# From Our Mayor's Desk ...

What a thrill it was for me to present the Masters Athlete of the Year Award at the recent Trust Aoraki South Canterbury Sports Awards to one of our own, Mackenzie's Kim Jordan.

Kim Jordan is the Coast to Coast Multisport Veteran Women's winner who has conquered one of the toughest adventure races in the country. Two full days of competing with the last 70km bike ride into Christchurch left to complete, and where she was able to pull away to take the category lead.

Also a finalist at the Trust Aoraki South Canterbury Sports Awards was the Coast to Coast team of Jack Cassie, Luke Jordan and Hamish Ryall from Mackenzie College. Kim is Mackenzie College's Sports Co-ordinator and inspires pupils to push themselves to their limits. She was a driving force behind the College team's success in the Coast to Coast, when they too won their category.

An equally thrilling story comes from the Twizel Area School. A group of talented young first year rowers, under the tutelage of Sarah Henderson and Kelvin Maker, excelled themselves. Apparently, these students were told that if they managed to medal at the South Island Secondary School Rowing Championships being held on Lake Ruataniwha, consideration would be given to taking them to the Maadi Cup at Lake Karapiro in March of this year. The Maadi Cup is held at the NZ Secondary Schools Rowing Regatta which is the largest school sports event in the Southern Hemisphere.

The team surpassed all expectations and brought home gold from the South Island Championships. Then, with the generous help from a 'whip round' from the Twizel community, the young people were able to head to the prestigious Maadi Cup.

These wonderful uplifting stories show what our young people can achieve with encouragement, enthusiasm and support. A love of sport runs through our Mackenzie community and it's not hard to see why. It is a sport and activity wonderland and, with snow on the mountains and the drop in temperature, the fun of our winter wonderland is about to start. Within a couple of weeks the ski fields in the Mackenzie will be opening and we will see skiers and snow-boarders taking to the mountains in pursuit of their winter hobbies.

#### **Bubbles**






# Upcoming Library Survey

# Pat Jacque's Coffee Cake

1½ c sugar

2 large eggs

3/4 c plain unsweetened voghurt

1 c vegetable oil

½ t vanilla essence

1-2 shot espresso coffee, to taste (or 4 T hot water with 2 T instant coffee

dissolved in hot water)

2 c Edmonds Flour 2 t Edmonds Baking

Powder

½ t Edmonds Baking Soda

Pinch salt

Icing sugar

# **Icing Ingredients**

1 c icing sugar

25g soft butter

1 shot espresso coffee, or 2 T hot water and 1 T instant coffee

A little hot water to mix Walnuts for garnish

- 1. Beat the sugar and eggs well.
- 2. Add the yoghurt, oil, vanilla and coffee gradually
- 3. Fold in the sifted dry ingredients gently
- 4. Bake in a greased 21cm tin (175°C in a classic bake oven for 50 mins, or 155°C for 60-70 min 155°C on fan bake). Remove as soon as a skewer comes clean and the cake springs back in the centre.
- 5. Prepare the icing by combining all ingredients Spread the icing on top of the cake, and sprinkle fresh walnuts around the edge.

# BEWARE SCAMS & FRAUD - A warning from our Police partners

The Police Community team has been looking at ways to beat the scammers as it is a big problem locally at the moment. At the present time scams are a major concern in our community. There are many email and text scams circulating. Please be aware and careful. Below are some tips to keep you safe. As our world becomes increasingly connected digitally, it's more important than ever that we stay aware of potential threats to our safety in the technology space.

#### Staying Safe Online TIPS -

- Never give out your passwords, log in details, or account info.
- Don't respond or click on any links to verify your account information, even if it looks like it's from a real organisation.
- Never share personal or financial information by text or
- Do not respond to texts from unknown numbers, or any that appear suspicious.
- If a 'friend' sends you a text with a suspicious link, call them to make sure they weren't hacked.
- If a business or organisation sends you a text that you weren't expecting, call them to verify its authenticity using the phone number on your bill or statement (or their official website).
- If you receive an email from a business or organisation and suspect it might not be from who it claims, look carefully at the email address and firstly cross reference it to those provided on the official website. If still not sure, call the phone number listed on the official website and clarify that the email was sent from someone within the organisation.

- Only shop on trusted and verified websites. Look for the padlock icon by the website address.
- Be wary of unexpected deals, contests, or log in requests.
- Check and adjust your privacy settings.
- Log out after using a shared computer.
- Report suspected scams.

If you receive suspected spam content you can report it to the Department of Internal Affairs:

- Report email spam by forwarding to reportspam.co.nz.
- Report text spam for free on your phone by forwarding the spam text message to 7726.

You can also contact Netsafe for help with the steps to take should you fall victim to a scam or cyber bulling by submitting a report on netsafe.org.nz/report or by calling 0508 NETSAFE or emailing help@netsafe.org.nz.

# **SNAP SEND SOLVE and Reporting issues to Councils**

We are often asked by neighbours how to report issues relating to Councils rather than Police like a pothole, a water leak, a stray dog, abandoned vehicles, litter or loud noise or some broken playground equipment that needs fixing.

For any issues you can now can grab your Smartphone, snap a photo and send it to your Council. Your photo arrives at the Council with all the details including the exact address of the problem with any notes you may have added all via the GPS on your phone.

This way of letting the Council know of problems is being used across Canterbury, and will work in whatever District you are in – see a problem in Timaru or Christchurch and Snap it, Send it and it automatically goes to the Timaru or Christchurch Council.

