## The future of Fairlie's Old Library Café Building

Thirty seven people came out on a chilly evening, to both be informed and have their say about the options available for the future of the former library building on Allandale Road.

Obviously designed as a library back in 1913, the building ceased to be a library when the government of the day in 1995 withdrew many library services and the building owners, the Mackenzie District Council had to explore other options for the buildings use.

The library was moved to the Mackenzie College site.

Jon Hellmrich had the foresight to see what could be and went about establishing the Old Library Café, a restaurant with a special atmosphere, created by the nook effect left over from the library days. When the Hellmrich's looked for a change, the ownership was taken up by George Rhind and it was George as lease holder when the fire devastated his livelihood and the building back in October of 2011.

The wheels of insurance claims and adjusters do not turn rapidly in this case, and it has taken this long for the options to be made clear to the Mackenzie District Council who in turn delivered them to the meeting. Paul Morris from the Mackenzie District Council explained the situation as it stands now and the three options which were presented for public response in the last Accessible.

Repair – insurers will pay up to \$676,000 towards repair

Demolish building and replace with a modern building for similar purpose to \$676,000

Demolish building and clear site – only get indemnity value of \$272,000 plus demolition

The meeting was in favour of the first two options being considered and requested that the Mackenzie District Council get the figures for both proposals and once again come back to the community for consultation.

Comments noted:

retaining the facade or using parts of the existing building should the new build option be chosen structure there but all interior fire damaged need to remember the spirit with which it was given to the town for the community to use. Needs to be practical for the future large unused area to rear of building could be better used Costs of draughting and engineering have been \$5000 to date.

Now if you want to be further informed on this, your attendance will be welcomed at the next meeting.

It is a great deal better to hear it first hand!

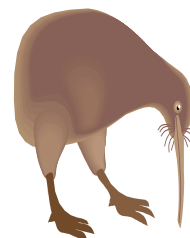

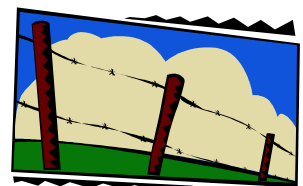

## Are you ready for the big one?

**A magnitude 8 earthquake on the Alpine Fault could cause the destruction of buildings, roads, bridges, power lines and pipes in the Mackenzie District - making it important for everyone to be well prepared.**

The ability of the Mackenzie District Council to respond to a severe alpine fault earthquake was tested by Exercise Te Ripahapa on May 29.

Civil defence controller Bernie Haar said "the council joined a south-island wide response from local authorities, district health boards, emergency services and volunteers. The exercise scenario was a magnitude 8 earthquake at Fox Glacier".

"We activated the emergency operations centre at 8.30am and responded in two shifts. This helped us practice a shift handover, which would be needed in a real event," said Mr Haar.

During the day potential situations were injected into the exercise including a report of broken pipes at Twizel, the closure of airports, and the collapse of a hotel with 50 people trapped.

The council team simulated a response to each event.

"The day went really well. There are some new people in the organisation who have never been involved in an exercise before so this was valuable for them. It was good to get people thinking about what might happen in a real earthquake and how they would respond."

Mr Haar said the Mackenzie District Council holds a civil defence exercise every year. "Exercises like this are important. Practicing simple things like setting up the emergency headquarters in the council chambers and knowing where the radio telephones are kept will help people respond to a real event at a time when it's much more stressful."

He said some volunteer helpers from the community were phoned during the exercise to ensure they were available and ready.

Exercise Te Ripahapa raised some challenges specific to the Mackenzie District. One challenge is that many homes in the district are unoccupied holiday homes. They often don't have emergency supplies. Older people living next door to holiday homes are without neighbours to keep an eye on them. Mr Haar says checking on your neighbours is very important in an emergency.

"I want people to know the council and civil defence are always planning and exercising so if something goes wrong we have the systems in place to support you. But that support might not arrive immediately. It can take as long as 72 hours and it's just as important for individuals to be well prepared. You are going to have to look after yourselves for a while."

"Make sure you have an emergency kit and extra food and water in your home. People who holiday here from the cities are often unprepared, so remind them that holiday homes need to have emergency supplies as well."

## A Haven of Hope

A Christian based non profit organisation called Bread of Life, established 23 years ago in Blenheim, Marlborough, takes their vision statement very seriously.... *To make Jesus visible in our community, through actions of love, concern and support.*

Well respected in the community for the work this organisation does working in with all the other social service agencies in Blenheim, their clients come to trust and respect the love and care that they receive from the centre's staff. Due to the number of resourced single teen parents that continue to come to the centre the staff became concerned with the high rate of pregnancy in Marlborough.

