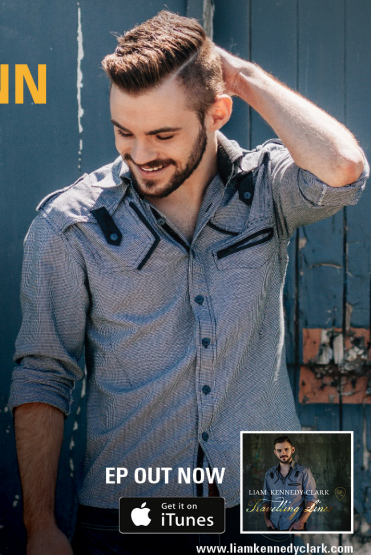

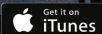



Mackenzie Amateur Swim Club

Keen on swimming and you can competently swim free-style/backstroke/breaststroke (butterfly optional but this is a great opportunity to learn)? The Mackenzie Amateur Swim Club has two great options:

Option 1 - Squad (competitive swimmers, 2 training sessions per week) for those wanting to compete in carnivals over the summer – 4 main local carnivals plus plenty more that you can work towards – and if you qualify you can swim at the South Island Country and Town championships.

Option 2 - Non-competitive swimmers (training once a week) – you will still be required to compete in at least 2 carnivals. These carnivals are a great opportunity to swim against your own personal best times and if you beat your times you receive a ribbon.

Training starts in November and continues during the school holidays with only a brief break over the Christmas period. BALANCE

We are told in life, this is what we need! Balance home and work life, balance good foods with the odd sneaky “not so good for you” foods, etc. I want to talk about physical balance!

As we age, our ability to balance decreases. If we have had a few injuries along the way, this will add to the difficulties we can experience with balance.

Sometimes we may not even be aware that our balance has got poor, can't remember when we didn't sit down to put undies on or off, or socks as we age even more, walking balance can get a bit scary, we might walk with our feet a bit wider apart, or constantly look at the ground as we walk - it sneaks up on us!

The good news is that it is reversible! Unless the balance issues are related to inner ear problems or some other medical issue, you can improve your balance!

Please try these simple tests to check your balance. Stand side on to a table or bench top for safety.

- ♦ Step 1 - Stand on a firm surface with your feet together, inside borders of your feet touching. Stand up tall and look straight ahead. Can you manage for 10 seconds without wobbling or moving a foot?
- ♦ Step 2 - Stand with one foot slightly in front of the other, but both feet still touching. Again, stand tall and looking forward. Are you able to manage that for 10 secs?
- ♦ Step 3 - One foot completely in front of the other, stand tall and looking straight ahead. As if standing on a tightrope. 10 secs again.
- ♦ Step 4 - Are you able to stand on one leg, stand tall for 10 secs? And the other?

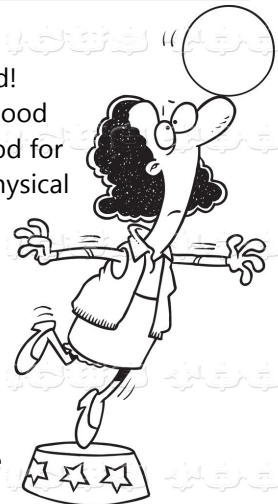
If you have any concerns with your balance, there is help available. In Fairlie and Tekapo there is the “Stay on your Feet” programme, a home based programme to help regain lost balance. Ask at the Fairlie Medical Centre and be referred. It will cost you nothing and may save a fall.

Also, coming soon to our area is a newly funded ‘Strength and Balance’ class for over 65 year olds. Again, if this is of interest to you, ask to be referred at the Medical Centre or alternatively give me a ring and leave your details on my answer machine or send me an e mail.

Lets stop falls before they start and feel fitter, stronger and safer for longer!

Fairlie Swimming is supported by Heartlands Resource Centre to encourage our Mackenzie kids to swim. A few discussion points and common questions are: what is the difference between school swimming and our swim programs? Once you have reached the Level 5 of the holiday program what is beyond the Level 5 achievement?

