## Mackenzie District Council receives grant to help young people and those who have lost jobs due to COVID-19

Mackenzie District Council has received \$250,000 as part of a Government scheme to pump \$11.5m into rural New Zealand to help young people into jobs as wage subsidies come to an end and their unemployment rate rises at twice the rate of older workers.

The Mayors Taskforce for Jobs programme is a collaboration between the Mayors Taskforce for Jobs and the Ministry of Social Development and is being launched nationwide to help young workers and those displaced due to the impact of the COVID-19 crisis.

The Mayoral Taskforce for Jobs and the Ministry of Social Development have signed an agreement which will involve 23 rural councils each receiving up to \$500,000 over the next year, to help match up job seekers with employers.

The initiative will aim to create 50 jobs in each council district over the 12 months, by assisting small to medium-sized businesses with recruitment, training and subsidies, to help them take on young workers or those who have been displaced due to the impact of Covid-19.

The programme will largely focus on young people, into their late 20's, not in education, employment, or training.

Mayor Graham Smith said "We in the Mackenzie are very fortunate to get these funds and the timing is very good for local businesses. I hope businesses will support employing locals where they can, and I'm sure that the scheme will make a significant difference to businesses and employees in the Mackenzie".

Mackenzie District Council has also created a Facebook group 'Jobs in the Mackenzie District' which aims to connect local businesses in the Mackenzie with local people looking for employment.

Mackenzie District Council staff will be running a road-show around the District in early September to help inform both businesses and job seekers on the assistance available to them.

Kerri enjoys presenting 'good Kiwi food' and will incorporate Kiwi, German and Thai Cuisine in the menu.

## The Historic Silverstream Hotel

When Lockie and Caroline Broadfoot took over the Silverstream Hotel at Kimbell a few months ago, they could not foresee the weeks they would spend in lockdown - time to set about planning and making changes to the historic hotel.



Having painted the interior and stripped back timber, once lockdown ended they turned their attention to the northern wall of the hotel and after pulling off existing cladding found the original limestone building. What a joy! They have had this area restored and old bricks have been used to make a superb paved outdoors area to be used for seating adjacent to the Charlie Brown Coffee Cart, and undoubtedly a suntrap come summer! Lockie explained that due to an extension to the front of the hotel, the limestone doesn't appear to extend along that area.

Lockie says he knows the Silverstream has always been a popular community asset, that it is a well used hotel and its use has evolved over the years. Lockie and Caroline would like to display photos of just how the place is used. "Yes, I do," said Chris.


"Did you, er, happen to get up in the middle of the night, go up to the house and pay her a visit?"

# Health and Wellbeing

## Peter Wardle - CrossFit H-Squad

Righto... so last time we talked about how the old food pyramid principle can cause havoc in the body. Too many refined carbs plays with our blood sugars and upsets our system. Chances are if you read the last article you had a little bit more awareness of what it felt like an hour or two after eating? How was it? Did you find you want to eat more of some foods? Salty, fatty, french fries or crisps?? What are your 'watch out' foods? I still eat my 'watch out' foods on occasions to give me a reminder of why to watch out for them! Anyway... back to the journey, what I did.

Let's wind it back to when I was 20 years old. Just for a moment, think what you were doing when you were 20 years old and how you made decisions. What kinds of decisions did you have to make back then? I had just finished up my time at Smedley Station in the Hawkes Bay, booked in to go to Outward Bound and was on the way to Study a Bachelor of Agriculture, Double Majoring in Farm Management and Rural Valuation. It was all go.



Mum was a big help. I love my mum. She took me to a dude called Dayandra at the Therapeutic Centre in Thorndon, Wellington. They viewed my blood under a microscope to see red cells, whites cells, and undigested food. Unreal. It explained a lot about how I felt too.

Dayandra hooked me up to this device designed by NASA to read energy levels in the body. Talk about mind blown with information! It picked up that I had had giardia, glandular fever, damaged ankles, neck stiffness, felt resentment, I'd dropped my immunity to make me more sensitive to cheese and a whole bunch of other things. Long story short, stay off the wheat, so I did - 100%.

