## Taking care of our community

As more houses in the area are taken up as visitor accommodation and there are fewer people in residence, it has become increasingly important that people become more aware of what is going on in their neighbourhood. This applies to both urban and rural.

This not only applies to watching out for who is about, but also to keeping watch on these empty or irregularly occupied homes following heavy frosts and high winds. It is timely too to remind Airbnb and other accommodation providers to ensure your signage and instructions on how to get to your place is clear. We have some very startled people turning up in very unusual places looking for the place they have booked.

Residents have complained recently about the increasing amount of dog faeces on the streets about the town. This is either the result of irresponsible owners or the number of dogs being let loose at night to roam the town. Regent Street has been noted as one of the worst affected streets.

Residents have expressed dismay at the number of dogs let out onto our **Fairlie Village Green** to go to the toilet. This is disgusting when the area is used as a recreation area. Even locals seem to be taking their dogs into the playground area on the Village Green contrary to signage saying 'No dogs'. Surely it is obvious to people as to why they shouldn't have them there.

The message here is clear!  
Pick up your dog's poo (in McLean's Park too)  
and put it in the red bin!

## New responsibilities for landlords!

It is pretty obvious to tenants living in rental accommodation in the Mackenzie, if their home they live in is insulated. Condensation running down windows, damp rooms, wet walls – does not bode well for residents in these cold homes.

Landlords were given three years to complete these improvements. Updated insulation requirements for rental properties become law on July 1, 2019, requiring landlords to install or update ceiling and underfloor insulation in all rentals where it is reasonably practicable to install it. Information for landlords is available and will become law under the Residential Tenancies Act.

How will new rules apply?

- Landlords will be legally required to include insulation statements in all new tenancy agreements.
- Property owners must disclose whether there is insulation in the rental home, where it is, what type and what condition it is in, so tenants can make an informed decision about the property, the Tenancy Services website explained.
- If a statement about insulation is not included in a new agreement or includes false information, landlords can be liable for a \$500 penalty.
- Landlords could be fined \$4,000 from July 1 next year if they break the insulation laws. The money would be given to the tenant.

We seem to be getting through the winter quite well so far, but remember to stay alert out there and always drive to the conditions. The black ice and some of those shady areas can catch you out if you are not paying attention.

A Juicy Rental van with a couple of tourists lost control at Lake Tekapo when they braked on the icy road. The van left the road and rolled onto its side. The vehicle was badly damaged, but luckily there was no injury.

There was another crash at Lake Tekapo due to the following driver not paying attention. She failed to see the vehicle in front waiting to turn right, resulting in a hard impact nose to tail. Both vehicles sustained extensive damage, but luckily again there were no injuries.

It appears a vehicle has crashed through a deer fence on Hamilton Rd, probably due to hooning around and losing control. There was broken red tail light plastic left behind at the scene. If anyone has any knowledge of a vehicle that has recently broken a tail light, let me know. Any call anonymous or otherwise would be appreciated.

We continue to receive other reports of alarming driving behaviour on all the highways around the district. Stay alert out there and be prepared to take evasive action at any moment. Expect the unexpected.

A chicken and some rubber eggs were taken from a hen house on Butlers Rd.

There was a minor assault reported involving two mature males on Nixons Rd. Enquiries are continuing with possible charges pending.

There was an unusual burglary reported at a Musterers High Country Accommodation unit in Fairlie. The uninvited offender has found a key and stayed the night. A large hole was caused to the interior wall and a 30cm cut was done to the carpet. Inquiries are continuing with some leads to follow.

Another burglary was reported on Three Springs Rd where a child's quad motor bike was stolen from a garage during the day. The bike has since been returned and inquiries are continuing with identified suspects.

It was recently reported, but a few months ago that a cat was shot with a slug gun pellet which caused a lot of pain for the cat and the owner. This would have occurred around the Hamilton St end of Fairlie. If anyone has any information on anyone using a slug gun within the town boundaries, tell me about it also.

There were another two very successful firearms courses run recently at Albury. A big thanks to all the instructors who gave up their two weekends to make this possible.

