

## The bird has flown! The bridge has landed!

An amazing community project to replace a bridge in the Opihi Gorge, led by the Fairlie Lions is a perfect example of a community working together to achieve a goal! A bridge was needed to enable the restoration of the popular Opihi Gorge track from Fairlie to Rockwood!

It was back in February 2016 that Murray Bell lead the Lions to begin investigations into replacing the bridge that was washed away in the 'big' flood 24 years ago! Correspondence with DOC, LINZ, the NZ Army and land-owners met with positive responses following lengthy 'toing and froing'.

So after much work behind the scenes it was June 18th this year that the NZ Defence Forces confirmed they were able to fly a proposed bridge in for placement in the Opihi Gorge and it was all go!

The 3 year community campaign with the tremendous support of local businesses and the NZ Defence Force was about to come to fruition. Taken by road from its building site in Fairlie the bridge awaited the arrival of the helicopter and NZDF staff to carry out the final act. And so it was that the bridge, built by Gibson Bros of Fairlie, was lowered in to place, midst much excitement and feeling of accomplishment by all concerned.

Millions of children around the world struggle daily with war, poverty, famine and disease. I could tell she specifically chose that dog for me and wanted to use it to communicate God's love."

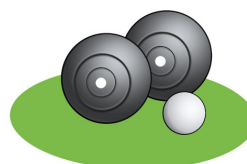

Learning about the Five Ways to Wellbeing will help inspire and motivate you to:

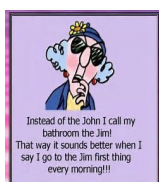

## SC DISTRICT HEALTH BOARD ...

Maps released by Environment Canterbury (ECan) show drinking-water bores in areas around Fairlie are at risk of having nitrate concentrations above the recommended safe level. High nitrate levels in drinking-water occur when nitrates from farming and sewage disposal travel through soil into groundwater. This can be dangerous for the babies of pregnant women and formula-fed babies younger than six months. Adults, babies over six months, and breast-fed babies are not at risk.

Symptoms include blueness around the baby's mouth, hands, and feet. In severe cases, it affects breathing and may be life-threatening.

If your water has high nitrate, it means contamination is occurring and that bacteria could be present. The presence of bacteria can increase the risk of blue baby syndrome, so it is recommended to also test the water for E.coli bacteria.

If a pregnant woman or formula-fed baby drinks water from a private bore, they need to find out whether it is in a moderate/high-risk area. The ECan risk maps are available at <https://www.cph.co.nz/your-health/drinking-water/>. People can also talk to their midwife/GP for advice.

- Those in high-risk areas should have their drinking water tested by an approved laboratory, or use an alternative water source. If they have their water tested, testing for E.coli is also recommended.
- Those in moderate-risk areas should have their drinking-water tested by an approved laboratory, and E. coli testing is also recommended.
- Those in low-risk areas do not require nitrate testing, but may still benefit from having E. coli tests done.
- Environmental Health Officers at your local council can be contacted to discuss test results.
- People on council water supplies are not at risk and can keep using their water as normal.

Vinyasa flow is a more challenging class suitable for those who have done yoga before or already have a good level of fitness. Yoga poses can always be modified no matter the level of the class, however the vinyasa classes do move at a quicker pace.

The gentle flow class are suitable for all levels including beginners, and help yogis to become familiar with the poses in a slower pace but can also help more seasoned practitioners refine their poses for a better understanding of the pose benefits.

## HOW TO AVOID BLOAT IN PET LAMBS

Bloat in pet lambs happens when bugs in the stomach produce too much gas. The lamb cannot get rid of this gas and as a result, a bloated stomach occurs which can be very painful as well as life threatening. Bloat can be prevented by making your milk into yoghurt before you feed the lamb.



To do this:

1. Make up 2 feeds worth of milk in a bucket with a lid (big enough that the milk only fills to half way) using warmer water than normal, but not boiling.
2. Add a 1 litre container of unsweetened natural yoghurt to the bucket and mix well.
3. Put the bucket in the hot water cylinder cupboard for 6-12 hours, until the mixture thickens – the mixture can look like crusty cream cheese, bubbly milkshake, or thick yoghurt
4. When feeding the lamb/s, whisk the mixture and remove as much as the lamb needs for its feed. You can add a small amount of water if the yoghurt/milk mix is too thick.
5. Make up an equal volume of milk replacer to what you have removed and whisk it into the bucket. The mixture can be cleaned out and started again as needed. Yoghurt mix will last up to 5 days in a cool place.

