

As I write this, I realise there are only 13 weeks left until the inaugural Mackenzie Half Marathon. Gulp!. So much to do, so little time! But it is all coming together really nicely.



Don’t think that you have to run a half marathon because we also have a 10 km option and a 5.5 km option. I am going to focus a little on just the half marathon course today though. The most scenic of the three. Why? Because it is the course that has a hill in it so also stunning views! I can’t help myself when I run/ walk it ... I always have to take a photo or two.

Starting at the Village Green, you head towards Timaru for 300 metres and then turn into Gray St and follow that until you get to the back of the Domain. Head down the hill and over the new Flying Fox course... We didn’t know it was going to be an obstacle course when we designed the run!

For those who are speedy and have time on their hands, feel free to go for a fly on the flying fox!. Head right past the ice rink and onto the track. Continue to the end and then at the end of Talbot Street cross the river, and head over to a farm track that leads onto Tondros Road. Carry on until you get to Spur Road. Yes... Aren’t you excited?.. you get to run/walk up Spur Road!, 3 km on past the picnic table at the top we will send you right onto The Bridal Track which is absolutely beautiful and the views are to die for. But we would appreciate it if you don’t actually do that! The Bridal track will lead you all the way back to Tondros Road and then you retrace your steps across the river and back up the track to Fairlie where you will receive an ‘awesome as’ medal! We will have food and coffee carts available and at Prize giving everyone will have the opportunity to win spot prizes.




Mackenzie Community Library News

Our Summer Reading Programme, with a theme of "Heat Wave: Reading Is Hot" is a free programme for children aged 4 years old to year 6, which is running until the 24th January 2020. We currently have 12 tamariki signed up and the staff are enjoying hearing about the books that they have been reading. Some favourites have been chosen for our Recommended Read section below. The free weekly "Crafternoon" sessions, every Monday at 2:30pm in the library, have had a slow start but the activities have been enjoyed by the children who attended.

Currently, we are able to offer an interloan service between ourselves and Timaru Library which is free to our library members, as we use staff and locals to collect/return the borrowed items. If you travel to Timaru frequently, and would be willing to help us keep this service free, please contact the library staff and we can arrange a roster of keen helpers. If we are unable to get the books collected and returned ourselves, we will need to charge customers postage, which would be around \$4 per book.

Emma Wynn's Recommended Read – *Go Girl – A Story Book of Epic NZ Women* by Barbara Else


Emma enjoyed this book because it was about female heroes from New Zealand, whose real-life stories are amazing and inspirational. It includes successful scientists, athletes, writers, lawyers, artists, social campaigners and more, and shows how these girls became heroes in their field and have achieved extraordinary things. It tells the story of how each girl discovered the confidence and determination to be successful in her own way. Emma was particularly interested in Sophie Pascoe's story because "she kept trying and didn't give up". This book reminds us that we have a legacy of brave, powerful, and history-changing women who can show the current generation what's possible if you 'dream big', don't give up, and dare to be different.



Lucas Lanchester's Recommended Read – *Nanny Mihi and the Bellbird* by Melanie Drewery

Lucas enjoys books about nature and animals, so this was a good choice, with a New Zealand focus. It is the story Nanny Mihi, who has her mokopuna (grandchildren) visit her every holiday. They enjoy listening to the beautiful melody of a visiting bellbird, and they even teach him to sing a song they have created. However, the bellbird doesn't visit them on their next holiday with Nanny. Where has he gone?

Lucas thought that this book would interest kids who liked nature and learning Maori words. The illustrations, by Tracy Duncan, are really special too.



Our Community

With summer now upon us and the school holidays underway, there will no doubt be more people out and about riding their horses in the Fairlie region.

Whilst most of us prefer to ride along the wonderful tracks and trails available to us in the region, sometimes we have to travel along the roads to get to these trails if floating our horses there isn't an option. With this in mind, it would be an ideal opportunity to remind everyone to take more care when passing horses on country roads.

Most riders will only ride or lead their horses along roads if they are sure that their horses will be steady enough to cope with any traffic that may pass them (even at 100Kmh, which is quite daunting even for experienced horses and riders), including noisy cars, flapping canopies on trailers and cyclists. This does not, however guarantee that something will not spook or unnerve the horse and turn them from a calm, relaxed steed into a frightened, shying, bolting flight animal keen to get away as fast as possible from whatever perceived terror they feel is after them. This can happen in a millisecond and before you know it you have gone from the relative safety of the roadside verge into oncoming traffic and the result, if that traffic is travelling at anything over 30km, will be devastating not only to the horse and rider but to the vehicle and its driver and any passengers.

ROAD SAFETY AROUND HORSES – PLEASE:

- ★ Slow down and pass carefully, giving plenty of room.
- ★ Do not sound your horn, rev your engine or pass at speed, as this could frighten the horse.
- ★ If the horse and rider are on a bridge or narrow road, be very careful — slow down or stop.
- ★ If the horse appears frightened, stop.
- ★ At night, dip your headlights when approaching a horse.
- ★ Two vehicles should avoid passing near a horse.

Important Note: If you are not careful around horse traffic, you could be charged with careless or dangerous driving.

