## FAIRLIE RESIDENT PUBLISHES NEW BOOK ON JAMES MACKENZIE, THE SHEEP STEALER

*Catriona Baker, retired Mackenzie Country run-holder now residing in Fairlie, has written and published her first book, 'The Story of James Mackenzie of the Mackenzie Country, New Zealand'.*

The book was published at the beginning of August in Timaru and has been very well received, with the first print-run almost sold out and the second print-run about to take place.

The idea for the book stems from a chapter in Mrs Baker's memoirs which she is currently completing. At the conclusion of dictating the chapter on James Mackenzie, she turned to friend and researcher Linda Sundberg and said "I think we should write a book about Mackenzie instead of just this chapter!"

Approximately two and a half years later, that is exactly what Catriona Baker has achieved.

In his foreword to the book, Christchurch historian and writer Michael Vance states that Mrs Baker's book is the most comprehensive account of Mackenzie available and that it provides an account informed like no other.

Mrs Baker's book begins with Mackenzie's hurried departure from Scotland to Australia following an incident involving prized cattle belonging to the Lord Provost of Aberdeen and then moves through Mackenzie's arrival in New Zealand, his knowledge of the Pass at Manahuna, the uplift of the sheep from Taiko flat, his capture by John Sidebottom and the two Maori shepherds Taiko Topere and Wainui Tarawhata, Mackenzie's escape and his trek to Lyttelton, his arrest in the loft at Lyttelton by Police Sergeant Edward Seager, Mackenzie's trial, his subsequent escapes from the Lyttelton gaol, Mackenzie's Pardon, remembering Mackenzie's capture with the Jock Mackenzie Memorial Centennial Challenge Cup along with the four monuments throughout South Canterbury and the Mackenzie District, the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Mackenzie's capture and Epilogue.

The book comprises 159 pages and contains a good number of coloured and black and white photographs as well as a selection of historical documents – a number of which have never been published before including Mackenzie's Pardon document dated 11th January 1856.

Catriona Baker is the third generation of the Burnett family (of Mount Cook Station) to show an interest in James Mackenzie and she has included in the book her father, Thomas David Burnett's writings about James Mackenzie completed in 1917.

'T.D.' Burnett collected material on James Mackenzie throughout his life and was acknowledged as having a very large collection of material about the sheep stealer.

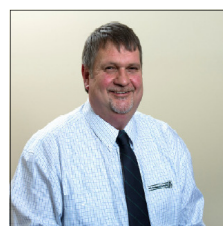

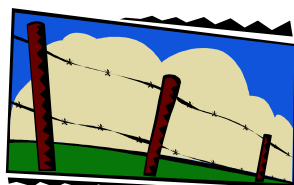

## Working out you emergency plan

Living in shaky Canterbury has meant that our family emergency plan has got a good work out over the last few years. My family all live elsewhere in the country and after the February earthquake working out an efficient way of contacting everyone became really important.

Well the family plan got another workout late Friday with the Seddon earthquake. I felt the earthquake come through in big slow waves on Friday afternoon I knew there had been another earthquake somewhere near the Cook Strait. My sister works in downtown Wellington and I knew that she would be feeling it worse than I was. Next minute a text message came through "big shake, I'm ok" was all it said. I didn't need to know any more information because we have discussed what each of us would be doing after an emergency. I knew she would make her way home where she had everything she needed to be on her own for three days.

The next part of our family emergency plan was my job, to contact the rest of my family in Christchurch, Auckland and Hamilton. My text message simply said "big quake in Wellington, have heard from Laura, she's ok". A few hours later when the phones were working again I rang my sister and she was a bit shaken, but fine.

Working out an emergency plan with your family can be simple, but it saves a lot of time and stress when you need it. Mostly it's about communication, who is your contact person? How will they let everybody know you're ok? In our family we have a designated contact person who lives outside the city we live in. This is because it can be easier to get a text through if the person is out of the area affected by the emergency. That person has the responsibility of contacting everybody else. It's simple, but effective. I just hope we don't have to use it too often in the future!

Information was given on the current state of St John in the area and queried as to what the future will hold.

# Lake Tekapo Community Board

The Community Board has engaged Bofa Miskell, the landscape architects that are looking at landscape concepts around the commercial development to also produce concept plans for the grounds around the upgraded community Hall and courts. The landscaping is the final stage in completing the current project and its important that we make the area a very functional area for the community and families.

The MDC Forestry committee has pledged \$10,000 to the community board for the landscaping of the cleared forest area behind Murray place. This work is to move the forest boundary back from the current houses and create new walking /biking tracks and provide for amenity planting.

This work has now provided a safe area as well for the houses and reduces the risk of falling branches and fire. The board will also look at amenity planting along the Resource park access, around the cemetery and cleaning up the area around the tarns.

This will then tie into the walkway that will stretch from town, along this section behind Murray place, across the Tekapo scientific reserve to the Regional Park.

The Board will make submissions on the long term status and use of the Tekapo forest area under the review of the district plan coming up.

The Board is currently looking at producing an updated strategy and workplan on the walking/biking tracks around Tekapo to ensure that the network of tracks are maintained to the required standard and that the new subdivisions are linked to the town and the regional park.

