It has been a hectic first two weeks at the Red Stag Restaurant, hence the reason why it has taken a while to introduce the new owners, Carla and Bruce Gibson, to the Fairlie community. Carla and Bruce have moved from Christchurch to pursue this new venture, bringing with them, for a short while, their son Bevan.

For Carla, this move is significant. She has been teaching for 35 years both in secondary and primary schools on the Kapiti Coast, north of Wellington, Picton and for the last 5 years at Hornby High School in Christchurch. She is however, not a complete stranger to the hospitality industry. Her mother was an avid cook and baker, so grew up around the food industry. Carla and Bruce also operated "Sovereign Cruises" firstly out of Wellington Harbour and then moving this business south to the glorious Marlborough Sounds, where they provided a glorious setting and food for events such as weddings, 21<sup>st</sup> birthdays and fishing excursions. Owning a little café or bakery had long been Carla's dream, how that ended up being a full-scale restaurant operation she is still unsure, but totally fell in love with the magnificent "Rimuwhare" historic homestead.

Bruce who was not only the skipper on "The Sovereign", has a background in marketing and along with the Red Stag, continues to operate "Online New Zealand", a web-site development and hosting company.

They have been overwhelmed with the support they have received so far from the people of Fairlie and also the friendliness of the community, which speaks volumes for the character of this little town, accepting newcomers with open arms.

The Red Stag is currently open for dinner from 5.30 pm every night and for private events and functions, however within the next couple of weeks, the Red Stag will also restart a café-style lunch menu. Carla, Bruce and Bevan also have an interest and love of music, particularly country, 60's and 70's, as Carla's school pupils used to say "old school". They hope to be able to incorporate this interest into the business, starting with a karaoke evening in the very near future.

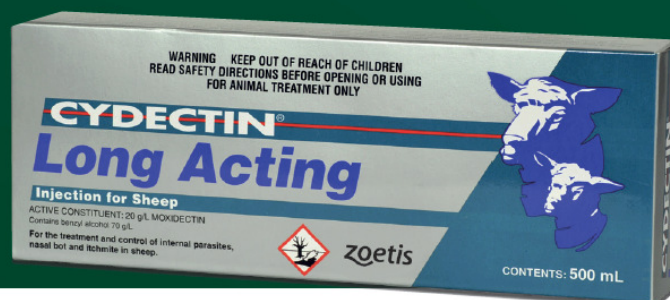

### ARMISTICE CENTENARY - 2018

At 11.00 am on 11 November this year, Aotearoa New Zealand will mark the centenary of the armistice that ended the First World War in 1918.

Although news of the Armistice reached a New Zealand ravaged by the lethal influenza pandemic, it was met with widespread celebration. Bells rang, sirens sounded and children banged on kerosene tin drums. Communities came together, parades filled bunting-lined streets followed by dances and bonfires that continued into the night.

Details of the official plans for the centenary have now been announced by Acting Minister for Arts, Culture and Heritage Carmel Sepuloni. A series of public events will be held at Pukeahu National War Memorial Park in Wellington, in addition to a number of activities designed to support communities across New Zealand to engage in the commemorations.

#### *How will we celebrate this event in the Mackenzie?*

The local RSA holds a service for the community at 11.00 am on the 11<sup>th</sup> of November at Albury!

The statue of Trooper Mackenzie was created to commemorate the beginning of World War One.

Perhaps we should be celebrating and remembering the end of that horrific war in some lasting fashion.

### HOUSEHOLD DANGERS TO YOUR PETS

Just as parents 'childproof' their homes, so should pet owners pet-proof theirs. Four-legged family members, just like toddlers and children, are naturally curious and will explore their surroundings with their paws, claws and mouths. Hopefully the following tips will help keep your pet safe and accident free while in your care.



#### AROUND THE HOUSE

- \* Puppies and kittens love to chew when they are teething, so unplug, cover or remove electrical cords.
- \* Plastic bags can be fun to play with, but they can suffocate.
- \* Dangerous household chemicals such as bleach and ammonia should be stored out of reach.
- \* Close washing machine and dryer lids – your pet might climb in and become trapped.
- \* Keep toilet lids down – small pets can actually drown if they fall in.
- \* Medicines, shampoo, sunscreen and other personal care items can kill your pet. Make sure they can't get hold of them.
- \* Some common foods are toxic to pets eg, chocolate, onions, grapes.

#### IN THE GARAGE AND OUTDOORS

- \* Cats enjoy naps near a warm engine so, before you drive off, toot your horn and make sure your pet is not under or near the car.
- \* Pets, especially cats, like the smell and taste of anti-freeze and windscreen washer. These chemicals can easily kill your pet. Tightly cover containers and wipe up any spillage.
- \* *Rat bait is extremely tempting for dogs to eat, yet it is very poisonous and can be fatal. It should not be accessible at anytime.*
- \* Keep pets away from lawns and gardens treated with snail bait or chemicals.
- \* Some outdoor plants, eg Lillies, Ivy, Oleander, Azalea, Foxglove, Hydrangea, Morning Glory, Nightshade, Rhododendron, Yew and many more can be poisonous. Many plants can also be responsible for allergies in our pets.