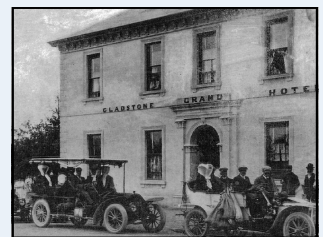

## Our History

### BRRRRING BRRRING!

Some fancy tune starts playing and we plunge our hand into our pocket or handbag for our palm-sized phone. Next moment we are chatting to someone from the other side of the world, or to one of the kids in a nearby bedroom. We take our phones for granted now; so accessible, so versatile, so common, that the modern child has one too. Compare its size to the supreme model of 100 years ago.

The Fairlie Heritage Museum has a selection of phones dating from 1910. But the first phones go back to the 1870s, when inventors from Hungary, Italy and America were trying to transmit voices across distance. Tele=far; phone=voice. The first were between 2 rooms. The Scottish-American, Alexander Graham Bell, won the race to patent this new device in 1876.

Originally owners paid for separate wires to be laid between each telephone. To attract the other owner's attention you had to whistle! Then you had to shout into the mouthpiece and strain your ears to hear the reply. The first long distance one-to-one line was laid in 1877.

Meanwhile Hungarian Tivadar Puskas, was inventing a switchboard, which in a central position, was able to connect many lines to each other. These were manually operated. Later versions, able to interconnect 100 phones, exist in the Fairlie Museum. They operated in the Fairlie Post Office, which opened in February 1909. (or 1907?) By 1893 many countries had telephone systems. Sweden led the way with 1 telephone owner to 181 persons. New Zealand, Norway and Switzerland were close behind, ahead of USA. And the most frequent users, then and now? Women.

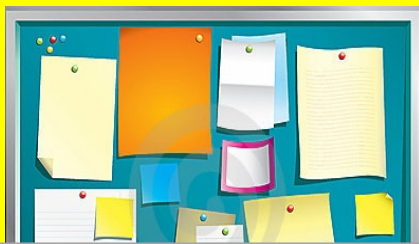

## Looking Forward to Term 3

While the school holidays are a time for students, teachers and support staff alike to catch up on some rest, relaxation and reflection, it is also a time for preparation for the term ahead. We welcome back Mrs Sophie Osborne who is returning from maternity leave. In Term 3 our teaching and learning focus is Change - Past, Present and Future. We will be making comparisons between time periods, in particular the way that people communicate and relate to one another. In the first week of the holidays Mrs Marshall attended a Maori Games workshop. She learnt not only about how to play the games, but also the history and stories behind them. These will be incorporated as part of the Term 3 focus.



## Prayers and Religious Education

We often get asked by parents looking at a Catholic Education about how much time is spent praying and on Religious Education. This is an excellent question as it is an area that seems like a mystery and so you may have heard a range of stories from people both in the Catholic system (past and present) or those not in the system too! Prayers - we begin our day with prayers for approximately 15 minutes. This a time to gather our thoughts, to be grateful, reflective and to care for those we know (family and friends) and those we do not (people in need). Prayers could be whole school, separate classes, student led, or teacher directed. Religious Education - our students have an extra curriculum area compared to those in a state school. As set out by the Bishops, we are to spend 2 hours a week on this curriculum area. However Religious Education is more of a way of being, and not just for our students - it is the way that we interact and treat one another in and out of the classrooms. When we fundraise for those in need (Pacific Island schools, Nepalese earthquake survivors etc) we are teaching Religious Education. When we visit Moreh, or make gifts or cards for those at risk we are teaching Religious Education. When we include others, or repair our friendships we are teaching Religious Education. It is not just in our words but in our actions too. This is a brief outline, but if you are interested in a Catholic Education for your child we highly recommend you come for a visit.

## CAT BITE ABSCESS

Cat fights, and their resulting injuries, are one of the most common reasons for a visit to your vet.



While cats living inside together will occasionally fight over territory or for their owners' affection this rarely leads to serious injury. However, when cats encounter other cats outside they are more likely to fight, usually over territory.

Cats' teeth are sharp, and when they do bite, puncture wounds are created. Cats' mouths contain a lot of bacteria and because the puncture wounds seal over quite quickly the bacteria injected into the skin becomes trapped. When this happens, white blood cells and bacteria accumulate to form a painful pocket of pus just beneath the skin, called an abscess. The most common locations for abscesses are the face and neck, tail, back and legs.

