Regular Transport to Timaru



South Canterbury Neighbourhood Support 'Gets Ready'

What is 'Gets Ready'?

It's our South Canterbury Neighbourhood Support website database tool. It's easy and free to register online or by completing a form so we can sign you up. It enables us to safely keep contact information for local residents that could be used by local community response teams to identify those who need assistance in an emergency and those who have the skills and resources (like first aid skills or own a generator) that could help out in a disaster.

Why join 'Gets Ready'?

Gets Ready enables us to send you information or emergency texts/emails. These could include boil water notices, uncontrolled fire, wind, flooding and snow alerts. You could choose to share this information with your neighbours who may not be connected to the internet.

What are the advantages of being registered?

You can be alerted quickly if there are any local issues, concerns or emergencies like flooding, weather warnings, road closures or crime in your area. Through the system we can send you information, reminders and Newsletters by email. Your neighbourhood will become more connected and a safer, friendlier place to live through shared communication.

Privacy

We've settled on zero information sharing with the public. The public see nothing of the information held relating to people registered with 'Gets Ready'. Our Neighbourhood Support members who have agreed to play a role in our organisation and who look after your area can see the information you share to allow them to assist in an emergency situation.

There are two different kinds of people in a 'Gets Ready' system.

- The public, who join, but have no role in 'Gets Ready', they are called members.
- Those who join and become street or area contacts. They have roles, often working alongside the Neighbourhood Support Co-ordinator and emergency professionals during an emergency.

Your details may be shared with emergency services but otherwise we will not give your details to anyone else.

How safe is my information?

Your information is protected by the password you have chosen and the steps our developers have taken to encrypt and keep all information safe. Remember only the information you are happy to share with us will be kept on the system. The system is encrypted and our information will never be sold or shared, except with emergency services in the event of an emergency.

Update/Farewell from Community Board 2016-2019

With the election of a new Community Board imminent we will take a moment to reflect on the developments in Lake Tekapo during our term and also share with you what will be happening very soon.

- the Village Square has been completed with the Village Green planting/landscaping to come.
- the solar system and signage on the domain is now complete
- the walkway from Tekapo Springs almost to the Regional Park has been partially done and should be completed this summer
- playground equipment has been installed - with the surface yet to be improved
- new planter boxes have improved the look of the village centre
- new compacting rubbish bins are assisting with the huge volume of rubbish in the town centre
- a very large solar powered compactor for freedom camper and holiday home rubbish has been installed at Hamilton Drive
- 3 sets of new toilets have been installed with support from MBIE funding
- a fence with landscaping is protecting the Church of the Good Shepherd -in the next month or two the mound, further landscaping and new sealing will reduce car parks at the Church to 15 with no buses or large vehicles permitted
- the stone walls and landscaping at each entrance to the footbridge are almost complete
- the new eastern carpark by the Godley is almost complete. This is where tour buses will park.
- walkway signage has been installed, walkways have been protected and further improvements are planned
- Barbara Hay Reserve will be landscaped with some amenities to encourage use.
- A new reserve between the school and D'Archiac Drive will be planted and recreation opportunities created - to happen for this summer
- the disc (frisbee) golf park has been supported along with the developments for the school pool
- safer walking paths within the village, especially between Simpson Lane and Four Square are a work in progress
- a very positive relationship continues with Genesis with a new process introduced to ensure transparent use of the Genesis grant

The Community Board is very mindful of the need to ensure that improvements for residents and visitors continue.




A group of Fairlie Primary School students put on a vibrant performance of *Giraffes Can't Dance* to family and friends last week.



Local farmers and farm workers, including anyone who may come into contact with pigs, are being urged to take biosecurity precautions when travelling to African Swine Fever-infected countries. Even if a farm only raises a handful of pigs or if a worker just comes into contact with another farm that does, our very real fear is that this devastating disease could be picked up and spread into the commercial herd – with potentially devastating effects on our industry. We are asking everyone in the community to be vigilant, observe biosecurity protocols and report any suspected signs to the Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) on 0800 80 99 66.

Dress out wild boar where they were killed – bury the guts if at all possible. Check organs for lesions – if they look unusual, don't take meat from these pigs

Do not give home-made products to pigs



- If you are in regular contact with domestic pigs, do not hunt wild boar.

Community Response Team Update

The emphasis for Civil Defence and Emergency Management over the last four months has been the creation of Community Response Teams to be located in Tekapo, Twizel and Fairlie. The community has really responded well to this request and we now have three teams with leaders appointed in each of the three locations. In Fairlie and Tekapo, the Emergency Event Teams that have protected and served within the community for many years have agreed to merge into these new Community Response Teams, bringing their knowledge and skills with them.

The purpose of this team is to assist the local community during an emergency or when there is adverse conditions that may impact members of the community. They do not replace our fantastic emergency services or do their job, they are there for the community to assist where they can and will link up with Civil Defence when required.

On Saturday 14 September members of the Fairlie and Tekapo teams travelled to Twizel to join with that team to receive a day's training. They learnt about managing stress in themselves and affected community members, learnt the correct procedures to operate hand held radios and to finish the day off they learnt the basics of how the Emergency Operations Centre would manage an emergency including the operating system called CIMS. The 21 members who attended this training found it invaluable and enjoyed their day meeting other team members from the Mackenzie District and learning new skills.

Fairlie Farmers Up Against It

An unfair and intolerable amount of pressure is falling on the shoulders of Fairlie farmers at what is a critical time of year, Waitaki MP Jacqui Dean says.

"For ECan's Plan Change 7 submission deadline to fall right in the middle of calving reflects what farmers are up against. They've had to take time out to put forward a case for protecting their livelihood and have had to do so amid a climate of hostility with vitriol coming thick and fast from anti-farming groups.

"Sadly, the government has added to their stress by wheeling out policy that would have people believe that farmers are the scourge of the environment, which is wrong and unfair.

"I'm fed up at people taking a pot shot at farmers when the reality is that the dairy sector has made significant in-roads, fencing off over 98 percent of waterways and spending over \$1 billion in environmental investment over the last five years.

"Everyone is weighing in on the water quality issue and while debate is healthy, I encourage people to take a deep breath and maintain some perspective on this. We all want good quality water but we also need to recognise the economic reality as we work towards a common goal.

"A science-led approach is key. Let's take the emotion out of it, focus on the facts and keep proposals fair and realistic. For farmers to fear that they will go out of business as a result of plans born out of a boardroom is a concern and something the country should be wary of. Farmers in and around Fairlie work hard for their family. They, like the vast majority of farmers, are proud and protective of their land and I will not sit back and keep quiet as they are vilified time and time again."
