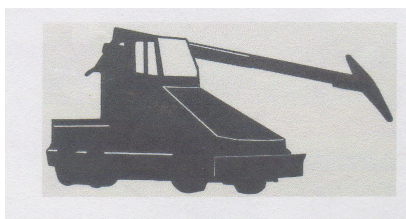

Raising Children in New Zealand – a Brainwave Trust Presentation

One day every child in New Zealand will get the best start in life because parents and the whole community understand and value the impact early experiences have on brain development, and ultimately on the healthy development of society.

The Brainwave Trust is a national organisation set up as a charitable trust which aims to raise public awareness about amazing new findings in brain research, which emphasise the importance of early experiences on infant brain development; and to educate about the important implications of this knowledge.

The Brainwave Trust team is made up of doctors, educationalists, academic and business professionals who all work voluntarily. A group of presenters are located around New Zealand to impart the recent findings and their knowledge on brain development.

Many amazing new discoveries relating to brain development and functioning have been made relating to the year's from childhood right through to late adolescence. These findings often contradict many of the long-held practices that we have viewed as best practice. The result is that there is now a large gap between how people 'think' the developing brain functions and what neuroscience research has actually shown to be the case. An understanding of this knowledge will help to guide us to better meet the behavioural, developmental and educational needs of our children.

The Mackenzie District is hosting one of the presenters on Monday 4th November in the Community Centre (7.00pm – 9.00pm. \$5 per family). This presentation covers childhood development from the early years to the teens.

The Brainwave Trust presenter is Nathan Mikaere-Wallis. Nathan has a Masters degree in Educational Psychology and a practice background in teaching and child therapy. Nathan has lectured at the Christchurch College of Education in the areas of human development, brain development, language and communication, risk and resilience. www.brainwave.org.nz

Pedestrian Safety on the Allandale Bridge

Anyone who has had an accident or near miss on Fairlie's Allandale Bridge needs to report their experience so pedestrian safety can be improved.

Fairlie Community Board chairman Owen Hunter says the bridge is not safe to walk across but provides an important link. With the Fairlie township on one side and a growing industrial area on the other side, people are increasingly needing to walk across the bridge and are putting their safety at risk.

"For example people are dropping their vehicle off to get it fixed at one of the businesses and walking back into town across the bridge," he says.

There is only a narrow path for walkers and although it's in a 50km/h zone, the traffic speed is often higher. "It's a real danger. Parents walking children in prams or on bikes are our main concern."

The community board has been in contact with Opus, who manage state highways for the New Zealand Transport Agency (NZTA). The bridge is part of the state highway network and is administered by NZTA.

"They have been helpful in reviewing the problem but haven't had any reports of accidents or near misses," Mr Hunter says. "What we need is for people to report anything that has happened so we can take that information back to Opus."

Mr Hunter encourages residents, accommodation providers and hosts to get in touch with Anne Thomson at Heartlands Fairlie Resource Centre to report incidents or near misses. She has agreed to collate the details so the information can be forwarded.

Mr Hunter says once the reports have been collated, the community board will work towards making the Allandale Bridge safe for pedestrians.

"There are not many towns around that have a bridge in the middle that you cannot walk across," Mr Hunter says. To report an incident or near miss contact Anne Thomson on phone 685 8496.

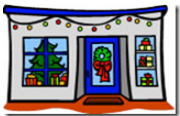

REMEMBERING PASSCHENDALE

The first great clash of arms of the First World War resulted in what became universally known as the Western Front. This was a line of trench fortifications stretching

750 kilometres from the English Channel to the Swiss frontier and despite numerous attempts to break it, this battle line remained stationary until the last months of the war.

The Western Front is of immense significance to New Zealand's military history. From mid 1916 until the end of the war the New Zealand military forces were involved in some of the most lethal battles of modern history. The two New Zealand attacks made in Oct 1917 in the Flanders region of Belgium rank among the most significant military engagements the country has ever undertaken and were part of the British offensive known as the third battle of Ypres. The New Zealand Division took part in two of the eight separate battles in this offensive.

The first was the battle of Broodseinde on 4 Oct.

The New Zealander's part in this battle was a stunning success. They captured all the objectives, advancing the British line by 2000 yards and taking 1,159 prisoners. Success did not come cheaply though. It never did on the Western Front. New Zealand casualties numbered 1,853 of which more than 449 had been killed. And this was a battle where everything had gone according to plan.

