Two Centuries of Remembrance

This year we remember two defining events in the story of New Zealand. The first is a centenary remembrance and the second is a bicentennial celebration.

The first centennial memorial is that of the First World War. The war is a powerful part of our national story. But we are wise to consider how best to tell that national story. War is a tragic dimension of human life; it's symptomatic of a deep dysfunction that sees us set against one another in most areas of life; individuals against individuals, tribes against tribes, cultures against cultures, religions against religions, economies against economies, men against women, women against men, even siblings against siblings - as the ancient stories of the Bible so clearly illustrate. Peace does not come easily. Our War commemorations are a reminder of the tragic cost of human conflict and a call to peacemaking, not only at the international level, which is beyond most of us anyway, but also in our closest relationships and our national community.

Christmas Day 2014 marks 200 years since the Christian message was first brought to New Zealand. At the invitation of the chief Ruatara several missionary families settled in the Bay of Islands. They arrived in December 22nd, 1814 and Samuel Marsden preached the first known sermon in a makeshift pulpit made of old canoes on Christmas Day, three days later.

The four decades of missionary activity in New Zealand shouldn't be glorified anymore than our remembrance of WW1.

The missionaries made mistakes as well as the good they accomplished. During the musket wars, in which 20000 Maori died, the missionaries engaged in peace making efforts.

Their message of God's forgiveness through Jesus Christ empowered Maori to overcome their practice of utu or revenge.

Missionaries were also instrumental in writing the Treaty of Waitangi; a document they believed would lay the foundation of peace between Maori and colonists.

To modern ears, who so often think of Christian spirituality as somehow irrelevant, stories of forgiveness, reconciliation, peacemaking are a reminder that God's purpose for humanity is to reconnect with God and each other across all the boundaries that divide and fragment us. The message of Jesus Christ still has the power to accomplish that.



These two historical events have left a deep impression on the soul of our national identity. Both hold out the opportunity to reflect not only on our past, but also to ask questions about our future and about the values that continue to shape us.

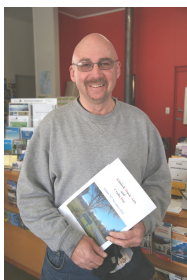
Overall spring of 2014 was a dry cool season.

The most significant feature of the season was that it didn't seem to progress towards summer as spring is meant to do!

For example the temperatures recorded in November weren't so different from those recorded in September. This was mainly due to anticyclones heading further south than they usually do so late in the year.

November was the most dramatic month in the season with an hour long snowstorm sweeping through the district late in the evening of the 4th. The snowflakes were gigantic and had the storm managed to last for another hour, it would have become a significant weather event for 2014. November also delivered some punchy winds which were noticeably absent from September and October. I've now learnt that November cannot be trusted when it comes to organising outside events such as the inaugural KMAC Day!

Hopefully the sun will shine and the summer rain will fall at all the right times!

This year I gained membership into the LJ Hooker "Captain's Club" which recognises the top performers in the LJ Hooker Group.

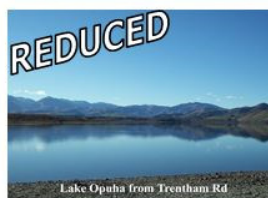

Police Notebook:

If you are lucky enough to be going away on holiday this Christmas don't forget to give your vehicles the once over. Make sure the boat has all the correct safety equipment as you don't want to spoil a good trip. Check all the licence labels, W.O.F and Road User licences, as you don't want the holiday costing anymore than it needs to. Remember to secure your property and make the usual arrangements with neighbours to clear the mail box. etc.

There is no need to make it even easier for burglars.

Things on the crime front have been relatively quiet over the last few weeks, but that doesn't mean we should get complacent. The crims will still be active and looking for opportunities to take advantage of some easy pickings.

A notable nasty incident occurred up Nixon's Rd last Friday night where a plumber's work van was severely damaged in a frenzied attack while parked in a driveway. The police are following good positive leads and an arrest should be imminent in the near future.

A couple of weeks ago the cricket pavilion in Strathconan Park was destroyed by fire when some young local boys decided to play with matches. These boys will benefit from attending a fire service prevention programme to educate them on the consequences and dangers of playing with fire.

