## The Night Sky in February 2022

At the beginning of the month Jupiter might be seen near the western horizon soon after sunset. It looks like a bright golden star. It sets a little earlier each night so fades into the twilight by mid-month. On the 2nd the very thin crescent Moon will be left of Jupiter.




The brightest 'real' stars are nearly overhead. Sirius, the brightest star, is north of the zenith. Canopus, the second brightest star, is south of the zenith. Below and left of Sirius are Orion's bright stars: bluish Rigel and reddish Betelgeuse. Between them is the line of three stars making Orion's Belt. The Belt line points left and down to orange Aldebaran, one eye of Taurus the Bull. Continuing the same line finds a tight bunch of fainter stars making the Pleiades/ Matariki star cluster.

Sirius, 'the Dog Star', marks the head of Canis Major the big dog. A group of stars above and right of it make the dog's hindquarters and tail. Procyon, in the northeast below Sirius, marks the smaller of the two dogs that follow Orion the hunter across the sky. The three stars of Orion's belt make the bottom of 'the pot' or 'the saucepan'. The handle of the pot is the faint line of stars above the bright three. At its centre is the Orion Nebula: a glowing gas cloud easily seen in binoculars.

Crux, the Southern Cross, is upside down in the southeast. Below it are Beta and Alpha Centauri, often called 'The Pointers'. The Milky Way is brightest in the southeast toward Crux. It can be traced up the sky, fading where it is nearly overhead. The Clouds of Magellan are high in the south sky, looking like misty clouds, easily seen on a dark moonless night. They are two small galaxies, nearby as galaxies go.

For early-risers, Mercury, Venus and Mars are all in the dawn sky. Brilliant Venus is the beacon for the region. It rises around 4:20 a.m. at the beginning of the month and 3:30 by the end. Mars looks like a medium-brightness red star above Venus at first. Venus catches up on Mars so the two are nearly level by the end of February. Mercury is below and right of Venus and similar in brightness to Mars at the beginning of the month. It slowly brightens. The Moon will be near Mars and Venus on the 28th and above Mercury on March 1st.

# Our Community

Dear Friends,

After 13 years as an ordained minister, with nearly nine years of that time in the beautiful Mackenzie Parish, Anna and I have decided it is time for me to step down from ordained ministry at the end of February 2022. Coming to this realisation and making this decision has not been easy. We love this church and the wider community. Our children have been cradled by the hills, mountains, and lakes of this district for most of their growing years. I have often questioned my role as an ordained minister within our changing society and the changing culture of the church, but I have never questioned living here. We have been greatly blessed being part of this community for the past years. Leaving church leadership has some differences from leaving other jobs. The church congregation and the community has become something of an encompassing concern for my thoughts and prayers, my struggles, and my hopes. So, in leaving, I leave not only a job or a workplace, but a community that has shaped both my relationship with God and my identity in very important ways.

The past two years have been challenging for all of us. Covid-19 has reminded us that we are not gods and that there are vast dimensions of creation outside the control of human management. The pandemic has surfaced both anxiety and faith, it has brought us together and it has divided us. It has been a challenging time for me to pastor, lead and preach. I have found my own deepest intuitions to be at odds with much of the way our society, church and government has responded to the pandemic. This uncomfortable discovery has surfaced some raw and honest sermons at times, and has been mentally, emotionally, and spiritually draining. There are things I wish I had done better to support members of our own community during this time, and perhaps convictions I wish I could have been clearer about. My deepest hope is still that we will all weather this storm with increasing compassion, forgiveness, and reverence for each other, especially those who think, feel, and respond differently to the pandemic than ourselves.

The pandemic has also brought to the surface my need to step down from ordained ministry. We have decided to move back to our home in Ashburton where I have been offered work on a large family farm. Our oldest children, Ailan and Eilish have just left home, Ailan to pursue work opportunities in Marlborough and Eilish to complete her secondary schooling in Christchurch. Moving to Ashburton will enable us to be closer to them and to other members of our family. Coming to this decision has been for me, not so much a matter of making a decision but recognising that a decision of the heart has already been made that my head is catching up with. The hope in taking this step is to recognise the next stage of God's purpose unfolding in our life. (CONT)

**Growing companion plants in and around your veggie garden is a great way to help keep your edible plants happy and healthy.**

Many flowering companion plants help attract beneficial insects. Some help pollinate plants, which often improves yields, while others are predatory, preying on a whole host of pest species. Plants to attract beneficial insects: alyssum, anise hyssop, hyssop, sage, lavender, rosemary, cleome, thyme, echinacea, fox glove, phacelia, crab apples, and borage.

