Our History

"Guinness Down Under" at Burkes Pass

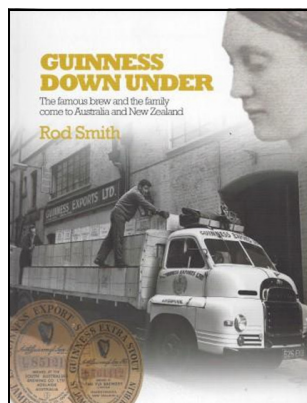
The story of how the iconic brew and the Guinness family came to Australia and New Zealand in the mid-1800s was presented recently by author and family historian Rod Smith. Accompanied by his wife Glennis, they were hosted by The Burkes Pass Heritage Trust to introduce his new book to a good turnout at Burkes Pass. First launched in Parliament Buildings, it was a contrast to come to the little pioneer church at Burkes Pass. Some members of the audience later unexpectedly revealed their own connections to the family. Afterwards local artist Julie Greig provided a warm welcome at the Burkes Pass Gallery for refreshments and the Burkes Brewing Company generously treated the group to a tasting of their range of local craft beer.

The book was inspired over 15 years ago by Glennis's 6th generation Guinness connection. The never-before-told story, records how four grandsons of Arthur and Olivia Guinness (founders of the famous stout brewery), made a new life Down Under, where many of their descendants remain to this day. One of these grandsons was Michael John Burke. The background to their stories is set in Ireland when Arthur Guinness started his brewery in the mid 1700's at a time when drinking ale was safer than the risk of drinking water. Produced in Dublin for over 250 years, three million pints are brewed there each day, and breweries in 50 countries produce the famous stout. An order from Wellington Hospital in the 1880s records its use as an early health supplement and many other reminders of the Guinness and Burke names remain today such as the Guinness Book of Records and the Guinness name in PGG.

Woven through the book are the imaginary reminiscences and letters of Sarah Anne Guinness (Glennis's great grandmother) who coming from a comfortable Irish vicarage, travelled with her family to Melbourne and later married, experiencing the hardships of life as a colonial wife and mother, in the remote north of New Zealand and Fiji. This adds a personal and heart-felt thread to the factual history.

The book has been meticulously researched, with pictures and information from over 300 people, forty libraries and archives here in NZ and overseas. It is beautifully written, described as utterly engaging and a book to be savoured, not just by those who love their pint of Guinness, but by all those interested in how Irish culture and tastes have shaped and continue to shape the lives of New Zealanders and Australians.'

A new exhibit has been loaned to the Fairlie Heritage Museum by the late Robert Bray Estate.

In 1925 Sidney Bray from 'Lilydale' in Sherwood Downs purchased a Model T Ford truck which he converted to a school bus. He thought his children would have a better education at the larger Fairlie School some 14 miles away and to demonstrate the feasibility of a bus service.

Sidney Bray paid Dennis (Dinny) O'Reilly to drive his children and others from the district into Fairlie for school. After 3 years the bus was withdrawn from service and a car was put on, as Sidney's oldest children could now drive the car.

The 2 original Model T school bus seats were retained by the Bray family and can be seen in this 1926 Chev truck which is a replica of the S.P. Bray school bus also known as the Donkey Bus.

Meaning of Place Name - Fairlie

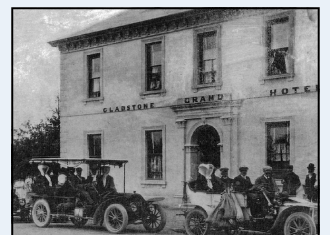
First known as Fairlies Creek, and supposedly named by David Hamilton, the brother-in-law of James Lister (or Lizter), a pioneer settler who set up an accommodation house beside the creek. At one time the name Hamilton was suggested but abandoned because of the prior claim of Hamilton in the North Island. David Hamilton then suggested Fairlie after the town in Ayresshire, where he and his wife had spent their honeymoon.

Fairlie Primary is involved in a programme called **ALiM (Accelerating**

Learning in Mathematics). This programme is designed to provide short-term intervention to accelerate the progress of students that are not progressing at the same stage or at the required rate to meet where they need to be by the end of the year.

The programme is in addition to effective classroom teaching and is presented to students over a 10 week course. At Fairlie Primary selected students will take part in maths twice a day. They will work on specific areas that has been identified as something they need to work on in testing. The aim during this intervention is to change the students mindset on maths and help them become more confident in voicing their answers and explaining it to others ,as well make accelerated progress towards the stage they need to be by the end of the year.

