

## Boost your wellbeing with Mindfulness Month this August

Over 1,600 people across Aotearoa have already pledged to take charge of their wellbeing and fundraise for a better mental health system by participating in Mindfulness Month, launched this August by the Mental Health Foundation in partnership with The Kindness Institute.

Mindfulness Month is an initiative that encourages participants to prioritise a mindful moment during each day of August while raising money for the Mental Health Foundation. There are a variety of tools on offer to support participants; daily guided mindfulness podcasts by Kristina Cavit, a mindfulness journal based on the month done concept by Stephen McCarthy and daily mindfulness activities to weave into everyday life from Pause Breathe Smile.

Mindfulness has been linked to a reduction in anxiety and stress, a boost in mood, and enhanced relationships, sleep and general wellbeing. Founder of The Kindness Institute and mindfulness coach Kristina Cavit hopes that participants will find more calm and clarity in their lives through taking a mindful moment each day.

"This campaign is for everyone, even those who think mindfulness is nonsense! There is a variety of tools so everyone can choose how they want to have a mindful moment each day. It's about doing something good for yourself and your wellbeing and doing something good for others by fundraising for mental health. Working with the Mental Health Foundation on this shared kaupapa makes so much sense and I have loved every moment of it."

The money raised by participants in Mindfulness Month goes towards supporting the work of the Mental Health Foundation to promote mental wellbeing and fund policy and advocacy work to transform the mental health system, engage with tāngata whaiora (people with lived experience of mental distress) and advocate for systemic change to improve social, economic and cultural determinants of mental health and wellbeing.

"The money raised through Mindfulness Month will really help to support us to be the guide dog and the watchdog for the creation of a world-class mental health system in New Zealand." **Albury School - Literacy**

Last week we held a Literacy Parent Information Seminar at Albury School that was very well received by our parents.

Our teachers Mrs van der Heyden and Miss Beynon shared their approach to teaching literacy at Albury School along with interesting background information such as scientific research into brain development in the young.

For students to understand how print works in reading, writing, and spelling it is important that they understand how spoken sounds are mapped together. The blending of the sounds of letter helps to decode unfamiliar words by sounding them out. Once the students are confident in reading, they are being taught spelling rules to enable them to decode sounds of unknown trickier words and to work out the correct spelling in their writing.

Our youngest learners start off with 8 sounds. The children learn to match sounds to what the letter representing the sound looks like, how to say it and how to write it. Once they are familiar with recognising, saying, and writing those sounds correctly they start blending those sounds together into short words and then move on to new sounds, building on to their base knowledge.

It is evident in our tamariki how much joy they are experiencing to be able to put those skills to use, seeing themselves as independent and successful learners. We are very lucky to have highly trained teachers who are passionate about teaching and supporting our Albury kid's learning journeys.

We were blown away by our educator named Tu, who shared his wealth of knowledge with us and shared traditional stories of the night sky. We watched an informative movie and saw some amazing photos of our night sky. Tu also showed us how to find some well known constellations and answered our numerous questions.

We enjoyed lunch at Tekapo School and played basketball with the students and Dark Sky Project educators.



Afterwards it was time for some kite making! The senior students helped gather the flax, while we got the bamboo ready. Their first job was to make a triangle with the 3 pieces of bamboo and tie these together with string. Next we split the pieces of flax and arranged them inside the triangle. Finally the tricky part which took a lot of perseverance. Each piece of flax had to be tied carefully to the bamboo with string. The end result was awesome and the students were very proud of their kites.

## Te Manahuna Kāhui Ako

### What is a Kāhui Ako?

A kāhui ako is a community of learning, a group of kura (place of learning) that have signed a formal agreement to work together to reach common goals. These goals are formed by the Principals and, if the kāhui includes ECE centre's, Head Teachers. The goals can include curriculum achievement goals but also goals around student wellbeing, coherent learning pathways (ECE to leaving school), culturally responsive teaching, and digital fluency. The members of a kāhui ako appoint a lead principal and other members of the leadership team. This can include across school teachers and within school teachers. The number of roles available is governed by the number of students within the kāhui.