The app is free and can be downloaded from the Apple app store, or Android's Google Play. Of course local requests and issues can still be reported by phoning the Mackenzie District Council on at 0800 685 8514 or email at info@mackenzie.govt.nz.

# the Garden Buzz



It's bare root season! It's best to plant bare-rooted trees while they are dormant. Start thinking about preparing the ground and choosing the best fruit trees for your garden. Deciduous exotic trees can also be planted now.

Pick a plant that looks vigorous, has a nice shape, no visible damage to branches and trunk, and appears free of blemishes. Remember that many fruit trees need pollinators (friends that help them fruit) so ask your nursery for suitable varieties for the trees you have chosen. Choose the correct root stock for your soil type and the space where it will grow as the root stock also determines the hight of the tree.

Fruit trees don't like poorly drained soils so if you dig a 30cm deep hole and fill it with water and it doesn't drain away in three hours then you may have to find a different spot. If that isn't an option, then try to mound the soil at the planting spot.

Pre-dig the holes twice the depth and width of the pot or and add some well-rotted manure and/or mature compost.

As well as watering the planting site, the tree root ball should be thoroughly soaked prior to planting.

Gently loosen the roots down the sides of the root ball and loosen any matted roots. If there are any roots that are overly long then you can prune these back, which will ensure the tree grows evenly.

Create a mound for the roots and spread them over it, putting the strongest roots and/or the strongest branch to the prevailing wind.

As you fill in the soil around the roots, keep an eye on where the trunk flares to the roots, this should determine your planting depth. Try to keep it the same as the nursery, you will most likely see the line between the rougher trunk bark that has been exposed and the roots that have been covered. It's better to plant slightly too high as the soil may slump and you can mound it up anyway.

Gently firm around the tree, using hands only, to remove any air pockets and ensure root contact with the soil. Stake either side of the tree, at about half a metre away.

It is best to prune bare-rooted trees at the time of planting. Pruning will be covered in the next issue. Keep an eye out for a notice about a pruning course during the week leading up to Matariki.



# Restoration project at Te Kopi-O-Te Ōpihi/Burkes Pass takes shape

The work, supported by the Ōrāri Temuka Ōpihi Pareora (OTOP) Water Zone Committee, will eventually transform a stretch of the upper Ōpihi River adjacent to the Burkes Pass township, restoring an ecosystem and enhancing the natural character of the area. A new public walking track along the banks of the main river is also planned and will extend the existing Burkes Pass Heritage Walk by an extra kilometre.

The site has significant cultural value for mana whenua as it was once used as a major travel route and was an important place for gathering kai and resources.

Last year, the OTOP Water Zone Committee supported the project with more than \$13,800 of its action plan budget, and now more funding is being considered.


Key work completed since spring 2022 includes clearing willows from about half the overall 3.4 hectare site and the planting of an additional 1,600 natives – equipped with protectors to keep the rabbits off. The plants are sourced through both the Arowhenua Native Nursery and the Burkes Pass Heritage Trust Nursery.

Founding member of the Trust and Headley Green Farm owner, Jane Batchelor, is particularly passionate about the restoration as it borders her land. Jane and her husband Graham have spent 35 years establishing native bush on their property and this new work will complement that mahi. "The established trees, shrubs, and grassland on my farm provide a vision of what other areas could look like in 35 years."

Jane said other planned work includes predator control, water quality monitoring, and fencing. "I'm thrilled to see this restoration work take a leap forward while learning so much about the area's history along the way. It's also a chance for our community to understand more about the site's precolonial era."



"God loves you. ... at every moment, you are infinitely loved" (John 3:16-18)

The Love of God, who is Trinitarian, is a central theme in Christianity. The Bible verse John 3:16-18 encapsulates this love, stating that God loved the world so much that He sent His only Son to offer eternal life to those who believe in Him. Pope Francis echoes this message in his letter to the youth, saying:

"The very first truth I would tell each of you is this: 'God loves you.' It makes no difference whether you have already heard it or not. I want to remind you of it. God loves you. Never doubt this, whatever may happen to you in life. At every moment, you are infinitely loved" (Christus Vivit - No. 112).

The love of God does not take away our own freedom, but his love completes and fulfills us in our longing for true happiness. We love because God first loved us (1 John 4:8 -19). St Paul also wrote, "I am convinced that nothing can ever separate us from God's love in Jesus Christ" (Romans 8:39).

When I was 11 years old, I fractured an arm while playing soccer with my friends in the village. Even though my mother was already busy with her work, she brought me on her bicycle to a local doctor. To be precise, he was a herbalist who used plants to heal wounds. Despite my fractured arm, he did not amputate it; instead, he applied medicinal treatments around it, and gradually it healed.

Our heavenly and loving Father is like that. Sometimes, due to our human weaknesses and frailties, we may break our relationship with him and with one another, but he does not cut us off. The Bible tells us that the chosen of God repeatedly broke their covenants with God, yet God did not abandon them because he is faithful to his love. St. John reminds us that God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but to save it (3:16-18).

Finally, when we believe that we are unconditionally loved by the Creator of the universe, we are emboldened to step out in faith, knowing that we are supported by a love that is greater than any fear we may face. "God loves you. ... Never doubt this, whatever may happen to you in life. At every moment, you are infinitely loved." Fr. Tien Cao




