
Albury School

Rural Retirement Living

The meetings held around the closure of Moreh Home last year created a lot of interest, and so on the back of this a group was formed to look at the needs and solutions for the ageing population of our area. Specifically, they are considering how these folk can remain a vital part of our vibrant Mackenzie community to which they have become very attached.

After a number of meetings and viewing different types of retirement living and care facilities including, Observatory Village in Oamaru, Mountainview Village in Timaru and Ribbonwood Home in Tapanui, it was decided to form a Charitable Trust which is named the Mackenzie District Community Care Charitable Trust. Trust members are Murray Cox, Ian McDonald, Owen Hunter, Jackie Donald, Evan Williams, and Murray Bell.

The Trust applied to Mid and South Canterbury Community Trust for funding for a feasibility study to look at establishing a retirement living space with some wrap-around services. We were successful in obtaining funding and have engaged Rationale Consulting who are also working alongside the Mackenzie District Council on their Aged Friendly Strategy. There will be more information available soon.

It is our view that a retirement living space would be Stage 1, Stage 2 would be a communal space with facilities as a common shared area for residents and Stage 3 would provide wrap around services and care. All of this would depend on demand, need and being financially viable, as this would have to be a self-supporting service.

The Trust has recently acquired the option of some land in the west side of the Fairlie township to situate such a facility and housing, and are carrying out due diligence.

This is a major project that will have many benefits to our Mackenzie community valuing and retaining our ageing residents in their retirement, within our community, in modern, warm, healthy homes.

It is essential we have community feedback, ideas and support and we intend having community meetings in the next few weeks so keep an eye out for the date, come along and hear more and provide your view.

The autumn of 2022 was influenced by two major factors. The first was dust in the stratosphere, left over from the Tongan volcanic eruption earlier in the year, which was noticeably providing a filter to sunlight during the months of March and April. This had the effect of the days feeling very autumnal by mid February. The dust seemed to fully disperse by May, resulting in many days being milder than April had been. The other factor was the dissipation of a massive La Nina global cycle which had ruined our summer. This meant we had a period of 'not much happening' in our part of the Pacific which led to low rainfall figures.

Last autumn will probably mostly be remembered for the plague of Cluster Flies which invaded parts of Canterbury. Their population explosion was due to a wet summer and the subsequent abundance of earthworms which they thrive on. Unfortunately the only way to dramatically reduce their future population in our district is a cold late spring followed by a dry summer.

Fingers crossed for a great ski season this year!

There are lots of visitors looking forward to coming to the Mackenzie this winter.

Tekapo Power Scheme – Winter Community Update

Kia ora, the frosty mornings of winter have arrived and it's time for an update from the team at the Tekapo Power Scheme.

Seasonal Changes – Winter

As the temperature drops, demand for electricity increases to keep homes and businesses warm. As the Tekapo Power Scheme has been generating consistently over the last few months the level of Lake Tekapo has gradually decreased. Currently, Lake Tekapo is approximately 706.4 meters above sea level, that's around 48% full. It is expected that the lake level will continue to decrease within the consented operating range throughout winter.

Public Safety around the Tekapo Power Scheme

At Genesis we take safety seriously and want to make sure everyone has a great time around the canals while remaining safe. Please remember the following when you're out along the canals or around the Tekapo Power Scheme:

- Drive safely – follow the posted speed limits, drive to the weather conditions, slow down around farm machinery, the Mount Cook Alpine Salmon Farm and others who are out fishing, biking, or enjoying the outdoors.
- Park in the designated parking areas so others can access the canals too.
- The edge of the canal is slippery, particularly where it is lined, and the canals are 9m deep. Please take care!
- Our power stations' water intake and discharge areas have fast flowing water. Follow the safety information on our signs near these areas.
- Do not climb fences around our structures – the fences are there to keep you safe.

If in doubt, please stay out.

What do you love about live theatre?


It's different every night, no two nights are ever the same. Also the team effort is really important with a small theatre group. We had a very tight knit team.

Bat roosting retreat flourishes

Hundreds of native seedlings planted on farmland near Te Ana a te Wai River are flourishing and providing a more biodiverse home for the local inhabitants—the pekapeka long-tailed bat.

Four years after a mega native planting day—and the installation of 25 bat roost boxes in the old poplar trees—the native plants have sprung up and are providing shelter and a better habitat for the resident pekapeka.

The 300 native plants, which include kanuka, tī kōuka (cabbage tree), harakeke (flax) and toe toe, were donated by

Waihao Marae and planted by members of the OTOP Water Zone Committee, along with their friends and families.

The native bats like roosting in older-age trees with cavities to hide in, so when old trees are felled they lose their habitat.

The roosting boxes give the bats some extra options and there's also regular predator control undertaken to further boost the survival of the tiny species.

The Orari Temuka Opihi Pareora Water Zone Committee is a joint committee made up of community members, rūnanga and local councils.

Tekapo

The majority of initial buyer enquiry in recent times has been directed to sections and/or opportunities for new builds largely driven by government tax incentives.

For many potential buyers once they gain an understanding of the likely build costs and extended build times they often redirect their interest to existing, often older dwellings suited for existing use & renovation or refurbishment at a later time.

There has certainly been a noticeable effect in terms of contracts falling due to banks withholding finance approval.

However with low listing levels and confidence increasing based on the relaxing of borders and anticipation of visitors returning to Lake Tekapo there is hope that there will be an upward shift in occupancy levels and likely returns for many Lake Tekapo homes used for visitor accommodation. Once this happens I believe the focus will truly shift once more to Lake Tekapo opportunities.

We certainly have noticed an increase in the number of visitors in Tekapo calling in to our office to enquire about Lake Tekapo properties. Speaking to the accommodation providers it seems that July is going to be a busy month for Lake Tekapo and its ski season.

Ohau had 2 sales with one being a house sold for \$775,000 & the other a lake front section for \$450,500