A large water tank beside School Rd was interfered with and had the lid unscrewed and left a short distance away.

The motive is unclear.

Every day we are dealing with reports of bad driving, such as crossing the centre line and passing with little or no visibility and the like. Stay alert out there as you never know when you may have to take evasive action. Some quick thinking may save your life or stop you spending Christmas in hospital.

A Swedish man driving a 'Happy Camper' camper van (or should that be Unhappy Camper van) collided with a car driven by a Malaysian man. He was attempting to overtake the Malaysians vehicle as it started to make a right hand turn near Tekapo. The Swedish man has been formally warned for Careless Driving.

We are still getting the odd report of poachers spotlighting around the district's roads late at night. This type of hunting from the roads at night is not only illegal but wrong on so many levels and we will be prosecuting anyone caught.

They will also probably get their firearms licence revoked.

The cannabis growers will be as active as ever over the summer period, so keep an eye out for suspicious people or vehicles parked in odd places. This could be anywhere on public or private property, generally not too far from a water source. Take note of registration numbers/descriptions and then pass it on to me.

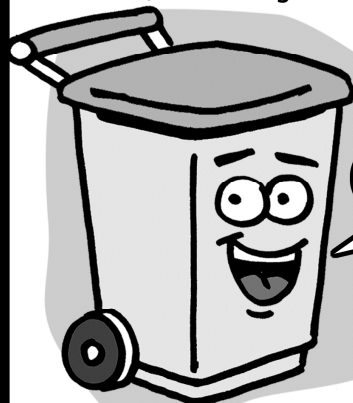

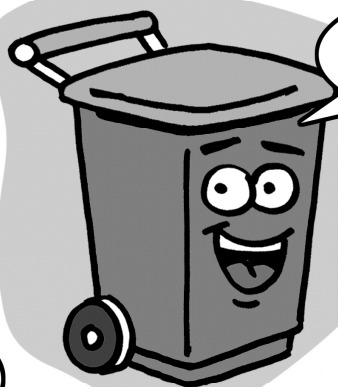

Our mural finally arrived at Albury School on Thursday 23rd of October. Mrs A. went to Fairlie to get it. We all signed the back of the mural before it was put up on the wall. Karen Lanchester is the *AMAZING* artist. When we arrived at school on Friday 24th of October we all noticed it was up on the wall HOORAY!!!!!!!!!!

We thought it was really colourful, awesome, amazing, outstanding, stunning, humorous and FANTASTIC!

It is unique to Albury School because it shows some things that are 'old Albury' and of 'now-2014' such as the Albury Kid, our Logo, our Motto, our Waiata which flows down the Te Ngawai River, the Brothers, the Church, the Tavern, State Highway 8. It has been another fantastic year at Albury School. Our staff (Ken, Fran and Di) have worked hard with the children and the children are receiving very good National Standards results. ALBURY DISTRICT 'GREAT WAR' RECORD

(Ma Waro, Mona Vale, Mt Nessing, Chamberlain and Te Ngawai)

1914 – 1918 *Those that made the Supreme sacrifice*

Tpr. William Williams ROSS, 7/1653, 8th (South Canterbury) Mounted Rifles, 7th Reinforcements. (*Farm hand*) embarked 9th October 1915. DOD (Spanish Flu), Gallipoli, 21st December 1918 (aged 25) after the armistice with Turkey. Son of Harry & Selena Ross of Oamaru. Working for Thomas Simpson of Richardsons Rd, Lower TeNgawai at time of enlistment. Farewell social held at Albury Hall. Buried at Chanak Consular Cemetery, Turkey. Brother Alexander John Ross was KIA, Gallipoli. Not listed at Oamaru. Yet to be listed - Albury and Fairlie Monuments.

Pte. Michael James SCANNELL, 22427, 2nd (South Canterbury) Infantry Reg. (*Railway Porter*) embarked 20th August 1916. KIA Messines Ridge, Belgium, 7th June 1917. Son of Dan & Ellen Scannell of Lyalldale, South Canterbury. Worked at Albury Railway Station. Brother Charles Scannell DOD, South Africa on way to England, 1917. Played rugby for Albury F.C. Body not recovered, listed on Messines Ridge (NZ) Memorial, Belgium. Listed at Lyalldale and St Andrews Monuments. Not listed at Albury.