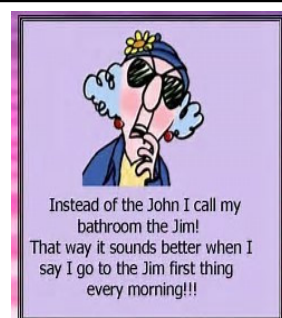

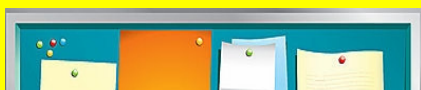

#### **Country Hero by Holly Ford** (NZ Author)

*A standalone novel following on from The Last McAdam, High Country Hero tells the story of ex-Afghan War helicopter pilot Mitch Stuart and a chance meeting in a country pub that will change his life forever. Having brokered a fragile peace with his demons at last, Mitch isn't in the market for redemption. But when he steps outside his comfort zone to help a stranger, he inadvertently opens the door to the ghosts of a woman he thought he'd left behind him long ago. This is a story about loyalty, love and the courage to make a change. Holly Ford grew up in a farming community in Southland's Hokonui Hills. She now shares her own small patch of hill country on Banks Peninsula with her husband and dog. Packed with gutsy women who aren't afraid to take what they want, Holly's novels celebrate life and love in some of the world's most rugged farming country.*

### Recipes for the Season!

#### Slow Cooker Beef Casserole



600g casserole steak  
1 onion, chopped thickly  
2 medium carrots, sliced thickly  
1 leek - sliced  
2 tbsp plain flour  
1 tsp Worcestershire sauce  
1 tbsp fresh thyme (if possible otherwise 1 tsp dried)  
2 bay leaves  
3 cups beef stock  
1 tbsp soy sauce

Cut beef into cubes. Season with salt and pepper, add about 2 tablespoons of oil and mix well. Heat a large fry pan over a medium-high heat. Brown the beef in batches then place in slow cooker.

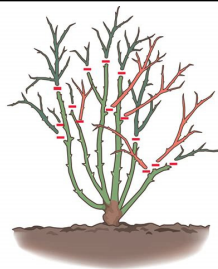
Reduce heat in pan, and sauté the onion and carrot and leek in oil. Cook for 1-2 minutes, stirring occasionally. Sprinkle in flour and stir until the vegetables are coated.

Gradually pour in stock, stirring well. Add the remaining ingredients and bring to the boil. Pour into a slow cooker, and place onto low for 6 hours or until the meat is tender. Depending on size and cut this can take up to 8 hours.

Great served with mashed potato and mashed swede!

- **Cigarette: 1-12 years**
- **Fishing line: 600 years.**
- **Glass bottle: 1-2 million years**
- **Aluminum can: 200 years**

### What happens to our recycling?

Once you have rinsed your milk bottle and thrown it in your yellow bin it is easy to feel that you have done the right thing and forget about it. But, where does it go?

All recycling collected at your kerb side is taken to EcoCentral, a sorting centre in Christchurch. This is a specially built facility made of conveyor belts, magnetic grabs, puffs of air and optical sorters that skillfully separates all the different types of material. These are then bundled up and sent to a range of locations to be recycled into new products. So, YES, our recycling is recycled!

Glass is an exception to this system. This is sent to a local facility in Twizel where it is crushed and used in roading material. It is important to remember to put glass in your blue crate, if glass goes in the yellow bin our district has to pay more to transport it to Christchurch and it may not get recycled.

Keep up the great recycling Mackenzie!

## Further Facilities Upgrades in the Mackenzie District

New toilets, an upgrade to Tekapo's effluent dumping facilities and new compacting rubbish bins are all part of a suite of projects just completed in the Mackenzie District and co-funded by central government.

In Tekapo, a new public Permaloo toilet block with five unisex toilets has been installed opposite the Lake Tekapo Water Ski Club on Lakeside Drive. The toilets are expected to be available for use this week.

The town's effluent dump station has also been upgraded, with the installation of an additional dumping facility and improvements to vehicle access.

A public toilet has also been installed at Burke's Pass (pictured below).



Two coin-operated compacting rubbish bins have also been purchased. One is installed at the Tekapo dump station, while the other is being used in Twizel but will be installed at Lake Alexandrina over the summer months.

The total cost of these projects was \$545,000, with Mackenzie District Council contributing 44% of the funding. The remaining funds came from central government's regional mid-sized tourism facilities grant fund administered by the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment.

The grant fund has previously been used to co-fund an upgrade of The Pines camp ground facilities at Lake Pukaki. It is also being used to co-fund an upgrade of the toilets at the Mt Cook lookout—this work is currently underway.

Mackenzie District is among a group of high tourism but low-population areas that has growing infrastructure needs. This central government fund provides co-funding for infrastructure used by visitors and locals, such as carparks, toilets, rubbish disposal and minor water management projects.