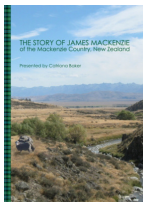
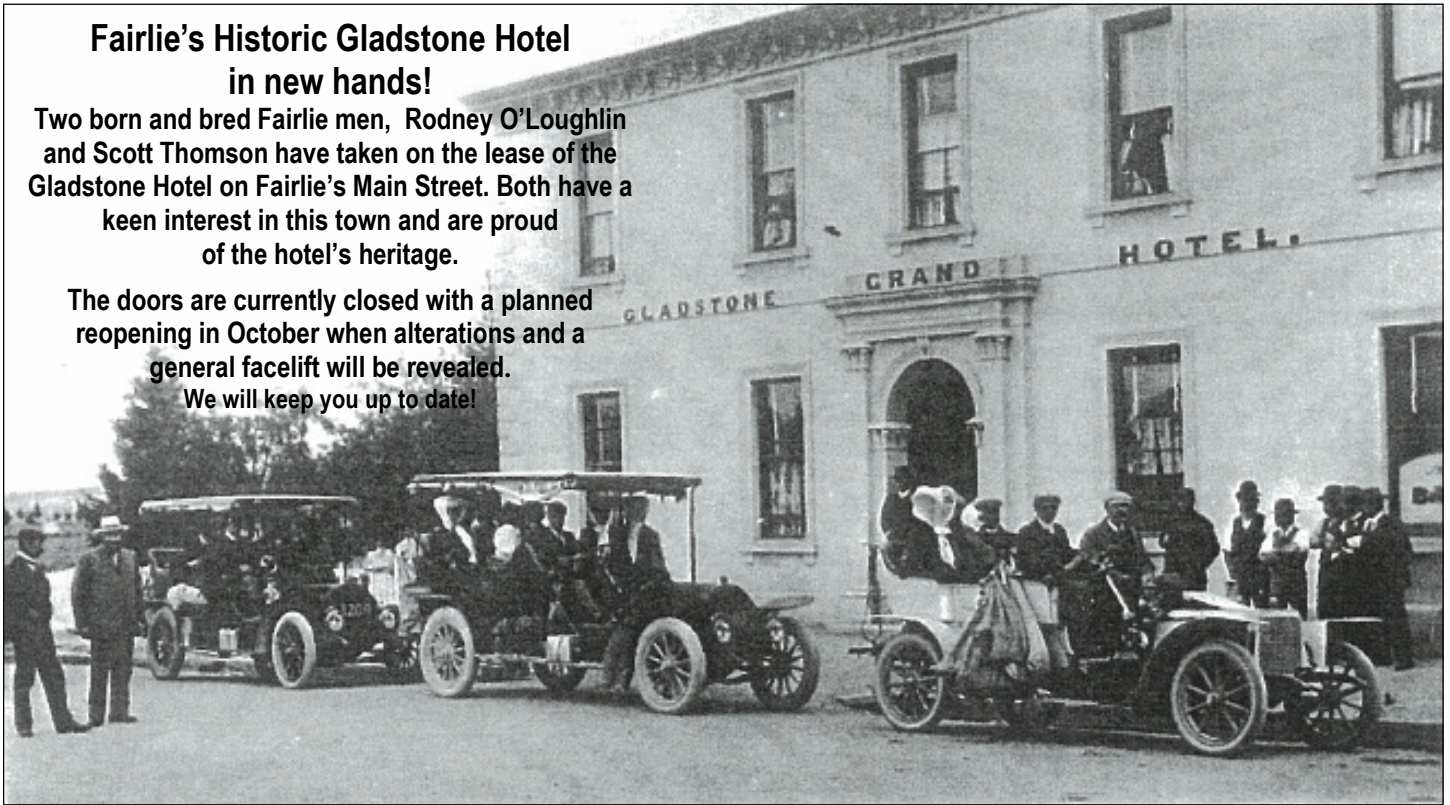


## Fairlie's Historic Gladstone Hotel in new hands!

## What Happens to your Glass?

Glass recycling is proving to be a success story for the Mackenzie District Council and the environment.

For the past six months all glass collected in the district has been going to EcoCentral in Christchurch for recycling.

EcoCentral procurement manager Averil Stevenson says the glass is delivered to EcoCentral's recycling facility in Sockburn, Christchurch, where it is "re-engineered into EcoCrystal products used as pool filtration mediums, sandblasting products and soil enhancers".

A Mackenzie District Council decision to introduce a separate blue bin for glass, instead of mixing glass in the same bin with other recyclables, has proven to be the right way to go. Solid Waste manager Angie Taylor says the glass collected from residents is very clean, not only because people are very good at cleaning their glass jars and bottles, but also because it is collected in a separate crate rather than mixed in with other recycling.

"This means there is very little contamination with other recycling which makes it a more valuable resource and allows the glass to be more easily recycled," she says. "I really appreciate how clean the glass is and I want to say a big 'thank you' to people who are taking the time to recycle their glass correctly."

The council recycles about 20 tonnes of glass each month.

Previously, large amounts of glass had been stockpiled with some being used in road construction. Under the new arrangement with EcoCentral more of the glass is recycled into new products.

Ms Taylor says the council is not paid for the glass it sends to EcoCentral, but it also does not need to pay to dispose of it. The motivation behind recycling is to keep the district free of rubbish and ensure resources are re-used rather than sent to landfill.

A friendly reminder to householders – don't pile your glass above the rim of the blue recycling bin because it can easily fall out and break on the footpath when being picked up.