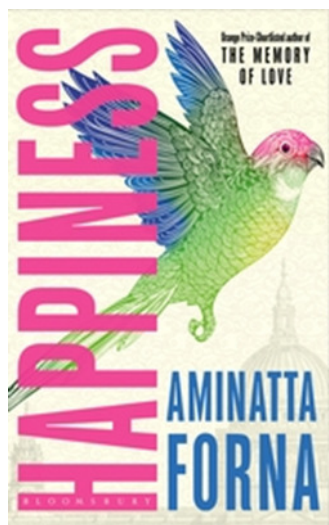

## ECO ETHEL

Eco Ethel's Great Aunt Daisy always planted eggshells with tomatoes, peppers, squash and other vegetables that are susceptible to blossom end rot. While planting eggshells directly with plants most likely will not help this season's plants (because the eggshells will not break down fast enough to create calcium), eggshells in the soil will decompose eventually and will help add calcium directly to the soil, crushed eggshells work best. Eggshells can also be used in the garden to help fight off pests like slugs, snails, cutworms and other crawling pests.

**Eggstra calcium:** Eco Ethel washes and dries egg shells thoroughly, grinding them to a powder and adds them to the flour for use for making bread. This will add calcium to our diet.

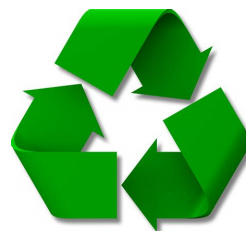
## •SEW• Term 4 Sewing Workshops

## Recycling Tip:

Lids on or lids off... it's a good question to ask when you're standing in front of the recycling bin. The answer is lids off – take lids off plastic bottles before dropping them in the yellow bin. The reason is that the bottles do not squash easily with lids on and the lid is often a different plastic to its bottle, so needs to be sorted separately. So get your lids off Mackenzie!



Another good recycling question is whether aerosol cans are accepted in the yellow bin. The answer is yes, these are great for recycling, but make sure they are empty. Leave the small spray nozzle on, but take off any plastic lid.

### Recipes for the Season!

#### Lemon and Poppy Seed Muffins

2 c self-raising flour	2/3 c caster sugar
1/4 c poppy seeds	grated zest 1 lemon
3/4 c milk	1/2 c lemon juice
90 g butter, melted	1 egg, lightly beaten
icing sugar, to dust	

- Heat oven to 180°C. Line a 12 muffin pan holes with paper patty cases or spray lightly with oil.
- Sift flour into a large bowl. Stir in sugar, poppy seeds and zest. Make a well in centre of dry ingredients and add milk, juice, butter and egg which have been previously mixed. Mix gently into dry ingredients until just mixed.
- 2/3 fill patty cases and bake for 15-20 minutes, until cooked when tested. Cool on a wire rack.

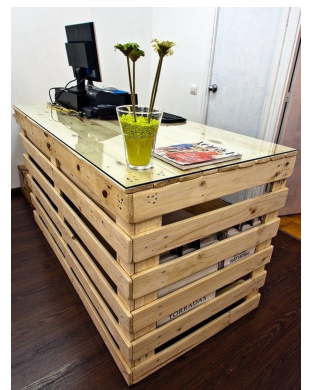

### FAIRLIE GARDEN CLUB

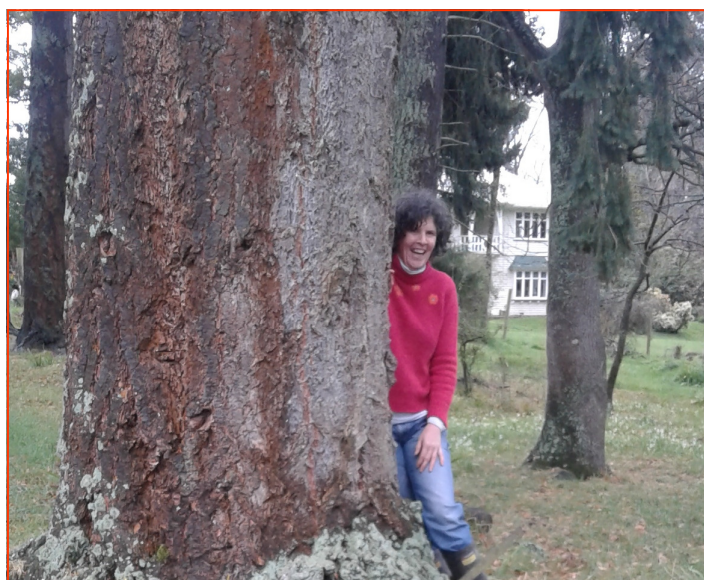
Rain did not deter 18 women to setting off for the first garden club event of the season, appropriately attired in raincoats and gumboots.