We are excited to see the results that the students produce.

Enviroschools Update

When the Enviroschool team completed their waste audit last term, we discovered that a lot of compostable food waste was getting into our general waste. This is a problem in terms of cost and environmental impact. We decided to do something about it. We applied for funding from Environment Canterbury to address the waste issue.

We are delighted to have been granted almost \$1,000 for the purchase of 'Hungry Bins' worm farms and Compost Caddies for each classroom. The children can now put their fruit skins and vegetable scraps into these bins.

The great thing is that the bi-product of this waste is nutrient rich worm juice and worm castings. These products are like 'super foods' for your garden. They will enable us to grow huge vegetables for use in cooking, for sale and for sharing with our community.

Another exciting development will be the addition of a huge 3m x 8m tunnel house for growing vegetables in cooler times. We can grow some vegetables in the winter and extend our growing season at each end. Students will benefit from this as a central feature our 'Food growing Hub' and will have a chance to see the process of food



production from sowing, to growing, to harvest to plate. This will be a wonderful opportunity for hands on, real life experiences right here at Fairlie Primary .



A 'puzzling time' at Fairlie Kindergarten

We recently received a donation from the Kimbell Residents Committee as a generous gesture of community goodwill.



We used these funds to purchase some new wooden puzzles for our children. These puzzles are individually crafted and designed by a New Zealand company Kidz Jigz.

Puzzle play supports learning across all strands of Te Whāriki. In particular, working with puzzles supports the Communication strand as children experience the symbols of their culture including that of numeracy and other mathematical concepts.

Through the Exploration strand children develop working theories about spatial understanding and they learn strategies for active exploration, thinking and reasoning.

Our students will have a workshop shed where they can store their tools (gardening and building), wood, building supplies and current projects. We thank Fonterra who have granted us \$821 for this project.

Our students have been looking at ways that they can reduce the waste that goes into our red bin. After completing a waste audit the students identified that the majority of our waste was from food (peels and cores). The students through action research came up with the idea of having our own chickens at school. The Mackenzie District EnviroSchools' Action Fund (a partnership between the Mackenzie District Council, Toimata Foundation and Environment Canterbury) will be funding this for us.

FAIRLIE FIRE BRIGADE



The Fairlie Fire Brigade had a steady month with 7 call outs

5 motor vehicle accident, 1 scrub fire and 1 alarm activation at Tekapo. Early last month the brigade got called to the port at Timaru to assist with the ship fire, Our crew were in breathing apparatus using a hose monitor to keep the hull cool, as well assisting the other brigades.

The brigade held its AGM in mid May. Chief Fire Officer Phill Mackay presented the 108th annual report .

During the year the brigade responded to 61 calls, which is down from the 63 last year. These are broken down to the following - 16 motor vehicle accident, 5 vegetation, 6 structure fires with damage, 1 private fire alarm, 4 smoke alarm investigations, 1 standby at Geraldine, 6 controlled burns, 8 assist St John, 8 assist Tekapo and 6 miscellaneous calls include car fires and flooding incidents.

The brigade has been busy with training and receiving new equipment. We have also busy in the community other than emergency response .The Brigade installed 18 smoke alarms ,participated in the New Years Day Parade, ANZAC Parade and demos at the A&P Show. One of the more interesting calls for the year was the rescue of a dog stuck down a cliff. This resulted in a response from Fairlie and a crew from Timaru utilizing their new skills with the lines equipment.

WINTER PRESENTS A UNIQUE ENVIRONMENT, GENERALLY WET, WINDY, COLD AND ICY

That means paths and roads should be approached with good tyres, grippy shoes and care. If it's a howling gale outside, stay indoors.

If you think you are going to lose power, find another source of cooking and heating. However, don't use a BBQ inside, as the fumes and the smoke and the gas may present a risk of fire or asphyxiation. Same applies with a portable gas fire, make sure there is vented air and moisture from the room.

Check your tyres on your car, and if you do need to travel make sure you have snow chains (and know how to use them), warm clothes and blankets or sleeping bags, just in case you get caught out and have to sleep in the car. Keep your speed down to compensate for the wet or icy conditions and make sure your anti-freeze is newly topped up.

If staying home, don't drape your drying clothes over a heater, especially if it is a panel heater on the wall, or those fire engines may well wash it all over again (and ruin the paint job you spent all summer getting right).

