#### Lake Tekapo Kindergarten

#### **Early Reading Together Programme**

At Lake Tekapo Kindergarten, we have just had a very successful Early Reading Together Programme. This is an initiative funded by the Ministry of Education and involved the Kaiako facilitating three workshops for parents to learn more about how to support children to develop a love for reading. We laughed together as we attempted to read stories and books in made up languages. Our eyes were opened to the difficulties that children face when they are learning to read for the first time. We have all forgotten what it was like when we were just learning. Having more patience for our tamariki became our mantra.

We also expressed our frustrations at how much tamariki love to read the same stories over and over and over and over again! But through the workshop we discovered how children develop confidence in reading when they repeat stories. They then have the opportunity to learn who the characters are, to talk about the story, to point to new things in the pictures and eventually they might 'read' the story to you before they even know how to read.





Throughout the workshop, Bron from the Mackenzie Library came to visit and tell us about the access that we have to the books there. So many were surprised to hear that Library cards are free for everyone in the Mackenzie Area and we can get books out so easily. Already many parents are starting to head to the library to access a bigger selection of books.

Here's some of the feedback from our whānau: "We tried doing more rhymes after our discussion. Our son loves them!" This was following a discussion about the repetitive sounds and musicality in poems and rhymes. Singing songs and reading poems is just as important for language development as reading books.

"We got Timaru and Fairlie Library cards. Mum is super excited! Got a big pile! We read a few in the library and our daughter started to get excited about new books. Now she's seen new books at home and 'reads' them quietly. Reading books helps to calm her down." "We are paying more attention to having books she's interested in and what relates to what is going on with her life. We're taking her lead and mixing with what Mum thinks she needs."

This last comment came after a few discussions around how to successfully choose books that are appropriate for tamariki. Every child is different but the most important thing is to choose books that interest them and help them to develop a love for reading rather than finding reading a chore.

We are exceptionally grateful to the Ministry of Education for funding this Early Reading Together Programme for us to faciliate. The workshops were really successful.

#### Online Virtual Classroom



#### The Book Worm

#### DARK SKY, Murder Among the Stars By Marie Connolly Quentin Wilson Publishing, \$37.99

When a debut novel and murder mystery is set at Mt John Observatory and in Lake Tekapo, we are instantly curious. *Dark Sky* is the story of a group of scientists, astronomers,



technicians, and partners who have drinks together at the Superintendent's House after the official opening of the conference to celebrate the observatory's fiftieth anniversary. The author Marie Connolly, a retired academic but not an astronomer herself, does not stray from facts: the date of the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration is the same as the actual 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrated in May 2015, the map of Mt John Observatory is accurate, the observatory jobs are as we know them, the descriptions of the Godley Hotel and the Community Hall are precise. But if the local reader is looking for people they might recognise, they'll look in vain and thankfully so, because one of them is going to be murdered and one of them is a murderer!

When Evelyn Major, the new director of the Mt John Observatory, is found dead in one of the telescope buildings, criminal psychologist Nellie Prayle is asked to help the police with their investigation. Nellie hails from Fairlie and still has a soft spot for the Mackenzie District. In Agatha Christie style we slowly get introduced to the nine people who were on the mountain at the time of the murder. Was the murder motivated by romantic jealousy, academic envy, fear for fraud exposure? Marie Connolly keeps us guessing till the end.

The book is called *A Nellie Prayle Mysterie* suggesting that the author plans a few more books with Nellie. That would be great because if I am honest, I felt a little overwhelmed with the details of each character and what they did and said and didn't get enough time with Nellie Prayle – I love a good criminal psychologist.

#### **Opuha Water Ltd Update**

The water level in Lake Opuha has been holding steady over the last week at around 1.5% capacity, thanks to rainfall in the catchment and a reduction in downstream flow requirements.

The Opuha Dam is operating under an amended water shortage direction in place until 9 April 2024, issued at the request of the Opuha Environmental Flow Release Advisory Group (OEFRAG) which comprises representatives from Tangata Whenua, Fish and Game, district councils, farmers and Opuha Water Limited (OWL).

