The Mackenzie District Archive

The Mackenzie District Archive was created back in 1998, the second choice in the communities decision for a Year 2000 Project behind the Main Street upgrade. Documents and photographs held by the museum were handed over for better care and storage to the new group and formed the basis of the archive.

Since then archivists Helen Beattie and Joan Gill have given hundreds of hours and have processed thousands of items from local organisations wanting their documents held in safe storage! The amount is huge and especially when you see it boxed up in archival boxes in the little archive room! It is jam packed.

As a result of the growing use of their skills and storage space the Mackenzie District Archive hopes to build a purpose built building on Fairlie Heritage Museum land. They are currently in negotiation about the building and with a substantial donation toward the project they are looking towards a positive outcome.

Feedback Sought on Old Library

The Mackenzie District Council is seeking public feedback on the fate of the Old Library building and plans to hold a public meeting

Built in 1914, the Old Library was a gift from American philanthropist Andrew Carnegie and was known as a "Carnegie Library". In more recent times it has housed the Old Library Café, a well-known destination for visitors.

The building was badly damaged by fire in October, 2011. Since then, insurance assessors and engineers have studied the damage and the general condition of the building.

Mackenzie District Council chief executive Wayne Barnett says the insurers believe the cost of repairing the building is too high. The insurance company has made two offers – either demolish the building and claim its indemnity value of \$272,000, or replace the building with a new one and claim the insured value of \$676,000.

However, the council has also sought a second opinion from engineers who believe it might be possible to repair the building within the insured value of \$676,000. This would include bringing the building up to current earthquake standards. Further engineering design work is needed to confirm this. Mr Barnett says the council would like to hear the views of the community before moving forward.

There are three options for people to consider:

Option 1: Repair the Old Library, but only if this can be done within the insured value.

Option 2: Demolish the Old Library and replace it with a new building, within the insured value.

Option 3: Demolish the Old Library and claim the indemnity value. The future of the land would be uncertain.

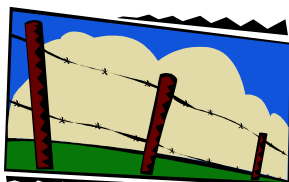

He has been Pipe Major for 29 years but he has had 58 years of continuous service with the Mackenzie Highland Pipe Band. Fortunately for the band John will still be there with his pipes and available for parades / community events.



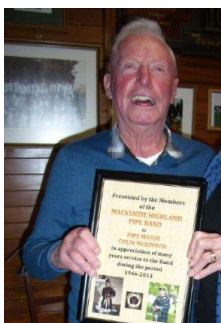
As Pipe Major John has lead virtually all parades and other outings during his tenure. Last year leading up to the Centennial celebrations there were well over 30 events. John's name is, and always will be synonymous with the Mackenzie Highland Pipe Band.

Eric Jones was given a framed certificate of appreciation for his 51 years of service to the Mackenzie Highland Pipe Band. While Eric Jones is not resigning from any position, the MHPB would like to take this opportunity to express our appreciation of the work he does. Eric began as a tenor drummer, became bass drummer, Drum Major, a Centre Delegate for many years. He was President of the MHPB for 7 years. Even though he "retired" from active involvement in 2005 he has remained as custodian and attends every practice night just to keep an eye on us all. He is a member of the MHPB Executive Committee and checks our dressing when on parade, as well as standing in for the Drum Major on occasion.

Eric attends all our parades and contests as well. Eric is a multi-talented, energetic man with a great sense of humour, who is always there for members of the MHPB.



Another loyal and esteemed pipe band member is Colin McKinnon, who was also awarded a certificate of appreciation for his service and dedication to the band. Colin began



playing the chanter when he was 10 years old and played in the band at 14 years. He then played continuously for 30 years in the Mackenzie Highland Pipe Band. Colin was Pipe Major for 2 years and then had a break from the band, for work and family commitments. When he was just on 70, he rejoined the band and has been attending practices and parades regularly.

Colin now thinks he will retire from competition work but the members of the band are delighted he will continue playing with them informally and at the weekly practices and parades. Best of all we get to eat his seriously good sandwiches at band social functions.

