Landmark Event for St Patricks Union Church.

Stained glass windows have just been installed at St Patricks Union Church at Burkes Pass, South Canterbury.

St Patricks at 141 years old, is a category 1 Historic Place and is the oldest union church in use on its original site in New Zealand.

The project began in 2004 after discovering a badly damaged original window under the church. Graham Stewart donated the restoration work of the original window and reproduced all the others to match, which proved to be no easy task. He has utilised parts of windows damaged in the Christchurch quake to help restore this beautiful little church. If you haven't been there lately then its time to stop and enjoy!

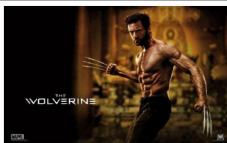

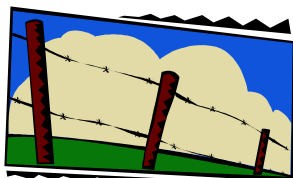

A once in a lifetime opportunity

Have you taken the opportunity for your name, family, or business to be engraved on the new footbridge over the Tekapo River? In years to come, future generations will continue to see the support given to this essential community project.

The committee set a target of 100 names and, with this campaign all ready proving popular with the locals and holiday homeowners, we are half way there.

A \$1,000 donation "buys" a plank and can either be paid in full or by monthly installments. Once the planks are in place the opportunity will be lost forever.

The photo shows an example of what the engraving will look like - there is a limit to the number of characters that can be included. In the meantime, the Lake Tekapo Footbridge Society Inc. has enough funding to be able to proceed with the next major step - the construction of the footbridge piers.



Access paths and platforms for the big crane are now taking form. The drilling of all the cassions for the piers will then begin before the end of November. The stonework around the concrete tubes that will be placed over the steel cassions will commence mid November. A local stonemason, Dale Karton, has been contracted to do the work. Two working bees to collect stones from the lakeside, to match the small church, have been held and, with the help of a few locals, 2/3 of the required amount has already been collected. A big thank you has to go to Rob Allan whose truck and digger have made the job so much easier for us all.

Once all funding has been obtained, stage 2 will then commence with the construction of the steel structure of the bridge and the planking and balustrades. If all applications for funding are successful and the target for the Public Campaign, "Buy a Plank" is met, this could be as early as the start of next year.

Mackenzie Mayoral Update

It was with some sadness that I attended the funeral of local legend, Max Smith on the 7th November.

I had met Max on a couple of occasions at rowing events in Twizel – always identifiable by his white shorts, white shirt, white socks and white hat (I often have difficulty remembering names but not Max – he was definitely unforgettable).

I learned a great deal more about Max and Twizel at the funeral – not just from the formal speeches that were given but from hearing the various conversations of attendees, most of whom were current or previous Twizel residents. It was as if I were attending a large family reunion and the stories of times during the 'project days' were many and varied.

Without being impolite, it was noticeable that the age of the project workers is advancing and that funerals are more commonplace meeting venues than weddings or other events. This made me realise how important it is to record the stories and memories of these folk, not just for historical purposes but also for their entertainment value as well.

I commend the late Marion Sheridan and the TPDA for their work to preserve some of the stories and pictures of such an evocative time in our past. I also want to thank Rick Ramsay for an interesting history lesson in the car travelling to and from the funeral in Rangiora. He had a captive audience and made the trip seem much shorter than usual.

Another event that I had the privilege to attend was the official opening of the South Opuha Hut. This was a venture undertaken by the Mackenzie Alpine Trust to replace an old DOC hut with a new building further up the valley than the previous one. What a logistical challenge it would have been transporting the materials up there! However, I noted from the photographic record of the build, that there was always a cold beer on hand once the work was done.

On behalf of the Mackenzie communities, I would like to extend my thanks to David Williams and the volunteers and sponsors who brought the project to life. It is an outstanding wee hut in an outstanding location and the helicopter flight in was amazing (thanks also to Tony Delaney and Clint – our pilots).



It is on occasions like this that I appreciate again, just how fortunate we are to have some of the world's most majestic scenery right at our back door and how blessed I feel to be the Mayor of this wonderful place.

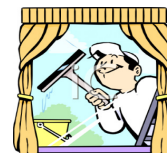

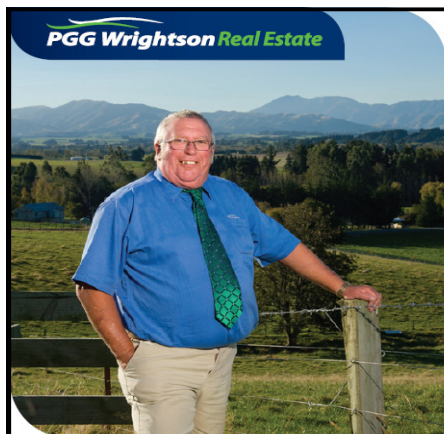

Fairlie Old Library Building Decision Soon

A new plan to repair Fairlie's Old Library Building is being considered.

A second public meeting to discuss the future of the Old Library Building was held on November 14 at the Mackenzie District Council. The meeting discussed a proposal by Graham McDermid of Architects Plus. Mr McDermid has offered to provide architectural services for the rebuild and repair of the Old Library building at no cost to the Mackenzie District Council.