School Swimming: The school curriculum clearly states that teachers jobs in terms of swimming are to teach water confidence and safety only. There are guidelines on the Kiwi Swim Safe Programmes on the Swim NZ website. Albury Primary have their own pool and so does Lake Tekapo Primary School, which is awesome.

Fairlie Swimming also follows the Swim NZ guidelines:

Level 1 Confidence and submerging happily
 Level 2 Float, glide, kick and arms - good position
 Level 3i Breathing 15m freestyle, backstroke
 Level 3ii Breaststroke leg and arm action
 Level 4i 25m Freestyle / Backstroke and Breaststroke
 Level 4ii Safe Dives / Dolphin kicks (butterfly)
 Level 5 50m Freestyle, Backstroke and Breaststroke

Beyond Level 5: is the Mastery of all strokes, Increased distance for freestyle, backstroke and breaststroke. Full stroke butterfly. Individual medley, tumble turns, Race diving, starts and finishes. Competency as an all round swimmer.

January Learn to Swim Programme: follows the Swim NZ guidelines and starts from age 5 years and up to Level 5, a big focus on water safety rescue actions, improvised floatation, survival backstroke, H.E.L.P, Clothed survival; Group Safety Initiatives, 25m sidestroke. This course issues Certificates and is run in the holiday for 6 half hour sessions over 6 mornings. The consecutive lessons in a row, really shows great progression and results. This year the January Learn to Swim programme is being co-ordinated by Fairlie Swimming. The programme will continue as it has done in the past years with the added workshops either side of the swim lessons, simply to focus on other skills and techniques for breaststroke, butterfly, tumble turns, starts, finishes, and dives.

Fairlie Little Swimmers (Parent in the Pool groups), a five week program runs in February to March on Saturday mornings. Classes only run if we have enough numbers, so put your name down if you think this class is for your little swimmer.

Monthly Swim races in Timaru are on the first Wednesday of the month, these races are easy noncompetitive races swim races. If you are interested and we have enough numbers, we will organize a community van.

Our Wider District - Tekapo

TEKAPO COMMUNITY BOARD UPDATE

New developments are proceeding within the village, albeit slowly. Some great initiatives from local groups - the Regional Park Trust, Tekapo Trails and Lions.

- Billy Kerr and Simon Waymouth from the Regional Park have presented a proposal for a Disc Golf and Pump Park. This will provide low cost activities for both visitors and locals. Work has already begun and a grant to support this work will be requested from the CB.
- Tekapo Trails presented signage for new and existing trails including Cowans Hill, Mt John, a new Sawdon Track on Sawdon Station and Lake MacGregor. Some funding has been approved for signage.
- Lions proposal to tidy the area known as the Kettle Tarn, near the cemetery, is approved subject to conditions around any future changes.
- The Dog Statue: Concerns around its development were shared by Walter and Zita Speck and addressed by MDC staff and the CB. Agreement that a design for its protection (to prevent people climbing up and damaging the stone-work etc) needs only a simple tidy-up with an improved pathway. Car parking is a challenge that remains to be resolved separately.
- Church of the Good Shepherd: Plans for protective structures that still allow a flow of people are now final. Parking will be reduced; the project is aimed to be finished for the summer 'season'.
- Village Square: noted the ramp for the middle section has now been installed to enable full access for wheel-chairs etc.
- Playground: Equipment has now been in storage for a long time. The CB wants to see some in place, on the agreed site in the Domain adjacent to the flying fox, by October.
- Long vehicle carpark: Contractors have been lined up to begin this project
- 60km speed limit extension: Mayor Smith has again approached NZTA with community concerns and progress is now expected. Still an aim to pursue a further reduction to 50km!
- Mobile Trading in the village: There are options for suitable locations, one yet to be decided.
- Request to rename the Tekapo Footbridge to recognise Christine MacLaren: A majority vote has recommended the change to MDC for consideration. Most likely MacLaren Footbridge.
- Visitor accommodation: The proliferation of rentals in Residential Zone 1, and the erosion of any meaning of residential, remains the major concern of village residents. Any rule changes need to come through the District Plan, which is recognised as no longer fit for purpose. Residents' concerns were reflected in the feedback on the Long Term Plan.

