COLLEGE STUDENTS NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

After only six months of instruction a trio of novice Mackenzie College target shooting pupils are in the national spotlight, for Daisy Holtham, Katie Patterson and Ethan Sugrue are the winning team in the 'rest' division of the Target Shooting New Zealand Secondary School Postal Shooting Competition. Competing against over 900 other students nationally the above 'A' team placed first in New Zealand.

The school's 'B' team was placed second in the South Island and ninth nationally. With two teams placing in the Top Ten we should be proud of our young adults and the college that has encouraged this demanding sporting discipline.

Due credit must be given first to teacher Mrs Lisa Holden who initiated the concept of students gaining target shooting instruction; secondly to three members of the Fairlie Miniature Rifle Club, Tony Holtham, Gary Joll and Lindsay Tubbs, who have weekly volunteered to provide not only instruction in target shooting but also continual reminders of firearms safety.

Mrs Holden reports that the Mackenzie College pupils have gained success nationally due largely to the high level of individual instruction provide by the volunteer instructors. "They one-on-one assist each pupil, drawing their attention to small necessary corrections in a multitude of factors that led to each pupil continually improving their personal best.

Mr Joll reports that the pupils from Mackenzie College are a delightful group of young adults to work with, always attentive to instruction, courteous and very willing to learn and improve. "A real credit to their parents, their school, our community," he said.

Mackenzie Mayoral Update

It's been almost one month since the local body elections so I thought it time that I get back to regularly writing a column for the local papers. Plenty has happened in the intervening time between when I stopped writing and now but I will pick up the thread from Election Day onwards.

First and foremost, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those people who supported me throughout the campaign process and who took the time to vote in the election – giving Mackenzie one of the highest voter turn-outs in the country at 63.04%. The government are bemoaning the poor voter turnout in these elections but here in the Mackenzie the democratic process is alive and well. I believe this is due in part, to the fact that we are a small district and that our voters feel more connected to their elected members than in larger towns and cities.

Unless you have been through the campaign process for the mayoralty yourself, I don't believe you can appreciate how vulnerable and exposed one feels as a candidate for the position. It is particularly difficult in a small place like the Mackenzie and there can only ever be one successful candidate for the job, so disappointment is unavoidable for someone.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Graeme Page, not only for his nine years of service to this district as a councillor, but also for being an excellent running mate in the period preceding the election. It was an unpleasant time for both of us and I appreciated having a contender with whom I could share "war stories" and have a laugh with after our various campaign experiences. It would be somewhat insincere for me to say that I was sorry at the outcome of the voting but it is true to say that, although I was delighted to be re-elected, there was no pleasure for me in beating another candidate whom I have worked with for the past three years.

Moving on from Election Day, the calendar has been quite busy with such events as the Starlight Festival in Tekapo, Re-elected Mayors Workshop in Wellington, and the Swearing-in Ceremony for all new elected members. We held our first full Council meeting and adopted the Annual Report for 2012/2013 on 30th October. The report is one that I am very proud to put my name to and very appreciative of the staff of MDC who worked long and hard to produce a fine result which was given a clear audit and signed off before the statutory cut-off date. Well done team. J

Being the Mayor certainly has some advantages and an invite to the official opening of the new Trippo hydro-slide at Tekapo Springs was one of those valuable opportunities. After the formal opening speeches, the slide was made available to visitors to try out and Damon Odey (new Mayor of Timaru) and I donned our swimsuits and 'had a go'. It is a great ride (I went back the following Sunday with a young friend) and another example of the exciting things happening in our small but fantastic district. Well done Karl Burtcher and his team for giving visitors yet another reason to stop and spend some time with us!



That's me for this week. You shall hear from me again on a fortnightly basis for the next three years.

Council Adopts Annual Report 2013

The Mackenzie District Council has adopted its Annual Report 2013, outlining the council's activities and finances over the past year.

Mackenzie Mayor Claire Barlow says the year was challenging in many ways, but the Annual Report shows significant achievements were made.

The council received an income of \$13.25 million, 46% of which came from rates. Over the same period the council spent \$11.58 million, leaving a surplus of \$1.67 million. This included spending an un-budgeted \$1.18 million on repairs and clean-up work after significant floods, snow and wind storms resulted in widespread damage throughout the district.

"The emergency response and management of repairs has been excellent and our contractors and staff deserve to be commended for their efforts," says Mrs Barlow. "The snow events in particular provided an opportunity to assess our levels of service. It has been heartening that a review of our standards indicated a high level of public satisfaction."

Other highlights of the past year included:

- Achieve clarification in relation to water source options for the future upgrade of the Twizel water supply.
- Receiving and granting a very high number of building consents.
- Making progress on projects including the Alps2Ocean cycleway and the Tekapo lakefront development.
- Meeting the challenge of changes to legislation, including the refining of the purpose of local government under the Local Government Act.

Council chief executive Wayne Barnett says the Annual Report is an independently audited document that sets out how the council is collecting and spending rates in the community. "It puts everything out in the open, for anyone to read," he says. "Ratepayers and residents can take assurance from the Audit New Zealand finding that the council continues to comply with generally accepted accounting practice."