The group agreed to maintain a release from the downstream weir equivalent to the lesser of either natural flows entering Lake Opuha, or one cubic metre per second. Currently inflows are around one cubic metres per second. In addition to the water shortage direction, OWL irrigators are on full restriction.

Monitoring over Easter shows the river has maintained connection under the current water shortage direction. There are certain points along the Opihi River below State Highway One that are most vulnerable at low flows, and OEFRAG members are monitoring them so mitigation action can begin quickly. To date, no fish salvages have been necessary.

#### Blackboy Peach and Apple Shortcake

230gm butter, softened

- 1 cup white sugar
- 2 eggs
- 3 cup plain flour
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 1 1/4 cup stewed blackboy peach and apple

#### **Blackboy Peach and Apple:**

1/2 cup water

- 6 black boy peaches
- 2 large green apples

#### Method:

- 1. Pre-heat oven to 180°C bake.
- 2. In heavy based saucepan add water, roughly chopped peaches and diced apple leaving the skin on. Bring to boil and simmer for 15 minutes until fruit is soft and tender. Stir often to avoid the fruit from catching.
- 3. Allow to cool.
- 4. In bowl combine sugar and softened butter, cream together and then stir in eggs until well creamed.
- 5. Add flour and baking powder and mix until crumbly dough is formed.
- 6. Line baking dish with baking paper and press 3/4 of the base into the tin.
- Spread over stewed fruit, crumble over remaining shortcake mixture and press down.
- 8. Bake for 40 minutes until golden brown.
- 9. Serve cold by itself or warm with a scoop of vanilla ice-cream.

#### What bought you to Fairlie?



This week I got to talk to Penny Wilson, one of the passionate organisers of Breathe Tekapo, our first wellness festival, which will take place from 24-26 May.

## Let's start at the beginning then: how did this idea come about?

I guess it evolved from various conversations we had while walking in the hills and reflecting on how Tekapo makes us feel good. We wanted to find a way to share that and showcase it as we all have a common interest in health and community. ## Eight days later, the Risen Lord came again and stood among the Apostles

On this Second Sunday of Easter, the Risen Lord has appeared again to the Apostles to give them peace by showing God's mercy and tolerance to those who were uncertain about the resurrection of Christ (Jn 20:19-31). In particular, Thomas was not only uncertain about the resurrection of Christ, but he also refused to believe in the testimonies of the other disciples.

Thomas is a typical example of those who undergo a crisis of faith. It is not that they don't want to believe in God or trust in their potential, or in the capability of others to help them, but they are paralyzed by their own doubt and uncertainty. They can be like people who live in the shadow of darkness. And in the end, it leads to a crisis of trust, and the person can become despaired.

Sometimes, a leap of faith, or an act of taking the risk to believe in God, helps us regain our strength of hope, of new possibilities that God is not dead and He is still at work in our midst. An act of faith also brings about a spark of love that sets our lives ablaze with enthusiasm, with good works, and with the vibrancy of life. Our community of faith can only pray and continuously accompany those who have gone through the crisis of faith like Thomas. If we are willing to help them, we have to be patient and always be ready to offer them assistance when needed.

Pope Francis suggests questioning one's faith is natural because it can happen to everyone who believes in God as a test of faith. With humility, it can also lead us to a deeper understanding of God's mysteries of love.

Ultimately, let us admit that it is not our capability to deal with people's crises of faith because only Jesus can address and alleviate crises of faith, offering mercy and removing doubts as he once showed himself to the Apostles, especially Thomas, so that their doubts and uncertainties may be removed. And with God's grace, we might cry out in God's everlasting mercy – 'Jesus My Lord, My God, My All.'



A seed library is a community initiative where community members can "borrow" seeds to plant in their gardens for a sustainable future.


Much like a book in a traditional library, these seeds are taken with the intention of returning something back later.


