Squash Club meets every Wednesday evening from 7pm and the locals are always looking for a new challenge.

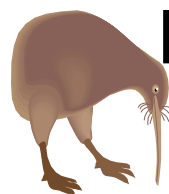

Work and Income - we stock information and forms for Work and Income and have internet and fax services available to send forms through. We are able to witness originals of forms for clients.

IRD visits monthly so make an appointment here in your own town! We are fortunate to have contact with the visiting outreach worker should you have urgent queries or concerns.

Free use of the extensive range of jigsaw puzzles is available!

Second hand books are sold and traded at Heartlands with all funds going towards flags for the Fairlie township. Donations are welcome but we simply can't cope with magazines and Readers Digest Condensed books! Come check them out!

Donations of non-perishable items for the **Fairlie Food Bank** are most welcome as are **cell phones** that are past their best! These help fundraise for Starship!

Mayoral Views

I love autumn. The clear days, cool, crisp mornings and, in particular, the return of the bellbirds to our neighbourhood make this my favourite time of year. The fact that it comes on the back of a great summer makes it even better.

I saw lots of familiar faces at the Lake Tekapo Fete last week and, had the weather been warmer on the day, I think we would have all hung around a bit longer but it did get a bit chilly. Never mind, I still managed to buy one or two nice things and sample one of those twisty fried potato snacks that I had seen but never tried before. To be perfectly honest, it tasted just like hot chips (no surprises there!).

Speaking of Tekapo, a very hot topic at the moment is the fate of the forest plantation at the back of Murray Place. This is one of those issues that generates considerable controversy and has no simple solution.

The Community Board and Forestry Board have resolved to remove the trees (not all of them) while the market is favourable, and a number of passionate residents have asked if the trees could remain for recreational purposes, as this is a popular walking route for locals and visitors. A public meeting, letters and emails from residents and appearances at board meetings lend weight to the importance of these trees to quite a number of Tekapo locals. However, a plan to fell, clean up and replant while leaving some younger trees between the township and the forestry block is the long term view taken by the two boards.

I have learned a considerable amount about trees over the past couple of weeks and the costs of maintaining and managing forest areas. I thought they just grew and looked after themselves! The decision of the Forestry Board will come back to Council on April 2nd for debate and I know that this is not going to be a simple decision whichever way it goes.

I had the pleasure of being asked to help out at the Mt. Nessing Dog Trials last week and, even though they didn't really need my help, I thought what a fantastic place the Boothroyd's have up there, and what amazing animals those working dogs are. Quite something to watch for a "townie" like myself.

A great bit of news for Albury is the re-opening of the Albury Pub. I bet the locals are pleased and I know of a few Fairlie folk who have already been up to sample Graeme's cooking. I will add that to my list of things to do over the next few weeks.

On a more regional note: I attended the official opening of the new MRI scanner on the 15th March and was pretty impressed with the fact that from the start of the fundraising campaign to the finished project and opening, it only took 18 months to raise almost three million dollars. We live in a great place and although I hope you never have to use its services it is comforting to know that our residents no longer have to travel far to access this kind of medical technology.

Last but not least, on the 11th and 12th March we hosted a visit from the Ecan commissioners and I would like to thank the O'Sullivans, Klissers, Snow Loxton and Alan Gilmore of Mt. John for their generosity and time in giving the commissioners an insight into just a sample of all that goes on here in the Mackenzie. They were very appreciative and I believe they will have gone away with a better understanding of the issues faced here on both sides of Burke's Pass.

Mackenzie Highland A&P Show

The countdown is on...less than a week of sleeps until Easter Monday rolls around again. This year's Mackenzie Highland A&P Show will have a few exciting new things on offer – but don't worry, it will still have all of the old favourites too.

One of the biggest things to mention is the **new parking scheme**...you may or may not be aware that the Mackenzie A&P Society has recently purchased an 18 acre parking lot adjacent to the showgrounds. This purchase ensures the future of the Show by securing nearby parking for those attending the Show. The new parking scheme will be a bit of a steep learning curve as public parking will now ALL be off of School Road (just past the rugby grounds). It will be well signposted from all directions...but all locals can help point the way to wandering cars should you see any!

Please note: if you have entries to exhibit, a trade site or an A&P issued disabled parking permit, you may still use the Gillingham Street gate.

Another exciting addition to the Show is the return of the **Mackenzie Shears** after more than a ten year absence. There will be Junior, Intermediate, Senior and Open Machine shearing and Open Blades attracting top competitors from throughout New Zealand. Each grade will be shearing for big prize money. This competition will be located in the corner of the Showgrounds near the rugby fields and Gillingham Street.

No doubt you will hear the sheep baa-ing and the crowds cheering and know you are in the right place.

For the first time ever to the Mackenzie Show is the sport of **Cowboy Challenge**. The NZ Cowboy Challenge Association formed in 2010 after holding its inaugural event near Geraldine. It has now become a national sport and is holding a points approved competition at this year's Show....apty called the Mackenzie Cowboy Challenge. Organised by the Aoraki Western Riding Club, this event will add a bit of speed and excitement to the Show. A Cowboy Challenge is a timed competition featuring thirteen obstacles per round.

