Mackenzie Attitude Adjustments

- A Mackenzie Community Development Project

Every three months, representatives from the communities of the Mackenzie come together as the members of the Mackenzie Community Development Project. They discuss current issues in the Mackenzie and prioritise projects for the two Community Development Workers – Tanya Coles in Twizel and Kylie Murphy in Fairlie, to work on. Two recent projects they have undertaken district-wide have been 'No Straws Thanks' and 'Borrow Bags Mackenzie'.

Mackenzie Attitude Adjustments – the new project for the next while – is about driving in the Mackenzie! This follows the growing concern about safety on our Mackenzie roads and the fear that some now face when they think about driving! The project will 'touch' from the young through to aged.



A meeting between the South Canterbury Road Safety Co-ordinator - Daniel Naude, MDC Mayor - Graham Smith, MDC Roading Manager - Scott McKenzie , a Community Development Project rep and Kylie and Tanya (pictured above) identified some strategies that will be included in this campaign and how they might be delivered to the residents of the Mackenzie. There will also be a focus on our visiting drivers, looking at lasting information here in the Mackenzie, for them to absorb. Let's face it! None of our visitors come to New Zealand to die or to be involved in accidents on our roads. 'It's not us' you might say and to a high degree that may be true, but equipping ourselves with valuable information and options for driving, heightening our awareness as drivers, can only be of benefit to us all.

So the project will be engaging you, the community, to look at your attitudes and habits and how they might be improved, even to protect yourself. Working together for the residents of the Mackenzie -



A NOTE ABOUT MEASLES VACCINATIONS FROM THE FAIRLIE MEDICAL CENTRE

We have had a number of worried parents ring the Medical Centre about the measles outbreak in Christchurch.

As of today (Tuesday 11th March) there have been NO cases in the South Canterbury district and as such, there is no current recommendation to alter our immunisation schedule - in other words, there is no directive from the Ministry of Health to bring forward the MMR vaccinations.

Anyone born before 1969, or anyone who has received 2 MMR vaccinations is considered to be immune.

Should there be cases in South Canterbury then children who have not yet had their first vaccination would take priority.

We currently have very limited stocks of MMR, so these are being reserved for children not yet immunised with MMR.

Meanwhile, many countries in the Northern Hemisphere experienced a bitterly cold winter as the Arctic Jet Stream moved south. I'm astounded that some world leaders refuse to accept that Planet Earth is not in good shape and that we could do more to ensure future generations don't end up with a climate more suited to a disaster movie!

GROWTH MINDSET

Believing you can achieve is a strong characteristic and value reflected in the students at Fairlie Primary School. The school has installed new signs this week reflecting this attitude, which is all about developing a growth mindset. We thank Karen Lanchester for her skills and willingness to help design these. The term has been coined by American psychology professor Carol Dweck who became interested in students' attitudes about failure after noticing that some students rebounded while other students seemed devastated by even the smallest setbacks. She studied the behaviour of thousands of children and found that when students believe they can get smarter, they understand that effort makes them stronger. Therefore they put in extra time and effort, and that leads to higher achievement.

Fairlie Primary School explicitly teaches growth mindset in class through tools such as Class Dojo. The Mojo monster explores growth mindset through stories and shows how our brain is like a muscle, the magic of mistakes and the incredible power of yet. Growth mindset coupled with our strong values of being respectful, confident, caring and resilient means we are growing some pretty awesome Mackenzie Kids.

***New Biography:
Chasing the Dream
by Shaun Wallace***

Born in London on 2 June 1960 to Jamaican parents, Shaun knew he wanted to be a barrister from the age of 12 and was determined to make it. Despite one or two setbacks along the way, he finally managed to fulfil his childhood ambition when he was called to the Bar in November 1984.