## Fairlie – an interesting history: Heartlands Fairlie Resource Centre


The Fairlie Work Trust was established to take on government contracts for the delivery of pre-employment training programs in the form of Access courses. It operated with tutors offering courses ranging from life skills to building. The first of these courses was based in the old stone house at Kimbell. Later the Work Trust rented the old post office and a schoolhouse in Gillingham Street for further courses.

Fairlie's local paper 'The Fairlie Accessible' was named after these Access courses. It was produced as part of a training programme run by Rosemary Moran and Olive Bevan and began as a double sided A3 green paper, folded into four. The trainees were involved in setting it up, photocopying and delivery. Just as it is today, it contains local news, information and advertising and is delivered fortnightly to every household in the town. When the Access courses were discontinued, the paper was produced by volunteers and paid staff until it was sold to Angela Evans and then later sold to the Resource Centre where it is still produced.

In 1992, with the unanimous support of a public meeting, the Fairlie Work Trust was given the go ahead to set up a resource and development office. Eight people were appointed to manage the project and formed the Mackenzie Community Enhancement Board. The Board was tasked with finding premises, getting funding and employing staff and find ways to enhance the lives of members of the community by the provision of services.

With the discontinuation of the Access courses, the Fairlie Work Trust had less work to do and subsequently folded but there was still a need for some kind of service in the town that would be able to get contracts and do a variety of activities in the community and support those in need, particularly the unemployed, unskilled, beneficiaries and elderly. After a community meeting the Fairlie Resource Centre was established with initial funding from the Lotteries Grants Board.

The Fairlie Resource Centre, situated in what was formerly the butcher's shop on the Main St, opened its doors in December 1992. The Mackenzie Community Enhancement Board appointed David Reynolds to interview for the co-ordinator position and appointed Linda Gibson and Anne Thomson in a shared job. With subsequent funding from Lotteries Grants Board, Hillary Commission, Creative Communities New Zealand Scheme, COGS and the Mackenzie District Council, the Fairlie Resource Centre continued to operate from these premises for a couple of years until it moved along to the corner where the Mackenzie Country Restaurant is now.



After a purpose built fit out with offices and a meeting room, it was then able to provide other services and retail items. Along with services to the community, it was able to provide tourist information and run courses, do drivers' licences and take people for practical tests – getting your licence in Fairlie was a breeze back in those days as there were no roundabouts or traffic lights, few hill starts and very little traffic!

After a while Linda left and Anne Thomson took over the role of co-ordinator fulltime and Jill O'Connor was employed one day a week as treasurer. They were assisted by a team of volunteers.

The Council gave both the Fairlie Resource Centre and the Twizel Community Care Trust contracts to deliver welfare services to the town. (At the time the Fairlie office was open 9 am-5 pm, five days a week and the Twizel office 10 am-2 pm). The services provided were geared to each community and so were quite different. If there was a need for something or a new idea then the staff at The Fairlie Resource Centre would try to make it happen. Not all ideas took flight and they have since learnt that it is a good idea to test the waters before committing to a new project.

Adult Education Classes were run in conjunction with the College until funding for these were cut. The Resource Centre got the contract for the "Work for the Dole" scheme which was well supported and was of great benefit to non-profit organisations throughout the town – the painting on the wall at the rugby club is one example of someone on the scheme.

And so The Resource Centre continued until the Government decided that it wanted to retain government services in small towns. To achieve that the Government started a body called 'Heartlands' which approached not-for-profit organisations in certain towns - the Fairlie Resource Centre being one of them. And that's how the current name 'Heartlands Fairlie Resource Centre' came about.

### What do you love about living in Lake Tekapo?

I love Tekapo people. It's a very special place. I feel connected with God here.

### Chinese New Year is very soon. What are your memories of celebrating this special occasion, growing up in China?

I remember all the loud music playing in the city. Streets, shops and houses were all beautifully decorated in red. Chinese New Year is very much a family occasion. Children always go to visit their parents and share special food, which in my home, always included a pan fried whole fish. Everyone stayed up until midnight to see the next New Year in. When I was a child, this was the only time of the year that my siblings and I were given new clothes. On the last day of the holiday period, we were so excited to receive new clothes, socks and shoes. 