Healing Rooms Fairlie Opening in November

We would like to inform the community that a group from the Fairlie area has formed to open healing rooms in Fairlie. These rooms link in with the 3000 Healing Rooms worldwide of which 44 are in New Zealand.

The Mackenzie Co-operating Parish has kindly allowed us the use of their premises at St Columba Church Building, 59 Main St, Fairlie, to open fortnightly every 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month from 1.00pm to 3pm starting in November.

Healing rooms was established in 1999 in Spokane, Washington by Cal Pierce.

Cal, a Real Estate Developer, felt God draw he and his wife, Michelle, north to Washington State in November 1997. "We sold everything, packed up our furniture and moved to Spokane having never been there before. We were not sure exactly what God wanted us to do, so we continued to seek his direction for ministry."

"On February 28, 1999 I started a 40 day fast. I went to Lake's grave site to pray when I heard God say, 'There is a time to pray, and a time to move.' There was no doubt that God wanted us to re-dig the generational wells of healing in Spokane." Cal called in intercessors and began training up healing teams. On July 22, 1999 the Spokane Healing Rooms of John G. Lake were re-opened in the same location they were 80 years ago.

The focus of the ministry is on establishing healing in the body of Christ with a commission based on Mark 16:17-18

"And these signs shall follow those that believe...they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover."

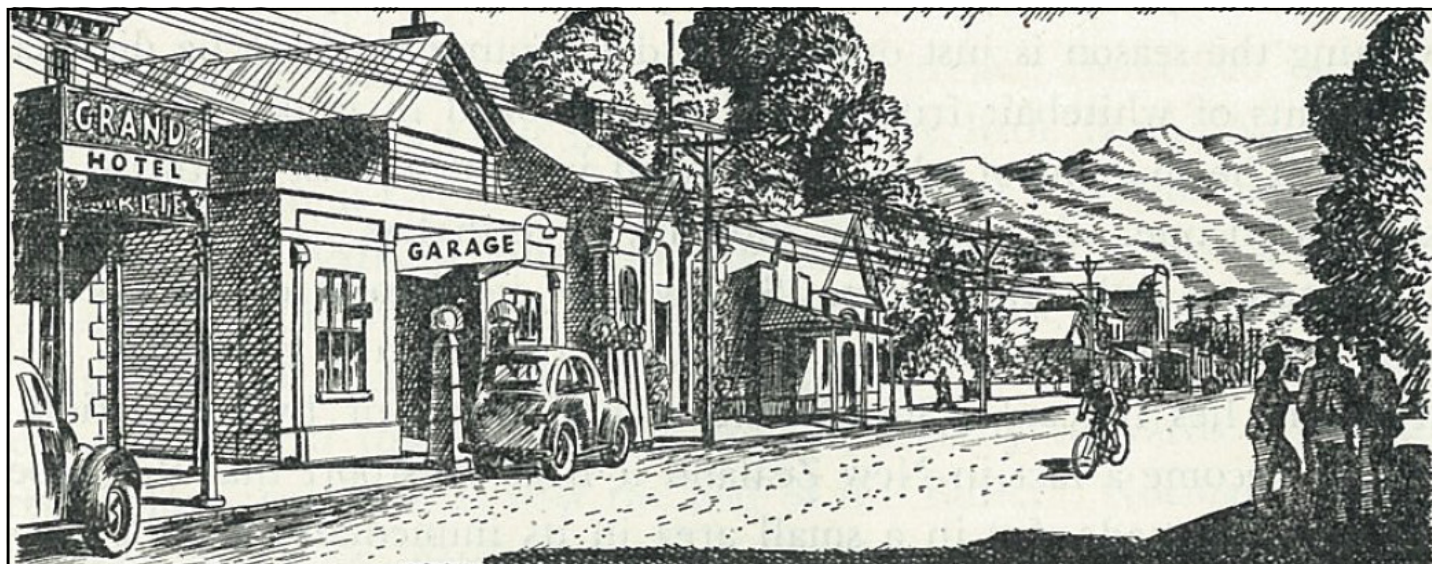

COUNTRY TOWN

Most people see Fairlie from the windows of a Mount Cook bus. In summer they see it usually as a dusty sun-baked main street – the near replica of a dozen or more main streets one might pass along in a day's motoring through Canterbury.

The railway-station, the post-office, the pubs, the petrol-pumps, the stores that sell everything from sheep-dip to razor blades – all seem to have been cut from a pattern that has served country townships from Auckland to the Bluff.

Fairlie's main street looked much the same ten years ago as it does today, and will probably look much the same ten years hence.

Here, you might conclude, is a place whose currents of life are undisturbed by wars, revolutions or general elections, a place where one might go to forget for a while that there is such a thing as war.

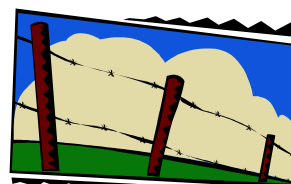

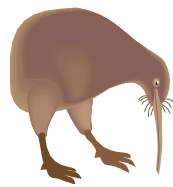

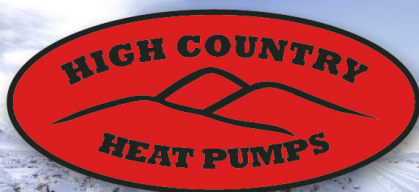
