Makingtrax – with Jezza Williams



Hailing from Fairlie, Cattle Valley to be specific and having gone to school in Fairlie, many of his age will remember Jeremy Williams. Jezza Williams broke his neck in 2010 while guiding a canyoning trip near Interlaken Switzerland leaving him a C5 C6 tetraplegic, meaning no use of legs or hands and only limited use of arms thus a wheelchair for mobility. However nothing holds this young man back. Jezza works to make adventure available for all, becoming renown as New Zealand's Adaptive Adventure Specialist.

Having spent years as an adventure guide throughout the world Jezza has extensive experience and contacts in the adventure tourism world.

Jezza is in London at present having just presented at the World Summit on Accessible Tourism in Brussels, with a side visit to talk to the Dulwich Boy's Prep pupils and teachers, where his sister Sarah teaches. His message is one of focusing on ability and resiliency, while facilitating access by designing and testing enabling equipment.

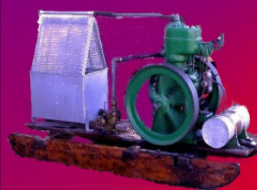

Mackenzie Amateur Swim Club

Loneliness is making us sick!

That terrible feeling of loneliness and isolation is overwhelming modern society and reaching epidemic proportions.

Studies have found that people who are socially isolated are twice as likely to die prematurely than those with strong social relationships. Loneliness has been identified to be as bad for humans as other health hazards like smoking, alcohol and obesity.

The UK has recently created the world's first Minister for Loneliness, recognising that the loneliness epidemic is a public health issue and starting conversation on the topic around the world.

Young or old, loneliness doesn't discriminate. With increasing urbanisation, people no longer live in intergenerational communities and in a city high rise building it is common for neighbours not to know each other's names. Hopefully that is not the case in our Mackenzie communities.

More and more people are living alone and with the rise of social media, there is no longer a need felt to mix with others. This has been reflected in community events that have been organised and cancelled due in part to people's need for contact with others being met on the net. Thus loneliness can become a condition that people live with as they lose the means to interact with others.

Organised activities and institutions aren't necessary to make someone feel less alone. Just saying hello, asking somebody how they are, or offering a simple cup of tea can make a huge difference to a person feeling isolated. Volunteering and joining community groups can make a huge difference to those living with loneliness and the modern technology can actually assist in allowing a person to connect with more people and organise meet ups.

Have a chat or conversation! Fight this epidemic!

Flea Facts

Did you know? If you can see a single flea on your pet – your pet has a flea problem.



The typical flea population is made up of 50% eggs, 30 % larvae, 15% pupae but only 5% are the biting adult fleas. Fleas are laid in the fur of your pet and when your pet is sleeping or resting, will fall out in areas like carpets, bedding, furniture and kennels. These flea eggs hatch into larvae in 2 – 14 days, and then feed on dried adult flea faeces (consisting of dried blood sucked from pet or maybe yourself), dead skin, hair and other organic debris. The larvae then pass through three stages before pupating within a cocoon.

The adult flea will hatch after about 5-14 days, or will stay resting in its cocoon until it detects a vibration (either pet or person movement), heat or noise.

Adult fleas cannot survive or lay eggs without a meal of blood, but can hibernate for up to one year without feeding, before emerging from their cocoons. However, once hatched, they must feed within a week. The adult flea's primary goal in life is a blood meal and to reproduce!!!!

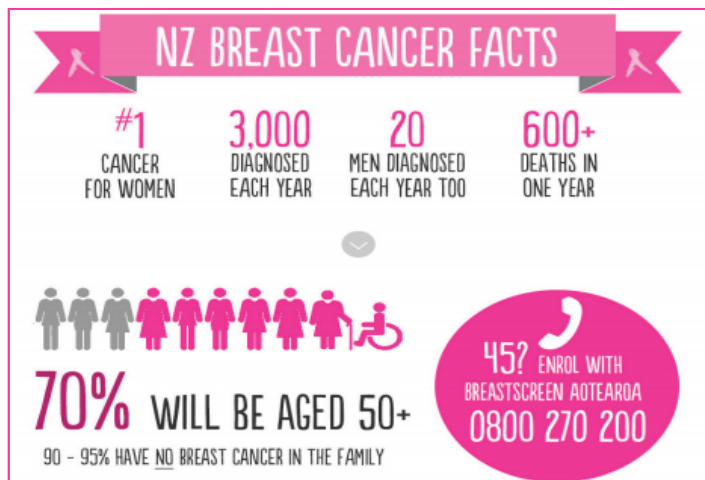
Fleas cause irritation and skin itching which leads to your pet (and yourself) scratching and biting to resolve the itch. Some pets are allergic to the flea saliva and this can result in skin irritation and rashes.