## Tekapo speed review update

The new lower speed signs went up in Tekapo in mid-December. We would like to thank the Tekapo community for working with us to make these changes that will save lives and prevent serious injuries.

These other safety improvements were also completed as part of this project.

- A new right turn bay into Lakeside Drive.
- An extension of the existing right turn bay into Rapuwai Lane.
- A new pedestrian refuge (central crossing island) opposite Tekapo Adventures.
- A new right turn bay into the Challenge Service Station.
- An extension of the existing right turn bay into Domain Road.
- A new pedestrian refuge (island) and kerb buildout on the south side of the road opposite the school bus stop near Greig Street.
- A new pedestrian refuge and kerbs on both sides of the road midway between Pioneer Drive and Hamilton Drive.
- A new right turn bay into Hamilton Drive.
- (Planned streetlight improvements are still to be completed)

## Upcoming maintenance and improvements

### Resealing

Our maintenance crew will be resealing SH8 through Tekapo from Lake Tekapo Bridge to just east of Cairns Avenue on or about Friday 28 January, depending on conditions. The road will be chip sealed and this should only take about a day to complete. The work will be done during the day with traffic management in place to keep road users and our crew safe. Please take care and follow the signposted safety directions both during and after this work is finished and while loose chip is still on site. Following the re-seal our crew will apply the updated line markings for this section of SH8.



## New footpaths for Tekapo

Waka Kotahi are doing some additional work in Tekapo to improve safety and access for pedestrians. We expect this work to start in the second week of February 2022 and take about six weeks to be finished.



### Aorangi to Peppers

We will be building a footpath between Aorangi Crescent and the entry to Peppers Resort. This path will be two metres wide and sealed with asphalt. 70m of new kerb and channel will be installed along SH8 and some landscaping will be included.

There may be traffic management restriction on the road shoulder while the new kerb is going in. This is to ensure your own safety and the safety of our crew. Please take care. (Unfortunately, this work could not be scheduled before the re-seal.)

### Pioneer to bus shelter

We will be building a footpath from the new bus shelter on SH8 near Greig Street to the corner of Pioneer Drive. This path will be 1.8 metres wide and sealed with a fine chip seal.

There may be minor traffic management restriction on the road shoulder when our crew is working close to the roadside to ensure safety for road users and our workers. Please take care.





Initially representatives from organisations such as WINZ and IRD would visit to assist customers with their affairs but as a result of the Ashburton shooting, it was no longer deemed safe for them to continue the service. Heartlands Fairlie Resource Centre continues to act as contact for these services and can put people in touch with the appropriate organisation.

Thanks to the Toy Library and Len Smith, the Heartlands Fairlie Resource Centre was able to move across the road from where it still operates today. With the support of the Mackenzie Community Enhancement Board and financing from various groups the Heartlands Fairlie Resource Centre continues to support the needs of the community. The Centre currently operates with 7 paid part time staff and Janine who works on the Fairlie Accessible at the Fairlie Office and Julie in Tekapo.

This marks Anne Thomson's 30<sup>th</sup> year and sadly her last. Anne has undoubtedly been the backbone of the organisation in her unwavering desire to help all those in need. From being a shoulder to cry on, an ear to listen to problems, fighting the big guys, getting the funding, taking the outings, she will be leaving very big boots to fill and will be sorely missed when she retires in November.

**Workplaces are open** - where appropriate staff may work from home




**Everyone can go to school** - public health measures will be in place

## Gatherings - Red

If a gathering chooses to follow My Vaccine Pass requirements, only people with My Vaccine Pass are allowed to be there. This includes workers.

Children under the age of 12 years and 3 months do not need to provide a My Vaccine Pass to enter places with a vaccination requirement.

- At a gathering at your home or private dwelling, there can be **up to 100 people**.
- At gatherings held at other venues, there can be **up to 100 people based on 1-metre physical distancing** in a single defined space at the venue at any time.

The limit applies to both indoor and outdoor venues. It includes children, but not staff.

If a venue for a gathering chooses not to operate with vaccine pass requirements:

- at a gathering at your home, there can be **up to 25 people**.
- at gatherings held at other venues, there can be **up to 25 people based on 1-metre physical distancing** in a single defined space at the venue at any time.

There can be a mix of people with and without My Vaccine Pass. The limit applies to both indoor and outdoor venues. The limit includes children, but not staff.
