Quick facts :

- Respiratory disease is New Zealand's third most common cause of death.
- Respiratory disease costs New Zealand over \$6 billion every year.
- One in six (over 700,000) New Zealanders live with a respiratory condition.
- Respiratory disease accounts for one in eight of all hospital stays.
- One in seven children and one in nine adults in New Zealand have asthma.
- It's estimated that 586,000 school days are lost each year due to asthma related symptoms in children.
- More than half of the people admitted to hospital with a poverty-related condition are there because of a respiratory problem such as asthma, bronchiolitis, acute infection or pneumonia.
- People living in the most deprived households are admitted to hospital for respiratory illness over three times more often than people from the wealthiest areas.



Five Steps to Prostate Cancer Prevention:

- **Test Annually:** Men should undergo annual prostate specific antigen (PSA) blood test and digital rectal exams (DRE) starting at age 50 or earlier. High-risk groups should begin testing at age 40.
- **Listen to Your Body:** A change in the frequency, urgency and pressure during urination, painful urination or the presence of blood in urine are all warning signs.
- **Regulate Diet & Alcohol Intake:** Eat healthy, balanced meals rich in fruits, vegetables and whole grains. Consume no more than two drinks per day as studies show regular heavy drinking increases risk.
- **Maintain a Healthy Weight:** Obesity may effect hormone levels related to prostate cancer risk.
- **Exercise Regularly:** At least 30 minutes of aerobic

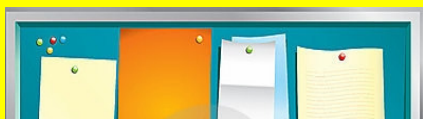

Meteorologically speaking, the past three months were boring! Winter never arrived. Only 90mm of rain fell in the entire season and there were no days recorded in which the rainfall exceeded 10mm. There were no significant weather events. It was 13 weeks of not much at all, leading to what surely would be one of the mildest and driest winters on record for our region.

This was due to the usual progression of depressions followed by anticyclones moving across the Tasman Sea being noticeably disrupted. Planet Earth seemed to have changed the rules, as week after week depressions would cross the Tasman only to stall just west of the South Island before dissipating and re-establishing themselves across the North Island. Meanwhile the following anti-cyclone would suddenly speed away to the south of the stalled depression, preventing any chance of a southerly air mass to develop.

Spring has now arrived with a blaze of colour and bleating lambs. Hopefully any storm that might get me excited will be well forecast!

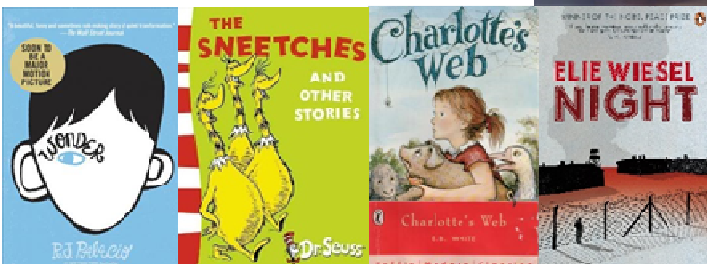

What plastics can we recycle? There are all sorts of plastics out there, but not all can be recycled, so how can you tell which is what? Just check for a recycling symbol with a number, if it has 1-5 or 7, it can go in the yellow bin. But if has 6 or

no number, put it in the red bin. Polystyrene is a common recycling imposter, this often has the recycling symbol with a number 6, so while it looks recyclable because of the symbol, it needs to go in the rubbish.

The other trick is soft plastics that have no number.

Supermarket shopping bags can go in the yellow bin, but not other plastic bags or plastic wrap. So, all bread bags, biscuit packs and glad wrap need to go in the red bin as these cannot be recycled by our systems.

Recipes for the Season!