### Why is a Kāhui Ako good for our students/schools?

Being a member of a kāhui ako provides a number of benefits and opportunities for students and schools. By working together for common goals that are centred around what is best for ākonga (learners) we aim to improve knowledge, teacher practice, and outcomes for students. Kāhui Ako look to build collaborative and collegial relationships between kura and staff, with whanau, iwi and the wider community.

### Who is the Te Manahuna Kāhui Ako?

Te Manahuna Kāhui Ako comprises the following schools and ECE; Albury School, Aoraki Mt Cook School, Cannington School, Fairlie School, Fairlie Early Learners, Fairlie Kindergarten, Mackenzie College, St Joseph's Fairlie, Tekapo School, Tekapo Kindergarten.

Our achievement goals were selected and written by a panel of representatives from the kāhui. These are:

1. Coherent Pathways/Transition - ensuring seamless and coherent transitions at various stages of an ākonga's educational journey.
2. Wellbeing - establishing a baseline of ākonga (students) and kaiako (teacher/staff) wellbeing and monitoring this, as wellbeing is a key predictor of achievement.
3. Digital Fluency - understanding how ākonga use digital tools, kaiako becoming more fluent with digital tools as well as unpacking the new digital technologies curriculum.

Significant mahi has been undertaken over the last 4 years in the above areas. The transition from primary school to college has been investigated with student, parent and staff voice gathered and changes trialled in the 2022 Year 7 cohort. Further focus groups followed to gauge the impact of these changes. In the wellbeing space the early work around the '5 ways to wellbeing' has been followed up with a successful application to the MOE for professional development for kaiako.

This year we have been able to introduce the NZIWR (New Zealand Institute of Wellbeing and Resilience) program to our wellbeing leads (representatives from different kura and the two AST's) who then take this knowledge back to their own kura. The remainder of this year will see ākonga voice gathered and wellbeing audits undertaken.

Recently all kura came together for a teacher only professional development day focusing on culturally responsive practices and growing our understanding of the local mana whenua histories. This was rescheduled from the beginning of this year which had to be postponed due to the COVID 19 red light setting.

The Principals/Head Teachers and Stewardship Group (a group of representatives from each kura) are currently seeking a new Lead Principal/s with the departure of Jason Reid to Kaiapoi College. Currently Kelly Eason, St Jo's Fairlie and Kathryn Lett, Mackenzie College are the current Across School Teachers. They are continuing to work on the mahi begun this year, linking regularly with Principals and Head Teachers.


### Storytime at the Library

Mary B highly recommends 'Red Notice' and 'Freezing Order', both by Bill Browder, which follow the author's quest for justice for his murdered lawyer, Sergei Magnitsky, and to clear his own name while exposing the corruption in Russia, despite the risk to his life.

**Red Notice:** an unputdownable, real-life political thriller about an American financier in the Wild East of Russia, the murder of his principled young tax attorney, Sergei Magnitsky, who uncovered a massive fraud committed by Russian government officials that involved the theft of US \$230 million of state taxes, and the author's dangerous mission to expose the Kremlin's corruption. 

### Gripping Novel set in the Mackenzie District

**WINTER TIME** by Laurence Fearnley  
(Penguin NZ)



As an immigrant to New Zealand, I read books by New Zealand authors Keri Hulme and Janet Frame even before I set foot in this beautiful country. Many of us love reading books set in other countries because it opens our minds to different cultures and traditions.

But we also love reading about what we know well, the places we have been, experiences we've had and the food we love. It is the fascination of seeing what you know well through someone else's eyes.

For us in the Mackenzie Country it cannot get any more local than the setting of Winter Time by Laurence Fearnley. Lake Matariki is a town in the Mackenzie Basin – a place almost identical to Lake Tekapo. The author renamed the town, to avoid local readers taking everything she describes too literally. All the other names are authentic: Twizel, Motuariki Island, Lilybank Road only Lake Alexandrina is also renamed (as Lake Christiana).

