Elder Abuse - help is just a phone call away!

We all want to feel safe in our homes and communities. Unfortunately, that is not the case for us all. Elder abuse is a hidden problem that is often not reported because family members are involved. Do not think this isn't happening in our Mackenzie community! It is something that the victims find so hard to talk about - those they love treating them like this. However many an outsider can see what is going on and we can only encourage the victim to get help.

FACT: 81% of alleged elder abusers are family members FACT: 57% of alleged elder abusers are adult children or grandchildren.

We continue the fight against elder abuse through raising awareness, making it clear just what elder abuse is, as we want to make sure all older folk feel safe in their own home.

Elder abuse can take many forms – a family member taking control of finances, suggesting the older person stay in their home rather than going into care when they need it, because it COSTS! Not visiting and refusing contact, hurtful words and actions, threatening and blackmail type behaviour, not allowing contact with grandchildren and ones the older person loves! So many forms exist!

Together, we can help vulnerable older Kiwis feel safe in their own home. World Elder Abuse Awareness Week runs from 15-22 June and this year the focus is on why 'Elder Abuse Hits Close to Home.'

A lot of older people don't want to feel like a burden to their family and don't speak up, so elder abuse is often a hidden issue within Aotearoa or attached with a lot of stigma. Older folk are our living treasures and deserve to be treated as such! Help us care for them as you will want to be cared for some day!

Unfortunately we have had some vehicle crime in the area lately. If anyone has any information, please contact NZ Police by dialling 105.



Lake Tekapo Regional Park

The <u>Lake Tekapo Regional Park</u> is made up of 165 hectares of exotic forest nestled close to the shores of picturesque Lake Tekapo. It has about 24kms of shared use tracks developed for mountain biking, walking, cross country skiing and orienteering.

It also includes a 2-hectare fully enclosed dog park for letting your pets run free, and plenty of great spots for a picnic!

The Park flanks both sides of the southern end of Lilybank Road north of State Highway 8, accessed by vehicles from Lilybank Road. There is also walking and mountain bike access from the Tekapo Village directly or via the Cowans Hill track.

Who we are? We took over ownership at the beginning of April whilst caught in Wanaka for Level 4. As soon as restrictions allowed, we packed up our wee family and made our way to Kimbell to get the pub ready for re-opening.

Together with our incredible team - both locals and humans hailing from further away – we aim to honour what Silverstream Hotel means to locals - a welcoming gathering place for a drink and chat, good food and company - but also extend the offering through our crêpes and coffee van Charlie Brown, and share the story of the pub with travellers.

Mango Chicken Slow Cooker Curry

425g tin mango slices 2 carrots – peeled and sliced 2 cloves garlic, sliced 400ml tin coconut milk 1 T brown sugar 600g chicken thighs 2 t curry powder Lemon or Lime juice, to serve Coriander, to serve

I brown onion – sliced It chicken stock powder 1 T oil

1 t ground turmeric 100g green beans, halved

- 1. Drain mango slices and dice. Add to the slow cooker with onion, carrots and garlic.
- Add coconut milk with the chicken stock powder 2. and brown sugar. Stir to combine.
- Heat oil in a pan over medium heat. Cut thighs into 3. 4cm pieces. Working in batches, brown well. Return all of the chicken to the pan and add turmeric and curry powder. Stir well for a minute or two then add chicken to the slow cooker, being sure to scrape in all the oil and spices from the pan.

4. Cook on low for 4 – 6 hours until the chicken is tender. Add beans during last half hour.

5. Just before serving add lemon or lime juice to taste and coriander. Serve with steamed rice!

Do you need 1 to 1 support with a situation that is stressing you out? Our advocates are available, free of charge, to help you prepare to take action.

1 to 1 Advocacy

We base our 1 to 1 advocacy on the guiding principle of social justice, which underpins all of our work. That means standing alongside people, doing things with them not for them, and helping to empower them to get their voices heard.

Each member of our team of advocates is:

- confidential
- non judgemental
- reassuring

We can support you with a wide range of issues:

- Work and income
- Employment disputes
- Tenancy
- and any other requests

1 to 1 advocacy is flexible to meet the needs of each individual. Requests for support can come from any source – directly from yourself, from other agencies, and friends or family.

Once we get a request for support, it is essentially a 3 step process, but that can vary depending on your own preference:

- Make time to meet in advance of the actual appointment to find out all the relevant background information and to prepare together.
- Attend the appointment with the 3rd party together; your advocate will be your support person, not spokesperson, so you will need to speak on your own behalf;
- Debrief afterwards discuss how you think the appointment went, and plan where to from here with your situation.

The 'No Straws please' promotion asked why we needed to use straws at all when we expect glassware that we are being offered use of, should be immaculately clean! Some have continued to use the plastic but pleasingly many have switched to the cardboard straws - some of which aren't up to much, and would be better just not using them at all!

You live in the Mackenzie? We can lead by example? Do not buy



single use water bottles, buy reusable! Do not support the use of take away cups! Take 5 mins to drink your coffee at the place where you buy it and return the cup or carry your own reusable coffee cup wherever you may go!