He has been a Criminal Defence Advocate now for nearly 34 years and has worked tirelessly on cases ranging from murder to money laundering to firearms to drug trafficking. Shaun regularly appeared on British television quiz shows but was catapulted to national prominence and recognition in 2004 when he became the first black person to win the BBC's renowned Mastermind. Since 2009, he has become a household name, regularly appearing as The Dark Destroyer on the smash ITV hit teatime quiz show, The Chase. Read how Shaun's passions have helped turn him into the man he is today: staunchly just and fair, ruthless when he needs to be, kind, fun, and a fiercely loyal friend.



Black Bean Beef

(15-30 mns - serves 4)

Sauce:

1 t canola oil	1 T fermented black beans
2 cloves garlic, crushed	1 t ginger, finely chopped
1 t oyster sauce	1/4 c water
1 t soy sauce	1 T rice wine
1/2 t brown sugar	1/2 t sesame oil
1 t chinkiang vinegar	1 t cornflour

Stir Fry:

1 t canola oil	135g lean beef
1/2 capsicum	1 onion
1/2 c green beans	3 spring onions
1/3 c shitake mushrooms	1 carrot

Sauce:

1. Heat first measure of canola oil in a wok or large fry pan.
2. Add black beans, garlic and ginger and saute briefly.
3. Add oyster sauce, water, soy sauce, rice wine, brown sugar, sesame oil and vinegar and bring to boil.
4. Mix cornflour with a little water to form a paste and gradually stir into sauce until it thickens.
5. Remove from heat.

Stir Fry:

1. Heat second measure of canola oil in wok or large fry pan.
2. Add sliced beef and brown all over. Remove beef and set aside.
3. Add capsicum, onion, beans, spring onion, mushrooms and carrots to wok and stir fry until cooked.
4. Add beef and sauce to the wok and heat through.
5. Remove from heat and serve immediately.



Our History

FAIRLIE BOWLING CLUB

In the year 1910 the Misses McLean of "Strathconan" bequeathed the land now known as Strathconan Park to the people of Fairlie. At the request of some residents, not recorded by name, land was set aside as a beginning of a bowling club. This was in 1911. The club began but seemed to go into recess. This does happen to some sports bodies: much information is lost forever.

*"There was a door to which I found no key
There was a veil past which I could not see
Some little talk awhile of me and thee
There seem'd, and then no more of thee and me."*



Early in January 1924, a band of enthusiasts got together and requested 18ft of extra land from the Mackenzie County Council. This application was granted.

The first recorded meeting was held on the 17th January 1924 for the purpose of forming a bowling club. The club was to be called the Mackenzie Bowling Club, subscriptions to be 1 pound. It was agreed that ladies be allowed to become members.

Many working bees were held and soil carted. As there was no shelter it was proposed to erect a building of a pergola type with a flat roof 10ft by 10ft. This still stands sound today and is now used as a shelter from the sun.

At a committee meeting held on the 3/10/24 it was decided to change the name to the Fairlie Bowling Club and become affiliated to South Canterbury Bowling Centre. In the winter of the same year it was decided to hold a ball, ladies to provide supper, fruit salads and jellies and trifles. There was a profit of 7 pounds.

Through the efforts of H Carlton and RL Banks plans were drawn up for the building of a club house and accepted at a cost of 218 pounds. The building was opened in November 1928 by CJ Talbot MP.

During the war years many patriotic days were held and later soldier members returning from overseas were allowed to play bowls at much reduced rates. No amber ale was to be brought on to the green on Sundays due to some disturbances.

To keep pace with other clubs in South Canterbury in 1967 it was decided unanimously to convert the grass green to cotula. If the early pioneers of the club, after all

their hard work, had seen a tractor and rotary hoe appear through the privet hedge and go down on to the green, imagine their feelings.

The club has celebrated the anniversaries of 50, 70 and 90 years. The Carlton family had a big influence on the founding of the club and administration which was to extend to the 1980's. Hector Carlton was a founding member who represented New Zealand against Australia in 1929.

The original club building still stands on the western side of the green. The main clubrooms have been extended over time and can cater for up to 70 on open tournament days.