Our main character, Roland returns to Lake Matariki when his brother Eddie drowns after crashing his car into the canal. Roland and the readers will wonder if this was an accident or something more sinister. A 1080 poison drop has created a division between hunters and conservationists. Is Eddie a victim of this division and who is bullying Roland on social media? The backdrop of this tense story is a very cold Mackenzie Basin with whiteouts, cold homes, lake drownings and the prospect of a tectonic catastrophe potentially causing a tsunami. Laurence Fearnley has an affinity with the district and as a young girl camped in the mountains in wintertime. Her descriptions are spare and accurate and very relatable for anyone who knows the district.



**NZ Arable Awards Grower of the Year**  
 (Grain sponsored by Bayer)  
**David & Anna Irving, Lanark Downs**

This inaugural combined event was held in Christchurch on 6 August and backed by Federated Farmers, the Foundation for Arable Research, United Wheatgrowers and the NZ Grain & Seed Trade Association.

The Total production from the arable sector in 2021 was 2.3 million tonnes. This was a 31 per cent increase from 2018 when total arable production was 1.8 million tonnes. Total grain and pulse production of 2.2 million tonnes was a 30 per cent increase from 2018. Meanwhile, seeds for sowing production grew by 40 percent from 58,268 tonnes in 2018 to 81,470 tonnes in 2021.

In 2021 the arable sector directly produced crops worth \$1 billion. These sales went upstream of the arable sector and created total sales of all goods and services of \$2.2 billion. These total sales were equivalent to a contribution of \$932 million to New Zealand's gross domestic product (GDP). This has seen the arable sector increase its contribution to GDP from 0.3 percent of national GDP to 0.34 percent.

The contribution to GDP is sufficient to support 7,687 full-time equivalent employees (FTEs).

#### *Do you have any pets?*





A few weeks ago, several huts at Lake Alexandrina were the target of burglars. There may also be other huts there that have been hit but the owners haven't been up there for a while, so if you have a hut up there it might pay to go up and check things out. It would also be a good opportunity to give the security the once over, there is no point in making it easy for them.

There was a deliberate drive off with a full tank of petrol from the Caltex Station, but luckily the offender was intercepted and arrested. He had also been busy doing the same thing around several other service stations around the South Island and was an illegal over stayer from the UK to boot.

A young Fairlie man was picked up and processed for drink driving after his driving behaviour came to our attention. He returned a reading of more than 3 x the legal alcohol limit.

There have been several reports of people being fleeced by internet scams promising big returns on investments. The offenders are nearly always overseas and therefore we can not investigate or touch them. Stay vigilant and sceptical of anyone promising instant riches on the internet. Do your due diligence and homework first. They can be very persistent and convincing, so make sure you know who you are dealing with.

The roads are keeping us busy as always by trying to keep the speed down to a safe level for the winter conditions and making sure everyone stays on their wheels and goes home safely.

There have been a few vehicles running off the road and going through fences and smashing into trees lately, but luckily not having to involve too much medical intervention. A Twizel man had a narrow escape when he ran into a fallen tree at Mary burn. His car flipped over, and more trees were falling all around him as he tried to get to safety.

The snow and falling trees have been causing a few issues on the highways lately, and as I write this there are more snow warnings in the next couple of days, so drive safe out there.

## Know when to use your headlights

30 minutes **after** sunset until 30 minutes **before** sunrise

Anytime you are unable to see 100 metres in front of your vehicle



If there are hazards like this affecting the roads, delay your trip if possible and only travel if you need to.

Keep an eye on the expiry date of your firearms licence as the 10 years seems to roll by quicker these days. Get your application in at least six months before the licence is due to expire to allow sufficient time for processing. If you are late, it will cost another \$115.

It might be a good time to remind people to make sure you have a good visible number on your letter box or the front of your property. It could save a lot of time or your life if you need emergency services.

Also remember to keep vehicles locked and property hidden out of sight to avoid temptation from light fingers, even in your garage and driveways.