Pumpkin, Caramelised Onion & Feta Tarts

400 g pumpkin, cubed
1 t cumin
3 onions
2 T balsamic vinegar
1 sheet puff pastry

3 T olive oil
1/2 t salt and paprika
1 T sugar
cracked pepper
100 g feta cheese

Preheat oven to 200°C.

1. Toss pumpkin in bag with olive oil, cumin, salt and paprika.
2. Bake 20 mins until soft.
3. Fry onions until soft and beginning to brown (10 mins).
4. Stir in sugar and balsamic vinegar, cook for a few minutes.
5. Add pumpkin and cracked pepper.
6. Place squares of pastry on baking tray, score a 1 cm border.
7. Pile on the vege mix and feta cubes.
8. Bake for 12 mins.



"Always plan your meals before going to the supermarket, even if it is just one or two meals. Plan meals that will use the same ingredients in different ways e.g. a piece of pumpkin could be roasted one day with the leftovers used to make pumpkin gnocchi and hummus. Another smart move is to buy ingredients that can serve many purposes e.g. a bag of spinach could be used in an omelette for breakfast, in a sandwich or salad at lunch and in a curry or pasta for dinner. Tortillas, which last forever in the freezer, can be used for burritos, quesadillas, enchiladas etc."

With two significant earthquakes happening in the South Pacific in the last week, it's timely to make sure we all understand the correct actions to take when an earthquake strikes.



Each year in New Zealand we have over 150 earthquakes that are large enough to be felt. A large damaging earthquake could happen any time, and can be followed by aftershocks that continue for a long time. Most earthquake-related deaths and serious injuries are caused by collapsing walls, and falling glass and objects caused by the shaking. In a major earthquake, masonry and glass can fall off buildings and into the streets.



During an earthquake:

If you are inside, Drop, Cover and Hold – do not run outside or you risk getting hit by falling masonry and glass

- **DROP** down on your hands and knees. This protects you from falling but lets you move if you need to.
- **COVER** your head and neck (or your entire body if possible) under a sturdy table or desk (if it is within a few steps of you). If there is no shelter nearby, and cover your head and neck with your arms and hands.
- **HOLD** on to your shelter (or your position to protect your head and neck) until the shaking stops. If the shaking shifts your shelter around, move with it.

If you are outside, move away from buildings, trees, streetlights, and power lines, then Drop, Cover and Hold. Stay there until the shaking stops.

If an earthquake is very strong and/or long and you are near the beach, coast or a lake, move quickly to higher ground in case a tsunami follows the quake. For more information on what to do before, during and after an earthquake, visit www.getthru.govt.nz.

Remember when an emergency happens, try and limit cell phone calls as cell towers will rapidly overload. Just send text messages to friends and family, as this will allow emergency services to receive the urgent calls for help.

ROAD RENAMED IN HONOUR OF FORMER MACKENZIE DISTRICT MAYOR

The contribution of former Mackenzie District Council Mayor Neil Anderson is to be honoured in Tekapo. Domain Rd will be renamed Neil Anderson Way in honour of Mr Anderson's work for the betterment of the town and the wider Mackenzie District. He passed away in January this year.

"Neil had a great ability to support and work with others to get things done. He was instrumental in negotiations over the acquisition of the freehold of Lake Tekapo's fore-shore, including the area of the motor camp and surrounds," said Mackenzie District Council Group Manager Assets Bernie Haar.

"His foresight means that this area is today enjoyed by many Tekapo locals and visitors alike. He made a significant contribution to both the district and Tekapo, therefore it's great that we have been able to acknowledge and remember him in this way," Mr Haar said.

Mr Anderson joined the then Mackenzie County Council in 1980 and was District Council Mayor from 1992-2001. Neil's ability to support and engage with officials to gain trust and cement relationships was dubbed by some as "the Anderson Way".

Mr Anderson's wider work included championing Twizel's future after the completion of the Upper Waitaki Power Development. He played an important part in the Council's purchase of Pukaki Airfield in the 1980s, and served on the South Canterbury District Health Board.