In its heyday, Fairlie had a membership of 70+ men and 30+ women. Our current membership is 48. Our members are actively involved in South Canterbury's Interclub competitions on Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays and over the years have enjoyed their share of successes.

The club runs three open tournaments each season which attracts full fields and are popular with visitors. The members also support other club tournaments. The women and men have both been very successful in the Interclub 7's competition, winning at Centre Regional and Zone level and going on to compete at the National 7's. The Women's Section has been very successful at Centre Champion of Champion events since 2011, winning 7 titles in these years. The big success last season was Barbara Tiffen achieving her Gold Star, a first for our club and we are very proud of her.

For the past eight years we have run a "Crackerjack" competition for eight weeks over the summer, involving 45 non-bowlers aged 14 to 60years. These people really enjoy the bowls and we feel these are our future members and are confident of a bright future for the club.

The club is financially strong and the assets of clubroom and green are in excellent condition.

While we can't predict when earthquakes will occur, scientific research has shown that the Alpine Fault has a history of generating regular, large earthquakes. The next event is likely to occur within the lifetime of most of us, or our children and young people, for whom this is likely to have major short and long-term impacts.

The AF8 Roadshow provides South Island communities, in areas most likely to be affected by an AF8 earthquake, with direct access to Alpine Fault science and hazard impact information relevant to them and their region. On this inaugural tour we will be visiting 12 communities around the South Island, working with local schools and hosting a series of Public Science Talks. While we can't visit everyone on this tour, we hope to be able to run a second tour in the future.

Price cuts on Air New Zealand flights to and from Timaru will make the Mackenzie District more attractive to domestic travellers, Waitaki MP Jacqui Dean says.

"I've long talked about the importance of domestic tourism to the Mackenzie District and in particular its potential to boost business in the shoulder and off-seasons. There's no doubt that the region's infrastructure has taken a pounding in recent years from increasing numbers of international visitors during peak season, but there's room for growth in the quieter months.

"The Alps 2 Ocean cycle trail, ski fields and hot pools are wonderful attractions, and with Earth & Sky's new Tekapo headquarters nearing completion, the timing couldn't be better.

"Having a higher flow of visitors year round is ideal. It makes it easier for businesses to invest in their operation and helps to create and sustain jobs. I often hear people saying that visiting Mt Cook and Lake Tekapo is on their 'bucket list' and with cheaper flights into Timaru that trip will become more realistic for many New Zealanders."

North Street Bridge - Update

The bridge was closed late last year due to deterioration of the substructure, making it unsafe for pedestrian use. This is because the current bearing timbers have serious cracks in them. Work on the timber design to replace the existing structure has been completed, however the timber required to complete the repair is hardwood which needs to be sourced from overseas. Due to this, council staff are considering using steel members as an alternative - Council contractors have some steel in stock. Staff are also considering a full replacement option as a large proportion of the bridge would need to be deconstructed to repair and are assessing whether a new structure is a more feasible solution to bring it up to today's standard and extend its useful life. Staff will report to council in due course outlining the options. At this stage the bridge remains closed until repair works are completed.

MACKENZIE DISTRICT COUNCIL NEW ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE

Yesterday the Council approved a new organisational structure. Suzette van Aswegen, the CEO, said, "This is a watershed moment for the Council, an exciting time. Council is responding to the community's request to change its operational model in order to better resource the organisation in pursuit of providing more effective and efficient services."

The improvement process has been in train since last December, following an independent organisational review and a comprehensive consultation process with staff and elected members. During an Extraordinary Council meeting yesterday afternoon, Council endorsed the proposed changes, and the staff were informed of the new organisational structure.

Some services currently outsourced to organisations outside the district will be brought back in house; ensuring that service levels to ratepayers are enhanced and delivered more cost effectively. While it will serve to provide more opportunities for job seekers within the Mackenzie District, it will also enable us to retain local ratepayers' money over the medium and long term by developing our human resources and expertise locally. Other contracted services will also be reviewed.
