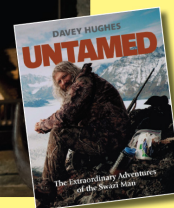

## Commemorating World War 1 in Fairlie

A group comprising those with an interest in history, Fairlie Community Board and Mackenzie District Council met to further the ideas of how we can commemorate World War 1 in Fairlie.

Two ideas were taken up from the previous meeting and gained favour for further investigation.

One was the statue of a young 18 year old lad from the Fairlie area, in full WW1 military uniform, standing on a platform in the vicinity of where the Fairlie Railway platform once was. An interpretation panel telling of those who left their beloved town by train, never to return would be erected adjacent to the statue.

The second project is the proposed building of a rotunda type building, with interpretation panel walls telling of the soldiers who left Fairlie and housing a German Krupp Field Gun – similar to the one bought back to Fairlie by WW1 soldiers and was on display on the Fairlie Village Green until some 30 or more years ago. The preferred area for this is near the monument if free space allowed.

## PRINCES STREET FAIRLIE UPDATE

A public meeting was held at the Mackenzie District Council offices on 3 April to discuss the streetscaping recently undertaken at Princes Street.

There was a good turnout with approximately 40 residents present to air their views. The key message from those present was that almost all were unhappy with the planter boxes that had been installed.

Information was provided about the underground services in their street and the impact this has on the placement of street trees. Several options were presented for the street landscaping that catered for the need to avoid water, storm water, sewer and telecom services. It was explained that some of the trees may not be able to be planted directly into the ground because of a telecom cable that runs along the verge.

There were a number of constructive suggestions made at the meeting regarding placement of trees but all residents were keen to remove the planter boxes.

The meeting decisions were presented to the Fairlie Community Board on 17 April. The Board accepted the meeting feedback and has instructed Council staff to arrange for the removal of the planter boxes, and to plant these trees directly into the new grass verges where possible. Council staff will liaise with residents to determine the most suitable location for the trees.

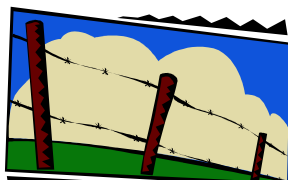

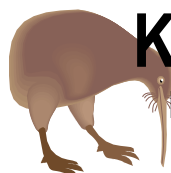

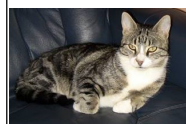