Check on your neighbours more often. They may need additional assistance with things like putting out their wheelie bins on the slippery paths. They may also enjoy a catch-up about the weather and to hear that you are ok as well. Don't assume because you haven't heard from them or seen them that they are ok. If they have fallen and it is winter then they may get too cold too quickly and not be able to get up.

Make sure your gutters are cleared, your drains unhindered and that your loose outside furniture is stacked and tied so the winter winds won't blow it away. If you have a trampoline either stash it away somewhere the wind won't grab it or turn it upside down in place and secure the edges.

Make sure your water supplies are stocked, your gas bottles are full, your warm jacket is handy and your gummies don't have holes in them. Mark your toby in case of snow!

I would just like to thank everyone that's helped me out recently by raising money towards my rehabilitation. The group of people that organised the TAP event in Tekapo, you guys done an amazing job it was a great night, I can't thank you guys enough there must have been a huge amount of work and preparation to organise such a cool event cheers guys! Mackenzie Community Library News

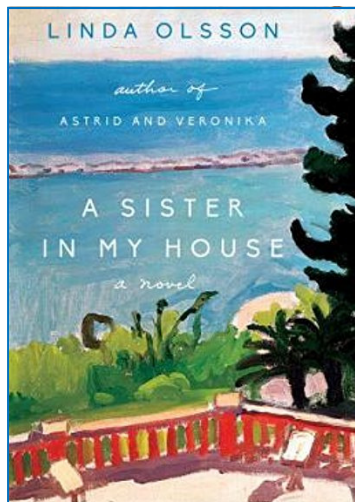

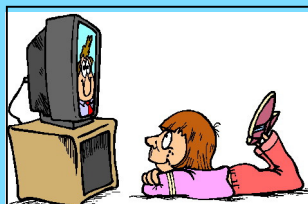

SOFT PLASTICS RECYCLING

The Love NZ Soft Plastics Scheme is about recycling soft plastic bags and wrappers because we've found new uses for them. Collect all the soft plastics which you use at home, make sure the bags are empty, clean and dry, and drop them into the **Love NZ Soft Plastics Recycling bins** at these participating stores in Timaru:



- Countdown - 9 Browne Street
- Countdown - 129 Church Street
- Pak n Save - Northtown Mall
- New World - Highfield Mall

Soft plastic packaging is not collected for recycling by councils because it can contaminate the recycling process. New Zealanders use over 1.6 billion plastic bags in the home every year. The project is supported by major brands and if one of your favourite brands isn't on board, let them know. We can only provide this recycling service because brands help pay for the collection, processing and recycling costs.

There actually isn't any value in soft plastics – its not like other recyclables like glass and aluminium - so we have to pay to have it recycled. That's why we need to have manufacturers and big brands contributing to the costs of recycling this soft plastic.

The project takes all soft plastic bags including bread bags, frozen food bags, confectionery and biscuit wrap, chip bags, pasta and rice bags, courier envelopes, shopping bags, toilet paper and other sanitary hygiene wrappers - basically anything made of plastic which can be scrunched into a ball.

Bring your used soft plastics back to store and put them in the recycling bin. The Packaging Forum organises the collection services for every participating store.



MAKE THESE SIMPLE POSITIVE CHANGES IN YOUR LIFESTYLE AND SAY GOODBYE TO A THROW AWAY CULTURE

- Take reusable bags with you.
- Plastic bags are the bane of the ocean. Like other plastic products littering our waterways and filling our landfills, plastic bags are ingested by sea creatures and birds who mistake them for food. And considering that 200,000 plastic bags are dumped into landfills each hour, using a reusable canvas bag is an easy way to avoid waste.
- Still have plastic bags around the home? You can recycle them. Put them in your bin!
- Getting take away? Say no to plastic straws, try and find places that avoid Styrofoam packaging, or better yet, BYO reusable containers!
- Styrofoam is notoriously problematic for the environment as it never fully breaks down in the environment and is derived from petroleum. By taking your own reusable containers with you when ordering take away, you're avoiding additional and forever-lasting waste that is often mistaken for food.
- Reuse everything you can and save money by avoiding over consumption
- Remember to pack a keep cup. Keep cups are the simple solution for waste generated by the Australian love of coffee. Considering that single-use coffee cups are often made from Styrofoam or lined with polyethylene, which makes them unrecyclable.
- Keep cups not only last longer, but are made from recyclable material. Glass and ceramic options are also available.

