AirBnB – A Blessing or a Curse?

You'd have had to have your head buried pretty deeply in the sand to have failed to notice the increasing number of residential properties now being let out as visitor accommodation, in Fairlie and across the district. It's estimated that 88% of properties in Tekapo are visitor accommodation and around 25% in Fairlie, and this number is growing rapidly. Increased visitor numbers have definitely brought benefits to the community. The town is buzzing; our shops and eateries are thriving, and ultimately that's a good thing for residents.

However there are negative consequences too. House prices are rising pushed up by investors looking for properties to let out. Higher property prices inevitably mean rents are rising – to a level where many young families on relative low incomes simply can't afford to rent a home in Fairlie. Lack of suitable accommodation has resulted in a number of families leaving town in recent months. Heartlands has a waiting list of families looking to move into the area – most are unable to find a home and the few that become available often have prohibitive rental costs – those families move to other communities.

Families are the lifeblood of our communities. Our kindergartens and schools need minimum numbers to guarantee funding. Our community facilities – library, community centre, swimming pool and more – are primarily used by residents and need support to keep them viable. Our emergency services – fire and ambulance – who do such a vital job, rely entirely on volunteers. And we are blessed to have an enormous number of clubs, societies and groups run by generous people who give their time and skills so selflessly. The diverse activities these volunteer groups have to offer is what makes Fairlie the wonderful, vibrant place to live that we all love.

All of these endeavours need people, and as our resident population declines all the above – all the things which make our community truly special – are threatened.

So what to do? Perhaps as a community we need to have a conversation about what we want, what we view as important, and how we want our town to develop. There's clearly a need for visitor accommodation, but if we are to have a viable community, we also need residents. Should we consider restrictions on the amount of visitor accommodation, or unlock more land to allow the town to grow beyond its current boundaries, or both? Or do we do nothing – let market forces prevail and become a town dominated by visitor accommodation like Queenstown or Wanaka. There's no 'right' and 'wrong' answer to the

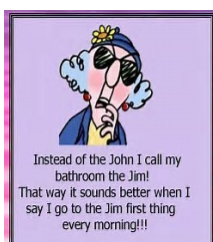

WORLD WAR 1 – THE FINAL DAYS of WORLD WAR 1 for the NZ DIVISION

The lead up to 11am on the 11th day of the 11th month 1918 ARMISTICE DAY

The New Zealand Division came out of reserve in early Oct 1918 to regroup with the British Third and Fourth armies for the final phases of the Battle of the Canal du Nord (27 September–1 October). Fighting their way through the main Hindenburg Line, the 1st New Zealand Infantry Brigade seized the town of Crèvecoeur on the final day of the battle, establishing a valuable foothold across the Scheldt (Escaut) Canal in the process. In effect, the New Zealanders had already broken through the 'Masnières–Beaurevoir line', a trench system prepared hastily behind the Hindenburg Line on which the Germans hoped to hold the Allied advance in this sector.

They renewed their attack on 8 October. Breaking through weak German defences, the NZ Division advanced more than 5 km to take the village of Esnes, capturing more than 1000 prisoners and a dozen field guns along the way. The 800 NZ casualties included 150 dead. That night German forces withdrew to the Selle River, allowing Canadian troops to take Cambrai unopposed. Further south, the New Zealanders continued the pursuit for 18km to the river, seizing an important bridgehead at Briastre before being relieved on 14 October.

A week later, the division returned to the fray, taking part in the closing stages of the Battle of the Selle (17–25 October). It advanced to within a kilometre of the old fortress town of Le Quesnoy, which was encircled by elaborate and historic brick ramparts. During this attack, New Zealand lost one of its most courageous soldiers. Victoria Cross recipient Sergeant Henry James Nicholas was killed in action near Beaudignies, 4 km west of Le Quesnoy, on 23 October. He is buried in nearby Vertnigneul Churchyard.

On 4 November 1918, against faltering opposition, the British First, Third and Fourth armies launched a major offensive (later designated the Battle of the Sambre). It would prove to be the final attack of the war. On the opening day, the New Zealand Division captured 2000 prisoners and 60 field guns and advanced to the edge of the Mormal Forest. Le Quesnoy fell the same day after soldiers from the 4th Battalion, New Zealand Rifle Brigade, scaled the walls with a ladder. The old fortress town of Le Quesnoy had been in German hands since 1914, and several thousand German troops were still inside it when the New Zealanders attacked. Heavy artillery could have rapidly demolished the walls of Le Quesnoy, but at heavy cost to the inhabitants. No such attack was contemplated – the plan was for the 3rd NZ (Rifle) Brigade to bypass the town and isolate the enemy forces there.