Through education, love and support, the teen and her child will experience an environment that is stable and functional where the training offered will provide a much higher chance of the baby staying with it's mum long term because of the skills taught the young parent. *Hope House* staff will also encourage these young parents to complete their schooling with the support of a hand chosen team of people.

It is recognised that young women who continue with their pregnancy seldom get back into their studies. Early parenthood can have far reaching physical, social/emotional consequences for both the teenage parents and their children. Teenage mothers are more likely than older mothers to live in socio economic deprivation, depend on a benefit, and have low levels of education and literacy. They are less likely also to be surrounded by supportive social networks.

## Reuse

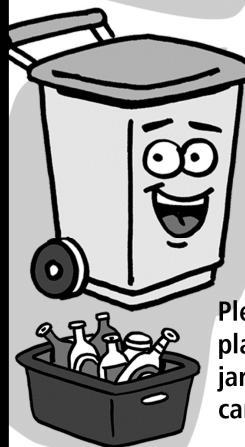
Your trash could be someone else's treasure, give away or sell your unwanted items rather than throw them away. Support your local second hand stores!

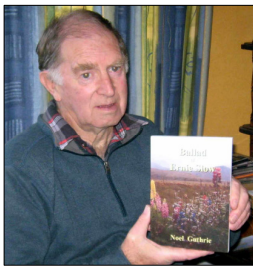

# The Ballad of Ernie Slow

by Noel Guthrie

**The book of Ernie Slow as a true Mackenzie character is about to be launched in the Lounge Room of the Mackenzie Community Centre, 7.00pm 21<sup>st</sup> June 2013**

**Everyone is welcome to this light-hearted evening where those who knew of Ernie can share their stories. There is a light supper throughout the evening. No cover charge. To help us with the light supper you may like to phone the Heartlands of your intention to attend.**

This is a Mackenzie book written about the Mackenzie for the people of the Mackenzie by a former Mackenzie-ite. Yes, my heart still remains in the Mackenzie after all these years. It is a place where I am proud to have been born and worked during my early years and to come back to now and again. This book has more than 200 pages of text and images, most of which have never before been to print.

It has taken about a year to carry out the research, however, it would not have been possible without the assistance of many of those high country folk who helped guide me in the right direction at the time. Particular thanks go to Victoria Slow from Porirua, the Slow family historian and Olwyn Whitehouse from Texas, America, who nudged me from time to time.

It is my belief Ernie began his poetry and ballads around the time of the Great Depression, about the same time as he became involved with Jack Skinner. Of course, whether the Devil's Daughter was the first of his ballads is anybody's guess, but I feel there may well have been some earlier pieces that we will never be privileged to read. I have been able to track down 17 of his works and for that we must thank William Vance, a true lifetime friend to Ernie and who penned much of Ernie's work, as each was recited to him.

Ernie Slow obviously had a soft heart, for he loved animals and children but he never married. Although after the 1914-1918 War, the rumour mill was rife that he had been smitten, however, the drink got in the way. I bet you did not know that the Ancient Order of Froth Blowers flourished in Fairlie and the Mackenzie during the late 1920's. I was never able to establish Ernie's roll in that organization, although I think he could well have been the Chairman of the Tasters Section.

He is known to have been a great shearer, like his father before him and practised the art in shearing sheds all over the Mackenzie Basin.

During the off season and throughout the winter months he took up rabbiting, fencing, the odd stint as station cook, not forgetting his poetry.

Whether we like it or not, Ernie has helped, like James Mackenzie the sheep stealer, to place the Mackenzie Basin on the international stage, most probably for his piece the Devil's Daughter or as it is known in some quarters as The Godley Ghost.

One piece that is not well known yet, is **Marching on the Road to Life**, but it will be shortly. It is to me, a very moving piece. In it Ernie appears to be pondering the remaining years of his life as he drifts along on a boulevard of dreams. In it he mentions a broken heart, could that have been his lost love? He mentions lost comrades; perhaps he is recalling those lost in the War? In his declining years, is he having misgivings of his past and that it has finally dawned on him he has no one to share his twilight years, as he heads into the final lap along that avenue of life?

## Walking dogs around Fairlie

### Information for dog owners

Ovis Management Ltd is the meat industry organisation responsible for monitoring and working with farmers to keep the prevalence of sheep measles (T.ovis) at low levels.

We have been in touch with farmers around the Fairlie town in regard to high levels of sheep measles in lambs supplied by them. While they have appropriate on farm controls in place to prevent their dogs spreading sheep measles they are concerned about the risk posed by dogs from the town that are walked past their farms. It is important that if dogs are going on or near sheep pasture they are treated for sheep measles. Treatments should be monthly and is carried out by dosing dogs with praziquantel tablets available from the local vet.