The second battle was the First Passchendaele just over a week later, an attack that should never have gone ahead, and was an absolute disaster.

Nothing at all went according to plan and, as a result, New Zealand suffered not only a severe military defeat but its greatest ever human catastrophe. Not a single objective was taken and the cost was massive.



Close to a thousand New Zealanders were killed on this one morning and a further 2,000 soldiers were wounded. More New Zealanders were killed or maimed in these few short hours than on any other day in the nation's history.

Passchendaele, along with the Somme battle in 1916, came to epitomize the suffering, tragedy and futility of the First World War. The Western Front produced those haunting images by which most people remember this war: bleak muddy trenches, huge, costly battles achieving little and brave helpless soldiers enduring the unimaginable.

Some 12,483 New Zealand soldiers remain buried in the soil of the Western Front and 4,227 of them have no known grave. Many thousands more carried the physical and mental scars for the rest of their lives.

The Western Front then is of immense significance to New Zealand's military history and the nation's heritage. The campaigns in which the New Zealanders were involved certainly deserve to be more widely known.

One of the most memorable and moving poems of World War 1, was that scribbled by a Canadian Medical Officer on a page torn from his dispatch book.

In Flanders Fields

*In Flanders fields the poppies blow
Between the crosses, row on row,
That mark our place; and in the sky
The larks, still bravely singing, fly
Scarce heard amid the guns below.*

*We are the Dead. Short days ago
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow,
Loved, and were loved, and now we lie
In Flanders fields.*

*Take up our quarrel with the foe:
To you from failing hands we throw
The torch; be yours to hold it high.
If ye break faith with us who die
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders fields*

Reduce the risk of power cuts

A message from Alpine Energy, EA Networks, MainPower and Orion

Power outages following September's severe wind storm were primarily due to trees and branches coming into contact with overhead lines and poles. As trees on private land are the responsibility of the land owner, we need your help to reduce the impact of future storms on our electricity networks and on you and your neighbours.



How can you help?

If you have a tree that could impact power lines, please think about your local community's health and wellbeing. A power outage caused by a tree may not just affect you – it may impact many people, including those with health issues.

Consider replacing tall trees near power lines with a lower growing species. If tree removal isn't possible, as a minimum, make sure branches are kept well away from overhead lines and poles.

If planting, think carefully about the type of tree you put near overhead lines – a little shrub can become a giant in a few years' time. Call your local lines company for advice on suitable trees.

Reduce the risk of power cuts

- **CUT DOWN** – consider having tall trees that could fall through power lines removed.
- **TRIM EARLY** – if the tree can't be removed, branches must be at least 2.5m away from low voltage lines or at least 4m from high voltage lines. Ideally further.
- **BE SAFE** – please call your local lines company for information on who can safely cut down or trim your tree.
- **PLANT WISELY** – ask your lines company about safe planting distances and power line friendly trees and shrubs.

Follow the guide on the left to determine if your trees are a safe height.

DRAFT LOCAL ALCOHOL POLICY 2013 CONSULTATION

What is a Local Alcohol Policy?

The Draft Local Alcohol Policy (LAP) regulates the number, location, trading hours and licence conditions of licensed premises. An LAP can establish policy on some or all of the following matters:

- the location of licensed premises near certain types of facilities (e.g. schools, churches)
- the density of licensed premises
- "one-way door" conditions for licensed premises that would allow patrons to leave premises but not enter or re-enter after a certain time
- discretionary conditions in a licence
- restrictions or extensions to the maximum trading hours set in the new Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act)

A LAP may apply differently to different kinds of licensed premises. The LAP cannot include policies on any matter not relating to licensing. Once a LAP is in place, the Council's District Licensing Committee and the Alcohol Regulatory and Licensing Authority must have regard to the LAP when making decisions on licence applications or renewals.

How has the LAP been developed?

The Act allows councils to develop a LAP for their territorial areas. The objectives of the Act are focused around reducing alcohol related harm.

The Mackenzie, Timaru and Waimate District Councils have jointly prepared a draft LAP for consultation with the community. In preparing the policy, the views of the community about alcohol licensing matters have been sought through community surveys, and discussions with key stakeholders, including Police, the Medical Officer of Health, industry representatives and health and community groups.