Although their orders did not provide for an immediate assault on the town, the New Zealand riflemen were determined to capture it. A little competition between the 2nd and 4th Battalions developed after the encirclement was complete; the former advanced on the town in the direction of the Valenciennes Gate, while the latter pressed forward through the outer defences from the west. The German defenders were demoralised, but their officers were not prepared to surrender without a fight.

This set the stage for one of the New Zealand Division's most spectacular exploits of the war. When a section of the 4th Battalion reached the inner walls about midday on 4 November, they had already scaled the complex network of outer ramparts with ladders supplied by the field engineers. But because of the height of the inner wall,



the riflemen could only position a ladder on a narrow ledge atop a sluice gate. Led by Lieutenant Leslie Averill, the battalion's intelligence officer, a small group of men quickly climbed up the wall. The whole battalion followed. After exchanging shots with fleeing Germans, the New Zealanders entered the town. The garrison quickly surrendered.

This was last significant action of the war for the New Zealanders. During 5 November they pushed through the Mormal Forest north-east of Le Quesnoy. That night the division was relieved. The New Zealand gunners remained in action in support of British units for a few days before heading back into reserve on the 9th. Two days later, the fighting ended. The last New Zealanders in action had been the mounted riflemen and cyclists serving in XXII Corps, which, after helping to capture Valenciennes, had reached Mons when the guns fell silent.

Abandoned by its allies – Bulgaria, the Austro-Hungarian Empire and the Ottoman Empire had all ceased hostilities – its population suffering heavily from the effects of the Allied blockade and its armies in disarray, Germany accepted defeat. An armistice on the Western Front came into effect at 11 am on the 11th November 1918.

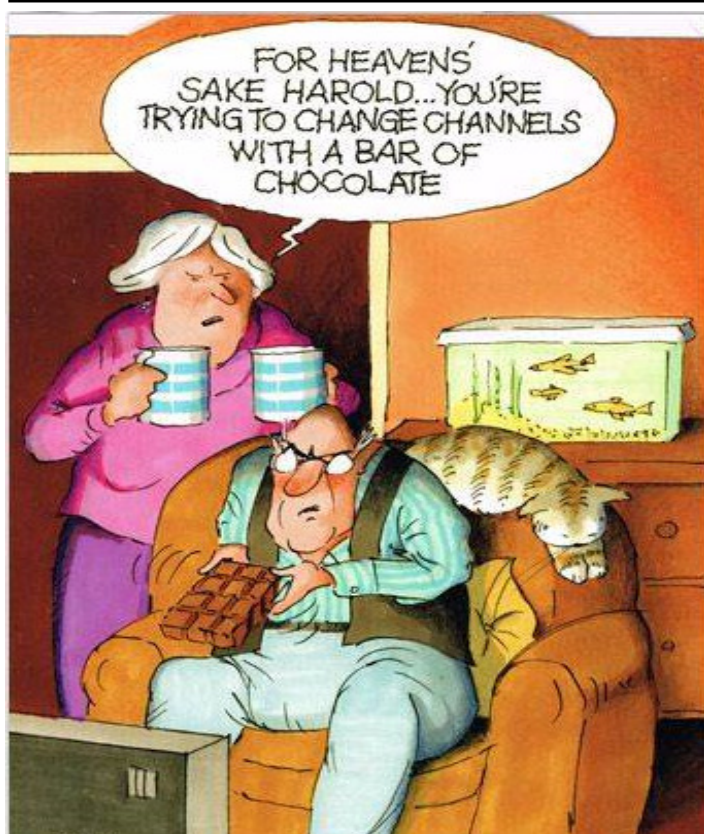

Managing the Stress of Guy Fawkes

Many pets get very anxious during fireworks season, which is not surprising given their heightened hearing and inability to understand what is happening. Dogs and cats that are naturally anxious have the highest risk of becoming stressed.

An animal’s natural response in a stressful situation is “fight or flight”. Adrenaline clouds their judgement and they may dash out an open door or start to toilet inside. Providing a safe, secure “hideout” or den for your pet can be comforting for them. If they are used to a crate this can be used, and even draped with a blanket or towels to make it darker and feel more enclosed. A similar area can be created in a garage or favourite room of the house.

Keep your pets locked indoors if you know there are likely to be fireworks and offer them lots of cuddles and reassurance. Ensure they have had dinner and been to the toilet before dark. Having music or the TV going to provide background noise and distraction may also help. Try to avoid leaving pets at home alone whilst fireworks are going off.

There are several drug-free calming remedies available that help to reduce an animal’s response to stress. In addition, there are pheromone based products that provide reassurance and also help reduce anxiety levels. Unlike a “drug”, the aim of these products is not to sedate an animal, but to help them feel normal and relaxed during a stressful situation. Pheromones are natural chemical “signals” that animals use to communicate with each other. When a cat rubs their face against you they are actually secreting a pheromone onto you which tells them that you are safe and familiar. These products use synthetic versions of these pheromones to achieve the same calming effect.

