Living in the Albury Inn, he had got to meet a number of locals and passers-by well before the pub was open for business. Good old hospitality dictated that he welcomed them just as warmly as he does each person who crosses the threshold, now he is open.

In developing the business he intends to convert one room into a dining room, upgrade the already popular outdoor area and continue with the idea of a changing menu. Chef Graeme Lane, formerly of Rimuwhare is working with James and of course with Graeme being world famous in Fairlie for his Thai cuisine, they are constantly asked if there will be Thai on the menu. The answer – not at the moment anyway!

Of course he and the Albury Inn will be the topic of conversation for some time to come, and as many of the locals have told him, 'the proof of the pudding' will be in the way James gets through events such as duck shooting morning! A big test for any hotelier!

James is enjoying getting to know the Albury folk and as far as the hotel goes – James says the time is right for him to take up the challenge. We wish him well!

## Commemorating World War One

A group of people enthusiastic to see World War One remembered in our area met last night to raise ideas as to how we might go about this. The group was pleased to hear that plans to apply for external funding to provide care for the Peace Avenue tress was already underway. The trees planted at the end of the War extend from Cricklewood to Kimbell (or thereabouts) and have been a great memorial to those who served. However many of them are in need of help and it is hoped that this plan will enable that! The trees in the town seem to be better cared for than those along the state highway and on private property. It was a concern that stock were damaging some trees and hoped landowners would be understanding of the significance of these trees.

A number of projects for 2014 were raised and will be the topic at the next community meeting where it is hoped decisions will be made.

- The Mackenzie Rugby Football Club will be arranging a special event to remember!
- The return of the German Krupp Field Gun 75mm – which was once here on the Main Street beside the public loos. Brought back by returning soldiers from WW1 as a souvenir, the gun fell into disrepair and disappeared! To where remains a mystery! Twenty five years ago a local gent thought he was on the trail but this came to nothing. Its fate is the topic of recurring conversation and speculation is rife that it fell into the hands of a collector. Anyway the hunt resumes and if it was not possible to get that particular gun then another would be an option. Jeremy Sutherland is on the case!
- A set of historic flags
- Plant a tree on the Green with a commemorative plaque
- An old time dance with music and dress from the WW1 era
- A statue opposite the Gladstone Hotel – of one of the young troopers - in full uniform - as he looked on the Fairlie Railway Station platform the day he left – never to return! The railway station was the last place many saw their husbands and sons for the very last time!
- A band rotunda on the Green
- A riverstone memorial wall

All of these will be presented for discussion at the next meeting at 7.30pm on Monday April 15<sup>th</sup> in Heartlands Fairlie. We will remind you! Come have your say!

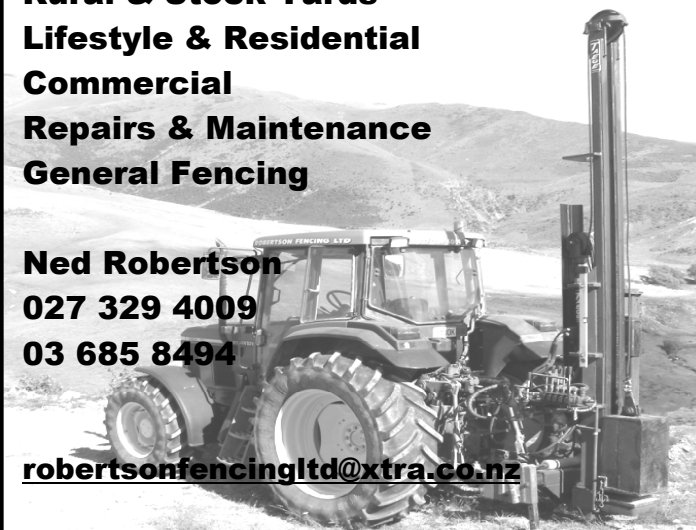

## Mayoral Views

I'm not sure how many of you had the opportunity to attend the NZ and South Pacific Pipe Band Championships in Timaru over the weekend of 2nd/3rd March, but I was invited to be a "celebrity" judge for the display section on the Sunday and my afternoon turned out to be so much more rewarding than I expected. To be perfectly honest, I had been thinking of turning up, doing my bit and then heading for home. I appreciate the bagpipes but I didn't think I would appreciate listening to them for the entire afternoon!

