Keep you posted on how we all get on ...







THE CREVICE GARDEN

How to make the perfect home for plants from rocky places

By Kenton Seth and Paul Spriggs
Published by Filbert Press, \$89.99



This week I would like to tell you about a book that features an unfamiliar type of garden, the crevice garden. My husband Michael Midgley is a life-long gardener and the dry, cold climate in Lake Tekapo works in favour of rock gardening. In 2012 he read an article on a crevice gardening in the Czech Republic. This is a style of rock gardening that employs the crevices between rocks to mimic the conditions that many difficult-to-grow plants need. The crevice garden grows plants better than other rock gardens mainly because of the way in which it channels and conserves water. Michael set to work to create the first crevice garden in New Zealand and it has earned a mention in a book about crevice gardening by US authors Kenton Seth and Paul Spriggs.

In *The Crevice Garden*, the authors share their hard-earned expertise on the design, construction, and planting of these stunning 'rock-and-plant' installations. The book is mostly very practical with information on soil and plants, an 8 Step plan to building a crevice garden, ideas for a miniature crevice garden in a trough and several case studies all illustrated with beautiful pictures.

Kenton Seth visited New Zealand in early 2019 on a speaking tour. During this tour he also created the foundation for a crevice garden in the Christchurch Botanic Gardens and built another demo-garden in Lake Tekapo. After a hasty departure from New Zealand due to Covid, Kenton is now returning to do a few more presentations in Christchurch. However, as the place in New Zealand with the most crevice gardens (two so far), Kenton is keen to meet all interested locals at an informal evening with wine and nibbles at the bookshop. He will speak about his journey to becoming a crevice garden crusader, share tips, answer questions, and demonstrate with a mini crevice garden in a wee pot. An inspiring night out!

My Experience

안녕하세요 (Hello)

My name is Maggie Holtham. At the start of last year, I decided that taking calculus as a class would not aid me in my goal to work in the entertainment industry, so I decided to learn a language instead. I started to learn the Korean language by distance through NetNZ because South Korea has one of the biggest entertainment industries in the world due to the rise of interest through Korean dramas/films and K-pop music.



After learning Korean for ten months, my teacher said that there was an opportunity to travel to South Korea for a language exchange. As always, I took the opportunity and I was fortunate enough to be able to represent New Zealand in South Korea at the International Korean Education Language and Cultural Exchange. The trip was fully funded and organised by the Korean Education Foundation and 100 students from 30 different countries were chosen to take part out of 6,000 applicants. Before the trip, I was put into a group of 10 students and we had zoom sessions together where we learnt about Korean history and literature. We each had to memorise and present a poem or essay to each other. The poem that I presented led me to be selected for the finals which would be held in South Korea during the exchange. We also had to learn a song from the musical '1446' which was about King Se-Jong and his creation, 'Hanguk' (the Korean characters). Because of the time-zone differences, I had the meetings from 8 pm-2 am for three nights in a row. Although it was tiring and difficult (and everyone in my group had been studying Korean for 4-5 years), we bonded as a group and were looking forward to meeting each other in South Korea.

During the exchange we were rehearsing the song that we learnt in the zoom sessions, because we were going to perform it at the award ceremony on the last day for the sponsors, organizers and VIPs who would be present. During the rehearsals some of us auditioned to have a main role (singing part) during the song. The main roles were then given beautiful hanboks (Korean traditional clothing) to wear - one person dressed as King Se-Jong in a beautiful red hanbok, there were two girls dressed as queens, two dressed as the King's advisors and four girls (including me) dressed as scholars. The other students dressed as 'commoners' but each of their Hanboks were just as beautiful. After we opened the award ceremony with the musical number, we listened to speeches presented by the organisation and sponsors, which was then followed by the presentation of awards.

I was one of the four students (out of 100 students) to be given an excellence award for my poem presentation where I was presented a medal and certificate by the Chairman of the International Korean Education Centre. With this award, I now have more opportunities for further study or work in South Korea.