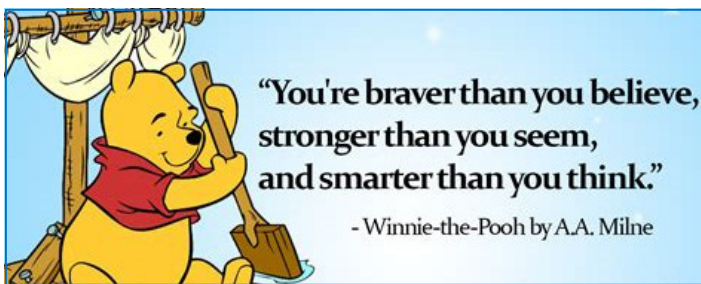

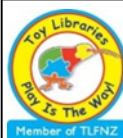
Playgroup Update

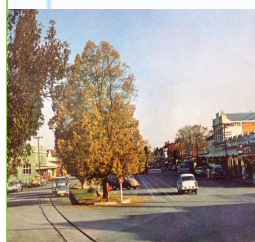

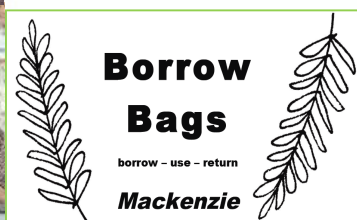

Check the number before you dial it. If it is genuinely from Spark, they won't be calling from abroad with an international dialling code.

And remember, you should never ever give out your bank details, nor credit card details to someone who has just called you out of the blue. If someone calls you out of the blue and asks you to confirm your identity, chances are it's a scam.

Beating the Burglars

Earlier this week Police arrested a local man with jewellery stolen from various addresses in Timaru.

Please folks, if you haven't done it already, keep a simple photo record of your most precious belongings. In the case of jewellery, take a photo of each item or even group them. Make sure that each individual item can be easily identified from the assemblage.

If you can, take a photo of the hallmark using the macro function on your camera/phone. Better yet, take a photo of the item with the receipt or valuation certificate.

Not only does this provide an excellent inventory for insurance purposes, but also proves that you own the piece. All too often the Police have to return items to the offender which they believe have been stolen, simply because of a lack of proof of ownership.

You can create your own private and personal inventory using the Police's SNAP web site (<https://www.snap.org.nz>).

You can even use social media to share photos of your stolen belongings and thus raise awareness, making them too hot to handle. This alerts any would be buyer and can help the Police track down the offender.

Lock That Shed

Spring is upon us and we're all out in the garden doing our jobs. Please make sure that your shed is locked and that all the tools that you had out are safely stowed away inside your locked shed.

A spade or shovel is an excellent tool for lifting off the ranch slider to gain entry into your house, it doesn't matter if it's locked.

Even a garden hand trowel or fork might be enough to slide in through that gap in the half open bathroom window and lift the handle to open the window to enable entry.

Window Locks

We all like to have the bedroom window open a wee bit, especially with the warmer nights. The bathroom window is usually open and on the latch in most homes. Every burglar worth his or her salt knows this. Let's make it harder for them.

Please fit window locks so that they can only be opened a few centimetres. These things need cost as little as \$18 a pair, and you can fit them in a few minutes. Alternatively, get a nice neighbour to fit them for you in exchange for the universal currency of home baking.

Just last week another Timaru resident was again the victim of the Spark scam. We are all far too trusting people, and the scammers know this. For them it is simply a numbers game. If they make enough unsolicited calls, eventually they will find someone to take the bait ...

Recycle Tip - It's spring and a great time to get gardening... but when you're busy planting and watering, what left over items can be recycled? If you have plant pots or seedling trays, check for a recycling number in the triangle before you put them in the **yellow bin**. It's surprising how many plant pots are not recyclable (but they are reusable!). If it is a plastic number 1-5 or 7 it can be recycled, but if it is number 6 or has no number, go for the **red bin**. Old garden hose and fittings also need to go in the **red bin** as these cannot be recycled. It's really important that only clean recyclable items go in the **yellow bin**, contaminated items can cause real recyclables to go to landfill and costs the district more. So it's great to recycle right!

Recipes for the Season!

Rhubarb Ginger Cake

450g rhubarb stalks	1 c brown sugar
1/2 c canola oil	1 egg, beaten
1 1/4 c flour	1 t ground ginger
2 t baking powder	
1 c crystallised ginger (chopped)	

Preheat oven to 180°C. Grease a rectangular 20x25cm tin.

1. Chop the rhubarb into small chunks and place in large bowl with the brown sugar. Mix well, then set aside to stand for 15 mins.
2. In a separate bowl mix together the oil, egg, flour, ginger and the baking powder. Add to rhubarb and mix.
3. Spread the combined mixture into the baking dish and bake for 1 hour.
4. Serve warm or cold with yoghurt or icecream.