Dogs and cats can also get tapeworms if they swallow a flea infected with tapeworm larvae. This may happen while your pet is grooming. Once a flea is digested inside your cat or dog, the larval tapeworm is able to develop into an adult tapeworm.

Treat with a trusted flea treatment to ensure not only the adult fleas are being killed but you are also killing the flea eggs in your home and surroundings to break the flea cycle. If your pet has fleas – treat ALL pets in the household, vacuum all floors and furniture, especially where your pets spend most of their time. Hot wash their bedding weekly for 4 weeks.

Flea Facts:

- ⇒ The female flea can lay 2000 eggs in her lifetime – that's about 30-40 eggs every day.
- ⇒ In just 30 days, 10 female fleas under ideal conditions can multiply to over ¼ million in different stages of their lifecycle.
- ⇒ The female flea consumes 15 times her own body weight in blood daily.
- ⇒ Adult fleas can bite your pet up to 400 times a day.
- ⇒ A flea can hatch from its cocoon – jump onto your passing pet (or you) and start feeding in as little time as 7 seconds!!!



Over 3,300 women (and around 25 men) will be diagnosed with breast cancer this year. 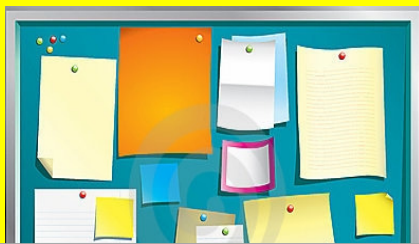

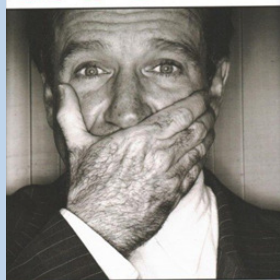

New Biography Robin by Dave Itzkoff

Robin Williams was an Academy Award-winning, innovative and beloved entertainer. He often came across as a man possessed with mercurial, tongue-twisting intensity as he inhabited characters. But as Dave Itzkoff shows in this revelatory biography, Williams's comic brilliance masked a deep well of conflicting emotions

and self-doubt, which he drew upon in his gift for improvisation. Williams struggled with addiction and depression – topics he discussed openly whilst performing and during interviews – and with a debilitating condition at the end of his life that affected him in ways his fans never knew. Drawing on more than 100 original interviews with family, friends and colleagues, as well as extensive research, Robin is a fresh and original look at a man whose work touched so many lives.

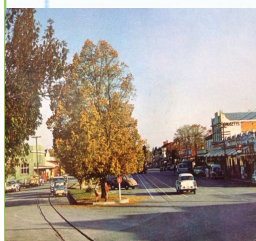

We wonder if there is a more simple and delicious recipe that this! Sad to see so many lemons drop to the ground unloved! You need a ring tin – a cake tin with a hole in the middle and off we go!

Lemon and Yoghurt Cake

1 c sugar	½ tsp salt
2 eggs	¾ c olive oil
Zest of two lemons (plus more to sprinkle over icing)	
3 tps of lemon juice	1 c natural yoghurt
2 c self-raising flour	

1. Set your oven at 180 degrees.
2. Mix sugar, eggs, salt, olive oil and zest of 2 lemons together in a bowl, with a fork. Add lemon juice, yoghurt and self-raising flour.
3. Mix until combined.
4. Pour batter into a well-greased or cooking paper lined ring tin and bake 30 mins.
5. Remove from oven and allow to cool before icing with lemon icing and letting it dribble down the sides of the cake! Memorable - if served with natural yoghurt!