There were many highlights from the exchange including traveling to Seoul and thanking Hana Bank for sponsoring the exchange, going to Gyeongbokgung Palace and the Korean National Museum, experiencing a K-pop concert (Drippin and VIVIZ performed for us!), eating delicious Korean food for every meal and meeting people from all over the world who had the same passion for learning. Every meal was a unique experience where I would sit with people from France, Malaysia, Taiwan, Japan, Vietnam, Indonesia and more, where we would all speak Korean to each other because none of us knew each other's native language. It was scary and difficult at first, however, by the second day we were all thinking and conversing with each other in Korean. This is an opportunity that I worked hard for and is an opportunity that I will never forget.



I highly recommend that everyone should take every opportunity that comes their way, even if they don't think they're ready for it. When I was accepted for the trip I was very excited, however, I was scared because I had only been learning the Korean language for ten months. On the exchange I was fortunate enough to be surrounded by students and teachers who supported and encouraged me and to raise me to the highest level. I now feel that I have grown as a person because I got to experience different cultures and languages where everyone around me was curious and excited for the future ahead. I was surrounded by like-minded people who each believed that they could do anything they set their minds to. I'm excited to see what the world has to offer in the future because I know that if you work hard, anything is possible.

The Evening Sky in February 2023

Venus and **Jupiter** are the 'evening stars', both low in the west. Brilliant Venus sets 70 minutes after the Sun through the month. Golden Jupiter sets more than two hours after the Sun at the beginning of the month but sinks steadily lower night to night. At the end of February Jupiter will be near Venus. The thin crescent Moon will be beside Venus on the 22nd and above Jupiter on the 23rd. We are moving to the far side of the Sun from Jupiter, hence its steady fall in the west. Venus, on the inside track, is slowly catching up with us. As it does so it will move higher in the evening sky till June.

Mars is a bright orange-red 'star' low in the sky a little west of due north. Above it are the orange stars Aldebaran, fainter than Mars, and Betelgeuse, similar in brightness to Mars. We are leaving Mars behind so it is fading. The Moon will be near Mars on the 28th.

Sirius and **Canopus** are the brightest true stars. Sirius, the brightest of all the stars, is north of overhead. Canopus, the second brightest star, is a bit south of overhead. Both stars are white in colour.

Sirius, 'the Dog Star', marks the head of **Canis Major** the big dog. A group of stars above and right of it make the dog's hindquarters and tail, upside down. **Procyon**, in the northeast below Sirius, marks the smaller of the two dogs that follow Orion the hunter across the sky.

Below and left of Sirius are bluish **Rigel** and orange **Betelgeuse**, the brightest stars in **Orion**. Between them is a line of three stars: Orion's belt. To southern hemisphere star watchers, the line of three makes the bottom of 'The Pot'. The handle of The Pot is Orion's sword, a fainter line of stars above the bright three. At its centre is the Orion Nebula; a glowing gas cloud.

Orion's belt points down and left to the orange star **Aldebaran**. Continuing the line finds the **Pleiades** or **Matariki** star cluster, well to the left of Mars. Aldebaran makes one eye of Taurus the bull. It is on one tip of an upside-down V of stars making the face of **Taurus**. These constellation pictures were thought up by northern hemisphere folk so are upside down to us.

The Southern Cross is in the southeast, on its side. Below it are Alpha and Beta Centauri, often called 'The Pointers'.

The **Milky Way** is brightest in the southeast toward the Southern Cross. It can be traced up the sky, fading where it is nearly overhead. The Milky Way is our edgewise view of the galaxy, the pancake of billions of stars of which the sun is just one.

High in the southern sky are two misty patches of light. They are the Clouds of Magellan, small nearby galaxies. They are easily seen by eye on a dark moonless night.

Mercury is in the morning sky, rising in the southeast around 4:30 a.m. at the beginning of the month. It is a lone bright 'star' in an empty region of sky.

Roasted Cherry Tomatoes with Mozzarella and Herb Dressing

Roasting intensifies the sweetness of tomatoes and complements the soft silkiness of the cheese in this dish. Add a punchy dressing and this can be served as an entrée, side dish or as a light meal on its own.



- 36 cherry tomatoes with stem end on, if possible
- 12 x 10 cm wooden skewers
- olive oil
- sea salt and freshly ground pepper
- 2 x 200 gram balls fresh mozzarella in whey, drained
- large handful rocket
- ¼ cup pine nuts, roasted
- 1 red shallot, thinly sliced

Dressing

- ¼ cup each basil and flat-leaf parsley leaves, roughly chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, roughly chopped
- 1 teaspoon sea salt & freshly ground pepper
- 4 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice

Preheat oven to 180°C. Thread the tomatoes onto skewers and place on lightly oiled baking tray. Roast for 5 mins until the skins just start to split. Season with salt and pepper then set aside.

