





Foraging Time

Autumn is a season I really enjoy. Cool mornings and evenings, with plenty of sun in between. It's also a time when I begin to squirrel things away for the upcoming months. A time for foraging, collecting fruits to turn into preserves, jams and jellies. I have my favourites that I make every autumn; pre-served pears, preserved Golden Queen peaches, crab apple jelly, and this year I have added quince jelly; all of which have not come from my own garden. These supplies usually easily last out the year. The art of making homemade preserves, etc was something I learned through my childhood.



My family, through the generations, have always made the most of seasonal fruits and vegetables. I have a recipe book from my grandfather which has numerous tomato relish recipes, as every year he would modify his recipe to suit his taste at the time, interestingly it has more chilli and spice added every year, but my favourite were always the pickled onions.

It seems that preserving is making a comeback, with the current price of fresh fruit and vegetables, it makes sense to make the most of what is available seasonally. It is often regarded as a time consuming process that many cannot be bothered with. But once you set aside a few hours it is amazing what you can achieve. You can save old jars, keep a look out in second-hand shops for preserving and jam jars, you don't need fancy equipment, just a big pot and some utensils, and the want to do it.

As one travels around the countryside you can see where apple cores have been thrown from car windows, this is an easy way to quickly pick a few to munch on, but these definitely need a good wash; think pesticides as roadsides are often sprayed, and contamination from car exhausts. But for the more serious forager it's about knowing where to look and what to look for. Sources of wild plants are usually well foraged around towns so sometimes you need to venture further afield. Maybe it is as easy as asking your neighbours or holiday home owners if they mind if you pick some of their fruit.

It's pretty easy to pop down to the supermarket to purchase cultivated varieties of fruit, veggies, nuts, etc, but their original source was once from wild varieties. It's believed that you will benefit from gathering your own as they are going to have a higher nutritional value. Freshly picked, haven't been sitting in a cool store, or stuck in transit - there are numerous factors that add to the reduction of nutritional value, affecting the vitamin, mineral and antioxidant content.

Fungi is a popular wild food, through autumn there is often an abundance if the climatic conditions are right. This season has been exceptional for fungi. What to look for is a problem for many, there are more to eat than field mushrooms, look for a guide or do some research into edible varieties, you don't want to pick the wrong one - like the death cap.

Chestnuts have had a great season too, but you maybe a little late for these now, and also likely have been beaten to them. The guy selling his roasted chestnuts at the Autumn Festival at the weekend seemed popular. I like to roast them on top of the fire in a cast iron pan, delicious and sweet.

Maybe you know where there is a good stand of walnut trees or other nuts that you can get your hands on. They are easy to store away and have so many nutritional benefits and uses.

Edible weeds are popular for salads and teas. I'm sure we all have some edible form of weeds in our gardens, chickweed, nettles, dandelions, wild fennel, onion weed. Add in some calendula petals and nasturtiums and you have a tasty foraged salad.

You may still find some wild blackberries around, but during warmer months when walking in the hills you can find: currant varieties, snowberries, totara berries, maybe even wild strawberries and raspberries. Perfect to increase the sugar level for a boost of energy.



So I challenge you to become familiar with your environment locally and further afield. Keep a look out throughout the seasons, down at the sea collecting shellfish or seaweed, maybe a good collection of elderflowers to make cordial, buy yourself a guide to foraging - I have seen an interesting guide in the Twizel Bookshop, *A Forager's Treasury*, which is a New Zealand guide.





NO PHONE OR INTERNET

"WE KNOW WHERE WE'LL MEET IF WE CAN'T GET IN TOUCH."



In most emergencies it's best to stay in your own home, so make your home your meeting place and have an alternative in case you can't get there.

PLAN A MEETING POINT

Talk to your family about how you will get in touch and where you will meet up in an emergency if the phone lines and/or internet are down.

IF YOU HAVE KIDS

If you have kids, make sure you know the school/day care's emergency plans and give the school names of three people who could pick the kids up if you can't get there.

STAY TUNED IN

Have a solar or battery powered radio so you can keep up with the latest news and alerts. Know which radio stations to tune in to for information during an emergency.

OUT OF TOWN CONTACT

Have an out of town contact that everyone knows about (sometimes when local phone lines are down you can still reach people outside your area). Get everyone to check in with your out of town contact by text or online messaging in an emergency if you can.

KEEP A LIST

Keep a written list of important phone numbers.

As always you should also stay alert around your computer and the internet. Be suspicious of emails or requests from strangers or unknown sources. A very useful web site to report any dodgy activity is www.theorb.org.nz. There are some other useful links to partner agencies on that web page also.

As always feel free to give me a call if you can help resolve any of the above issues or if you hear something that goes bump in the night or looks out of place. It is better to respond early to prevent things escalating and to avoid creating anymore victims.


The 20/20 Trust have added three new modules to their Stepping Up digital courses. Please let us know if you'd like to take part in any of these. They are:

LEMON AUTUMN PUDDING

There's nothing like a classic pudding to warm you up as the nights cool down and this classic version is sure to do the trick. It has the perfect mix of sweet and tangy, with a crispy exterior and a delicious lemon sauce inside. The secret to keeping it light and fluffy is to fold the egg mixture in carefully so as not to ruin all the little pockets of air you've created when beating the eggs.

Ingredients:

Melted butter, to grease	4 eggs, separated
1 T finely grated lemon rind	2/3 cup fresh lemon juice
1 1/3 cups reduced-fat milk	1/2 cup self-raising flour
1 cup caster sugar	Icing sugar, to dust

Method:

- Preheat oven to 180C. Grease six 250mL ovenproof dishes with melted butter.
- In a bowl add egg yolks, lemon rind, lemon juice, milk, flour and 2/3 cup caster sugar. Whisk until smooth.
- With an electric beater, beat egg whites in a bowl until soft peaks form. Beat in remaining caster sugar. Continue mixing until mixture is thick and glossy.
- Fold a quarter of the egg mixture into the lemon mixture. Fold in the rest of the egg mixture. Pour evenly into prepared dishes.
- Place in roasting pan. Fill roasting pan with boiling water halfway up the sides of the dishes. Bake for 25 minutes or until the tops of the pudding are golden.
- Remove dish from baking pan carefully. Leave to stand for 5 minutes. Dust pudding top with icing sugar and serve.
