Fairlie Lions Club 50th Birthday Celebration

On Sunday 24th of September, members and partners, past members and special guests gathered at the Rugby Clubrooms to celebrate 50 years of Lions in the Fairlie District. The MC for the evening was Owen Hunter.

The evening started with a welcome from President Colin Murdoch, this included some of the following comments. The Club has had 169 members over 50 years. Present membership is 47, with two more to join next month. Three stalwarts of the Club were acknowledged, Clarice

Girvan, Bev Smith and Marie Crampton, their husbands were all members of the Club. They have a combined connection to our Club of 133 years.

The local community and businesses were acknowledged for their continued support of the Club.

Norm Blakemore spoke to a visual display of the major projects that the Club undertook in the 10 years since the 40th Anniversary. These included, putting a roof on the Carriage on the Village Green, Opihi Gorge Bridge and track, painting Moreh, buying the Lions house next door, building carports for the pensioner flats, running the Mackenzie Half Marathon, donating \$17,000 to the Fire Brigade First Response Vehicle, yesteryear plagues around Fairlie, maintaining the river tracks and many hours cutting and splitting firewood. Norm summarised the funds that had been dispersed over the last 10-year period, amounting to \$430,000. This included local organisations, community groups, schools, local halls, scholarships for local students, and charities. The club also helped many families with their health and welfare needs. On top of that, thousands of volunteer hours were given freely by Fairlie members and their partners.

Norm proposed a Toast.

"To past and present members for their commitment up to today, and to future Lions that the Fairlie Club will continue the Lions motto "We Serve for the benefit of the Community and the District." Mayor Anne Munro responded by thanking the Club for its service to the Fairlie community.

The 50th anniversary cake was cut by our longest serving member (47 years), lan McDonald, pictured below. This was followed by a great meal provided by the Mackenzie College PTA.

Entertainment was provided by Jo Taylor and two musicians. Jo and her colleagues sang some well-known songs and provided some comical interludes throughout the evening. The highlights being a very entertaining Weather Lady and a Horse Race commentary by Jo, where the horse names, jockeys and trainers were names of people in the audience!

All in all, a great way to celebrate 50 years of Lions in the Fairlie District.



School Holiday Lunches - Cream Cheese Sushi



1 cup sushi rice (cooked to instructions)
250g pk Anchor Cream Cheese (at room temp)
200g fresh salmon, cut into 2cm strips
Snow peas, thinly sliced
1 small cucumber, julienned
6 nori/seaweed sheets

- 1. Once you have cooked the sushi rice, drain it and allow it to cool completely.
- 2. Place a nori sheet on the sushi rolling mat and, working from the edge closest to you, cover ¾ of the sheet with a layer of cooled rice about 1cm thick. (This should leave the end of the nori sheet furthest away from you with no rice on it.)
- Brush the uncovered section of nori with a little water as this will act as the seam of your roll. Pat the rice down then lay some cucumber and snow peas along the rice horizontally, followed by the salmon strips.
- 4. Place some of the Anchor Cream Cheese into a small zip lock bag, squeeze tightly and snip a corner off the bottom to create a piping bag. Pipe the cream cheese along the length of the sushi. Then, using your mat, roll the sheet up and over the ingredients and tuck it in tightly. Slice into 6 equal pieces.
- 5. Repeat this process with the remaining ingredients.
- 6. Store the finished sushi in the fridge until ready to serve. When serving, dip each piece in some soy sauce, dust with sesame seeds and dab with a little wasabi if you want to spice things up.



<u>Hog, Dogs and a Rifle by Kim</u> Swan



breaking. Send Kim out into the South Island high country with her battered Remington and her trusty canines and there's a high chance she'll snag a hog or two. Ther aren't many around who can spin a yarn like Kim can either, providing a rare insight into the hunting and adventuring that goes on in the back blocks of Marlborough, New Zealand (Back cover)

Born to Run 2 The Ultimate Training Guide by Christopher McDougal & Eric Orton

The original *Born to Run* ignited a global barefoot running movement, inspiring a generation to step outside and explore the world on our own two feet. Christopher McDougall and long-time coach and running wizard



Eric Norton's latest book teaches every runner, new or experienced, how to master humankind's first true superpower and tap into hidden reserves of strength and stamina. Drawing on lessons learned from Mexico's legendary Rarámuri and decades of running research and experience, *Born to Run 2* truly is The Ultimate Training Guide.

THE RAGING STORM, by Ann Cleeves Macmillan, \$37.99

Ann Cleeves is the author of over thirty crime novels, including the Shetland books and the Vera Stanhope books which have been made into TV series. Her latest book is *The Raging Storm*, the third book in the *Two Rivers* series. This is only the second Ann Cleeves book that I've read, but I am now



confident that if I need distraction and an easy read, this author will deliver.

Ann Cleeves' books are all anchored in place. The characters in the Shetland series are shaped by the rugged and isolated landscape. I read that the author planned the first Shetland book, *Raven Black*, as a standalone book because it would stretch credibility to have more than one murder in a place as small as Shetland. There are only 23,000 people in all of the islands. But readers loved the Shetland background, and this resulted in 8 books in this series.