Dressing - Use a mortar and pestle to grind the herbs, garlic and salt to a thick paste. Stir in the oil, lemon juice and season with pepper.

To Serve - Break the mozzarella into pieces and arrange on a large platter with the tomato skewers and rocket. Scatter over the pine nuts and shallot. Give the dressing a stir and spoon over the mozzarella. Drizzle tomatoes with a little olive oil.

Our History

Restoration Project at Fairlie Cemetery

The Mackenzie RSA, in association with the New Zealand Remembrance Army, has started a "war grave" restoration project in the Fairlie cemetery. The project will cover more than just items associated with actual war veterans. It is hoped that all of those identified as having a direct link to the Armed Forces can be included.

The following actions are planned:

- Identify gravestones and commemorative plaques associated with war veterans and others identified as members of the Armed Forces on headstones and plaques in the cemetery.
- Establish a register of such gravestones and commemorative plaques.
- Clean the identified gravestones and commemorative plaques, removing dirt, moss, lichens etc.
- The remnants of old RSA poppies will be removed, and the adhesives used to stick the poppies to the stones or plaques will be cleaned away.
- Do basic restoration on stones and plaques requiring such actions. In some instances, lettering and graphics may have to be retouched or re-painted.
- Apply a durable poppy to all of the stones and plaques identified. Doing so will allow visitors to the cemetery to easily spot the stones and plaques associated with members of the Forces.



The project will be run by volunteers (mainly from the RSA) and will take a while to complete. Members of the public are invited to contact the president of the Mackenzie RSA if they have any comments or would like to be involved. All help and support is appreciated.

We wish to acknowledge the contributions made by *Resene Paints* – a sponsor of War Grave Restoration projects currently being run throughout New Zealand. They supply the paint, some of the tools and promotional material used by the volunteers doing the work.



Ryan Gilbert (president of the Mackenzie RSA) starts the process of cleaning headstones by applying a special spray to the stone. The spray is not aggressive toward the stone and takes a while to do its job.



A little over eight years ago, Trooper Mackenzie arrived at the old Fairlie Railway platform to join his train to Timaru for the start of the Great War. The information panels had taken a battering from UV light, and have now been updated and replaced.



A reminder that the following areas are still in a Restricted Fire Season 365 days:

- Geraldine Forest Zone
- Waimate Forest Zone
- All public Conservation Land

A reminder that the Fireworks Ban is still in place until 31 March 2023 in the:

- Mackenzie Basin area.

Any permits issued during a Restricted Fire Season are suspended if Fire and Emergency declares a Prohibited Fire Season or prohibits fire in open air in the area.

Restrictions on Outdoor Fires in South Canterbury



Much of South Canterbury is moving into a restricted fire season today (Friday 20 January), meaning that a permit will be required to light most kinds of outdoor fires. Fire and Emergency NZ has imposed the restrictions on the Ashburton High Country, Mackenzie Basin High Country and Hakataramea Valley. There is already a complete ban on setting off fireworks in the whole of the Mackenzie Basin, while there is a permanent restricted fire season in the Geraldine Forest Zone, Waimate Forest Zone and on all public conservation land.

Mid South Canterbury District Manager Rob Hands said that the new measures reflected the elevated fire danger caused by persistent hot, windy conditions and drying vegetation. "The locals understand that there is a permanent risk of wildfire in this area, and we have been fielding requests to put restrictions in place so that visitors are made aware of the danger and can avoid accidentally starting a fire."

Some types of fire, such as hangi and camp stoves, are still allowed in a restricted fire season provided people follow all the guidance on the www.checkitsalright.nz website. That site is also the place to quickly find out whether any kind of outdoor fire is allowed in any location, whether a permit is required, and get advice on how to use fire safely.

Mr Hands said that farmers who applied for a permit to light a land management fire would find it was processed swiftly.

They say not to overthink things! but looking how the weather pattern has changed and the amount of growth that is about, if we get a warm spell there will be a lot of dry fuel that could burn.

The Brigade has had two call outs in the last couple of weeks - 12/1 scrub fire and 19/1 smoke showing.