#### Purchase versatile ingredients -

Another smart move is to buy ingredients that can serve many purposes. E.g. a bag of spinach could be used in an omelette for breakfast, in a sandwich or salad at lunch and in a curry or pasta for dinner. Tortillas, which last forever in the freezer, can be used for burritos, quesadillas, enchiladas etc.

#### Be realistic about what you need -

Telling you to only buy what you need may sound obvious, but it is important that you are realistic about how much food you will actually eat. If you only eat one piece of fresh fruit a day, only buy enough to cover you until your next supermarket trip, don't try to fill your fruit bowl. This will also ensure that the produce you are eating is as fresh as possible.

#### Choose frozen vegetables -

Buying frozen vegetables means that you can always have produce on hand, without worrying that it will go bad before you can eat it all.

#### Go for prepared meals -

While we don't advocate eating frozen or prepared meals all the time, sometimes they can be a good alternative. While they can be pricey, they do allow you to get a balanced meal without having to buy all of the individual ingredients needed to make the meal – which increases the likelihood that the leftover ingredients will go to waste.

#### Freezing tips - Freeze food - Divide and conquer -

It is such a frustration only being able to buy some foods in large amounts – such as a loaf of bread or a litre of milk. Because it can take you a lot longer to get through this food, it is extra important that you are storing it correctly to make it last longer.

- \* Bread should be kept in the freezer. Make sure you give it a light tap on the bench before freezing so it is easy to separate each slice once it is frozen.
- \* Cut a block of cheese in half and keep half in the fridge and then grate and freeze the rest. If it is a block of feta, making a simple brine to store the cheese in will prolong its life.
- \* If you can't finish a bottle of milk before it goes bad, freeze some of it in ice cube trays on the day you open it. You can then use the frozen milk as you need it. These ice cubes are the perfect size to go in a cup of tea or coffee.
- \* Portion meat before freezing it

Depending on where you shop, it can be difficult to buy meat in individual portions. To ensure that this extra meat doesn't go to waste, portion your meat into individual meal sizes and then freeze them. That way you can just grab the amount you need, rather than having to defrost 500g of mince.

### BRIEF NOTES TEKAPO COMMUNITY BOARD

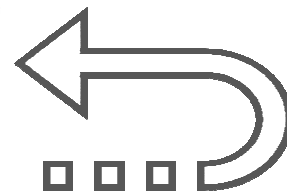
Meeting held 12 September, 2018

**Public Forum:** Stephanie Hagen expressed concern about the process that gave Book Tekapo permission to install a building on the Simpson Lane site; it is perceived by the community as preferential treatment. MDC Response: The current 3 year lease (from previous owner) ends in June 2019; the building is strictly for office use only; any new lease is only a possibility.

#### Matters Under Action/Reports/General Business:

- Hamilton Drive: public rubbish bins, pricing still to be changed. Amount of rubbish plus the dumping of it remains an issue. More bins? Need to make a survey to determine the location of hot spots and possibly add more bins in those places.
- Suggested that visitors need signed direction from the Footbridge toilets to the Western carpark toilets. Also, tour operators, bus drivers etc should be responsible for alerting passengers to the toilet fee and be prepared to pay.
- Playground: Flying fox well-used. Overall plan looks both attractive and practical; some of the stored play equipment is expected to be in place in October.
- COGS: Any work here is dependent on the bus and car parking area being installed on the east side of the Godley; a delay in pricing these.
- 60kph Speed Limit Extension: Further community consultation required by NZTA. It is critical that the Tekapo community responds to this consultation - watch for notification, or please ask!
- Yellow No-parking lines, removed from lakeside opposite Hamilton Drive for road maintenance, need to be reinstated by NZTA - a safety issue.
- Mobile trading: Appropriate site recommended and agreed to by Board - part of the public car park located off Lakeside Dr. Spaces to be delineated; potential vendors need to apply to MDC (will share with CB) and be correctly licensed; site applies Oct 2018-April 2019 only, and then to be reviewed.
- Inquiry about a bus shelter in Tekapo: Agreed that one is necessary and will be included in the strategic plan, this is some time away. MDC cannot fund at this time; any individual initiative should be in consultation with MDC and be a temporary shelter.
- MDC has granted its approval as a lessor for Tekapo Whitewater Trust to construct a light vehicle/pedestrian bridge at the Tekapo Canoe Course.
- Tekapo Trails: new trails in progress. AGM Sept 21, 7:30pm Mackenzie Room, Peppers.
- Drones remain an issue despite notices - anyone can call the police.
- A Responsible Camping Warden has been appointed. Reminder: our bylaw forbids any camping within the township and on reserves. The Patterson's Ponds site is being upgraded for use.