We find the same mix of community and landscape in the *Two Rivers* books. They are set in North Devon where the two rivers Taw and Torridge meet. In book one, *The Long Call*, Detective Inspector Matthew Venn returns to this area where he grew up. He left after he became estranged from his family because they're deeply religious and he is not, a tension that returns with every book. *The Raging Storm* is set in Greystone, a small, bleak (fictional) coastal town in the district where the locals know each other, and the arrival of a celebrity, Jem Rosco, creates some excitement. When during a raging storm, Rosco's body is found in a dingy anchored off Scully Cove, Venn and his sergeants arrive to investigate.

Ann Cleeves' books fall into the category of 'cosy crime'. There is no such thing as cosy crime of course. Murder is murder. The difference is that the violence in these stories usually happen off-stage. *The Raging Storm* is a gripping mystery. But you don't want to skip to the end, because the characters and the environment that shaped them are fascinating, and you want to spend some time with them before you close the book.

New tool revolutionising drought forecasts



A <u>newly launched tool</u> developed by NIWA and the Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) to predict dryness and drought will help farmers and growers be better prepared for challenging weather conditions.

Using the latest in artificial intelligence and long-range weather modelling, the free tool provides week-to-week predictions of rainfall, dryness, and potential drought 35 days into the future.

The outlook updates daily, capturing the latest changes in the climate system. It also offers long-term forecasts at a much higher spatial resolution than previously available. The launch of the tool comes after official confirmation that the El Niño weather pattern has developed in the Pacific. El Niño events typically come with an increased risk for abnormally dry conditions across many regions of New Zealand, particularly in the north and east.

NIWA meteorologist, Ben Noll, said the new tool is already making a big difference.

"This tool enables us to give more frequent and district-level predictions of rainfall, dryness, and drought. Providing advanced warning of future dry spells will be invaluable," said Noll.

Ben Noll said a lot of work has gone into making sure that the data is available in a way that works for those who need the tool.

"With climate change, the leading cause of increase in drought risk is the temperature-driven increase in atmospheric water demand. This leads to drier soil conditions, water stress for vegetation, and low hydrological flows.

 El Niño has officially arrived, and is likely to continue over summer.




- Dramatic temperature swings are likely in the next three months, with periods of unseasonable warmth likely followed by sharply colder southerlies
- Elevated chance for below normal rainfall in many regions
- Above normal wind strength, with periods of potentially damaging winds
- Greater fire danger potential than last year for many areas (For more info: www.checkitsalright.nz)
- Marine heatwaves are expected to be less persistent and widespread than those that have occurred in previous years.

Having this new tool on our belt will hopefully help the country be more prepared for and resilient to potential droughts, both now and in the future," said Noll.

MPI's director of Rural Communities and Farming Support, Nick Story, said the new software programme will be invaluable.

"The tool has been tailored for the primary sector and we've collaborated with farmers and growers over the last three years to ensure it provides useable information. Farmers and growers can utilise this tool to prepare in advance for drier than normal weather and the impacts this might have on production, pasture growth, and animal welfare," said Story.



Focus On Matters That Matter

Bishops Urge Politicians to Focus on Real Issues, Not Trivia (Excerpts from New Zealand Catholic Bishops' Statement)

The New Zealand Catholic Bishops' Conference has released a statement ahead of the upcoming election, urging their followers to carefully consider their choices and pray about their voting decisions. They



acknowledge that there may not be a perfect candidate aligned with Christian values, but they have issued guidance to help Christians make their voices heard through their votes. This also emphasizes the importance of not wasting one's vote and instead using it to support those who lack representation and whose lives could be positively impacted by that vote.

"The 2023 general election is a time to reflect on our nation and our hopes for its people. As bishops, we have reflected together in the light of the Gospels and Catholic Social Teaching on the issues affecting our country. We have discussed the rising levels of poverty and mental health, the lack of housing in our various dioceses, and the storm events that have beset our islands as global climate change impacts us and so many in our world. We lamented the growing indifference to the sanctity of life. We affirmed our commitment to Te Tiriti o Waitangi as offering us a pathway of unity for our nation. And we talked about the rapidly growing toxicity in our communities that is dividing us and generating anger, hate, and even violence. These are but some of the many issues we face.

At the same time, we are concerned with the growing trivialization of politics, with the focus of politicians and media being on mistakes, misdemeanors, or scandals of individual parliamentarians instead of being on the scandals of poverty, mental health, and the diminishment of the sanctity and dignity of life. Our hope is that the politicians who will form the government that voters elect on 14 October will focus on the issues that beset us as a nation and work together across party lines to make real progress in finding genuine, lasting solutions.

This election campaign reminds us as a nation that we all have a voice and a responsibility. May that voice and responsibility be guided by Christ, who calls all people to unity, justice, and peace, and the fullness of life.