I was wrong.

The piping, the drumming, the synchronisation, the uniforms and a good crowd made for an entertaining afternoon of musical performance but the highlight for me had to be when all of the bands came together for a massed performance of Amazing Grace. This was incredibly soul stirring and I was so proud to see our own Mackenzie Highland Pipe Band out there playing along with the best in the country. It will be another ten years until the competition comes back to Timaru so I am glad that I was given the opportunity to be there.

Another great thing to happen since I last wrote is that Meridian has kindly offered financial support in drilling one of two possible wells in Twizel to search for a new water source for the township. MDC engineers had found a site that they believed would be suitable but it was uncomfortably close to one of Meridian's canals. Meridian raised their concerns and MDC decided it would be better to look for the water elsewhere. As it is an expensive exercise to put down test wells, I approached Meridian and asked if they would be prepared to help with the cost of this. They agreed and I would like to publicly thank them for this support and their timely response to my request.

I had the privilege of sharing lunch with the Gudoy family in Fairlie last week. Nassar, Josie, Joanna and Paul come originally from the Philippines and have been in the district for just a few months, having previously lived in Ashburton. The Gudoy's live on a dairy farm and one of the problems for new migrants in any rural community is the potential to become quite isolated due to language barriers and cultural differences.

Fortunately the Government has recognised this and funded a program called "Settling In" to promote social cohesion, support new migrants and aid their transition into our communities. A well-educated man, Nassar Gudoy has agreed to support this program by communicating with the growing local Filipino community and assisting them in becoming part of the fabric of this region. I would like to welcome the Gudoy's and all the other immigrant families to the Mackenzie District and hope that you will feel as welcome as we were when we first settled here 16 years ago.

Well, there goes my space already. I had more to say but it can wait. What I would really like to do is to encourage you to spend a day out this Sunday (17<sup>th</sup> March) and take your friends and family along to the Lake Tekapo Fete. # A WORD FROM THE CHAIR



### **A busy year ahead for local water management**

A major focus for the committee this year will be on preparing for sub-regional planning processes for the zone in 2014.

The zone committee will be required to work with the community to develop recommendations for water quality limits to feed in to the Waitaki sub-regional chapter. We intend to hold public information meetings in the middle of the year and strongly encourage locals to get involved.

These limits will eventually replace the default water quality limits in Environment Canterbury's Land and Water Regional Plan (LWRP), so it is a very important process, and vital that you have your say.

This year the committee will also be working on building our knowledge of the groundwater resource in the zone.

Finally, as zone committees come to the end of their three year tenure, the structure and make-up of the zone committees may be refreshed. There could be an opportunity for new members to join so it's a good time to come along to one of our meetings and see what is involved, or contact our facilitator for details.

### **Upper Waitaki Zone Committee**

The Upper Waitaki Zone Implementation Programme (ZIP) was endorsed by Environment Canterbury, and the MacKenzie and Waitaki District Councils in early 2012.

On the ground action is starting to ramp up as the implementation of the ZIP gains pace. As things progress we will begin to profile some of the projects in this column.

The ZIP contains around 50 recommendations on how to achieve the vision of the CWMS in the zone - to enable present and future generations the greatest benefit from the water resource within a sustainable framework.

### **Get involved in local water issues**

All Zone Committee meetings are open to the public and time is made available for members of the public to contribute if they wish.

**The next meeting is at the Mackenzie Country Inn, Twizel, on Friday, 15 March from 9:30am.**

### **Immediate Steps biodiversity funding**

The committee is responsible for administering the Immediate Steps fund which supports biodiversity protection and enhancement projects in the zone.

To date, the programme has allocated around \$40,000 to support stream and wetland protection, fencing, willow control, planting, and other initiatives.