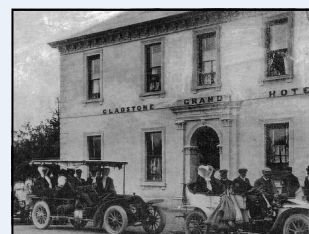

## MAYORAL MESSAGE

Spring is here and what a great winter it has been for farming. Farmer Joe reports that the grass growth is good and plenty of lambs. I do however remind him that in my life time of farming September can be a very fickle month. Tourist numbers remain strong and this last snow ensures continued skiing. It was great to see four innovative businesses in the Mackenzie make themselves into the finals of the South Canterbury Business awards in late August. It was an excellent night with Skyscape winning 2 awards and the Fairlie Bakehouse winning the People's Choice Award.



Borrow Bags, is a District wide initiative from Heartlands launched on 3 September to reduce plastic bags throughout the Mackenzie District is to be commended. Heartlands and a team of very willing volunteers have made many bags that are available to be borrowed at Four Square if you don't have your reusable bag with you. You simply return your bag the next time you are passing. Mackenzie as a district needs to support a reduction in plastic and I would like to thank our Four Square owners for their support in being part of this worthy program. When I attended the canal clean up in Twizel earlier in the year I was amazed at the places these bags turn up.

It was a tragic accident at the intersection of State Highway 8 and 80 in late August. My sympathies to the families involved. On behalf of the District I acknowledge our district's emergency services whom have the unenviable job of cleaning up and assisting at the scene. I have had discussions with NZTA and they have agreed to monitor this intersection with a camera to find the best option for some change. With good news NZTA have agreed to do some speed reduction in Tekapo and consultation will happen next month with the hope that changes will be in place by Christmas.

I was very happy last week, with members of the Fairlie Community Board to host a presentation for the Mackenzie Old Girls Netball Team who recently won the South Canterbury Premier Netball. I also was pleased to learn of the Twizel Area School's music band, Bell Birds doing very well at the Bandquest Online competition – well done to all involved. There are certainly some very talented young people in our District.

The Fairlie Lions Club have been busy working on a joint community project installing a new bridge in the Opihi River walkway near Fairlie. We thank the Fairlie Lions in achieving this worthy and ambitious bridge project. Our District benefits greatly from their efforts and truly makes for a strong and healthy community.

Our Council has partnered with private businesses to form the Mackenzie Development Group. We have prepared an application to the Provincial Growth Fund, the brain child of Minister Shayne Jones for some funding to prepare a feasibility study to determine a pathway forward to allow Mackenzie to become a sustainable destination to live and visit. We will hear the result of this shortly but I am very confident we will attract funding.

I am grateful to those of you whom answered our satisfaction survey conducted by Research First and we as a Council appreciated your comments. It was great to see the levels of satisfaction improving.

We at Mackenzie District Council continually provide the lowest residential rates in NZ according to the recent Taxpayers Union report, which is good news but we are pushed to balance our levels of service with expectation. The latest economic indicators show a softening of Canterbury's economy with unemployment rising as Christchurch comes off the rebuild. International tourist numbers have eased and there is more competition for these international visitors from different regions throughout NZ.

We have some excellent tourist businesses thriving well but it is important that we appreciate and maintain our DISTINCTIVENESS. We remain well positioned in the Mackenzie and attracted in a joint bid with Waitaki District Council \$568,000 extra funding through the Tourist Infrastructure Fund for more toilets in the Mackenzie and Waitaki up to Lindis Pass. I continually remind Ministers that there is much more to managing sustainable tourist destinations than toilets. The Provincial Growth Funding will provide for some of this work.

I am excited and with my team as we continually explore opportunities and deal with challenges.
