There were smiles to be seen everywhere. At the Village Green the supporters were cheering on their family and friends who came running, walking or stumbling across the finish line, exhausted but happy.

However with the effort of a number of people, we had another successful year, with all the funds raised going to the Fairlie Lions. 

New Books



Pieter Albertyn and I were invited out with pilgrim-banditsnz to try our hands at gold panning at the former Waiuta gold mine south of Reefton. Though we didn't succeed in filling our gold bucket we found a great bunch of people, and a beautiful part of NZ to spend a weekend with a great crew to relax and share stories with.

Kirke Street Community Garden Update – July 2022

I am pleased to report that we have had success, our rocket seeds have germinated! At this point it is quite unlikely that the other seeds will germinate, I suspect the soil was too cold. Nevertheless, we shall look forward to the rocket seedlings taking off and harvesting the leaves in the next month or two. Later, in the year when its warmer the turn around on seed sowing to harvesting will be much quicker, yay!

Again, thank you to everyone who came along to our working bee on the 9th July. It was a productive day despite the ground being frozen when we arrived. This month, progress on the shed continues, with a new step and somewhere to store our tools completed, next on the list is shelves and sorting out the rainwater collection system. In the garden a good start was made on mulching the fruit trees, we also planted garlic, moved some of the black and red currant cuttings that were propagated last year, and transplanted some lettuce seedlings in the greenhouse.

Our work continues and it really is time to start the planting plan for the coming growing season. That way we'll be ready to go when the soil starts warming up. We have been told that August is a good month to get in broad beans if they were missed earlier in the year, so watch this space.

Easy Recipe for Winter!

Smokey Bacon and Tomato Soup

50g butter 1 leek, sliced
1 onion, sliced 1 clove garlic, crushed
4 rashers streaky bacon, chopped
Saute until cooked.

Then add ...
1 carrot, diced 600 ml chicken stock
2 tins tomatoes good pinch of cayenne pepper
Simmer for 3/4 hour.

Season with salt and pepper and serve with crusty bread.



Other tasks coming up are finishing moving the currant bushes, preparing the garden beds for sowing, and finishing off mulching the fruit trees.

A big thank you to everyone who came to our working bee, we achieved a lot, thank you for giving up your time to come along and help us. A thank you also goes to those who support us from afar, we appreciate it. This month we gratefully received gifts of garlic, cardboard, and most importantly baking. Thank you.

Our next working bee is yet to be confirmed – however, there are ongoing tasks to be completed. If you are interested in helping, please contact Heartlands and we will get in touch with you. Scam and Fraud Prevention

There's a number of ways you can protect yourself against scams and fraud.


- Don't give out too much personal information online, whether on social media or by email.
- Put privacy settings on your social media accounts and don't add too many personal details to your profile.
- If a friend asks you for money on social media, call or email them to confirm their request is legitimate - don't pay without checking first.
- Turn on multifactor authentication for your online accounts.
- Choose unique passwords for your online accounts - don't use the same password for every account you have. Consider using a password manager as well.
- Don't click on web links sent by someone you don't know, or that seem out of character for someone you do know. If you're not sure about something, contact the person you think might have sent it to check first.
- Don't pay invoices for any goods or services that you didn't ask for or receive. Be wary if a company you often deal with changes their account payment details unexpectedly. If you're unsure about an invoice, call the business directly to check the details before you pay.
- Always check your bank statements.
- Get a regular credit report to check that no accounts have been opened in your name without your knowledge.
- Try to remember that if something seems to be too good to be true, it probably is.

Top Types of Scams and Fraud

Scams and fraud accounted for almost \$11.9 million (71%) of the total financial loss reported in 2021.

Of that loss:

- Almost \$3.9 million was lost to scams when buying, selling or donating goods online.
- Over \$2.1 million was lost to scams about employment and business opportunity offers.
- Over \$2 million was lost to unauthorized or falsified money transactions.
- Other scams and fraud \$3.9 million.

This month I attended the Primary Industries of NZ summit in Auckland followed by our National AGM. It was encouraging to be involved with the summit which was attended by over 600 people.



It was great to hear from numerous people in our industry who were positive about the future of agriculture and are doing exciting stuff. One speaker who really caught my attention was American Dietitian and Nutritionist Diana Rodgers who spoke about the fallacies around eating pasture raised red meat as bad for your health and the environment. She is a big believer in the benefits eating animal-based protein. A lot of the bad press around meat is based on unsubstituted claims. There has been no scientifically based studies which show omitting meat out of our diets is going to result in healthier people or achieve a substantial shift in green house gas emissions. I encourage any young mother to take the time to read her book, *The Scared Cow*, if they want their children to have a diet which will supply the essential nutrition children need for good brain development and good health.

The PINZ conference was followed by our National AGM. With three long standing members of the National Board stepping down it was good to see six people from around the country putting themselves forward for the election. Andrew Hoggard was re-elected for another year as National President with Wayne Langford elected Vice. The two new people to join the board are Sandra Faulkner, sheep and beef farmer from the Hawkes Bay and Mark Hooper, a Taranaki dairy farmer. Both have a lot to offer to Federated Farmers.

Half of all home heating fires
- Heating equipment is involved in **1 in every 7** home fires and **1 in every 5** home fire deaths.
- Keep anything that can burn **at least 3 feet** from any heat source like fireplaces, wood stoves, radiators or space heaters.
- Keep portable generators **outside, away from windows, and as far away** from your home as possible.
- Install and test carbon monoxide alarms **at least once a month**.
- Plug only **1 heat-producing appliance** (like a space heater) into an electrical outlet at a time.
- Have a qualified professional clean and inspect your chimney and vents **every year**.
- Store cooled ashes in a tightly covered metal container, and keep it **outside at least 10 feet** from your home and any nearby buildings.

I'm sure many people, like me, are fascinated with your love of swimming outdoors. What are the most frequently asked questions that people ask you?

Why do you do it?

I had heard that cold water was good for you so I had tried, without success, to do cold showers. But then, after I had my first major Meniere's attack in 15 years I decided to try cold water lake dips instead. I love it so much more than cold showers as I can focus on the incredible scenery surrounding me which helps take my mind off the cold. I find it difficult to be still in my mind but I can achieve this when I am submerged in the lake watching the beautiful sun rises. It feels great when you get out.

(For those who don't know, Meniere's Disease is a rare disorder of the inner ear that causes episodes of terrible vertigo. It also leads to hearing problems. So if you have ever said hello, asked me a question and I haven't replied or I have given you completely the wrong answer, I wasn't being rude, I probably just didn't hear you)

Do you find it difficult to get in?

Yes - Every single time. I never used to like swimming in the lake even on a hot day, let alone when it's a frosty minus 7 degree morning!

What do you do to help you get in?

I do a lot of self talk and deep breathing on the edge of the lake. Tussock helps with extra encouragement, if required, to help get me out of the warmth of the truck.

No but I do leave my red band gumboots at the lake edge to put on when I get out.






