### Fairlie Early Learners opens its doors!

It's been a long wait, but the new, purpose-built Fairlie Early Learning Centre is only days away from opening its doors to the children/ngā tamariki and families/ngā whanau of Fairlie and the greater Mackenzie District.

The centre faces north, to make the most of the sun. The building is light and airy, and has a large outside area, with lots of space to run and explore. There is also a deep verandah running the width of the building, to provide protection from both sun and rain ensuring the children can access the outdoors throughout the day.

There is a separate Nursery area, for children under two, and a larger Preschool area for older children. The Nursery is licenced to care for up to 10 children at a time, and the Preschool for up to 30 children. There is a shared separate nappy/toileting area, and sleep facilities for both areas.

The centre will initially be staffed by four trained teachers and one untrained, bringing a range of experiences and expertise. All the staff are looking forward to working in the Fairlie community and being part of this wonderful new facility.

The centre charges an hourly fee of \$6 per hour, per child. Childcare subsidies may be available from Work and Income and children over three years of age can be enrolled under the Early Childhood Education 20 Free Hours scheme, for all or part of their booking.

We are currently planning a special day-break opening ceremony and Māori blessing of the site on our opening day of Tuesday 28th October. We welcome the community to share in this occasion. The ceremony will start at sunrise (approx. 6.30am), with shared kai to follow. Please contact us, if you are intending to attend, so we have an idea for catering and we are able to contact you if the planned day needs to be changed for any reason.

The partners and staff are all excited to be a part of this new local development, and know that this is going to be another great asset for our community, and another reason why families/whānau will consider moving to the Fairlie area.

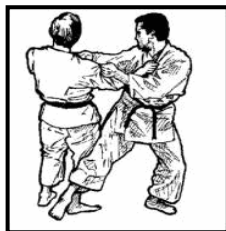

## Fairlie Heritage Museum Exhibit

What might be described as the most prominent exhibit of the Fairlie Heritage Museum on Mt Cook Road has been undergoing a refurbishment of late. Its joints have been lubricated, the catwalk under its energetic capital has been replaced and the tired and ragged signs that had adorned its sides have been taken away to Twizel for the finishing touch to give it a new lease on life.

Standing about 7½ metres tall, carrying a 2.4 metre fan, and situated in the car park between the Mabel Binney Cottage and the Whisk and Page Café (formerly Joseph Binney, Blacksmith) the Samson Windmill was looking a bit tired and ragged after seeing out a century of life. For all that it was a surprise to learn how many people in the Fairlie area did not know it is there.

The museum governing committee decided to take the plunge and give the structure a treat. When the project was under way Dwin Bishop, builder, stepped in to donate and cut wood for the platform and Mike Herlund of L & L Construction made sure we were up to the task by providing and operating a caged lift for the project. Both tradesmen gave their time after hours to see the task done when others were homeward bound for tea.

A hearty thanks to them both.

The windmill is a Samson Open Gear Windmill, a twin geared mill, manufactured by the Stover Manufacturing and Engine Company in Freeport, Illinois, USA. When it was being developed the mill was run day and night for a year for evaluation doing heavy pumping before the engineers decided in 1900 to release it onto the open market with production running until 1920 when it was replaced by a self oiling model. The mill ranges in size from a fan of 1.2m to one of 6 meter.

The Samson windmill is one of the great success stories in the history of the farm style pumping windmill, and in its day sold in large numbers throughout the world. The model in its various sizes is surprisingly common in Western Australia and has been found on many a rubbish tip. The Fairlie Museum windmill was saved from this fate by the Oakley Brothers of Cricklewood choosing to donate their fan and gearbox to the museum.

The windmill mechanism languished in the Blacksmith Shop of the museum for some years until 10–15 years ago Tom Gallagher, being aware of the unit, discovered a tower in Twizel. Putting one and one together he acquired the tower and brought it to Fairlie where it was sand blasted by Colin Richmond then painted by Tom and erected in its present position at the museum with the windmill mounted on top.

### Have Your Say on Council Bylaws

The Mackenzie District Council is currently reviewing some of its bylaws. Bylaws are rules that affect the way we live, work and play in certain areas. The draft bylaws are now open for public submissions, and the council welcomes your views.

The draft **'Dog Control Policy and Bylaw'** covers matters including dog registration, safety around dogs, response to complaints, picking up straying and aggressive dogs, and fees/charges for services like impounding dogs. They also identify areas in the district where dogs are prohibited, permitted on a leash, and where they may be exercised. The draft **'Mobile Shops and Traders Bylaw'** enables the council to control mobile shops, stalls and traders in public spaces in the Mackenzie District.

The draft **'Market Place Liquor Ban Bylaw'** bans liquor in Market Place, Twizel, with provision for temporary exemptions to allow special activities such as food and wine festivals.