Helen Gardner was given flowers for her many years of service to the Mackenzie Highland Pipe Band. Helen is fondly known to many band members as "Mum". It is with regret that we accept Helen's wish to stand down as custodian and from the committee.

Helen is very talented and has been secretary for 6 years. She has made kilts, flashes, plaids and spats and saw that we wore our uniform correctly. She has been the one who has had the safety pins, needles, buttons, cotton, elastic, shoe cleaner and a chilly bin full of refreshments!. Helen has been our bus driver and caterer extraordinaire. She is perhaps the only person who has had permission to feel our legs, dive under our uniforms, pull, tug and squeeze our bodies while adjusting our dress and not a word would we utter.



We have relied on Helen for our presentation for many years. She now can graduate while the rest of us need to learn the ropes and take responsibility for ourselves.

Several other changes happened at the Annual General Meeting. Anne Irving stood down as President after 4 years of well run meetings. Anne is looking forward to a life with fewer meetings and being able to put more time into playing her bagpipes. The new President of the Mackenzie Highland Pipe Band is Neville Smith.

Other people new to roles in the Mackenzie Highland Pipe Band are Jackie Phillips – committee member, Ross Jones – Drum Corporal, and Ivon Hurst – Pipe Major. Ivon began his piping with the Pleasant Point and Districts Pipe Band during the late 1960's and has played with the Mackenzie Highland Pipe Band in the 1970's. After several years of not being in a band Ivon rejoined the ranks of the MHPB 3 years ago. Ivon has musical and leadership strengths and will take the MHPB into the next century of practices, parades and competitions. He is a solo piper playing regularly in competitions.

So exciting times for the Mackenzie Highland Pipe Band and we look forward to continuing to play for our community who have supported us over the last 100 years.

Dear Effie

How are you getting on these times down in that island?
This is Saturday afternoon half holiday, so I am writing these
few lines on the bottom of a tin plate.

We had a visit from Colonel Robin yesterday and he gave us a

I have mates. We are getting plenty of drill and the time is

for the first week.

They gave us a half holiday last Saturday to go to the

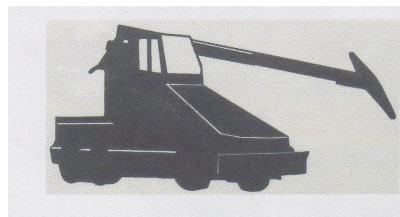

Thank you! NZ communities donate two tonnes of cash

In the past month communities across the country have cleared out drawers and searched their sofas to collectively donate more than 2 tonnes of obsolete cash for Lion Clubs' project Heads Up for Kids.

The two tonnes of cash, made up of old New Zealand and foreign currency, was dug out and donated following the project's National Awareness Week in April. Old and foreign currency has been donated from Northland to as far south as Invercargill. Over 600kgs alone has come from Auckland area and the Queenstown community have gathered more than 150kgs.

"Some of the coins date back to the 1700's, and we've received old 10 shilling notes and currencies that are no longer in circulation. It's amazing what people have stashed away," Mr Peterson says.

The donations made at various collection points, such as Resene Colorshops are collected by project sponsor Fastway Couriers and delivered to the Heads Up for Kids HQ. Once compiled, the cash is processed into dates, types and denominations and then redeemed for legal tender. These funds are then used to support young New Zealanders to attend programmes that help them to build confidence and develop new skills.

"We [Lions Clubs New Zealand] would like to thank New Zealanders for supporting Heads Up for Kids. This old and foreign currency will make a big difference in the lives of our young people."

Heads Up for Kids is an ongoing project and aims to reach \$1 million dollar mark.

The cause of an unplanned outage on the Albury to Fairlie 33kV powerline last Thursday which caused a wide spread power cut to the region has not been definitively determined.

Damaged assets were found on a section of line between Albury and Fairlie which Alpine Energy has removed for further examination. Possible causes include a powerline pole being hit, but not broken, causing two high voltage conductors to clash together, or an act of vandalism similar to that of the recent 110kV powerline outage on Transpower's network. Our investigation continues.