Intact males are usually at a higher risk than neutered males or females, as they are more likely to be roaming and fighting over territory.

Usually a cat that has been bitten appears to be fine after the encounter. However, over the next 2-4 days, bacteria deposited in the wound begin to multiply and the cat will develop a fever, become lethargic and will often stop eating. Many cats at this stage are seen by the vet, where the abscess will appear as a painful swelling. Usually puncture wounds or small lacerations will be present, and the affected area may feel warm. If not discovered at this early stage, the abscess will continue to swell, spreading through tissues and accumulating more pus. The abscess may then burst through the overlying skin, releasing creamy yellow or brownish, often malodorous pus. Overlying hair may become matted with dried discharge. The aim of treating abscesses is to prevent further contamination by cleaning the wound, removing any dead tissue and treating for infection.

Cats that have been bitten are also at risk of contracting Feline Immunodeficiency Virus (FIV), otherwise known as cat AIDS, so it is important to have cats that have been attacked checked out by your vet.

## Recipes for the Season!

It really is a shame to see lemons falling to the ground, unwanted, in so many properties away from the Mackenzie! If you have friends or relatives elsewhere with lemons going to waste – ask if you can bring some back to give away in Fairlie, and leave them outside Heartland to share!

### Lemon Delicious

Prep 20mins - Cook 30mins - Eat lovingly!

75g butter, melted	1 Tbsp lemon zest
1/3 c lemon juice	3 eggs, separated
1 c milk	1 c castor sugar
1/2 c self-raising flour	1 Tbsp icing sugar

- Preheat oven to 170°C fanbake. Grease an ovenproof dish to serve 4 to 6.
- Place butter, lemon zest, lemon juice, egg yolks and milk in a bowl then whisk to combine. Sift in caster sugar and flour, then stir again.
- In a clean bowl, beat egg whites until peaks form. Fold half the egg white into the lemon mixture then gently fold in the rest.
- Spoon mixture into prepared dish and place in a larger baking dish. Pour enough boiling water into larger baking dish to come half way up the smaller dish. Bake for 25-30 minutes until golden brown and just set. Dust with icing sugar.

## Parliamentary Commissioner for the Environment

Te Kaitiaki Taiao a Te Whare Pāremata

Parliamentary Commissioner for the Environment Simon Upton has urged the Government to take a lead in dealing with the confusion surrounding biodegradable and compostable plastics.

"There are all sorts of supposedly environmentally-friendly plastics coming onto the market, but it is extremely difficult for consumers to make sense of their respective claims," said the Commissioner.

The problem is that whatever impact biodegradable plastics may have on the environment depends very much on what they are made from and, critically, how and where they are disposed of.

"There is a surprising degree of complexity at play here. One can't simply toss these products onto the compost heap, or into our recycling bins, and go away thinking 'job done'," said Mr Upton.

The Commissioner has released an online resource to help concerned consumers tackle the complexities of the issue, but he says the Government needs to step in and assume greater responsibility.

"The array of environmental claims being made about plastic packaging can lead to misunderstandings on the part of even the most environmentally conscious citizens," he said.

"I am pleased that Minister Sage has acknowledged the issue, but there is a bigger role for the Government to play in providing much needed guidance and regulation." ## Orari Temuka Opihi Pareora Water Zone Committee

### Protecting the Kakahu River

A new approach to improve the water quality of the Kakahu River - and save time and money for landowners - has been given the go-ahead.

Environment Canterbury has approved the Kakahu catchment-wide consent to install sediment traps as an action to improve water quality and help protect populations of native fish and invertebrates in the Kakahu River. Previously, the landowner would have had to apply and pay for an individual land use consent.

An Environment Canterbury land management advisor has been working closely with the Kakahu Catchment Group to identify locations for these traps to be installed in the catchment, where they will reduce run-off and erosion into the waterway.

The Kakahu Catchment Group has representatives of the farming community, Forest and Bird, Port Blakely (Forestry) and rural consultants who live in the catchment and are actively involved in improving water quality.

Reducing sediment in local waterways is a priority for the Orari Temuka Opihi Pareora Water Zone Committee.

