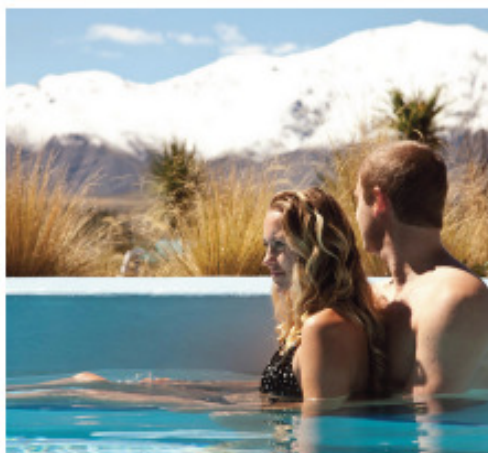

Tsunamis only happen in the ocean, right?

Actually, tsunamis can happen in lakes too. While they are rare, NIWA and GNS Science researchers have been out on Lake Tekapo mapping the lake bed to find evidence of past underwater landslides that could have created tsunamis.

The research has found evidence for large underwater landslides, most likely triggered by earthquakes, happening about once every thousand years over the lake's 12,000-year history. Some of these landslides may have created tsunamis several metres high at the lake shore.

What does this mean for Lake Tekapo?

Like any coastal area or lake shore in New Zealand, if you feel a long (more than a minute) or strong (hard to stand up) earthquake, stay away from the lake shore and move to higher ground if you can.

There is only a small chance that a tsunami will have been created, but if it has, it would cause the lake level to rise and fall rapidly. It would not necessarily flood land, especially if the lake level is low – it may just affect the lake beach or create strong currents in the lake.

Next Steps

Environment Canterbury and Mackenzie District Council are now working together to understand which parts of the Lake Tekapo lake shore are most vulnerable, and how best to use the new information.

We are holding a community meeting on Wednesday 23 May at 7 pm, at the Tekapo Community Centre, with NIWA and GNS Science researchers, to talk about the research and discuss the next steps with the community. All residents are welcome to attend.

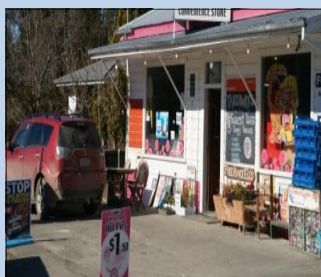

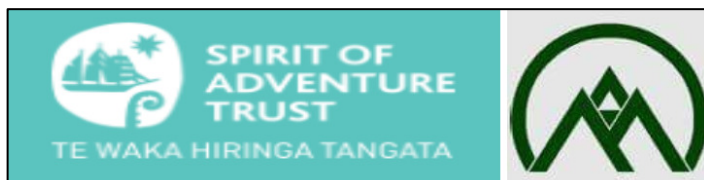

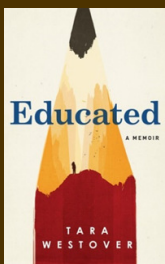
New Book – Educated by Tara Westover

Tara Westover was seventeen the first time she set foot in a classroom. Born to survivalists in the mountains of Idaho, she prepared for the end of the world by stock-piling home-canned peaches and sleeping with her "head-for-the-hills bag." In the summer she stewed herbs for her mother, a midwife and healer, and in the winter she salvaged in her father's junkyard.

Her father forbade hospitals, so Tara never saw a doctor or nurse. Gashes and concussions, even burns from explosions, were all treated at home with herbalism. The family was so isolated from mainstream society that there was no one to ensure the children received an education, and no one to intervene when one of Tara's older brothers became violent.

Then, lacking any formal education, Tara began to educate herself. She taught herself enough mathematics and grammar to be admitted to Brigham Young University, where she studied history, learning for the first time about important world events like the Holocaust and the civil rights movement. Her quest for knowledge transformed her, taking her over oceans and across continents, to Harvard and to Cambridge. Only then would she wonder if she'd travelled too far, if there was still a way home.

Educated is an account of the struggle for self-invention. It is a tale of fierce family loyalty, and of the grief that comes with severing the closest of ties. With the acute insight that distinguishes all great writers, Westover has crafted a universal coming-of-age story that gets to the heart of what an education is and what it offers: the perspective to see one's life through new eyes, and the will to change it.