Responsible Camping Gearing Up For Summer Season

The Mackenzie and Waitaki Basin Responsible Camping Working Group is celebrating the commencement of work that it is doing collaboratively.

Mackenzie District Council and Waitaki District Council are working alongside DOC, NZTA and LINZ to address responsible camping initiatives for the peak season. This work is fully funded through an MBIE Tourism Facilities Development Grant central government initiative. The total value of this work is \$548,000.

Work will include installation of seven new accessible public toilets across the Mackenzie and Waitaki Districts, provision of portable toilets for trouble spots in the Waitaki Valley, upgrades to camping areas at Lake Poaka, Pattersons Ponds, Lake Wardell and provision of compacting rubbish bins in Omarama and a new paywave compacting rubbish bin in Twizel.

This work will include new information signage, easy to read brochures and the employment of an Education Monitoring and Compliance Officer tasked with addressing camping issues across the two districts.

Toilet sites will include: NZTA rest areas at Edwards Stream near Tekapo, Hayman Road/State Highway 8 Pukaki, Bendrose Station near Twizel.



Pattersons Ponds will receive a road access upgrade and new toilet, an additional toilet at Lake Wardell, and a track upgrade and additional toilet at Lake Poaka. The Ahuriri River bridge site near Omarama will receive a new toilet and fencing to better define the area.

FREE GREENWASTE DAY

The Mackenzie Resource Recovery Parks will be accepting greenwaste at no charge for one day only. This is for **residential garden waste** such as lawncuttings and tree trimmings, but no food waste thanks. You will need to register your load with the park operator when you arrive, normal Sunday opening hours apply.

So, get your gardening gloves on and meet us at your local Resource Recovery Park on Sunday 21 October.

Church of the Good Shepherd Bus Parking Project

Council is about to commence work on the Church of Good Shepherd project which will involve revised car parking, landscaping and fencing around the Church of the Good Shepherd.

Work is planned to commence with the installation of a new stone entrance way to the Church of Good Shepherd. For the duration of this work there will be disruption to the normal access to the Church of the Good Shepherd and we thank you for your patience while this work is undertaken. Following this, new fencing and landscaping will be installed.

Temporary parking arrangements will be in place and will change as this work progresses. Council has designed a new bus park for the western side of the footbridge. It is intended that tour buses will pull into this park and drop off their passengers to visit the attractions in Tekapo. Currently Council is negotiating with contractors to undertake this work as soon as possible.

The establishment of this bus parking on the western side should be considered as Stage 1 of car parking improvements, the balance of the car parking will be completed as funding allows.

All of New Zealand is at risk of earthquakes, and all of our coastline and our large bodies of water such as lakes are at risk of tsunami. We can't predict when they will happen, but we can practice the right action to protect ourselves. Taking part in New Zealand ShakeOut 2018 is a great way to learn the right actions to take and get prepared.

ShakeOut is our national earthquake drill and tsunami hīkoi, which will take place on **Thursday 18 October 2018 at 9:30 am**. ShakeOut is held across the world to remind people of the right action to take during an earthquake (Drop, Cover and Hold), and to practice a tsunami hīkoi (evacuation) if in a coastal area or beside a lake.

Wherever you are at **9.30 am on 18 October 2018**, you can take part in the drill. Just Drop, Cover and Hold for up to one minute, and if you're in a coastal area or beside a lake, practice your tsunami hīkoi.

Drop, Cover and Hold is the right action to take in an earthquake. It stops you being knocked over, makes you a smaller target for falling and flying objects and protects your head, neck and vital organs. • **DROP** down on your hands and knees. This protects you from falling but lets you move if you need to.

- **COVER** your head and neck (or your entire body if possible) under a sturdy table or desk (if it is within a few steps of you). If there is no shelter nearby, and cover your head and neck with your arms and hands.
- **HOLD** on to your shelter (or your position to protect your head and neck) until the shaking stops. If the shaking shifts your shelter around, move with it.

If you are unable to drop, brace yourself in a chair or wheelchair (lock your wheels) and cover your head and neck with your hands and arms. If you are unable to get out of bed, cover your head and neck with a pillow. Many people are injured while trying to move **DURING** the shaking. It is safer to Drop, Cover, and Hold until the shaking is over.
