

Lake Tekapo Community Project - Save our Heritage Fruit Trees

The Lake Tekapo community has recently received some funding from the Genesis Tekapo township fund to carry out this very special project.

The idea for this project came about after members of The Lake Tekapo Community Garden Group attended an organic gardening course run by Robyn and Robert Guyton from Riverton in Southland, and heard about their Open Orchard project. The Guytons recognised that Southland's early settlers' orchards, with their heritage fruit trees, were rapidly disappearing. The age of some of the fruit trees were up to 165 years old. This, combined with changes to land use, counted against their survival. They acted quickly, identifying orchards and individual fruit trees in the district and set about grafting scion wood (cuttings) from the old trees onto new root stock, with a goal of returning young trees to locations all over Southland. They now have a collection of over 800 trees.

The Vision of Te Manahuna ki Uta – Destination Mackenzie Management Plan for the Mackenzie District is "Te Manahuna's Wonder and Treasures are restored, protected and thriving – to be loved and valued while sustaining us, our visitors and those who come after us."

Our Heritage Fruit Trees are Treasures (Taonga) and we believe this project exemplifies the Vision of Te Manahuna ki Uta.

With recent changes to urban zoning of land in Lake Tekapo township, and a much greater density of housing likely in the near future, it is imperative that we start this project ASAP, before our heritage fruit trees are gone forever.

Several wonderful specimens that are thriving in our climate have already been identified. Our goal is to 'save them' by creating new trees from cuttings, then planting the young trees around our region in schools, public parks, community gardens and home gardens.

Julie McDonald – Community Development worker for Lake Tekapo will drive the project. Assisting her will be Sue and Paul Geaney, Lake Tekapo residents who formerly owned and operated an apple orchard south of Timaru for 12 years.

Story telling is an important part of Te Manahuna ki Uta, so we plan to erect information signs (story boards) at each community micro-orchard telling the history of the fruit variety.

Robyn Guyton from the South Coast Environment Society in Riverton & founder of the Open Orchard project in Southland will be visiting Lake Tekapo this Summer. She will share her vast knowledge of Heritage Fruit Trees and contribute valuable information on each variety of fruit for the signs.

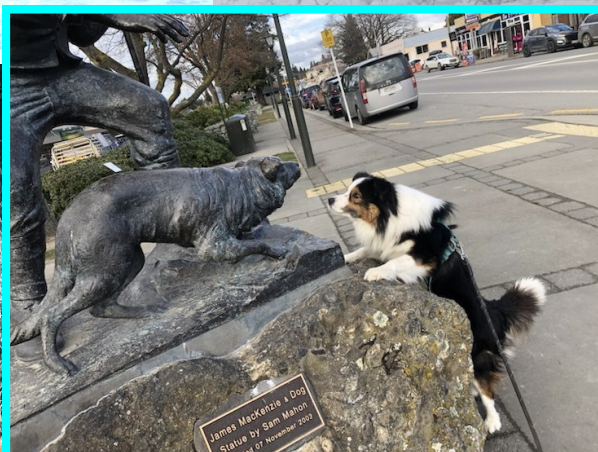
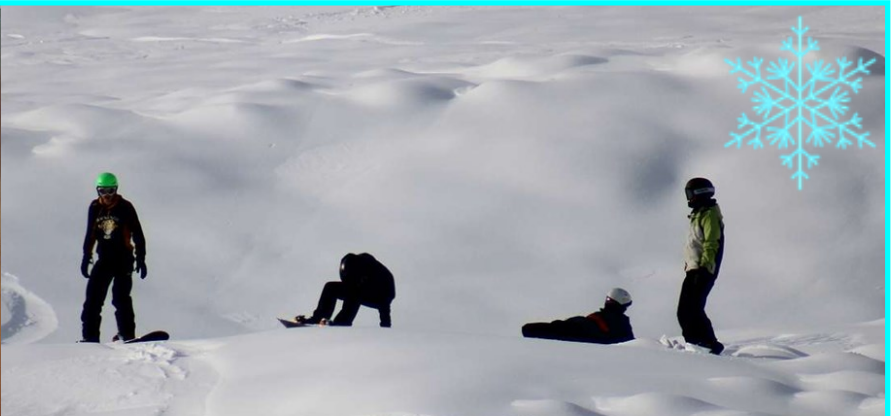
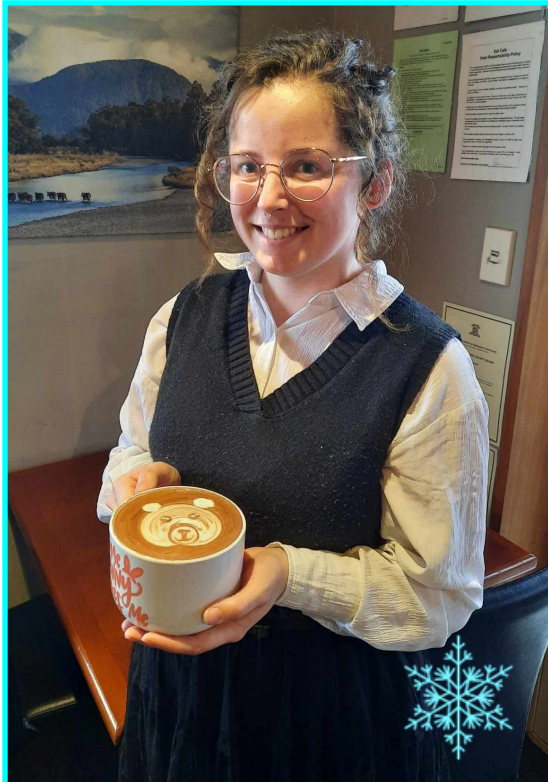