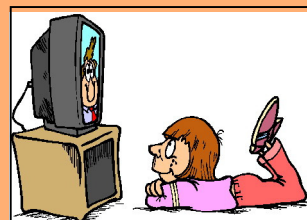

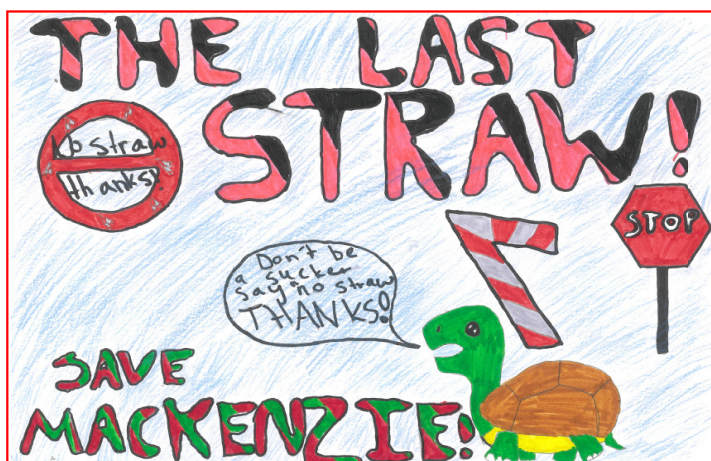

High Performance Housing - A Better way to Live

Last Sunday the Fairlie Community was invited to come and have a look through the new two story building on Princes Street! Thank you to Simon and Debbie for sharing this information with us all!

Thanks to those of you that came to our open home at the weekend. I hope you now have a better understanding of what we are doing and how we build better homes. If you missed the open home but are keen to know, read on.....

Why Build a Better Home?

New Zealand has a building code that stipulates the minimum standards for new homes. But they are just that, minimums. In a lot of cases, these minimums are not enough to create a warm, dry, healthy and energy efficient home. Lots of new homes are still cold and have moisture problems. This is not healthy, New Zealand has one of the highest rates of Asthma in the world due to our poor quality of housing. Nor are these new homes cheap to run. Heating bills, especially in climates like the Mackenzie District, are too high and, for a lot of people, unaffordable. Therefore homes aren't kept at a healthy temperature. The World Health Organisation recommends a minimum indoor temperature of 18°C, and ideally 21°C if babies or elderly people live in the house. The average daily indoor temperature in the winter for most New Zealand houses is just 16°C and even colder at night. How many of us have woken up to ice on the inside of our windows in the middle of winter? There has to be a better way.

There IS a Better Way -

The houses we are building on Princes St will only require 2kw of heat to keep them above 18°C, even in the middle of winter. To put that into perspective, the average hair dryer uses 2kw, a lot of the time they won't require any heating at all.

How do we achieve this?

Insulation - Super thick insulation.

Walls - 185mm - R5.4 (*Building Code 90mm - R2.0*).

Roof 275mm - R6.3 (*Building Code 140mm - R3.3*)

Floor 225mm - R5.4 (*Building Code R1.3*)

Airtightness - We add an airtight layer to the inside of the wall frames and across the ceiling. This is sealed to all the windows, doors and floor (the floor is also airtight). An average new house has an ACH (Air Changes per Hour) of between 5 & 7, an old (1950's - 1970's) house will have an ACH of 20 - 30. That means you are heating the air in your home many times each hour. The Princes St houses will have an ACH of less than 1. The heat stays in!

PVC Windows and Doors

Aluminium is a Thermal Bridge - it sucks the heat through your home. PVC or Timber is a much better alternative. At Princes St we have opted for PVC, double glazed with Low - E coating on the glass.

Recipes for the Season!

Seems such a waste when we hear of feijoas just left to rot up the North Island! One man's waste is another man's delicious treat! On sale now - expensive in some places but only a couple required in this recipe!

FEIJOA PIKELETS

50g butter	1/4 cup white sugar
1 cup flour	pinch of salt
1 1/2 teaspoon baking powder	1 egg
1/2 cup feijoa flesh, finely diced	3/4 cup milk

Melt the butter in a fry pan (the same pan you'll cook the fritters in). It can cook until golden but be sure it doesn't burn. Set melted butter aside to cool.

In the meantime mix sugar, sifted flour and baking powder in a bowl. In a separate bowl beat egg and milk together. Make a well in the dry mix, add wet mix and combine vigorously so there are no lumps. Finally add cooled melted butter, mix thoroughly. Fold through feijoas.

Add tablespoonfuls to a medium-hot fry pan until bubbles start to appear on one side. Flip and continue to cook until golden brown on both sides. Add more dollops of butter as required so the fritters don't cook 'dry'.

Transfer cooked fritters onto a paper towel to drain!

Yum - if you like feijoas!



Ventilation System

We have made the house very airtight but we need fresh air. We use a high quality ventilation system to do this, stale, moist air is extracted from bathrooms and kitchen. This air goes through a heat exchanger where 95% of the heat is recovered, fresh air is brought from outside, filtered and then passes through the heat exchanger to recover the heat from the outgoing air. Nice warm air is then fed to the living areas and bedrooms. All the unwanted moisture is removed in this process creating a home free of condensation and mould.