How? In a way I took the easy road. Switch all the wheat processed products to gluten free processed products.

Bread, pasta, crackers... I wouldn't call myself a shearer but I went and did a bit of shearing afterwards and lost 5kg in 5 days. Yes it was hot and yes I was working hard because I was a rookie, but boy did I feel an energy shift! The worst part of that was no scones with jam and cream for smoko!

It got me thinking. If having a simple change like this makes me feel this much better daily, and my new normal energy level is this much higher, what else can I do to make it better? I talked to people, I read books (believe it or not I actually went out of my way to read. The guy who almost failed English at School was reading!) and I tried new things. Some books I read were Eat for your Type, Born to Run and Why we get Fat to name a few.

For the next few years I just stuck to being the gluten free guy who didn't care because it felt awesome. I slowly started to get away from processed products. My food journey went up a level after reading the CrossFit Level 1 Training guide. Next time –my ZONE experience.

## Jackie Phillips - The Social Nature of Humans

Human nature is profoundly social – as a species we survive and flourish because of our ability to live and work together in complex social groups. We generally co-operate with others to solve problems and overcome threats, especially when faced with adversity and combined suffering. This sociality means we are also programmed to care deeply about social acceptance and social status to boost our chances of survival.

Many of us have difficulties with social situations and some of us may feel like actors playing roles and following scripts every day. The need to feel accepted and build self-esteem means that we sometimes conform to others' ideas, even if immoral. On the other hand, the perception of others plays an important role in self-development and our ego can allow too much self-importance. Given the right conditions of authoritative command, humans can have delusional perceptions of others which leads to sadism. The more power and control, the more cruel we can become – you only have to look at history to see many examples of this.

Humans are creatures of habit and we can be fearful when approaching the unknown, so it is difficult to adjust attitudes. Negative conditioning, favouring and racism makes people more likely to fail, so natural selection (survival of the fittest) kicks in and we see more arrogance, judgemental and patronising behaviour. Natural selection is selfish.

I feel that we are beginning to see societal changes because of social media – it is playing a huge role in changing our sense of self. Instant gratification and social comparison can inflate egos or it can lower self-esteem which is detrimental to the development of a positive sense of identity. There have been numerous longitudinal studies that show that children who are more patient and willing to delay gratification have a higher success rate in adulthood, so why are we allowing our children to spend so much time on social media which provides instant and constant gratification?

Building confidence requires positive reinforcement rather than constant criticism. It takes a community to raise a child and we are very fortunate in Fairlie to live in such a connected community with so many volunteers working towards making everyone feel valued.

In our modern, busy lives it would be nice to see people committing some time to being more reflexive and trying to develop into more compassionate humans. Perhaps the key is to begin thinking about your whole life story in a completely different way, in a way that may bring you contentment within yourself. Look deeply at what you already have and stop comparing yourself to others. Think more about the primary reinforcers (water, food, sleep, shelter, pleasure). Switch off the social media, YouTube and Netflix – be with each other – read – exercise – volunteer – eat and drink slowly and enjoy nature.

## MACKENZIE COMMUNITY GARDENS

I'm delighted to share with you two wonderful community projects that have begun in Fairlie and in Lake Tekapo (Takapō) this Spring. Two Community Gardens are being developed on sections of land that have been made available by the Mackenzie Cooperating Parish (Community Church). The Takapō Community Garden in Lake Tekapo is being developed on Aorangi Crescent next to The Bright Stars Centre. The Community Garden in Fairlie is being developed on Kirke Street on the land of St Stephen's church. Both community gardens will incorporate seasonal vegetables gardens, berries, orchard trees, native tree nursery, and be designed using Permaculture principles.



Their most memorable performances have been described as "... among the greatest in any art form to come out of this country".


With a forty year-plus history, recently celebrated with an expansive art gallery survey exhibition, this NZ group is not to be missed!