The draft **'Wastewater Network Bylaw'** enables the council to manage its wastewater network and wastewater connections.

The draft **'Water Supply Bylaw'** establishes terms and conditions for connection to the council water supply system, including the types of connections and the approval process to connect to water supplies.

The draft **'Downlands Water Supply Bylaw'** sets standards of supply, installation, and control of water associated with the Downlands Water Supply.

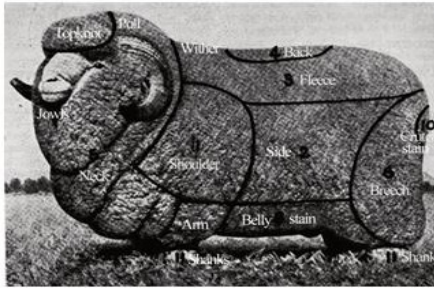

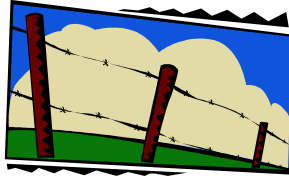

# Aoraki Mount Cook Mackenzie Marketing Update – October 2014

## Aoraki Mount Cook Mackenzie statistics snapshot

There have been a few people asking about how tourism is performing throughout the region so I thought I would provide a snapshot for you.

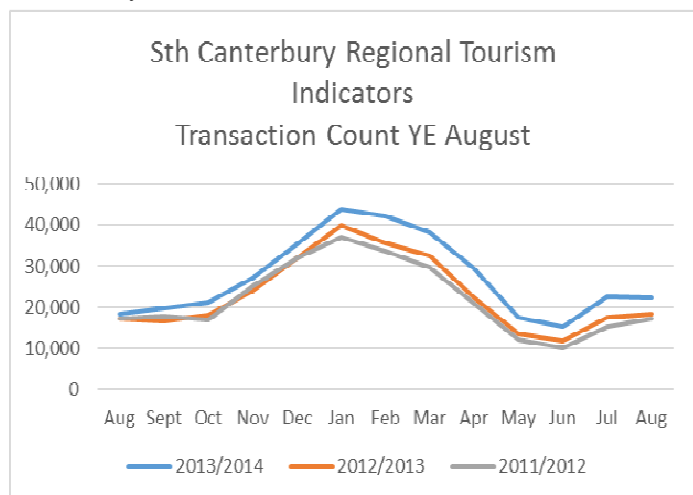
Information from Statistics NZ's Commercial Accommodation Monitor:

International guest nights increased 12.4% for the year ending August 2014 compared to August 2013

Total guest nights increased 7.8% for the year ending August 2014 compared to August 2013

In August 2014 there was an increase in total bed nights of 10.5% compared to August 2013

Below illustrates a successful 12 months for the South Canterbury area. Regional Tourism Indicators provide a transaction count of electronic card data (number of transactions within a given month) for South Canterbury (Mackenzie, Ashburton, Timaru). These indicators are broken down by territorial authority areas defined by Statistics New Zealand. Throughout the last 12 months there has been a 19.5% average increase in transactions from 2012/2013 to 2013/2014 which is an absolutely fantastic result!



## Attracting Sydney Visitors

Over the past two weeks, Christchurch and Canterbury Tourism have been running a campaign called 'Canterbury Tales Yet To Be Told'. Focused solely on the market of Sydney 'Independent Professionals', educating and enticing them about short break holiday options in the Canterbury region.

The campaign tone was a modern day take on the Chaucer's Tales paying tribute to medieval illustration with an iconic Kiwi twist. 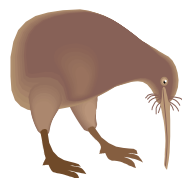

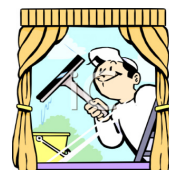

### STRAWBERRY COCONUT SLICE

#### Ingredients

1 cup plain flour, sifted  
1/3 cup caster sugar  
125g butter, melted  
1 1/4 cups strawberry jam

#### Coconut topping

2 eggs  
2 tsp vanilla essence  
2 1/4 cups shredded coconut  
1/3 cup caster sugar

#### Method

1. Preheat oven to 180°C. Line a 16 x 26cm slab pan with baking paper, allowing an overhang along each long side.  
2. Put the flour and sugar in a large bowl and stir to combine. Add the butter and mix until combined. Press evenly into base of prepared pan. Bake for 15-20 minutes or until light golden. Set aside to cool for 10 minutes. Spread the jam over warm base.  
3. To make coconut topping: Put the eggs and vanilla in a medium bowl and beat with a fork until combined. Stir in the coconut and sugar. Evenly spoon the coconut mixture over jam, pressing down slightly. Bake for 20 minutes or until golden. Set aside to cool in the pan for 3 hours. Cut into squares and serve.