'Naming the Sirens' Poetry Show coming to Fairlie!

Picture this:

Four worldly women. Four new books from Sudden Valley Press. One show curated and directed by 2022 Ockham NZ Book Award Winner, Joanna Preston. A chorus in poetry calling you, singing you, warning you, naming the joys, miseries and desires of women through time. Be warned. Be wooed. Be wowed.

This year Sudden Valley Press launches four superb poetry collections by Canterbury poets – the debut collections *A Game of Swans* by Janet Wainscott and *Stone Men* by Jeni Curtis, and the second collections *Some Bird* by Gail Ingram and *Tiny Insurrections* by Marisa Cappetta. To celebrate, Sudden Valley Press and the Canterbury Poets' Collective offer you **Naming the Sirens**.

Ok, what is it?

First appearing at WORD Writers' Festival Christchurch in August, the performance is part poetry reading, part modern Greek chorus, with poems from the four books weaving through and around each other. In practice there is a central speaker, with the other three providing gestural and stylised movement-based emphasis during the poem. Curated and directed by Ockham NZ Book Award Winner and Sudden Valley Press editor, Joanna Preston, it runs for approximately 60 minutes. Book sales will be available, and books signings after the show.

Who's it for?

We're calling women, men, all in-between. We're calling theatre-lovers, word-lovers, all lovers. We're calling wives, husbands, angels and crones. We're calling you.

Why come?

We're four established Canterbury poets, including Fairlie-original Gail Ingram (nee Coutts) who won the Fairlie 150th anniversary poetry competition with "Coming Home", published in the Fairlie Accessible in 2016! All four are award-winning poets, winning prizes both in Aotearoa and overseas. We are regular performers at the annual Canterbury Poets' Collective Poetry in Performance readings, and have been active in the Canterbury poetry scene for more than a decade.

Sudden Valley Press is a long-established boutique press, set up in 1997, publishing collections from both debut and established writers, such as Frankie McMillan, Tony Beyer and James Norcliffe.

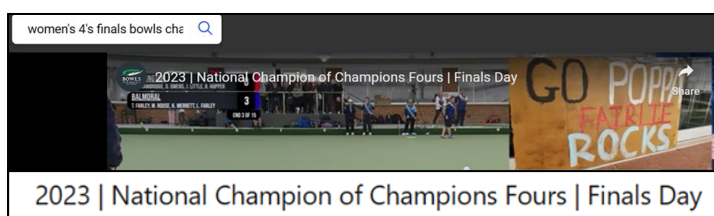

Dignity Bags

Thank you to all those people who have continued to support Dignity Bags. Soon it will be 4 years since I began the project.