It's not difficult to build a home that is warm, dry, healthy and highly energy efficient. We just need to challenge the status quo. If you have any questions please don't hesitate to get in touch.

SMALL STEPS to reduce waste in the Mackenzie District - Ways the Everyday Person Can Reduce Their Plastic Usage From the Rubbish Whisperer

You may not be ready to remove single-use plastic from your life entirely, but there are loads of simple, small steps you can take to do your part to reduce plastic waste.

Reduce food packaging

Reducing your food packaging may seem daunting, but there are many ways that this can be achieved – it's easier than you think. Buying produce and bulk foods that don't have any packaging is the easiest way to achieve this, but can often be difficult to find. A handy tip: I use a reusable produce bag when buying non-packaged bulk items such as dried fruit, nuts, beans and lentils. Another way to reduce your food packaging in your grocery shop is to go in prepared. Have your shopping list ready and don't forget your reusable bags and/or containers. Plastic is convenient, so be mindful and it will be easier to avoid.

TAKE YOUR OWN SHOPPING BAG

Taking your own shopping bags is a simple enough idea, but remembering them is another altogether. I try to ensure I keep them in my car at all times: once you are finished with unpacking your food, place the bags beside the front door so you can pop them back in your car. It's great knowing you're doing part to reduce the 673 million plastic shopping bags used in New Zealand every year. They pose a hazard to wildlife in many ways. Not only is there entanglement danger but when plastic bags are in water they look exactly the same as jellyfish, which many animals, including turtles, feed on.

SWAP OUT YOUR CLING FILM

Another form of soft plastic that is easily avoided is cling film. There are so many alternatives available, you are sure to find one that suits your preferences. You can buy wax wraps to cover a bowl or serving dish, it is also suitable for putting in the fridge. There are even fabric sandwich wraps for school lunches and snack pouches for other small goodies.

REUSABLE COFFEE CUPS AND MUGS

For the coffee drinkers, make sure you always have a reusable cup somewhere at hand, for when you are in need of a coffee to-go. You don't have to buy an expensive reusable cup, just take a mug from the kitchen on the way out the door. Generally coffee baristas will be happy that you have your own cup and maybe even slightly amused if you have your favourite mug with you.

ONE MAN'S TRASH

If you need a new item for your home, ask people in your family or community if they have it spare or for sale. You don't need to buy everything new, so share, trade and give-away where you can. There are some incredible Facebook groups, pages, websites, garage sale sites, community gardens and veggie co-ops dedicated to reusing everyday items that you can explore.

BRIEF NOTES TEKAPO COMMUNITY BOARD

Meeting held April 24, 2018

Public Forum:

Craig Simcox presented a proposal from the Lions to enhance the tarn below the Tekapo Cemetery to create a passive, landscaped area for the enjoyment of all. Consultation is needed re land ownership and water supply. The CB recommended the proposal is forwarded to MDC for reports.

Matters Under Action/ Reports/ General Business:

- * Compacting bins at Hamilton Drive to have signage clarified and cost amended to \$2.
- * Agreement that the landscaped area between Air Safaris and Aotea to be named Tekapo Village Square; the grassed area beyond, the Village Green.
- * Solution for wheeled access through the Village Square ongoing.
- * Progress expected on the Eastern (Godley) carpark for bus parking.
- * Discussion continues around landscaping and protection of COGS. Also for the dog statue.
- * Education session for property managers and landlords regarding accommodation, on MDC agenda to schedule a meeting.
- * Suggestion (Steve Howes) that Community Hall needs some form of recent technology to improve it as a desirable facility especially for business meetings.
- * Community Hall fees and charges annual review: Hireage of Board Room and Main Hall to be differentiated. Also change naming to Local/ Commercial for clarity.
- * To recognise the contribution of previous MDC Mayor, Neil Anderson, it was proposed that Domain Rd be renamed Neil Anderson Way. Supported by CB to go through notification process.
- * Proposal from Colin Maclaren that the Lake Tekapo Footbridge be officially called 'Chris's Bridge' in recognition that without Chris's commitment and fundraising the bridge would not have been built. A suggestion from CB, that a plaque dedicating the foot bridge to Chris and giving some description of her contribution to the village also be considered. Process for making a decision needs to be clear. Colin's request to plant Scarlet Oaks on the south side of the Lake Tekapo Cemetery was supported.
- * Application for a mobile shop and trader's permit from William Beauchamp (seller and trader of nuts) received and granted with several conditions for a period of 12 months. The Mobile Trader Bylaw is under review, as is the suitability of the present location (old toilet block) given it is a valuable commercial space.
- * MDC noted 45 submissions made on the Long Term Plan, district wide. Also, a people counter on the Footbridge recording upward of 2000 per day with visitors to the Church increasing towards 4000 per day.