Key points of the Draft LAP

The following summarises the main points of the Draft LAP:

Off-licence maximum trading hours

- Hours of Operation for off-licence premises proposed to remain the same - 7am to 11pm

On-licence maximum trading hours

- Hours of Operation for on-licence premises (Function Centres, Restaurants and Cafes) proposed to remain the same - 7am to 1am (the following day)

- Hours of Operation for on-licence premises (Taverns, Hotels, Bars and Nightclubs) proposed to remain the same - 7am to 3am (the following day)

Proximity to sensitive facilities such as schools, parks, health centres

- Discretionary condition restricting new ON (taverns, bars, nightclubs, not restaurants and cafes) and OFF licenced premises to not be within 100 metres from any Kindergarten, Early Childhood Centre, Primary or Secondary School.

One way door

- Licenced premises open to 3:00am will require a one way door restriction at 2:00am on Friday,

Saturday and Sunday morning and for any large event occurring at the premises.

Discretionary conditions

- Discretionary condition restricting the use of outdoor areas after midnight (0000hours) for ON licence premises.
- Discretionary condition for Taverns, Hotel, Bars and Nightclubs to have dedicated door security staff on Thursday, Friday, Saturday nights and for any large event occurring at the premises.

Early 2014	Final Local Alcohol Policy in effect <i>(subject to appeals process. If no appeals, then it will be final 30 days after it is publicly notified)</i>

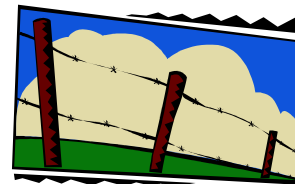

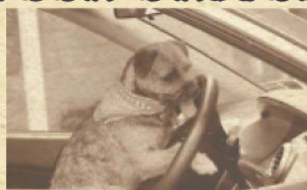

Time to get out the tramping boots and get into the hills again. Even though this spring weather is very changeable, we do catch the odd good day to wonder around the hills. The Ashburton Lakes District is a real gem and needs no introducing to those who know the area. If you have not turned left at the Mt Somers village and explored up the Ashburton Gorge Road, then you are missing out on one of New Zealand's best kept secrets.

This trip is an overnighiter or longer if time permits. First, you have to book a bed at Erewhon Station. They have renovated the old homestead and is available for hire. It sleeps a good crowd, and is very warm using the power they generate themselves. You ring the lovely ex Fairlie girl, Erin Cassie. While you are talking to her, book a ride on the wagons with the mighty Clydesdale horses pulling you around the hills, a journey you will never forget! You will remember them at this years New Year parade.

Erewhon Station is approx 50km from Mt Somers village. On the way you pass Lake Camp and Lake Clearwater, which are very popular recreation lakes. This has a holiday village, with a few amenities and a basic camping ground. Then you will pass Mt Potts Station that has a restaurant come café. You will need a coffee by now!!

Next stop is Mt Sunday. Lord of the Ring fans know all about Mt Sunday. In the boundary keeper days, the lads used to gather from the surrounding Stations for a Sunday "meeting"..!! No flash utes to zoom off down the road in those days! Mt Sunday is now open to the public and has a very good track to the top to relive the filming of the Lord of the Rings. This walk is about one hour return.

You would never know the village Ederus was built here. Back to your vehicle and 6km up the road is Erewhon Station, tucked under the shelter of the Jumped up Downs. These little mounds are hard deposits left from the glaciers. The musterers named them, as the sheep kept doubling back during a muster and generally not been very helpful!! Time for relaxing, wagon ride or whatever! Hopefully the next day is perfect for climbing Mt Potts.

So back down the road for 5km and park by a little DOC sign on the left. This is the access point to the old 4wd track that takes you up to the Erewhon Park Skifield. I think they only heliski up there now. The walk up is easy, you just loose a little sweat as it's a good 2hr climb. The old ski field is great to explore on its own, if you do not want to summit Mt Potts, but you can't half do a climb if the weather is good. We had a magic day!

You need your real boots for the summit as it is mostly scree and rock, also remember water. No creeks up here! Plus the usual good warm clothing etc. Depending on your fitness and ability, it will take another 2hrs to summit Mt Potts at 2185m. The views are absolutely amazing. You can't describe it in words, best you do it instead!! Great hill stick country for the return trip down the shingle scree, then a stroll back down the 4wd to your vehicle. Home or back to the historic Erewhon Station, you choose!

This is one of the many amazing trips in this area. Maps are J35 and J36.