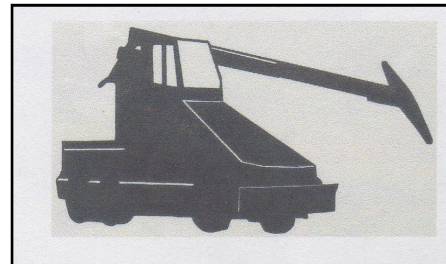

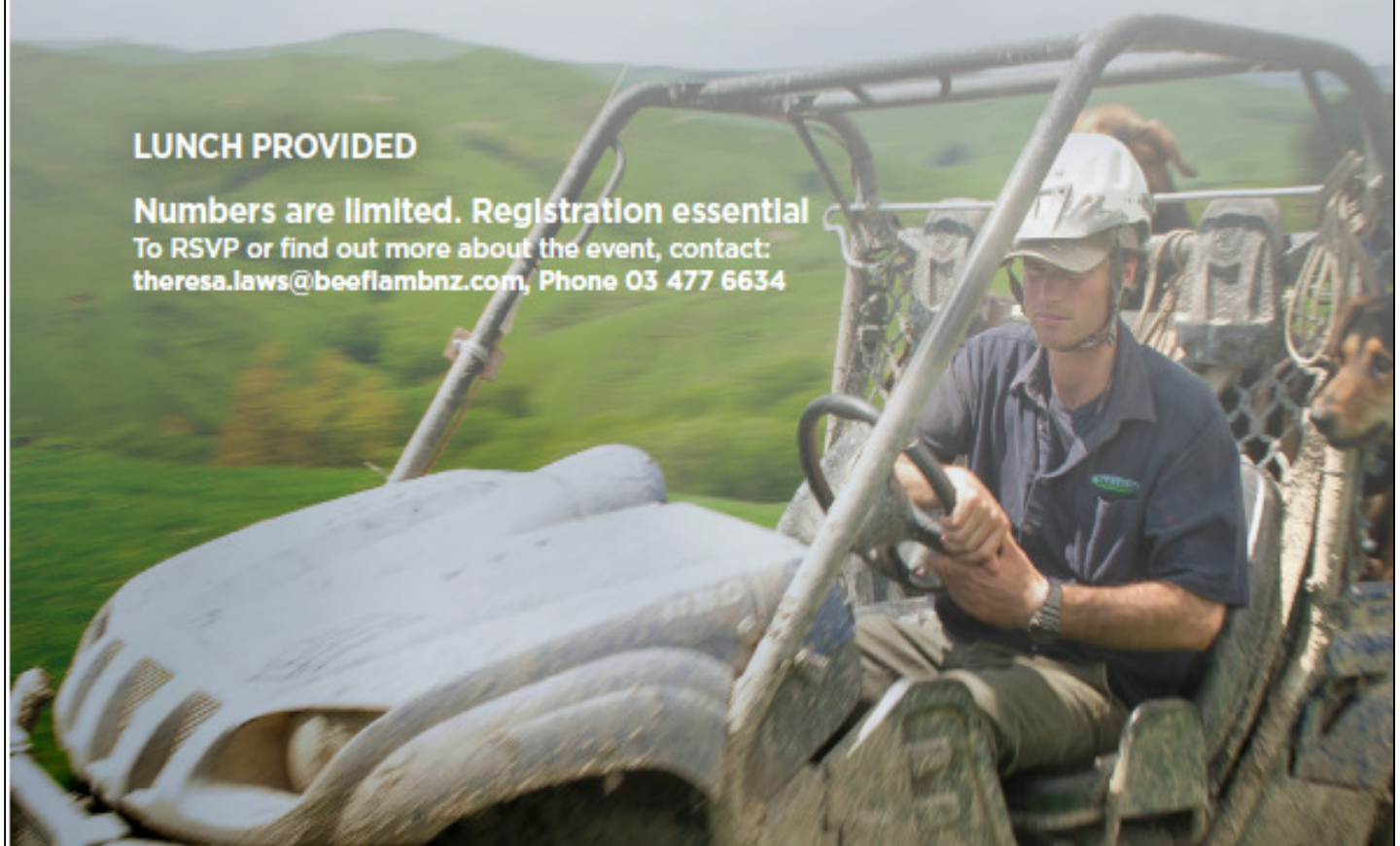