It has changed somewhat lately because the Women's Refuge in Timaru ceased to require the bags, as another charity has stepped in and is providing as much as they can store.

I discovered that the Salvation Army also has victims of family violence coming to them, as well as homeless people and those who do not have enough to cover the essentials of life; so the bags are going there. Recently I had a discussion with the lady who is in charge of their food bank. The upshot is that Dignity Bags will supply cloth bags, zipper wash purses and contents so that bags can be filled according to a person's needs.

Cloth bags take up less storage space than handbags and can be made from bright cheerful materials.

You don't need me to tell you that life has become harder for a lot of people and for those people who were already struggling, the difficulties have increased 100 fold; for this reason I know that the Dignity Bag project is needed even more. So please do think of buying an extra toothbrush or tube of toothpaste or something on special.

If you are travelling, aeroplanes and motels seem to have giveaway items that could be useful and remember all those Christmas presents of soaps, hand creams etc you know you won't use and have thrust away into a drawer. Put them to good use and feel good knowing that somewhere another human being will feel that somebody cares.

Here is a list of basic items for keeping yourself clean and tidy you may think of more: soap, deodorant, toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, conditioner, pads and panty liners, tissues, emery boards and hand cream. Also zipper wash purses new or nearly new and cloth bags.

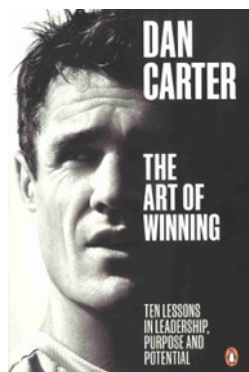

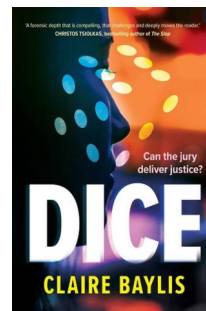

On most days the 6pm News covers at least one court case that is gripping the nation. We often wonder if the prosecution and lawyers are not overly complicating the obvious crime. But rarely do we envy the jury members for the difficult decision they have to make.



Dice is a new novel, set in Rotorua, by Claire Baylis. Four teenage boys, the Dice Bros, have invented a sex game based on the toss of a dice. They are now in court charged with multiple sexual offences against three teenage girls. The story is told through the eyes of each juror as the trial unfolds. We learn what skills and baggage the jurors bring to the jury room. You realise that getting a consensus in a group that is so diverse in age, background and values will be a challenge.

As a reader you are also in the juror's seat. When the prosecutor who acts on behalf of the Crown explains what (allegedly) happened and when the girls themselves give evidence, most readers will feel empathy for the girls, who (allegedly) never gave consent to the sexual acts. Or do the lawyers for the four boys, the defendants, have a point that maybe the girls were just after revenge because the boys were not interested in long-term relationships? And wouldn't the girls have screamed or come forward immediately after the assaults?

The author knows her stuff. Claire Baylis was a legal academic at the university in Wellington and worked as a jury researcher in Rotorua. This gave her an exclusive insight in the thought processes of real jury members.

I learned much about the jury system and even more about the complexities of sexual violence accusations and how sexual violence is viewed in our society. The beauty of fiction is that we can explore the accusations from many different angles. A bonus of the novel is that the book finishes with what really happened to one of the girls, not a luxury we have in real life. This is a compelling, well written book that will have more impact than many 'factual' articles on the same topic.

Pruning Tips for Apple and Pear Trees

For apples and pears (pip fruit), winter pruning is best as it encourages strong spring growth and the lack of leaves means you can better see the structure and shape of your tree. Prune on a sunny day to prevent any possibility of diseases/pests getting into the wounds. Avoid pruning on a wet, miserable day, it's best to sit by the fire and read about it!

