Old Library Consultation continues

It has been four months since Council conducted a Community Survey and held a Public Meeting regarding the future of the Old Fairlie Library Building. Since then there has been no change on site and many people are concerned that nothing has happened.

In fact a lot of project design work has been completed and the Council anticipates having a fully costed repair option available for Public consultation in mid November.

Immediately prior to the Public Meeting in June, Council had received a report from a Structural Engineer setting out a methodology for seismic strengthening of the Library's brick walls. The details of this specification were different to the initial contractor's methodology and a significant amount of work has been needed to determine the cost of the amended methodology. In addition to the structural aspects of the project there has been a need to determine architectural and finishing requirements for the building. Council has been extremely fortunate to receive assistance from local architect Graham McDermid who has undertaken this work through his Christchurch based company Architect Plus. Graham will be seeking pricing input from local companies during October to enable completion of the rebuild costing.

There have been views expressed that the Library should be removed and replaced with a high quality, new building. Council has made the decision to investigate and fully cost the repair option before expending money on investigating potential new build designs.

Council appreciates that the Old Library Building is important to the community and will ensure that people are well informed about the decision making process. A Public Meeting will be arranged once all costs for the repair are determined.

The Trust has just completed twelve months of full service, and our AGM was held on 25 September. It has been an incredibly successful and satisfying year for the Trust. The following is an excerpt from the Chairman's Report to the inaugural AGM on 25 September, providing all the highlights of the last 12 months.

It has been a very successful year for the Fairlie Community Vehicle Trust. The Trust was formed after a public meeting in May 2012. The Trust Deed was signed and our Certificate of Incorporation granted. A business plan and budget followed and applications for funding began. Successful Grants from the Aoraki Foundation, Environment Canterbury and the Community Trust of Mid and South Canterbury saw us with sufficient funds to purchase our first van.

An administration agreement with the Mackenzie Community Enhancement Board was signed and this allowed us to operate from the Heartlands Resource Centre. Our administration and setup costs were covered with a successful application to COGS.

After receiving Transport and Passenger Services Licenses our van hit the road in February 2013.

The Community car that was being operated by the Mackenzie Community Board was transferred to the Vehicle Trust while services continued as usual

The Fairlie Community has shown great support with local business buying advertising. The Fairlie Lions Club held a Golf match to raise funds for the shuttle trailer and a grant was received from the Mackenzie Community Services Charitable Trust. So Well Done Fairlie and thanks for your support.

Special thanks must go to Tony Henderson of Environment Canterbury. We have all benefited from his knowledge and willingness to help. To my fellow Trustees, thanks for stepping up and for all that you have done. To Hec Cox (the Van keeper) Anne Thomson, the volunteer drivers and staff at the Resource Centre thank you, your contributions are very much appreciated.

A WORD FROM THE CHAIR

Good progress being made in local water management



Barry Shepherd, Upper Waitaki Zone Committee Chair

We are making good progress implementing the recommendations outlined in our Zone Implementation Programme (ZIP), which has been created with the community to deliver the goals and targets of the Canterbury Water Management Strategy (CWMS).

The Upper Waitaki ZIP was endorsed by Environment Canterbury, and the MacKenzie and Waitaki District Councils in early 2012.

The ZIP contains around 50 recommendations on how to achieve the vision of the CWMS in the zone – to enable present and future generations the greatest benefit from the water resource within a sustainable framework.

Water Quality Limits

The default water quality limits in Environment Canterbury's Land and Water Regional Plan (LWRP) will eventually be superseded by catchment specific limits developed by the Zone Committees local communities.

We are developing some scenarios to test which will help us figure out what the local water quality limits should be. Using scenario testing is a good way of packaging up technical information to help ensure we get things right.

The proposed scenarios discussed by the zone committee at our last meeting are:

- Scenario One – Current land-use (agriculture, aquaculture, and urban)
- Scenario Two – Current land-use plus consented operations that are yet to be implemented
- Scenario Three – Full land-use development in the catchment.

Each scenario will be tested for its impact on Lake Benmore.

These scenarios are not the options for water quality limits – rather, they are the information that is useful to know before setting limits. The limits will eventually include a catchment load limit for Lake Benmore, based on a trophic level for the lake.

Before we finalise the scenarios, we will be seeking feedback on their design. We will keep you posted on when and how you will be able to provide feedback.

In 2014 we will then invite the community to work through the technical results of the scenarios.

Monitoring Integration

We have been pushing for the integration of stream water quality monitoring – to avoid duplication, lower the cost to the community, and to get better data.

We have come up with a solution for use by catchment groups:

- In situations where new consent holder monitoring duplicates the regional council monitoring, Environment Canterbury monitoring will be used
- For other consent monitoring on the same waterway – a local person could be trained to collect the samples locally
- Environment Canterbury could then get these samples processed, with the catchment group sorting out cost sharing.

This would result in one set of data for all parties to use, less cost, and no duplication.

Biodiversity Protection and Enhancement

The committee has funded approximately \$100,000 worth of projects to protect and enhance biodiversity. These projects include actions on wetlands, spring-fed streams, and braided rivers in the Zone.

The committee is responsible for administering the Immediate Steps fund and is always on the look-out for projects that would benefit from funding assistance.