Architects Plus has completed a rebuild design and obtained conservative price estimates from a specialist construction company and a local builder. This shows the cost of repairing the Old Library building is expected to be \$585,000, including a contingency allowance.

Mackenzie District Council chief executive Wayne Barnett says the Old Library building was damaged by fire in October, 2011. It was insured and the insurance company has given the council several options regarding settlement. The insured value is \$676,000 excluding GST. This can be used to either repair the existing building, or construct a replacement new building. The proposal presented by Architects Plus would see the interior of the Old Library repaired and the original exterior strengthened to meet appropriate earthquake standards.

Mr Barnett says there was good public support for this option at the public meeting on November 14, however he would still like to hear from any members of the public who were unable to attend and would like to express their view.

The next step in the process will be to take the issue to a meeting of the Fairlie Community Board on November 25.

This meeting will be open to the public.

A final decision on the future of the Old Library Building will then be made by the full council once it has considered public feedback and any recommendations that come from the Fairlie Community Board. If the proposal from Architects Plus is accepted, construction work on the building is expected to be completed by next spring.

"Council will consider two key parameters when deciding how to proceed. First they will need to weigh up the relative benefits of owning a repaired heritage building against a new, purpose built commercial building. Second, they will need to assess the cost, risk and uncertainty associated with each option."

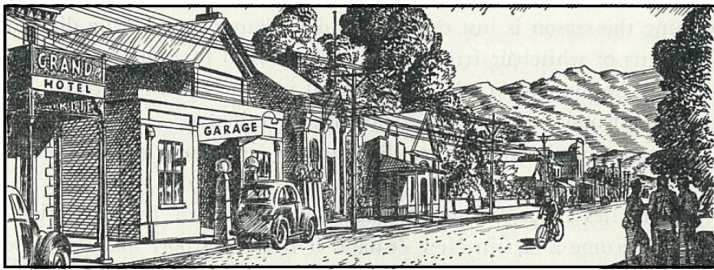

Country Town continued from 'Korero 1948'

As New Zealand country townships go, Fairlie is old because it depends on one of the country's oldest industries – the pasturing of sheep on the high tussock country of the South Island. For more than eighty years there has been a regular migration of sheep from the high country of the Mackenzie basin to the coastal lowlands as winter approaches, and back again to the Mackenzie country in late spring.

In its beginnings Fairlie was a place where drovers camped and watered and fed their flocks. According to the Jubilee History of South Canterbury it was first called Fairlie Creek, after Fairlie in Scotland. As the district was first settled by Highland shepherds, this sounds probable enough.

Nevertheless, one school of thought holds that the name was originally Fairlie's Creek, after a shepherd of that name who built himself a hut there. There was a regular rail service to Tekapo by way of Fairlie in 1862, and in 1870 Cobb and Co.'s coaches were taking freight and passengers. Then, in 1883 Fairlie's predominance in the area between the Mackenzie and the sea was settled by its becoming the railhead of a branch line from Timaru.

When the attractions of Lake Tekapo and Mount Cook were known, Fairlie became the half-way house for another sort of traffic. First the coaches, and then after the last war, the Mount Cook Co.'s buses brought a steady and growing stream of tourists through the main street. Transport, indeed, has always been Fairlie's main industry. The greater number of its male adults are employed on the railway or in garages, in keeping roads open and in repair, and in shoeing horses.

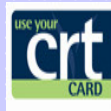

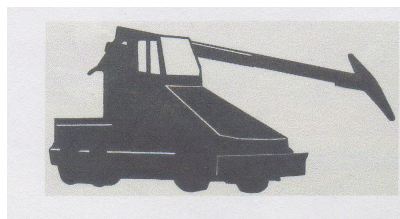

The St John Mackenzie Area urgently needs more volunteers to join its ranks.

Existing resources are very stretched and we need at least 9 new volunteers to ensure that St John services continue to be delivered to our community. It is a challenge to deliver a volunteer service in a rural community, where many live out of town and work long hours, but it is a challenge that needs to be met urgently if you want effective ambulance cover.

As a charitable organization providing essential services, volunteers are the lifeblood of St John. At the moment the job falls on a few shoulders and it is becoming difficult for them to meet increasing demands for St John services. We have a good team of volunteers in the Mackenzie and they are very dedicated but their numbers are too few for the service to be sustainable.

Recruitment is an urgent issue and we need members of our community to consider becoming a volunteer. The reality of the situation is this: our local ambulances have been and will increasingly be unmanned. During those times locals will have to rely on outlying services, in all likelihood Timaru. That is far from ideal.

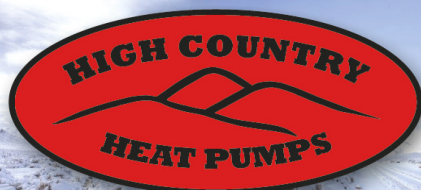

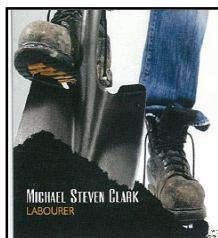