There are many ways to prune fruit trees, such as the traditional wine glass shape, a central leader or espalier. It's important to prune young trees well to establish a strong frame. In the home orchard you may want to prune to a manageable height for picking.

Aim to prune about 20% of your tree, removing and clearing the clutter within the tree for a nice, open framework with no competing branches. When branches rub against each other, the bark gets stripped away at the point of contact, creating a wound that can serve as an entry point for pests and diseases, as can broken branches. Trees are better able to seal off wounds and heal over when clean pruning cuts are made. Scab, canker and mildew are all associated with overcrowded growth. Light and air penetration can reduce the instance of disease.

The first few pruning steps which need to be carried out first are to:

- Remove any dead, diseased and broken branches.
- Eliminate crossing branches by pruning out one of the branches.
- Remove suckers, water sprouts and most competing branches growing straight up into the tree.

The shoot on the end of each tip is called a terminal and this won't ever fruit, so reduce that to just five or six buds. There's also a branch that comes off the side of the shoot at an angle of between 30 and 60 degrees and that's called a lateral. Leave the laterals intact because they will develop fruiting spurs for next season. And the little stubby bits of growth, which are fruiting spurs, will develop apples this season. Try to prune a quarter of an inch past a bud and at an angle. And remove any old fruit left hanging on the tree.

Pears fruit on the little flowering spurs, just like apples, but they also fruit on the tip of one year old laterals, and so when pruning reduce the terminal and leave these to produce fruit for next year.

Happy pruning and remember to start sowing your seeds in preparation for the seedling swap!



Mackenzie Freedom Camping Bylaw Review



MDC is reviewing our Responsible Freedom Camping Bylaw. This was last reviewed in 2016 so we are looking to ensure it meets the needs of our residents, visitors, and communities, while also bringing it into line with national best practice and government direction.

Recent changes regarding freedom camping laws mean our current rules are outdated. The Self-contained Motor Vehicles Legislation Act 2023 has been passed into law by government. This means there are some nation-wide changes to where people can freedom camp, the meaning of 'self-contained vehicle', and changes to infringement fees and fines.

Reviewing our bylaw will ensure we stay aligned with new legislation and manage responsible camping within the Mackenzie District, while ensuring we protect the things that make the Mackenzie District special for our visitors and residents.

Let us know what you think!

To help us shape up a new bylaw, we want to know what the community thinks.

To do this we will be carrying out a brief survey which seeks to understand what people feel about Freedom Camping in the Mackenzie District and any issues they see from a community perspective.

We'll be using the feedback we receive to help inform the changes to the Bylaw before taking them to Council for adoption and formal notification.

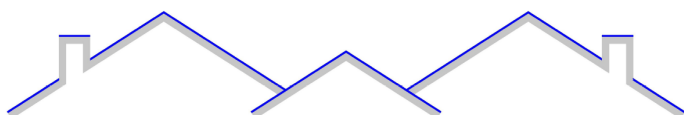

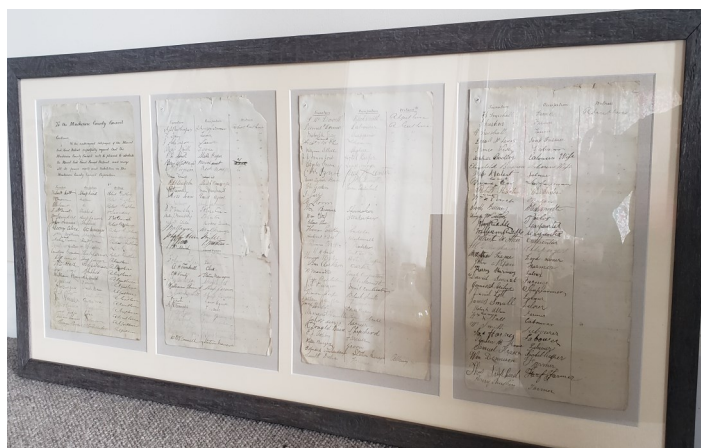