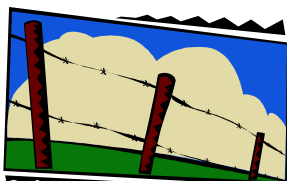

## Saffron Road Charitable Trust

### What can the Fairlie community do to help? Where to start??

Naturally, of greatest help to any overseas community project, is adequate funding. The running costs for fresh food, electricity, heating and the purchase of medication is substantial ~ and there is always a short-fall.

As mentioned in a feature article in the Timaru Herald (Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> February ~ [www.stuff.co.nz/timaru-herald/features/8313050/From-Fairlie-to-Nepal](http://www.stuff.co.nz/timaru-herald/features/8313050/From-Fairlie-to-Nepal)) **Saffron Road Charitable Trust** (a division of Saffron Road Tours), in addition to helping leprosy hospitals, is also supporting a day-care centre, **Orchid House Nepal** which offers hope and the chance of a secure future for street children in Kathmandu.

Started by just one amazing Nepalese woman, Bina Basnet, the centre currently cares for, and educates, an incredible 180+ children aged from birth to [school] Year Five. Ms Basnet originally cared for children in her small flat, but as numbers grew she managed to secure more suitable premises. Orchid Gardens now has the use of several buildings and a large open area which doubles as a playground (of sorts) and a vegetable garden.

Before being taken into care, small babies might be left at home in cradles or tied to their mother's ankle so they could crawl around. Toddlers were often chained to gas cylinders so they couldn't wander and older children simply roamed the streets. The mothers (widows or wives of alcoholics) work in low-paid menial or labouring jobs and many are destitute. Sadly, some of the mothers were forced to surrender their children to orphanages in order to keep them alive.

However, with the help of volunteers (both local and from abroad)



and financial donations, Orchid Gardens is able to provide care, fresh food, medical attention, education and a safe environment so mothers are free to make a living knowing their children are safe.

From very young the children (some of whom are incredibly bright) are taught reading, writing and maths and, when they are up to standard (and when funds allow), they are placed in private schools. Note: As many of the children don't have birth certificates, they cannot be enrolled in Government schools.

The cost of caring for a child at Orchid Gardens Nepal is only \$350pa (equating to \$29 a month, \$6.75pw or 95c a day). The cost of schooling alone (fees, uniforms and books) is approximately the same. If you would like to sponsor a child or volunteer at one of the community projects (Orchid Gardens, one of the leprosy hospitals or help to build a school, hospital, hostel etc), or even take a holiday in Nepal, this can be arranged.

A big thank-you to all those wonderful people who have donated items for the leprosy hospitals and schools. We are still collecting bed linen, medical supplies, spectacles and sunglasses (for adults and children), clothing, educational items etc.

## MORE and STILL COLLECTING!

A 'call-to-arms' in the Accessible in February last year generated several kind donations of medical dressings, spectacles, clean bedding, clothing and educational items for a leprosy hospital and small school in Nepal. A special word of thanks from the hospitals goes to Barbara McPherson who provides a regular supply of [washed and re-rolled] bandages.

The Timaru Herald feature brought forth more local donations as well as items and cash donations from Timaru, Pleasant Point, Temuka and Waimate.

The growing stockpile of goods (with hopefully much more to come) meant an increased need for clean, dry storage to house donated goods. Thanks must go to Edna Kerr for meeting the initial and urgent storage needs of the Trust and now also to Ian and Bev McDonald who have generously made available an even bigger space in the township.

More thanks go to H & J Bruce Transport which has donated a huge storage facility in Timaru.

Any excess clothing, unsuitable fabric or even furniture in good condition will be sold at a subsequent garage sale to raise money for the projects.

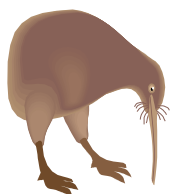

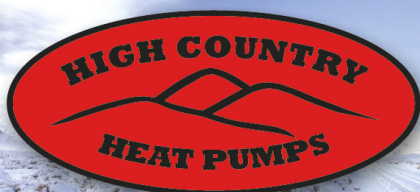