Additional Note: The CB is following up with NZTA re cutting down of Pinus Coulteri opposite Lilybank Road, as it is not a pest/wilding. Next meeting 12 September 2018.

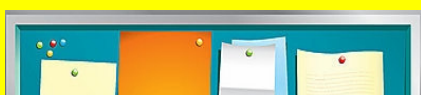
So what's changing?

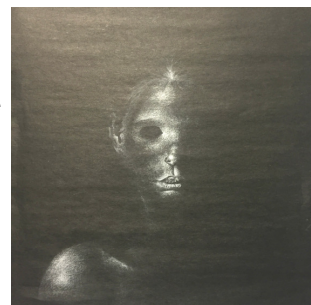

ALBURY SCHOOL



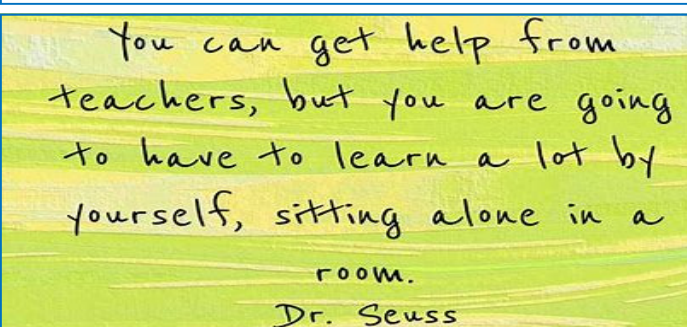

Cooking - Mr Tonkin and Mrs Scott, Fairlie Primary School Staffroom

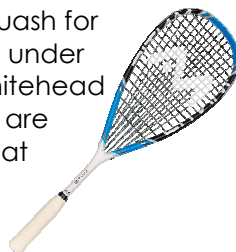

Mackenzie Community of Learning (Kahui Ako)

The Mackenzie region is very fortunate to have begun our journey as a Community of Learning (CoL). Our CoL includes Fairlie Area Kindergarten, Fairlie Early Learners, St Joseph's Fairlie, Fairlie Primary School, Albury School, Lake Tekapo School, Aoraki Mt Cook School and Mackenzie College.

Staff from these organisations met for the very first Mackenzie CoL Day on Friday 3 August. This day had the theme of 'Getting to know each other' and participants learnt much about each others strengths, backgrounds and interests. This information will be valuable moving forward as the CoL looks to set achievement challenges, and appoint across and in-school teachers. Lead Principal Ginny Neal and Expert Partner Lesley Brown will use information collected on this day to look at next steps which will include a consultation period. Participants were also involved in an afternoon session with Dr Christina Thornley from the Education Council, Wellington who updated staff on the new standards for teachers. We were fortunate to have such a skilled and knowledgeable speaker come to Fairlie to present.

The government's policy, Investing in Educational Success (IES) announced in 2014, seeks to lift educational achievement by establishing Communities of Learning Kāhui Ako (CoL). The policy encourages collaboration across, and within, early childhood services, kura and schools, and new leadership roles that have been established to oversee and co-ordinate the work of CoL.

IES is intended to raise the learning (ākō) and achievement of all our children and young people particularly for ākonga/students that are most at risk of underachieving. It will enable a system wide lift for all ākonga/student achievement by:

- Encouraging greater collaboration between kura/schools across the schooling system.
- Recognising, supporting and using professional expertise across the system where it is needed most.
- Enhancing opportunities for teacher-led innovation of new and good practice, to make clearly visible what is possible, new and exciting.

