Brave Caitlin Smith's Imaginary Band will be touring, **Caitlin Smith** (piano and vocals), **Mark Laurent** (guitar) and **Steve Cournane** (percussion and cymbals) a dream team performing jazz and folk music.

Caitlin Smith is a mesmerising performer, song-poet and story singer. Legally blind since birth, she is a tireless advocate for accessibility issues and the healing and transformative power of creativity.

A vocal and song-writing coach to many of our best known artists, Caitlin Smith combines poetry and music in unforgettable performances that include her original compositions as well as covers penned by her musical heroes. Caitlin Smith's latest album '*You Have Reached Your Destination*' creates a multisensory universe unto itself - originals are sandwiched between the tastiest covers, especially the repertoire of her spiritual parents Joni Mitchell and Leonard Cohen.

Mark Laurent has been replaced by **Lance McNichol**. Lance has been part of the Auckland music scene for decades. He can hold his own with most forms of music including jazz, blues, ska and rock. Famous for his solid rhythmic grooves and blistering soloing, he still leaves plenty of space for others.

Steve Cournane is a drummer and composer who began playing with the *Alpaca Brothers* in Dunedin, in 1984. Steve won a Tui for NZ Jazz album of the year in 2002 for the album *Stereoscope* by CLBob. This group released three albums and performed relentlessly around the country over a ten-year period. In 2007 he moved to Lima, Peru, where he survived as a musician while studying the coastal Afro-Criolla music for another seven years. He moved to Auckland in 2017 and currently playscajón with Isla Flamenca (with Ian Sinclair) and drum-kit with BOAT and Bill Direen.

At the prize giving the President Geoff Allison congratulated all winners of the Championships and the clubs competitions and thanked everyone for their work and support over the season.





Two lots of new signage in the Fairlie area have been created this last week. The signage for the Gorge is welcomed and has been mounted at the entrances of the Opihi Gorge Walk. Signage is on order for the Fairlie Skate Skooter Park. The one for the Skate Skooter Park is temporary but highlights the wearing of safety helmets, the 'no smoking, drinking and drugs' instruction plus that bikes can only be ridden on the park by those under 8 years. Why the later? This is only a small skatepark and the riding of bikes by older folk becomes a hazard to the little children.

Goey Caramel ANZAC Slice

This goey caramel slice is a great (and slightly more decadent) alternative to the traditional Anzac biscuit

1½ cups **Edmonds Standard Grade Flour**
1 tsp **Edmonds Baking Powder**
½ cup **Chelsea Soft Brown Sugar**
140g **Tararua Butter**, melted

Caramel

395g condensed milk
2 Tbsp **Chelsea Golden Syrup Tin**
50g **Tararua Butter**

Topping

½ cup thread coconut
½ cup rolled oats
½ cup **Chelsea Soft Brown Sugar**
30g **Tararua Butter**

Pre-heat oven to 175°C conventional bake, or 155°C fan bake. Line the base of a 19cm x 30cm slice tin with baking paper.

Base

Combine the flour, baking powder and brown sugar in a bowl, add the melted butter and stir well until combined, then press mixture evenly into the prepared tin to form a base. Bake for 10-12 minutes until pale golden and just set.

Caramel

Melt together the condensed milk, golden syrup and butter in a saucepan over low-medium heat, stirring until golden and thickened (watch the bottom doesn't burn). Set aside to cool for 5 minutes while making the topping.

Topping

Combine coconut, oats, brown sugar and butter and stir well.

Pour the caramel over the par-baked base. Then carefully spread over topping mixture, pressing into the caramel lightly. Bake the slice for a further 10-15 minutes until golden and bubbling.

Set aside to cool before cutting into slices.

Maybe that business was the CFCA, the big general department store that occupied the whole corner of Main St and Allandale Road where the Fairlie Pharmacy, EAT and the 4 Square shop are now.

Fairlie Pump Park Proposal

What is a pump track?

A pump track is a circuit of rollers, banked turns and features designed to be ridden completely by riders "pumping"- generating momentum by up and down body movements, instead of pedaling or pushing. Pump tracks are relatively simple to use and cheap to construct, and cater to a wide variety of rider skill levels.

Why a pump track for Fairlie?

As with the skatepark, the idea is driven by the community who have asked if there is enough support to consider one for Fairlie. Such a track would certainly give older youth and adults something to do other than use the skatepark. At what cost? Supporting the statement above, these parks can be cheap to construct as they are simply sculpturing the earth to form the track.

There will be a get together of those interested in the formation of a Pump Park – an informal get together – to see who thinks what and where to from here!



Our water is in a bit of trouble, not just in South Canterbury, but across the world.

The things that we do on land can affect the quality of our water. Our waste often gets washed into our rivers and coasts without any treatment. This waste might be the big bits that you can see like plastic bags, bottles, dog poo and ciggie butts. It's also the tiny, microscopic toxins that we can't see. They build up and pollute our water to such an extent that waterways become toxic for plants, fish and animals.

While we're all becoming more aware of our carbon footprint, we should also probably be looking at our nitrogen pollution, or our nitrogen footprint; this is the amount of nitrogen released to the environment from our food, housing, transportation, goods and services.

The collaboration of a wide range of people, stakeholders and organizations across an entire watershed is vital to reducing nutrient pollution to our water and air. Farmers play an important leadership role in these efforts when they get involved and engage with central government, local and regional councils, conservation groups, educational institutions, non-profit organizations, and community groups.

The Upper Opihi-Opuha catchment group meet regularly throughout the year and would love to see more community members attending.

Coping with the changes to your banking!

It is easy to understand the trepidation some people may face with online banking.

Many are nervous on their first forays into online banking but after people have a go, they realise it was safe and secure and not as hard as they thought. The biggest thing was taking that first step and trying it out. And that's where Heartlands Mary McCambridge comes in!

As well as digital banking, phone banking was also an option that people could try. Mary can get you sorted with that too. Mary's 'one on one' sessions are aimed specifically at teaching new skills and helping them feel comfortable with new ways of doing things.

Mary and your bank can address user's concerns about using online platforms for banking. There is a lot of mis-information about fraud, scams and being taken advantage of. Banks find that these are the main causes of fear around going online.

You can to set up bill payments via online banking, set up phone banking and write down the steps on how to follow the instructions next time. And if it all goes 'ka put', then Mary can call on you and take you through it again without you having to give passwords to her either.

A top tip for seniors and in fact anyone using banks - never share your password with anyone and do not hesitate to ask the bank for help if you need it - whether that's remote or face to face.

Sadly this change in banking means that some older folk may be taken advantage of when they have to put their finances in the hands of others - be it family or friends. Be sure you can trust the person you entrust your finances to.

If you need to discuss such things - confidentially - Heartlands can give you someone to talk to. Just ask for referral. Mary can also teach you the joy of using your ipad to fill in time exploring all it as to offer as well as games to pass those wintery evenings!