# Be Prepared - we are encouraging you to be ready!

The Christchurch earthquake reminded all New Zealand of the importance of assembling emergency survival items for home, car and workplace; discussing an emergency plan with family members; and emergency proofing the home. Think about the following hazards when you're making your emergency plans.

## GET STARTED

We are all procrastinators. Knowing what we should do is all very well. Getting started is the hard bit. Putting together emergency survival items, getaway kits and plans requires knowledge – that's what we're here to help you with, some time and a little money.

## FOUR KEY THINGS YOU AND YOUR HOUSEHOLD NEED TO DO:

- 1 Learn about the disasters that can affect you.
- 2 Create and practise a household emergency plan.
- 3 Assemble and maintain emergency survival items.
- 4 Have a getaway kit in case you have to leave in a hurry.

Some parts of the plan are easier to pull together than others. Breaking a big job into smaller tasks can sometimes help you get over your reluctance to start. **Here's how:**

## TODAY (30 minutes)

- 1 Cut and copy (or download or pick up from your local library or council office) the Household Emergency Plan and Checklist.
- 2 Go through the emergency and first aid checklists and tick what you already have in your home or car.
- 3 Create a shopping list for things you don't have. Include your list in a bin or storage container to hold your emergency items.

## ONE EVENING THIS WEEK (30 minutes)

- 4 Go through the household emergency plan with your family or flatmates and fill out the contact information. For Police, Fire or Ambulance, call 111. Note the numbers of your local council emergency helpline, local police station, medical centre and utility suppliers on the checklist.
- 5 If necessary, visit your neighbours to exchange contact information (including their work and mobile phone information) inform them about your plans and check theirs.
- 6 Start collecting old juice bottles to re-use as water containers.
- 7 Check your insurance policies (and make copies). Note important phone numbers on your household plan.
- 8 Find out from your local council or Civil Defence office whether there is a civil defence or public shelter near your home, your work and your children's schools or daycares. Be aware, however, that these may change if that place is damaged in an emergency. Find out what, if any, civil defence warning system or evacuation plans there are for your community.

## THIS WEEKEND (1 – 2 hours)

- 9 Go through your home and property with other members of the household and work out safe places to shelter in various scenarios, earthquake or storm for example. Decide where in the house or garage to store your survival items, getaway kit and emergency water.
- 10 You can store your survival items in the pantry or cupboard, or pack them in a container dedicated to emergency use. If you use the items, remember to replenish your stock.

- 11 Fill bottles with water. You will need at least 9 litres per person (3 litres per person per day for 3 days)
- 12 Photocopy important documents and add them to your emergency kit.
- 13 Go around your house with the EQC Quake Safe Your Home booklet and make sure everyone in the household knows where to turn off water and gas supplies from the street, and main electricity.
- 14 Using the booklet, make a checklist of the house and furniture and other items that need to be secured. Start with your chimney, foundations, gas bottles and hot water tank.
- 15 Take photographs around the interior and exterior of the house and burn to a CD (this may be needed to prove insurance claims)

## OVER THE NEXT WEEKS (5 – 15 minutes)

- 16 Add a couple of items missing from your emergency list to your regular grocery shop. First focus on food (including pet food), then hardware such as torch and transistor radio (with batteries) and first aid supplies.
- 17 As your budget allows, buy hooks and hardware to secure large furniture items such as bookshelves, TV and appliances, gas bottles and water tank.
- 18 Again, as your budget allows, book trades people to secure key items such as chimney, hot water tank, retaining walls and foundations.
- 19 As you add to your emergency supplies, keep a list handy with expiry dates of things that need refreshing (food, batteries, medications)
- 20 With your children, practice Drop, Cover and Hold. Work out where the safe places to shelter are, both inside and outside the house. Teach children to look for hazards such as windows that could break or tall furniture that could topple.

## ONCE EVERY COUPLE OF MONTHS (at least six monthly, 10 – 30 minutes)

- 21 Make daylight saving change-over day your reminder to check your emergency stash and household plan. Refresh batteries and expire items. Update contact numbers for your household and your neighbours.
- 22 Inspect your property regularly and check on potential hazards such as trees, fences, retaining walls and so on.

## ON THE ROAD - do it now!

Chances are you could be on the road when disaster strikes. At a minimum, your car emergency kit should have:

- \*First aid kit and manual
- \*Emergency blanket
- \*Fire-retardant blanket
- \*Heavy duty gloves, rain coat (with visibility strips)
- \*Sensible shoes
- \*Filled water bottle and some high energy snacks.
- \*Torch