## FUNDING APPROVED FOR LED LIGHTING THAT MEETS INTERNATIONAL DARK SKY RESERVE REQUIREMENTS

NZTA has approved funding for new 2200k LED light fittings that will meet the requirements of the Mackenzie Basin's International Dark Sky Reserve gold status.

The Mackenzie District Council has been working towards replacing the district's light fittings to more energy efficient, longer-life LED light fittings and had applied to NZTA for funding.

"Usually NZTA subsidises the use of 3000k or 4000k fittings. On this occasion we've been able to work together to get special approval for the use of 2200k fittings and still retain a very favourable subsidy," says Mackenzie District Council Group Manager Assets, Bernie Haar.

The Mackenzie Basin is the Southern Hemisphere's only International Dark Sky Reserve.

The 2200k fittings are more orange in colour appearance which is beneficial for viewing the night sky as there is less blue light emission.

"We're delighted that NZTA have recognised the importance of the Mackenzie Basin's gold star status as an International Dark Sky Reserve," Mr Haar said.

Existing street lights in the Mackenzie District will be replaced with the new LED lights over the next year. LED lights last longer, use half the amount of power and require less maintenance.

NZTA provided 85% of the funding for the LED lights, while the balance is from Council funds. The total cost of the replacement programme is \$795,000. Through NZTA's Financial Assistance Rate, councils can apply for funding to upgrade lighting to LED lights.

**Community Preparedness is everyone's responsibility.**

We're halfway through July and with winter being extremely mild so far - half of us are celebrating, the other half may be nervous about what is around the corner!

Very rarely do we get advance warnings when it comes to emergency events. The only exception is with some adverse weather events.

What do most of us do when we get warning of an extreme weather event approaching our district? We might get extra milk and bread, or we might check our gas bottle or fuel for the generator. We might ensure that the trampoline is tied down or any other loose items are secured away inside. All these actions are very prudent.

But what happens if we don't get any warning and we are thrown into an emergency? If all those things are already done, that will mean that as an individual or family we are more prepared. This will then mean that as a community we are more able to assist ourselves and others to get through the emergency.

As part of our emergency preparedness we also need to test our systems and ensure that all family members understand any particular safety measures. One key safety measure is to ensure that you don't bring in outside gas appliances into an enclosed area, as they need to be vented to the outside. An example of this would be the BBQ or patio heater. These appliances emit a large amount of carbon monoxide which is toxic to us and our pets.

Care must also be taken around the location of generators and where the exhaust gases are going. They shouldn't be located under homes or inside attached garages, as carbon monoxide is emitted and this can be deadly.

Family preparedness should be celebrated and shared, so talk to your neighbours or friends about what you have prepared and ask what they have done. There are some fantastic ideas out there. There are always new families shifting into our community and they may not be aware of the significant issues that we might face. By having that conversation early with them we will enable another family to be prepared for an emergency.

The Mackenzie District has numerous fault lines throughout the district and we always need to be conscious of the effects of a large earthquake impacting our communities. Which of you felt the M4.1 earthquake located on the Irishman Creek fault last Tuesday 10 July at 10:23 pm? According to Geonet reports, 51 people felt this throughout the district. Although going by conversations around town, many more people than that felt the shake.

### Borrow Bags Mackenzie

The aim is to reduce the use of single use plastic bags in the Mackenzie. Groups are working throughout the district, making Borrow Bags for their launch in the community in early September.

Borrow Bags is a concept that has evolved to help reduce our use of plastic bags. The Borrow Bags are made of fabric, mostly recycled and carrying the Borrow Bags Mackenzie logo. The aim is to educate residents of the Mackenzie about using these bags when shopping and returning them to the source when not needed. It is hoped that the supermarkets, who are the biggest user of plastic bags, will come on board and help the Mackenzie as a District to adopt the idea.

Hence the cutting, ironing and sewing of the bags! In Fairlie there will be suitcases on the street containing the bags as well. Have a look at the way Geraldine does that!

Now how can they stop visitors taking these bags out of the Mackenzie? They can't. But if shop assistants know about the bags and residents know what to do, then if a bag goes elsewhere, it is still reducing the use of the plastic bags.
