

Emergency Management



Since this article was prepared Sandra McCarthy has sadly left the Lake Tekapo

community to live in Christchurch. We wish her well, and thank her for the commitment she made to the community and in helping Tekapo prepare for an emergency. Sandra's foundation work will continue to be built on and the community are better prepared because of Sandra's efforts and enthusiasm.

Wherever Sandra is, she always makes sure she has at least half a tank of petrol, spare legal tender, a full gas bottle, and some emergency food.

Lake Tekapo is a small, relatively isolated town located within the long and stretching Mackenzie District, where the tourist population is up to 2000 per night. Tourist numbers easily outnumber Tekapo's small 360-person local population. For this reason, Sandra believes that it is important that individuals and the local community prepare themselves, in case of natural disasters.

"To expect Civil Defence to arrive, and army buses to come and help us, is just not realistic."

Often found walking around Tekapo, Sandra would be first to jump into action during an emergency. She founded the Tekapo Emergency Events Team (EET), which consists of 10 volunteers whose primary purpose is to support the great work that the local volunteer Fire Brigade, St John and the NZ Police do when they are involved with big incidents. They are also prepared to help to ensure the community can be self-sufficient and functional in an emergency. The EET is prepared to mobilise at any given time, but because it is built on community networks, each local resident who prepares themselves effectively becomes part of the team, essentially growing the EET.

The EET has received funding from the local Lion's Club, undertaken first aid and Civil Defence training, and established emergency housing plans with the local hotels, who also kindly provided toiletries and blankets to be stored by the team.

Tekapo's EET serves as an example of not needing to stray far from local resources and people in order to create strong networks, even in most challenging and stressful times.

The goal, Sandra says, is that EET has enough resources and support in the community to make sure that Tekapo can be self-sufficient rather than relying on immediate Civil Defence support and that establishing the EET has helped locals to understand, realistically, what their situation might be in an emergency.

"This helps us empower individuals and communities. To get them to realise that civil defence aren't coming over the hill - especially in that first three days." Throughout her work with the EET Sandra is motivated by her unwavering belief in the Lake Tekapo community's strength and assets. Sandra believes residents should not be complacent, as Civil Defence aid is never guaranteed to be only a few hours away.

While Civil Defence recommend that residents are self-sufficient for up to three days Sandra says, "we say a week. We know where our generators are, what volunteers are where, that the Lions Club have a big BBQ we can use. We know that we have to be self-sufficient."

"The whole philosophy behind it is that we are a very small community, Burkes Pass gets easily cut off - as does Twizel, and we have to do what Civil Defence suggest and manage for a week."

Sandra's efforts establishing the local EET has not resulted in drastic changes in routine for the residents of Tekapo. It has merely been a task of using the tools, people and resources that are already readily available in the community. While the EET hasn't needed to mobilise recently, they remain ready. The winter months tend to be the busiest, especially with road accidents.

"We have a great resource of knowing our team members and knowing what we can do." When asking what the key to managing in a disaster situation, Sandra says, "It's about co-operation and interdependency".

Fairlie Community Vehicle Trust Members and Volunteers

Fairlie Community Vehicle Trust Chairman's Report 2018

The Fairlie Community Vehicle Trust operates a car, three minivans vehicles and a trailer, providing affordable and accessible transport services to the Fairlie community. The Trust is funded by grants from Lotto, ECAN and the Ministry for Social Development, and by sponsorship by local businesses.

In the last year, the vehicles made almost 1500 trips benefiting almost 3500 local passengers. These trips include taking elderly and infirm residents to the doctor (in Fairlie and Timaru) and to hospital and healthcare appointments in Timaru; taking elderly and those without transport shopping and to access other essential appointments in Timaru including banking and social services. Day trips are organised by Heartlands for the elderly to support their wellbeing and increase their social connectivity. Numerous clubs and societies use the vans to enable local residents to take part in sporting and cultural events in SC and beyond. We continue to work in partnership with Mackenzie College who use Trust vehicles on a regular basis, enabling students to access opportunities locally and outside the district.

After consulting with regular users and volunteer drivers the Community Car has been changed to a Toyota Ractis. This model has increased legroom, lower seats for easier entry and exit, and is able to be adapted to carry a person in a wheelchair should the need arise in the future. Thanks to a generous grant from Lotto Communities and support from South Canterbury Toyota we were able to add an additional brand new 12 seater minivan to the fleet and the Trust expects to be able to replace the Trust's original minivan with a new 12 seater vehicle within the next few months. The Trust continues to explore opportunities for garaging space to ensure that all the vehicles can be kept together in a convenient and more permanent location.