Another thing to bear in mind in the Fairlie area, is that most of the trails are multi-use and therefore walkers, cyclists, horse riders and even trail bike riders may encounter each other on the tracks. Please remember the above when passing a horse and rider on a trail as well.

We are so fortunate to have such wonderful tracks and trails to enjoy right on our doorstep and every user of the trails has the right to be out there enjoying them and being safe whilst doing so. As horse riders we just ask that you remember that we are dealing with a living, breathing creature who sees the world differently to humans and their reactions to things may seem out of proportion however this is their instinct, run and ask questions later!! We will always do our best to ensure that nothing untoward happens, however if you come flying around a corner and frighten us then who knows what will happen!

School Holidays - Kids Cooking!

BLUEBERRY PIE



Ingredients for filling:

3/4 c white sugar, 3 T corn flour, 1/4 t salt, 1/2 t ground cinnamon, 1/2 t nutmeg, 4 c fresh blueberries, zest of 1 orange, icing sugar

This recipe is for a 9" double crust pie (or you can use a muffin tin to make about 6 small pies)

Method: Preheat oven to 190 degrees C. Add all of the filling ingredients into a bowl and mix well. Leave this and go make the pastry! Grease the pie dish. Line pie dish with one pie crust. Pour berry mixture into the crust. Cut remaining pastry into thin strips, and make lattice top. Crimp and seal edges with a fork. Bake pie on lower shelf of oven for about 50 mns, or until crust is golden brown. Dust pies with icing sugar. (If you are using a muffin tin, these only need to cook until golden on the tops - 20 mns.)

DAIRY FREE PASTRY:

Ingredients: 2 c flour, 1/2 t salt, 2/3 c coconut oil (not liquid) OR BUTTER if you aren't dairy free 3-6 T ice cold water

Method: Mix flour and salt together.

Add in the coconut oil slowly.

Add the ice water and mix dough together.

Roll out to the appropriate size.

Donations



Watching a disaster unfold elsewhere can be hard. It can often lead to feeling inept and our instinctive reaction is to consider what we can do to help. Unfortunately, if these efforts to support are not properly thought through, they can often do more harm than good.

Looking to the fires in Australia, we are seeing countless communities, fire stations and emergency response organisations pleading for people to stop sending donated goods. While such donations are obviously well-meaning, the influx of goods can easily overwhelm communities who are already pushed to the brink. This can cause what is often called 'The Second Disaster' as impacted communities and agencies struggle to transport, store and distribute goods. The huge amount of donations, many of which may be of little or no use, can pose a burden for years to come. Further afield, Vanuatu is still struggling to store and dispose of huge quantities of donated goods that arrived shortly after Cyclone Pam.

To give you an idea of the resource such donations can draw away from a response, research carried out after the 2009 Victoria bushfires found that:

The Victorian Bushfires resulted in the donation of in excess of 40,000 pallets of goods from across Australia that took up more than 50,000 square metres of storage space. The costs for managing these donations i.e. three central warehouses, five regional distribution points, approximately 35 paid staff, material handling equipment and transport costs to distribute the material aid, has amounted to over 8 million dollars.

In addition, volunteer numbers reached 1,500 during the first three months provided through over 40 store fronts. Resources in the fire affected areas immediately after the event were severely stretched as a result of material aid arriving without warning and without adequate resources to sort, store, handle and distribute.

So how can you help? Below are some tips to ensure that our good intentions are well directed.

Money is best

While many of us are 'do-ers' and look to get stuck in to lend a hand or donate items, the truth is that donating money is usually the best koha. That way, those that are impacted can decide for themselves what they need, rather than others making assumptions on their behalf.

It's often better to donate to established community groups or NGO's rather than individuals. Don't get scammed. You can check to see if the group you're looking to donate to in Australia is a registered charity at <https://www.acnc.gov.au/charity> or in New Zealand <https://www.charities.govt.nz/charities-in-new-zealand/>

Think local

One of the best things you can do, is to act local. Think about the community groups you're part of that could act collectively to assist.

Community events or campaigns to raise awareness and funds not only help the impacted areas, but also strengthen the connections in your own community. This will bear fruit not only for those you're looking to support, but also your own community in the event of an emergency closer to home

Now is the time to work on a plan for your own – what risks do you live with? Who could be impacted and what strengths and networks are in your community to provide support?

Within Civil Defence and Emergency Management across New Zealand we are also advocating that donating money is more efficient and has more flexibility for assisting the impacted community. This is also why there are more Mayoral Emergency funds being established during emergencies to create a trusted channel for any received funds.


North Street Bridge, Fairlie - Update

The North Street bridge has been closed for quite some time now and Council appreciates the patience of the community in relation to this matter. The bridge beams had come to the end of their life and deterioration was such that the bridge couldn't remain safely in service.

After considering all the options the decision was made to retain the existing foundations but replace the remainder of the superstructure. This will ensure the bridge is fit for purpose for many years to come.

There has been some delay in sourcing structural timber beams for the build because they are cut to order. There has also been design work to be completed to ensure the capacity of the structure will be adequate to cater for the loadings on the bridge. This is now complete and the contractor envisages these works will take approximately 2- 3 weeks to complete, with work starting in late January. During this time the old bridge will be deconstructed and removed and the new bridge erected in its place. We advise the public avoid this area while these construction works are undertaken.