Pte. William SEYB, 24/1808, 2nd (South Canterbury) Infantry Reg. F Coy, 2nd Batt. NZ Rifle Brigade, 3rd Reinforcements. (*School Teacher*) embarked 8th January 1916. KIA, Battle of the Somme, France, 21st September 1916. Son of M. Seyb of Timaru. Teacher at the Albury School. Played rugby for Albury F.C. Body not recovered. Listed on Caterpillar Valley (NZ) Monument, Longueval, Belgium, and at Albury.

Tpr. Henry Richard SMITH, 7/123, 8th (South Canterbury) Mounted Rifles. Main Body. (*Farmer*) embarked 16th October 1914. KIA, 'Hill 60' while holding the advance trench, 22nd August, 1915, aged 24. Son of Richard Smith of Albury (later 59 Raymond St, Timaru) Attended Albury School. Worked for W. Bray of Cricklewood at time of enlistment. Body not recovered. Listed at 'Hill 60' Memorial, Gallipoli. Yet to be listed on Albury and Fairlie Monuments.

Tpr. Henry Ernest SNUSHALL, 7/125, 8th (South Canterbury) Mounted Rifles, Main Body. (*Farm hand*) embarked October 1914. KIA. 'Hill 60', Gallipoli, 21st August 1915 (aged 21). Son of Mr & Mrs J.W. Snushall, Camp Valley Rd, (later Fairlie). Attended Te Ngawai School. Buried at Hill 60 Cemetery, Gallipoli. Listed on Monuments at Albury and Te Ngawai.

Rfl. James TREMBATH, 80301, A Coy, 42nd Reinforcements, NZ Rifle Brigade. (*Brewery assistant*) embarked 1st August 1918. DOW, England, 1st May, 1919. Wife of Louie Trembath, 319 Hereford St, Christchurch. Son of James Trembath of 'Springfield', Chamberlain Road. Attended Albury School. Played rugby for Albury F.C. Worked for Ward & Co, Canterbury Brewery, Fitzgerald Ave. Buried at Cannock Chase War Cemetery, Staffordshire, England. Listed on Albury Monument.

Cpl. Stanley Victor Carthew VINCENT, 28927, 18th Reinforcements, 2nd (South Canterbury) Infantry Reg. (*Farm hand*) embarked October 1916. KIA. Battle of Ypres 12th October 1917. Son of Mr & Mrs Alfred Vincent, 121 Wilson St, Timaru. Worked at 'Annandale' Limestone Valley Rd for his uncle, Richard Elijah Vincent. Attended Te Ngawai School. Buried at Tyne Cot Cemetery, Zonnebeke, West Vlaanderen, Belgium. Listed on Monuments at Albury and Te Ngawai.

Pte. William Arthur WALL, 6/567, 2nd (South Canterbury) Infantry Reg. Main Body. (*Blacksmith*) embarked 16th October 1914. KIA, at the 'Daisey Patch', Gallipoli, 8th May 1915, aged 40. Son of William and Rebecca Wall of Edward St, Timaru. Farrier/ Blacksmith of Cave and Albury. Served in the South African War with 24th Coy (Canterbury section) 7th Contingent NZ Mounted Rifles as Farrier – Sgt. Played rugby and cricket for Albury & Cave clubs. Body not recovered. Listed at Twelve Tree Copse Monument, Helles, Turkey, and at Albury.

Pte. Frederick George YATES, 6/578, 2nd (South Canterbury) Infantry Reg. Main Body. (*Farm hand*) embarked 16th October 1914. KIA. Battle of the Landing, Gallipoli, 25th April 1915 (aged 25). Son of Mr & Mrs W.M. Yates, Rangitata, (formerly the Master of the Ashwick Flat & Te Ngawai School). Attended Te Ngawai School. Body not recovered. Listed on Monument at Lone Pine, Gallipoli, at Te Ngawai and Temuka. Yet to be listed at Albury.