The Trust is run on an entirely voluntary basis and I'd like to take this opportunity to thank all our sponsors, our volunteer drivers and the Trustees for their commitment. A special thank you must also go to Hec and Val Cox and Maureen McColl who give so generously of their time to ensure the vehicles are cleaned, serviced and ready for collection. Without these wonderful individuals giving their time and expertise, the Trust couldn't operate and continue to provide this vital service for our community.

Finally thank you to all our customers - we need to demonstrate demand for the vehicles to secure continued funding, and so your support is essential to keep the Trust viable.

Aoraki Mackenzie International Dark Sky Reserve to launch a dark-sky friendly certification scheme

The Aoraki Mackenzie International Dark Sky Reserve (AMIDSR) Board will launch a new certification scheme from early 2019 to certify dark-sky friendly commercial enterprises inside the Reserve, which covers almost all of the Mackenzie Basin and also the Aoraki/Mt Cook National Park.

The scheme involves reviewing the exterior lighting installed at any establishment, and ensuring in particular that lights shine downwards, that they are mainly light types that emit warm yellow-white light, and that lights are off when they are not needed at night.

The scheme will help protect the dark skies of the Mackenzie from the harmful effects of light pollution. Not only does light pollution make the night sky brighter and mask the stars, but also it has serious harmful effects for the environment and for human health. Dark skies are essential for astro-tourism, on which the economy of the Mackenzie is heavily reliant, with up to nine enterprises now conducting guided night-sky tours. Many accommodation houses also rely on astro-tourism as do restaurants.

To be certified we will ask enterprises to state how closely they comply with the seven clauses of our Dark Sky Friendly charter (see below), as well as list all their exterior lights on their property. Compliance with most of the seven dark-sky friendly clauses will be required, as well as a lighting plan to improve any deficiencies over the coming years.

Certified enterprises will be issued with a prominent dark-sky friendly sticker to display in their premises, and a dark-sky friendly logo to place on their website. Certification will be an annual process, with incremental improvements required each year in the exterior lighting and its operation, such as replacing bulbs with warmer yellower lights, and fitting shades or motion sensors.



Twizel's Wastewater System Upgrade

Twizel's wastewater system is being upgraded with a new disposal field being installed.

The upgrade means that wastewater will travel into ponds where it is filtered before moving to another disposal field where it eventually soaks down through the ground. In the current system, wastewater is disposed of via a long trench.

"This is the same system that we use in Fairlie. It is both cost-effective and a good way of ensuring the wastewater doesn't go directly into waterways," says Mackenzie District Council Utilities Manager, Geoff Horler.

The new system will also include a screen to ensure that unwanted waste that's not good for the environment is collected."

Monitoring devices will be used to observe the ponds so that the new system complies with Environment Canterbury's regulations around the disposal of waste water.

The earth-works to construct the disposal field are already completed and other work such as installing the screens and monitoring systems will be done over the next month.

The cost of the upgrade is \$900,000 and the new system will be operational by around the end of November.

Urban Vegetation Fire Risk Now Handled by Fire Emergency NZ

If you live in the Mackenzie District and are concerned about a potential fire risk from overgrown vegetation, new legislation means you need to contact (FENZ) Fire Emergency New Zealand directly not the local Council.

Under the Fire Emergency New Zealand Act 2017, FENZ now takes responsibility for urban fire control and removing fire hazards. Previously this responsibility lay with Councils.

"We're coming into the summer season and this generally sees an increase in complaints to Council about overgrown sites that pose a fire risk," says Mackenzie District Council's Group Manager Regulations, Karina Morrow.

"An overgrown site can be a fire hazard. Long, dry grass can be fuel for a fire that starts on a property or spreads from elsewhere such as embers, ground fires or radiant heat. The problem is compounded when combustible materials like wood, cardboard, cloth and other rubbish are stored on a section."

"To reduce these risks, owners/occupiers need to make sure that their section is well maintained. This means cutting long grass regularly and clearing the property of loose rubbish. If you're renting, you might want to talk with your landlord about who has responsibility for maintaining the section," Ms Morrow says.

If there's a property in your neighbourhood that you believe is causing a fire hazard due to an unkempt section, Ms Morrow suggests having an initial conversation with the property owner. If this does not resolve the problem, you need to contact FENZ on **0800 336 942 (FENZHA)**.

"FENZ is only able to take action to deal with genuine fire hazards and not where the property is unsightly but does not pose a fire risk," Ms Morrow says.