IES provides resources to help ensure that the work of teachers, tumuaki/principals, Boards of Trustees, and the system is supported in ways that build teachers' individual and collective capacity to attend to the needs of every student.

The evidence shows that when kaiako/teachers engage in collaborative professional problem solving, focused on the impact of teaching on learning (ako) for students, they can deliver significant and sustained improvement in students' educational outcomes. The Community of Learning is an exciting initiative which will enhance learning opportunities for all children/ tamariki in the Mackenzie. We look forward to keeping our wider community updated. Nga mihi nui.

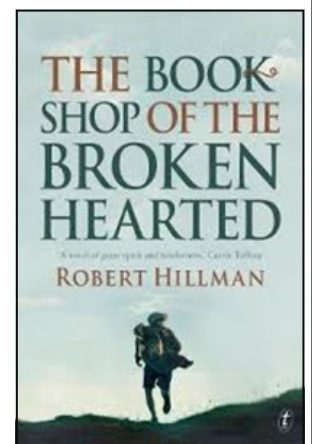

The not-so-fun facts:

- Almost half of the plastic existing today has been produced during the last 15 years.

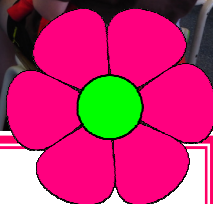

EMERGENCY PREP FOR YOUR FAMILY PET

In previous articles I have quoted the national civil defence advice that everyone needs to be self reliant for 3 days minimum, and in more remote locations up to a week. This includes food, water and methods of cooking food.

The often forgotten member of the family when doing preplanning for emergency preparedness is your family pet, or in the case of lifestyle block owners, your live-stock (horses, alpacas, goats and any other form of domesticated animals).

When planning for your pets, give thought to two possible scenarios for an emergency situation. The first scenario is where you and your pets are able to stay in your home. In this case, you will need their food, water and any medication for a minimum of three days.

The second scenario is when you might need to evacuate your home. To help you plan for your pets' needs in that scenario, the following are some suggestions:

- ⇒ Minimum 3 days of food and water, bowls and can opener if required.
- ⇒ Leash, muzzle, harness, or any other piece of specialised equipment.
- ⇒ Litter pan with some spare litter.
- ⇒ Pet carrier for transportation .
- ⇒ Medical records, especially proof of vaccinations as most boarding facilities will not accept pets without proof of current vaccinations, and medications.
- ⇒ Current photo of your pet in case they run off.
- ⇒ Written information on your pets feeding schedule, behavioural/ medical concerns, and any other special instructions in case your pets are getting boarded.
- ⇒ Also consider micro chipping your pets in case they run off or get lost. Have a record of their registration number.

For larger animals, consider ways to evacuate them and alternative locations to graze them. We just need to think back to the Port Hills fires and the number of horses and other large animals that had to be evacuated in a hurry and then housed for a period of time.

Like all preplanning, the aim is to lessen the stress for everyone during an emergency. The more prepared you are, the less impact the emergency event will have on you and your extended family, which will enable you to return to life as normal as soon as possible after the event.

HOW TO AVOID BLOAT IN PET LAMBS

Bloat in pet lambs happens when bugs in the stomach produce too much gas. The lamb cannot get rid of this gas and as a result, a bloated stomach occurs which can be very painful as well as life threatening.

Bloat can be prevented by making your milk into yoghurt before you feed the lamb. To do this:

1. Make up 2 feeds worth of milk in a bucket with a lid (big enough that the milk only fills to half way) using warmer water than normal, but not boiling.
2. Add a 1 litre container of unsweetened natural yoghurt to the bucket and mix well.
3. Put the bucket in the hot water cylinder cupboard for 6-12 hours, until the mixture thickens - the mixture can look like crusty cream cheese, bubbly milkshake, or thick yoghurt.
4. When feeding the lamb/s, whisk the mixture and remove as much as the lamb needs for its feed. You can add a small amount of water if the yoghurt/milk mix is too thick.
5. Make up an equal volume of milk replacer to what you have removed and whisk it into the bucket. The mixture can be cleaned out and started again as needed. Yoghurt mix will last up to 5 days in a cool place.