## Lemon Cupcakes

1 2/3 c (210 g) all-purpose flour	1/2 t baking powder
1/4 t baking soda	1/2 t salt
2 eggs	1 c (200 g) white sugar
1/2 c (115 g) butter, melted	2 t vanilla extract
1 T lemon zest	Juice of 1 lemon
3/4 c (180 ml) milk, at room temperature	

- Preheat the oven to 350°F (177°C). Line a 12-cup muffin pan with cupcake liners.
- Sift the flour, baking powder, baking soda, and salt together in a large bowl; set aside.
- In a medium bowl, whisk the eggs, sugar, melted butter and vanilla until combined.
- Pour the wet ingredients into the dry ingredients and using a spatula fold together until just combined.
- Whisk in lemon zest, lemon juice and milk and mix until just combined. Do not overmix.
- Spoon the batter into the cupcake liners, filling 3/4 full to avoid spilling over the sides.
- Bake for 18-20 minutes. Let the cupcakes cool completely before filling and frosting.

## Raspberry Filling

5 T (75 ml) water	1 T cornflour
1 1/2 c raspberries	1/3 c (70 g) white sugar

In a small bowl whisk together 2 tablespoons of water and cornflour. Set aside. In a small saucepan combine raspberries, sugar and 3 Tablespoons of water and cook over medium-high until berries break down, about 10 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add cornflour mixture into the raspberry puree and stir for another 2 minutes. The mixture will thicken. Remove from the heat and allow to cool.

## To fill the Cupcakes

- Using a sharp knife, cut a circular hole into the centre of the cooled cupcake to create a little pocket about 1/2 inch deep.
- Place 1 teaspoon of raspberry filling inside and top with the piece of cupcake you removed to seal. Repeat with the rest of the cupcakes.

### Scouring Calves

Rearing calves either commercially or as a pet has its challenges and scouring calves is one of the worst.

Scours (or diarrhoea) can be caused by diet (nutritional scours) or frequently by an infectious cause. This can rapidly lead to death if gone untreated.


The cause of death in scouring calves is:

**Dehydration + lack of energy → Death**

The intestines are stripped of their absorptive capabilities. The villi in the intestines are "killed off" meaning the calf cannot absorb the nutrition it requires. This leads to electrolyte imbalances in the blood and secondary bacterial infection.



Healthy villi in the intestines



Eroded villi after calf scours

Below is a quick guide to determining the degree of dehydration in a sick calf.

CALF SIGNS OF DEHYDRATION	% DEHYDRATED	SEVERITY
Scouring only	5%	MILD
Eyes a <i>little</i> sunken, skin slow to flatten (5-10s) when pinched, gums sticky to touch and calf flat	6-8%	MODERATE-SEVERE
Eyes sunken, skin slow to flatten (11-15s) when pinched, gums sticky to touch and calf very flat	9- 10%	SEVERE and may needs intravenous fluids
Eyes <i>very</i> sunken, skin not flattening (when pinched), calf will not stand	12%	CRITICAL and needs intravenous fluids

Many causes of infectious calf scours cause disease in humans so hygiene is VERY important.

We can diagnose common infectious causes of scour in-clinic and advise on treatment and prevention for your calves.



## PUBLIC NOTICE OF RIGHT TO DEMAND A POLL ON ELECTORAL SYSTEM

Notice is given under section 28(1) of the Local Electoral Act 2001, that electors of the Mackenzie District Council have the right to demand a poll on the electoral system to be used at the next two triennial general elections (2022 and 2025) of the Mackenzie District Council.

The choice is between the First Past the Post (FPP) and the Single Transferable Vote (STV) electoral systems. Unless a poll determines otherwise, the First Past the Post (FPP) system will be used for the Mackenzie District Council.

A valid demand for a poll must be:

- Made in writing.
- Signed by at least 5 percent of eligible electors of the Mackenzie District Council. This will require a minimum of 152 elector signatures.
- Delivered to the office of the Mackenzie District Council, 51 Main Street, Fairlie by 5pm Monday, 22 February 2021.

Every elector who signs a demand must also set out in it his or her full name and the address for which he or she is qualified as an elector of the Mackenzie District Council.