Obstacles are modelled on situations that a 'real' cowboy might encounter...such as throwing a (mock) sheep over the saddle, roping a calf, dragging a log, cantering bareback, etc. Riders don't know until the day which obstacles might be in their path. The highest points are for riders with speed and control. This competition will be held in the far end of the Parking Paddock (behind the beer garden) and will be going on for most of the day.

We also have the return of **Showjumping** this year- with all new jumps, this will prove exciting to watch as well. This will be happening after lunch in conjunction with the Round the Ring Hunter Jumping. President Dave Clark's theme centres around transport, particularly vintage transport.

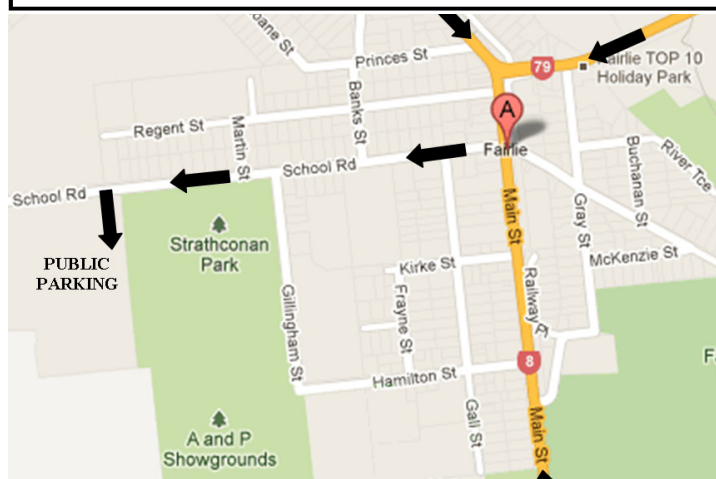
Of course, all of the usual attractions will be at the Show as well...Country Kidz competition, Carnival Rides, Pony Rides,

Burkes Pass Heritage Trust The Travels of a Historic Little Hut

The restoration of the Burkes Pass ice rink provoked re-discovery of a delightful little building whose history is still unfolding. The Corcoran family made a very generous offer of a little hut on their property, that adjoins the church, to be used for restroom facilities at the rink. This would also meet a long awaited need at church events. It perched high on the hill behind their house and virtually hung over the steep cliff that drops down to Burgess Stream, locked in by a mature larch tree.

It defied removal by any safe mechanical means so was dismantled by Graham and Murray and Maree Hemmingsen, turned into a 'flat pack', loaded onto a tractor tray and driven the 50 metres down the hill to the paddock close to the church. Many days later after careful reassembly and repair, including the creation of a carefully crafted door, and a paint job to match the church, it reappeared looking as cute as a button.

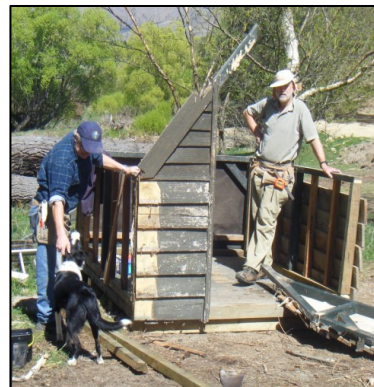
Discussion with previous residents of the Corcoran's present house included Joyce Kelly (nee Kingsbury), who remembered it was used as a play hut. Joyce was brought up at the hotel and has also has links with the ice rink. During the 1960s her father, while the publican at the hotel, developed the rink as a business. The family later sold the hotel to the Baxters and moved to the house next to the church.

Brenda McCarthy and her husband had built this house while managing Paddy's Market Station and Brenda was certain the hut was at the back of the section when they moved there.



In the process of dismantling the hut it became apparent that it might have started life with a canvas roof stretched over a wooden frame as significant remnants of the canvas remained under the later addition of tarpaper and corrugated iron. Early research suggests this may be an unusual early building technique.

Louise Corcoran, when examining an 1880's photograph of Burkes Pass township taken from up the hill behind, was sharp eyed enough to recognise the unique profile of the little hut with its steep pitched roof and horizontal rear window situated at rear of the hotel. Her suggestion, tongue-in-cheek, was that it has been steadily making its way to Tekapo!

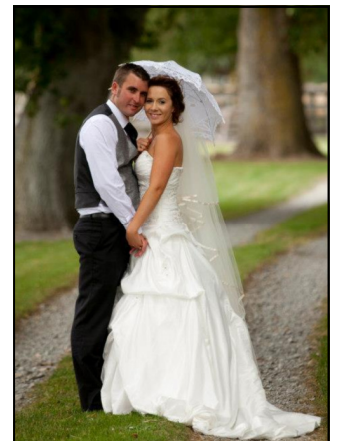

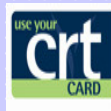

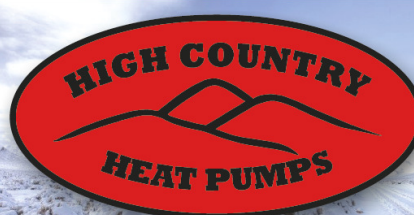