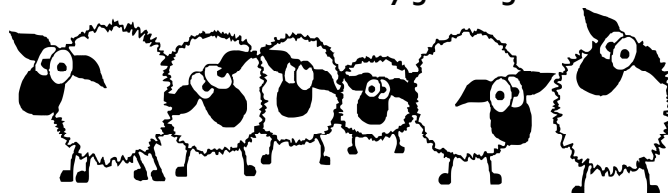

SURVEY RESULTS SHOWS RESIDENTS ARE GENERALLY SATISFIED

Respondents to Mackenzie District Council's 2018 resident opinion survey are generally satisfied with the district's services, facilities and delivery. Satisfaction levels for many services and facilities increased or remained consistent with previous years.

Satisfaction levels for community facilities generally show a consistently high trend. In total, 97% of respondents were satisfied with Council's management of cemeteries, while 96% were satisfied with library services. Ninety-two percent of respondents were satisfied with the district's parks, reserves and play-ground facilities, community halls and buildings.

Although a lower number of respondents said they were satisfied with the district's public toilet facilities (74%), this represented a 12% increase when compared with satisfaction levels recorded in last year's survey. This increase in satisfaction levels has been achieved in the context of significant pressures from increasing tourist and visitor numbers.

Compared with the 2017, survey respondents were slightly more satisfied with the services provided for storm water and surface flooding (83%), footpaths (87%), sewage treatment and disposal (94%) and rubbish collection and recycling (79%).

Satisfaction with water supply and quality services, decreased slightly from 76% to 74%. While the survey indicated that Tekapo residents were mostly likely to be satisfied with water supply and quality services (96%), Twizel residents indicated the lowest satisfaction level (60%).

There was an increase in positive perceptions around the Council's management of resource management issues. In total, 73% of respondents agreed or somewhat agreed that resource management issues were well-managed—representing an increase from 63% in 2017. A total of 86% of respondents either agreed or somewhat agreed that the Council was well-prepared for a civil defence emergency.

In other areas, 80% of respondents were satisfied or somewhat satisfied with Council's delivery of tourism promotion and economic development; 84% were satisfied with Council's communications approach, and 79% were satisfied or somewhat satisfied with the performance of staff and management. Overall 67% of ratepayers believed that the Council delivered value for money.

"The survey indicates that in most areas the Council is meeting our communities' expectations. This feedback is a credit to the hard work of our Council and staff yet there's always more we can do, and our aim is to continue to deliver the best possible outcomes for our communities," says Mayor Graham Smith.



BOOK EARLIER FOR BUILDING INSPECTIONS

There's plenty of building work going on in the Mackenzie District and the Council is streamlining its timeframes for building inspections accordingly.

"There's significant growth in building, particularly in commercial development in Tekapo and residential development in Twizel. This means the Council is receiving more requests than usual for building inspections. It's great to see positive growth and there's some really exciting projects coming to fruition. However, this also puts additional pressure on our building team" says Council's Group Manager Regulations, Karina Morrow.

During this period of higher demand, builders would need to book in building inspections 3-5 days in advance, rather than 1-2 days ahead.

"This three to five-day timeframe is still very reasonable and puts us on a par with most other Councils. It means we can still provide the best possible service. This change will help us get through this busy period without the need to employ additional staff at a cost to ratepayers," Ms Morrow said.

- Wandering dogs are a local issue in Fairlie, however Council does not get enough complaints to justify costs of enforcement unless it has data from people making complaints.
- Board was asked if interested in a Frisbee golf course in the town.
- Board provided afternoon tea for Heartlands staff as a means of appreciation.
- Cr Clarke updated on mobile phone coverage and the possibility of free public wifi in the centre of Fairlie township, inc Village Green.
- Next meeting 13 September, begins with public forum at 4.30 pm.
