Grit is one of the school values that Mackenzie College students exhibit frequently. Our students are tenacious in the way they show this value, putting their head down, and getting stuck in to get the task done. Grit is showing resilience and tenacity to get something finished even though doing it is tough and you are feeling like you want to give up.

When asked, Year 13 student Melissa said grit is "No matter what the task is, digging deep, trying your best and completing projects and activities with determination, motivation and drive to succeed". Whilst a small group of our Year 12 students (Maggie, Izzy, and Ollie) said that grit was never giving up (even though you might like to), persevering through the hard times and trying your hardest.





"Breathing Matters" and *"Breathe, Stretch & Move"*

Authors Dinah Bradley and Tania Clifton-Smith — the 'queens of calm' — are world experts on breathing pattern disorders. As practising physiotherapists they have an in-depth understanding of the physiological and musculoskeletal problems caused by poor breathing. Breathing well helps you relax, normalises your body biochemistry, reduces muscle pain and helps you achieve normal posture and movement (Backcover). These two books would be of interest to anyone who attended Catherine Rose's Breathing Workshop back in April of this year.



"Grief on the Run" by Julie Zarifeh

What happens when your life is rocked by unimaginable loss and grief? How do you survive and how do you keep going? Julie Zarifeh shares the tragic story of losing her 27-year-old son, Sam, in a whitewater rafting accident just sixteen days after her 60-year-old husband, Paul, died of pancreatic cancer. She describes how she and her surviving son and daughter dealt with this double whammy and how she embraced the notion of 'active grieving'. This included a 450-kilometre cycle tour around Sri Lanka, raising money to give disadvantaged Kiwi children new bikes; trekking the 800-kilometre Camino de Santiago; and running the New York marathon on behalf of the Mental Health Foundation. Julie's account of learning to live with grief, plus her experience as a clinical psychologist, make this an inspirational and ultimately uplifting read. (Backcover)

FAIRLIE COMMUNITY VEHICLE TRUST

Chairman's Report 2021

The Fairlie Community Vehicle Trust operates a car, four minivans and a trailer, providing affordable and accessible transport services to the Fairlie and surrounding communities. The Trust is funded by grants from Lotto, ECAN and the Ministry for Social Development, and by sponsorship by local businesses .

Despite operations being significantly impacted by restrictions as a result of COVID-19 at the start of the previous financial year and the end of the current one, demand for the vehicles has remained high. Our community car allows the elderly and those without a vehicle of their own to access essential services including healthcare appointments, banking services or even just to go shopping in Timaru. Clubs and societies use the minivans to access a range of cultural and sporting activities. Providing access to opportunities for social connectivity has never been more important than in the aftermath of lockdowns when some sections of our community have suffered from the impact of physical and social isolation. We continue to work in partnership with Mackenzie College who use Trust vehicles on a regular basis enabling students to access a range of opportunities and activities locally and outside the district.

The Trust continues to actively invest in a modern fleet, which keeps maintenance and repair costs to a minimum and provides high quality vehicles for our users. At the time of writing, we have ordered a new 12 seater van to replace the current oldest model - which is now three years old. In addition to reducing maintenance costs, selling vehicles after three years with relatively low mileage and while in a good condition ensures the Trust receives a good sale price to offset the purchase of new vehicles.

The Trust is run on an entirely voluntary basis and I'd like to thank all our sponsors, our volunteer drivers and the Trustees for their commitment. A special thank you to Sharyn and the two Annes (Thomson and Harrison) at Heartlands who look after our administration and keep the vehicles serviced and clean. Without these wonderful individuals giving their time and expertise the Trust couldn't operate and continue provide this vital service for our community. And thanks to those who use the vehicles - your support keeps the Trust viable.

All younger family members touch the feet of the elders to seek their blessings, at the end of the day.

This event has been organised as a way to build awareness of the people within our community and the festivals that are celebrated. This will be the first Diwali festival held in Fairlie.





FENZ - Fairlie Brigade Report



Hope everyone had a good Labour weekend - the roads are a lot busier with people getting out and about. At time of writing, the Brigade has not been needed this weekend and we have only had three call outs in a few weeks.

The winter weather seems to want to hang around with the odd frost and lower temperatures which is keeping the fire risk down. This is great but a bit of warmer weather would be nice!

Last practice night was at the Rugby Club where Grant and Haydon had the Firefighters doing breathing apparatus, entry control, chemical splash suits (we use these at Hazardous Chemical calls), search and rescue and water way equipment. The Rugby Club changing room was an excellent venue as it has many rooms. Many thanks to the Rugby Club for making these available.



Luke Howat attended a Recruit Course at the FENZ training centre at Woolston in Christchurch last week. This is a 7- day course that really tests the recruits in their Brigade training and gets them to a suitable standard to ride the appliances. Luke was presented with a yellow helmet - great effort Luke! It was a tough week as he has not long started a new job and to have to take a week off was asking a lot - thanks Luke.

You will be starting to get into the gardens and probably have the vege garden planted - I am still thinking about it! Have you got a safety zone around your house? What I mean by that is say a 10m radius around your house from trees, large bushes or hedges. It would be that safety space should those trees go on fire.

Lithium-ion battery safety tips from Fire and Emergency New Zealand:

- Do not charge a device under a pillow, on the bed or on a couch – they can overheat and cause a fire
- Don't use or charge a battery that shows signs of swelling, overheating or damage
- Only use the battery that is designed for the device
- Only use the charging equipment that came with the device, and don't use it if it's damaged
- Do not leave batteries or devices in direct sunlight or in hot vehicles
- Store batteries away from anything that can catch fire

Battery disposal

- Do not put lithium-ion batteries in the rubbish
- Recycling is always the best option – contact your local council for a recycling location
- Do not leave discarded batteries stored in piles, keep them separated until you can arrange for recycling

Tekapo Power Scheme Community Update – Spring 2021

Kia ora,


Welcome to our first update - we're planning to share these seasonally so you can stay in touch with what's happening at the Genesis Tekapo Power Scheme.

I've been the Tekapo Site Manager for just over two years now – time flies! I have a special connection with the scheme as I completed part of my apprenticeship here between 1986-87. I've spent most of my career working in the goldmining and hydroelectricity industries, and enjoyed coming back to the Mackenzie to lead our local team of eight who oversee the day-to-day operations and maintenance of the scheme.

Tekapo B Power Station Upgrade

Five years in the making, the \$15 million Tekapo B power station upgrade is underway. The project will deliver substantial efficiency gains and future proof the power station for decades. This is the first time this work has been undertaken since Tekapo B was commissioned in 1977. The project will see the station deliver its 800 GWh of annual generation by using water more efficiently - a great sustainability outcome.

Pictured is the disassembly of a generating unit at Tekapo B this month.



Seasonal Changes – Spring

The level of Lake Tekapo/Takapō changes throughout the year depending on inflows, snowmelt, weather events and electricity demand. The lake is currently around 63% full, with the lake level sitting at 707.7 meters above sea level (masl). Over the next couple of months, it's likely the lake level will gradually rise as the winter snow melts.