In 2005, Mr Anderson was honoured as a member of the New Zealand Order of Merit for his services to local body and community affairs,

The Council's Assets and Services Committee approved the change of name for Domain Road. The change would be made over the next few weeks.

CIGARETTE BUTTS

Plastic straw reduction remains a favourite project for many retailers, food sellers, cafes, restaurants, supermarkets and here in the Mackenzie – communities! However reports suggest that the biggest man-made contaminant of the world's oceans is not plastic straws, or even plastic bags, but cigarette butts.

Cigarette butts are not only everywhere, but also their disposal has largely been unregulated, meaning a nearly unlimited number hit the seas. But a number of individuals and organizations worldwide are fighting to change that. A campaign, the Cigarette Butt Pollution Project, hopes to ban cigarette filters, which are made from cellulose acetate, a type of plastic that can take over a decade to decompose. Of the 5.6 trillion cigarettes that are made with these filters each year, as many as two-thirds are dumped irresponsibly.

The campaign's founder and public health professor, Thomas Novotny, explained that filters provide no health benefits, but rather serve as a marketing tool, while making it "easier for people to smoke." And it's not just committed activists who are aware of the potential damage of the filters—the tobacco companies themselves have reportedly looked into everything from biodegradable filters and distributing portable ashtrays to avoid being held responsible for cigarette litter.

While tobacco companies continue to look for alternative to growing cigarette waste, Novotny and others are fighting to get legislation passed that would ban cigarette filters. Attempts to pass legislation have failed thus far, due in no small part to the fact that many lawmakers receive campaign contributions from the tobacco industry.

Our History

FAIRLIE HERITAGE MUSEUM

A small cardboard box with lid: a square of photo paper (sensitive to light): sticky tape. A pin. In a blacked-out room tape paper inside back of box: replace and seal lid. Aim box towards sunny scene: poke hole in centre of box front. WAIT 2 mins. Cover hole; back into dark room. Take out paper; turn on light. There, on the paper, like magic, is your scene. That, to a young schoolboy, showed the basics of photography. Of course the light would steadily blacken the paper, unless you soaked it (in the dark) in a dish of salt-based FIXER to preserve your image.

Digital photography has replaced film photography for most of us. From cumbersome cameras (the first were room-sized), to a palm-sized smart-phone. Now you see your photo moments later. No more waiting a week for that light-sensitive celluloid strip to be processed. But oh, wasn't that old hobby of developing and printing your own fascinating! If the Chemist did it for you, you had to wait days, making the anticipation greater.

Our Museum has a wonderful collection of cameras from the last 100+ years. Most are on loan by the late Tom Gallagher. They range from large cameras on tripods, to simple box cameras, to the last small "film" cameras.

The oldest surviving photo was made by Frenchman Nicéphore Niépce in 1816. It's on paper coated with silver chloride, which is sensitive to light. Later, in 1839 Frenchman Louis Daguerre used a copper sheet coated with it. But the huge cameras then had to be held steady on tripods, because the subject needed to be still for 1 to 3 minutes! By 1878, faster gelatin coated glass plates enabled smaller hand-held cameras to be developed. In 1888 the name KODAK appeared, created by George Eastman. He produced the famous Box-Brownie camera in 1900. They, and later bellows-type cameras, took up to 16 photos on a roll of film: a light-sensitive celluloid strip, 6cm wide. It wasn't until 1989 that a real rival, the first true digital camera, with a memory card, was produced, by Fuji. In 2003 digital cameras began outselling film cameras. Now we take them for granted and the old film cameras are becoming collectors' items.

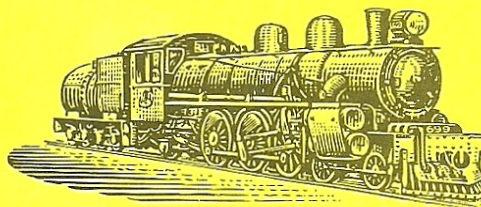
